Devotion - Unconditional Love

God gave us one of the greatest love stories ever told in the book of Hosea. He ordained and recorded a love story that parallels with His love for us. A story that highlights the connection between a tragic marriage and God's broken relationship with Israel. This nation had previously entered a covenant with God, agreeing to serve Him only, but turned to worshipping idols. In the same way, God commands a local prophet, Hosea, to marry Gomer, a well-known prostitute. Their marriage became a living object lesson of the love God has for His people. God's relentless pursuit of deliverance demonstrates His unconditional love for His people in spite of their constant rejection.

Hosea obeyed God and married someone he knew would be unfaithful to him. As predicted, the marriage didn't change Gomer's behavior and she retreated to the life she knew. She became a mother, but even her children failed to complete her. Gomer kept leaving her husband, yet he continued to pursue her. This is a picture of how we do the same thing in our relationship with our Savior. He offers us the most precious love imaginable. A love that goes beyond the love a human heart can withstand. It reaches the innermost places of our being and we reject Him by turning to other things. Hosea's struggle with Gomer's unfaithfulness overlaps God's declaration of love for Israel. Gomer left her husband and children for a final time in search of fulfillment, and ultimately found herself enslaved to prostitution. She was in a hopeless situation of her own making, yet, she heard a voice at the auction block that rang out above everyone else. Her beloved Hosea purchased her freedom. This woman had nothing to offer him, but he bought her back! He didn't meet her with the reprimand she no doubt deserved. He met her with hope and a love that looked a lot like forgiveness. This same compassion was offered to a wicked nation by a sovereign God. He continued to patiently hold out His arms to his people, even to the point of placing obstacles in their wayward path. Hosea 2:14 says, "Therefore, behold, I will allure her, will bring her into the wilderness, and speak comfort to her." God promised to bring his people to a metaphorical desert. A place free from distractions, uncomfortable, no doubt, just so He could clearly communicate with them. God often uses our negative experiences to create opportunities for us to know Him more intimately.

The nation of Israel would eventually begin to come to its senses, give up idols, and turn back to God. The relationship between God and His people would be restored through Jesus, and on that day, God would no longer be like a master to them; He would be like a husband. His wedding gift to his people, both in Hosea's day, and in our own, is His steadfast love. Through no merit of our own, God forgives us, loves us, and purchases us with His precious blood. He graciously accepts us and offers us a personal relationship with Him. No matter how low we sink, God is willing to buy us back, redeem us, and offer us a door of hope. Gomer's story turns out to be a well lit version of our story. We know Gomer better than we think, for she was what we were- sinners offered overwhelming grace by someone willing to love without conditions. Like Gomer, we can know unconditional love through the eyes of a man who paid the ultimate price for our redemption.


it was a special time for several adults in the church who had the Pricketts as youth leaders when they were younger.

- ➤ ENCOURAGEMENT BRINGS COMFORT (Colossians 4:7-11)

5 WAYS TO UPLIFT
