


Missions

Devotion: Why Behind the Why

I was listening to a podcast the other day about a nonprofit Christian organization called Mercy Multiplied. The founder, Nancy Alcorn, had previously spent eight years working in a juvenile correctional facility for the state of Tennessee. It was there that she came in contact with many young girls who'd found themselves in desperate situations. She watched these girls come and go with temporary change that produced permanent results. Many of these girls were lost to suicide, abuse, and drug overdose. In 1983, Nancy felt God calling her to establish a faith-based residential program that would help young girls who struggle with eating disorders, depression, self-harm, abuse, and drug/alcohol addictions. She called these girls, "The why behind the why," because they gave her a greater understanding of the young women from the correctional facility. Most of us may ask why someone so young would live so frivolously, but truthfully, we all have a why behind the why. Something from our past that morphed us into who we are. Maybe it was your home-life, your financial situation, lack of spiritual influence, or simply the sin-nature given to you when you were born. Toward the end of the podcast, someone asked Nancy what kind of treatment was given to these women and what she said stuck with me. She said, "We give them what they need as far as material things, but only Jesus can heal a heart." That reminded me of Psalm 147:3 that says, "He healeth the broken in heart, and bindeth up their wounds." Jesus knows the intricate details of your heart. He is fully aware of the scars, and the struggle within never goes unnoticed. He did, however, make a way to heal those broken places and restore beyond human comprehension. I've often wondered why He stood silent as He was ridiculed, mocked, and humiliated. Why He didn't call for reinforcements as He hung in agony. Why He'd go as far as asking His Father to forgive those that brutally beat and tortured Him. Jesus had the power to stop His own crucifixion, but He bore the cross because He couldn't bear the thought of eternity without you. What a breathtaking realization it is to know that Jesus paid the ultimate price for your why, because you are His!

I know his heart was troubled by the 21st day."

Our heart is so troubled, and we think God will never answer. But what if Daniel had stopped praying on day 20? His story would be completely different, and we wouldn't know the power of intercessory prayer.

I said a few weeks ago, I feel like I'm always waiting on God. But am I truly? The Hebrew word for waiting patiently doesn't mean to be still or quiet. The word "qavah" actually means to eagerly expect God to act, and to be ready to spring into action when He does. I definitely want to have faith like that.
