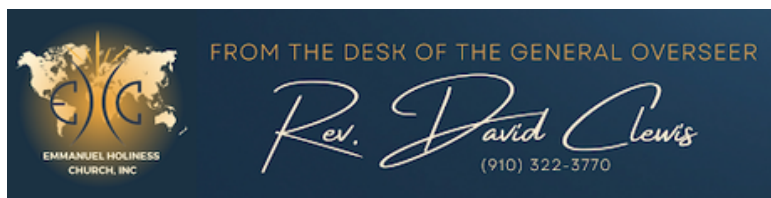

Your Circle & Your Soul

Ever notice how it is a hundred times easier to pull somebody down off a chair than it is to haul them up onto it? That's not just physics, that's spiritual reality.

Look at King Rehoboam in 1 Kings 12. He had the wisdom of the elders right in front of him, but he chose the vibes of his squad instead. He wanted to look alpha, he wanted to look edgy for his friends, and it cost him the entire kingdom. Ten tribes walked away because he was too weak to say no to his peers.

Proverbs 22:24-25 tells us not to make friends with an angry man, lest we learn his ways. Notice it doesn't say you'll just see his ways, it says you'll learn them. It's like a fever. If you sit long enough with someone who's running a 102-degree temperature, yours is going to start rising too. If you're running with people who are salty about the church, or mocking their parents, or constantly venting about the teacher or pastor, don't be surprised when you wake up and realize you've caught their spirit of rebellion. Picture a pristine white glove, and a cup of mud. The mud never gets cleaner by touching the glove. The glove just gets ruined.

Does your circle make it easier or harder for you to pray? If you feel awkward mentioning Jesus around your friends, that's not a circle; that's a cage. A snare of the enemy! Now, don't get me wrong, we are called to love everybody. We've got to be a light to the lost! But there is a huge difference between being a light and being influenced. You can be a friend to a soul without being besties with their lifestyle.

Real Godly friends have what I call a Godly Grip. They aren't just there for the fun and the TikToks; they hold you accountable to the Word. When you're about to slip, they're the ones pulling you back toward the altar, not pushing you toward the world.

Look at your inner circle. Do they pull you up toward the Godly path, or are they dragging you down into the mud?

Let's talk about false advertising. We know it means making untrue or misleading claims about a product or service.



What about our Christianity?

If people think you are a praying, godly person just because of your hair and clothes, and the inward man doesn't match the outside, that's false advertising. They see you in the store and ask for prayer because you have the look, but do you truly have the prayer life that matches? Do you possess God's power and anointing?

Are we advertising Christ or ourselves? Our good works should benefit the Kingdom and glorify God. It should be that we do well for others to see Christ, not that we do these things to get the applause of man. If we are falsely advertising the outside, we are ineffective when trying to do a work for God.

The Bible speaks of having a form of godliness but denying the power thereof, and being like whited sepulchres, beautiful on the outside but inside full of dead bones.

We are so quick to respond with the praying hands emoji or the care reaction when a person asks for prayers, but do we ever actually pray? Again, if you don't... that's false advertising! The person requesting prayer is depending on you to follow through. Your word is your bond. Simply put: if you say it, do it.

All this had me thinking about my own life. I say I believe in God. Is that really true? Do I live my life in a way that proves that without a shadow of a doubt? Or do I run to other sources before God? Do I lack faith? Do I neglect to pray over things like I should? Am I falsely advertising that I am a Christian?

Christian means Christ-like. Think about that. The title Christian claims that you possess the characteristics of Christ. Do you? Do I?

Do we have the power we claim to have? When you attend a church, or specifically a holiness church, you are marked; people know the life you are supposed to be living and the power you are supposed to have. Do we live up to those claims, or are we falsely advertising?



Greetings Ladies!

I have been meditating on what it truly means to be "*available*." In our fastpaced lives, we often confuse being busy with being fruitful. We fill our calendars until there is no

room left for the Holy Ghost to interrupt us. But I believe that the Lord is calling the ladies of the Emmanuel Holiness Church to a different posture: the posture of "AN AVAILABLE HEART." Having an available heart is about being teachable, responsive, and willing to be moved. Our ultimate purpose is to glorify God and to be used by Him for His Kingdom work. We are not a self-serving reservoir, but a conduit – a vessel through which God's love, grace, and power can flow to others. There is absolutely no greater life to live!!

In a world constantly pulling us in what seems like a thousand different directions, it's easy to feel overwhelmed, overbooked, and even exhausted. Many often chase after bigger, better, and more, believing that their significance lies in their achievements or their possessions. But I believe our greatest impact comes not from what we do or have, but from simply being *available*.

