






























## ALEXANDRIA EHC Alexandria, AL


making ice cream together.

## Bring Me Yet a Vessel EHC Ladies Conference 2025

The 2025 Beauty for Ashes Ladies Conference, held on June 4-6 at the EHC Campground in Bladenboro, North Carolina, was an unforgettable time of spiritual renewal and empowerment. The theme, "Bring Me Yet a Vessel," resonated deeply with every woman in attendance, reminding us of our call to be empty, available vessels for God's anointing.

The conference began on Wednesday evening with worship led by Sis. Stephanie Nesbitt and family. Following was a powerful message from the Word of God delivered by Sis. Lori Teague entitled "Don't Be Just An Olive which drew a powerful parallel between the olive and the Christian life. Sis. Lori passionately explained that while an olive is beautiful and useful on its own, its true purpose is realized when it's crushed to produce oil – the oil of anointing. Amy provided a practical, biblical roadmap for surrendering our self-will, pride, and past hurts, etc. Her teaching was a call to action, urging us to become vessels that are not only full but also overflowing with the love, power, and anointing of the Holy Ghost.

Sis. Rachel Ramirez wrote and directed an inspired and anointed presentation, "Back to the Potter's House," which brought the prophetic message of Jeremiah 18 to life, depicting the journey of a flawed clay vessel in the hands of the Master Potter. The performance beautifully illustrated how God can take our brokenness, mistakes, and shattered pieces and lovingly reshape us into something new and beautiful.

The conference was packed with activities that catered to every woman's interests. From engaging Bible classes for different age groups to hands-on sessions in Canva, crafts, cooking, painting, there was something for everyone. Attendees also had the opportunity to get a massage as well as explore their creative side with a hairstyling class. Greetings Ladies!

I am so grateful to hear reports of how the Spirit of the Lord is moving throughout our churches! I definitely believe that we are living in the last hours preceding Christ's return. I want to encourage you to be Women of the Word and Prayer!

These go hand in hand. You might say that one fuels the other. Let's breakdown what each practice means and how they work together:

## WOMEN OF THE WORD

A woman of the Word will be dedicated to the study, understanding, and application of the Bible. It goes beyond casual reading and involves:

- Seeking to know God: The Bible is God's primary revelation of himself. A woman of the Word reads scripture not just for information, but to intimately know God's character, His nature, and His will. Philippians 3:10 says "That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death."
- A Commitment to Learning: A woman of the Word will be a student of the Bible engaging with it regularly and thoughtfully. This includes reading, studying, memorizing, and meditating on scripture. I love thinking about the verse in Joshua 1:8—"This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shat have good success."
- Transformation through Truth: A woman of the Word will allow the Bible to transform her mind, heart, and actions. The goal is to be changed by God's truth, leading to a life that reflects His values and purposes. David wrote in Psalm 86:11, "Teach me thy way, O Lord; I will walk in thy truth; unite my heart to fear thy name."
- <u>Application to daily life:</u> A woman of the Word doesn't just hear the Word; she does what it says. She actively seeks to apply biblical principles to her relationships, work, finances, and all aspects of her life. "Be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only"...James1:22

## **WOMEN OF PRAYER**

This means having an active and consistent prayer life, which is more than just a list of requests. It involves:

• <u>Communion with God:</u> A woman of Prayer realizes that prayer is a two-way conversation. It's a time to talk

to God, confess sins, express gratitude, and bring our concerns before Him. It is also a time to listen for His guidance.

- <u>A Heart of Dependence:</u> A woman of prayer recognizes her complete reliance on God for everything. She regularly brings her worries, fears, and hopes to Him, trusting in His power and provision.
- Intercession for Others: A woman of prayer looks beyond herself and prays for her family, friends, community and the world. She carries burdens of others to God's throne.
- Fuel for Faith: Prayer strengthens her faith! As she sees God answer prayers—in small and large ways—her trust in Him deepens!

#### HOW THE TWO WORK TOGETHER

- The Word informs her prayers: Her study of scripture gives her a clearer understanding of God's will, so her prayers become more aligned with His heart. Instead of just praying for her own desires, she learns to pray God's promises and purposes back to Him.
- Prayer fuels her study of the Word: She approaches the Bible with a spirit of prayer, asking the Holy Ghost to give her wisdom and understanding. This makes her study more than casual reading; it's a spiritual encounter.
- Together, they lead to a deep relationship with God:
  This combination of listening to God (through His
  Word) and speaking to God (in prayer) creates a
  dynamic, personal, and powerful relationship with
  Him!

Ladies, to just sum it all up, to be a "Woman of the Word and Prayer" is to live a life where the Bible is the foundation for our faith, and prayer is the ongoing conversation that sustains our relationship with God. It is a continuous cycle of listening to God and responding to Him, leading to spiritual growth and a life that bears good fruit – ALL for the Glory of God!

Like David in Psalm 1, let's be delighters and meditators in God's Word. The result is a blessed life that will bless others!

Those words hit differently when you've been in the trenches, right? They remind me of a message I delivered as a teenager, based on the story of the prophet Elisha and King Joash. Elisha told the king to strike the ground with arrows to defeat Syria. The king struck the ground only three times and stopped. Elisha was angry, saying the king should have struck five or six times to completely defeat Syria. How many of us give up just before our one more?

Recently, I had the privilege to teach again at EHC's Alabama's youth camp and taught the kids the phrase "just keep swimming." We talked about how sharks have to keep moving to live. I told them to be like a shark: swim or die. It's a powerful picture of perseverance. Move forward despite the challenging circumstances. The very next day, I taught our BYBC kids about perseverance. The reward for their hard work? Homemade ice cream! Oh, the sweet rewards of staying the course! It's a great reminder that when we push through, there's a reward waiting for us.

Sometimes it feels like we're facing an endless series of rivers, mountains, and valleys. The enemy loves to make us feel like the struggle will never end, whispering, "You can't do this. Just quit." But we can't give up! We have to press on for that one more.

We have to keep swimming, keep striking the ground, and keep our eyes fixed on Jesus. He's the one who gets us through. We are going through with Jesus, holding to His nail-scarred hand. That hand isn't just a symbol; it's a testament to His victory and the strength He offers us. He's already conquered every mountain, every valley, and every battle. He is our anchor, and with Him, we have the strength to face one more challenge and every one after that.

Don't give up. Your victory is just one more push away.



In a world full of so much noise and so many different voices, it can be tough to know what's true. It's like trying to listen to ten different conversations at once.



The more you immerse yourself in the Word, the more sensitive your spirit will become to anything that doesn't line up with it. You'll hear something and get that little check in your spirit that says, "That doesn't sound right." That's the Spirit helping you recognize the counterfeit because you know the real thing so well!

So, don't get distracted by all the fakes. Pour your energy into knowing the truth. Dive into your Bible. Ask God to give you a hunger for His Word. When you do, you'll be so in tune with the truth that every lie will be exposed for what it is, and you won't fall for it!