Two stories in the Bible came to my mind that I'd like to share which reminded me of the importance of having an available heart. The first story is found in 1 Samuel 3. In the quietness of the night young Samuel hears a voice calling his name two different times thinking it was Eli. Each time Eli assured Samuel that it was not him. Realizing it was the Lord speaking to Samuel, Eli instructed him to respond by saying, "Speak; for thy servant heareth." He took Eli's advice and on the third time he heard the voice calling his name, he responded with "Speak; for thy servant heareth." Think about it -- Samuel simply offered his presence and that positioned him to be a very important prophet in Israel. I wonder sometimes, are we positioned to hear Him? Are the distractions and the noise of the world drowning out God's voice so that we miss His whisper? Availability starts in the quiet, telling God, "I am here, and I am listening." The purpose of an available heart is to yield our plans to God's higher purpose, making ourselves ready and willing instruments in His hands.

The second story is in Acts 3. Peter and John are on their way to the temple to pray and they encounter a lame man asking alms. That day, I believe the lame man got more than he ever expected — all because Peter had an available heart and couldn't help but share the power that had been given him through the name of Jesus. The truth is, we have been given that same power! Praise the Lord! The question is, "Are we willing to make ourselves available for God to use?"

There is a profound difference between a busy heart and an available heart. A busy heart is cluttered with its own plans, anxious about its own limitations, and often too loud to hear the "still small voice." But an available heart is a vessel that has been emptied of self-interest so it can be filled with Divine purpose. The power of an available heart isn't found in what you can do, but in what God can do through you!

I believe the Bible is full of lessons for our learning and application. Both Samuel and Peter left us a great example of the power of AN AVAILABLE HEART:



The Power of "I Am Here"

When Samuel cried out, "Speak; for thy servant heareth," he wasn't offering God a resume of his skills; he was offering his presence. • **The Challenge:** We often miss what God is doing because we are living in "tomorrow's" worries. The power of availability is being exactly where your feet are, ready to hear what the Lord has to say now.

The Power of "It Is Enough"

In Acts 3, Peter didn't apologize for his empty pockets. He didn't let his lack of silver diminish the value of his Spirit. • **The Challenge:** Stop telling God what you don't have. When you say, "I'm not gifted enough" or "I'm not knowledgeable enough," you are essentially saying that God's grace is insufficient. An available heart believes that whatever you have in your hand—a kind word, a prayer, a meal, a listening ear—is more than enough when placed in His hands.

The Power of the "First Step"

An available heart is a courageous heart. It is the heart that is willing to be the first to reach out, the first to forgive, and the first to stand up when everyone else is walking by. • **The Challenge:** Look for the "Gate Beautiful" in your own life today. It might be a grocery store aisle, a phone call to a shut-in, or a moment in the altar. Don't wait for a feeling; follow the prompting.

Ladies, the world doesn't need more "perfect" women; it needs available women. It needs women who are so sensitive to the Spirit that they can be "interrupted" by a neighbor's tear or a sister's silent plea.

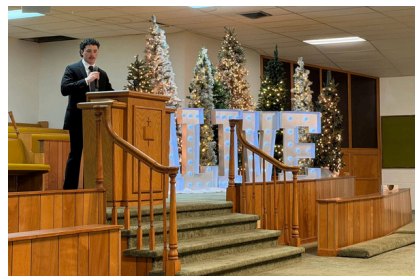
Young Adults Gathering

This quarter has been busy and full of the blessings of God.

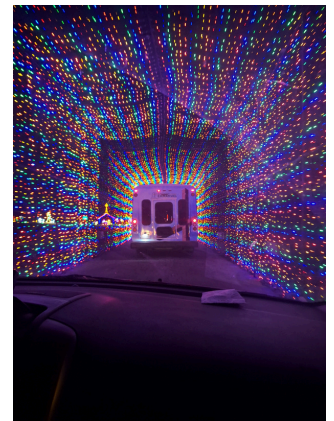
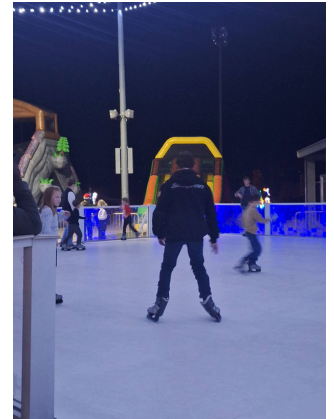

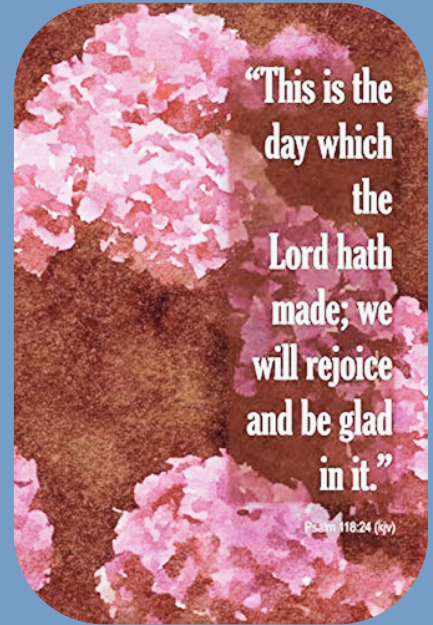
