
JESUS OTHERS YOURSELF

Being Spirit Led

Hi! I teach the teenage Sunday School class at Jacksonville Emmanuel Holiness church. We are going through the book of Acts currently and today's lesson was "Phillip witnesses to the Ethiopian". The story begins with Phillip being told to go into the desert. There were great revivals and mighty works being done in Jerusalem and Samaria, but Phillip was being sent alone to the middle of nowhere. I was reminded of Jesus being led of the spirit to the wilderness.

I asked my class, "What does it feel like to be led by the spirit? How do you know it's God that's leading you?" The answers I got were: "It's the scariest thing you have ever had to do." "It looks impossible." "It's the craziest sounding thing you have ever heard." & "You're afraid of how other people will respond to what God is leading you to do." They gave me instances of God speaking to their hearts, telling them to do something (witness, pray for someone, step out in a church service) and whether or not they followed the leading of the Spirit. It truly gave meaning to "The Spirit is willing, but the FLESH is weak."

We talked about how if Phillip would not have went to the desert, the Ethiopian man would have never understood the Gospel. Flesh wants to take the path of least resistance, to stay in Jerusalem, to sit in the pew when God is urging us to pray for our brother or sister.

But, as my class pointed out, when we are obedient and are truly led by the spirit, we become a greater blessing to those around us.

I am thankful for the "Phillips" God placed in my life who explained the scriptures to me, who were there when I needed prayer, who were in the will of God and able to guide me as I grew in faith.

What do you think of when you hear the word hero? Perhaps you think of firefighters, police. and doctors. Maybe you said Iron Man, Spiderman, or Wonder Woman. Whoever you thought of as a hero is still an ordinary person

just like you and me. Anyone can be a hero. While you may think no, not me, God uses ordinary people in extraordinary ways!

Paul instructs a young Timothy on how to be everything God has called us to be. 2 Timothy 2:15 says, "Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." There are four concepts in this verse: approved to God, a worker, being diligent, and teaching the word of truth.

Paul points out Timothy's genuine faith. From a child, God was preparing Timothy to be who He wanted Him to be. It began with learning the scriptures and that pointed him to a genuine faith in Jesus Christ that resulted in salvation. The only way to be approved to God is by trusting Jesus as our Lord and Savior. We are not saved by works, but we are saved for good works!

God saved us for a special purpose: a calling! It is not God's plan for us to just sit on a church pew once we are saved; He has greater plans than that! A soldier, an athlete, and a farmer are all different occupations, but they each can change the world around them. The same goes for the church though all the workers are different, they each can be used to be a hero and change the world around them. Each of us can be God's servant in whatever our calling is!

Timothy could have used excuses for not being diligent (constant in his effort) and working hard. He could have said, I'm too young. I'm too sick. I'm afraid. 2 Timothy 1:7, "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." We should never allow our excuses or circumstances to stand in the way of God's will for our lives. This is why Paul tells Timothy spiritual training is important. 1 Timothy 4:8, "For bodily exercise profiteth little: but godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come." Paul was telling Timothy that being diligent in learning God's Word, how we obtain spiritual strength, is so much more important in life for facing life's challenges. Spiritual training involves rightly dividing the word of truth. God's Word is called "the Sword of the Spirit". It takes strength and practice to wield a sword. Our ability or lack there of could cost a life. Paul wanted Timothy to

understand how serious and important God's call in his life was. God gives each of us a ministry, a calling as His children. It is important that we train and are prepared in season and out of season.

Greetings to all our Emmanuel Holiness Ladies! I am so thankful to be a part of the Emmanuel Holiness Church and all that God is doing. It is so exciting to

hear and see the reports from our churches and our evangelists of how God is moving! I am looking for greater things ahead as we all work together to make a lasting impact for the Kingdom of God.

It has been said that "The strength of the team is each individual member. The strength of each member is the team." I am grateful for our Ladies Auxiliary and the impact that we can make in our family, our community, and our local churches. Each of us can make a positive differenceif we commit ourselves to do so. I believe that is God's purpose for every one of us.

Jesus, in His sermon on the Mount used two metaphors **Salt** and **Light** to describe those who would follow Him. Through them He was saying, "I have created you and called you to make a positive impact on the world. The same is true of the church today. What an open door of opportunity we have to point a lost, dying, and dark world to Jesus. We have the opportunity each day show them the beauty of holiness. Let's look at these very familiar scriptures in Matthew chapter 5:

- 13 Ye are the salt of the earth: but if the salt have lost his savour, wherewith shall it be salted? it is thenceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out, and to be trodden under foot of men.
- 14 Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid.
- 15 Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house.
- 16 Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

I find it interesting that these verses come on the heels of the "Beatitudes" which represent godly character. With the two metaphors, Salt and Light that followed, I believe He was saying, Good character leads to action and influence. Notice of some of the effects of Salt and Light:

- Salt flavors. It has the power to turn what is tasteless into something enjoyable. In the same way, we bring flavor to a world filled with people whose lives are empty and void because they don't know Jesus.
- Salt preserves. In Roman times, salt was a very valuable commodity because it was the only means of preserving food. Christians have a similar preserving influence on a corrupt world. Our witness can help turn an unbeliever to Christ and preserves them from the decay of sinful choices.

- Salt penetrates. The Holy Ghost uses our godly example and witness to drive the truth into the heart in such a way that it permeates the entire person.
- Salt creates thirst. Believers are living examples of spiritual transformation. The joy, peace, and contentment that Christ gives us are attractive to thirsty souls whom the Spirit is drawing to the Savior.
- Salt heals. As salt gives relief to a sore throat, so we are called to offer healing to a broken world. Compassion, kindness, and a listening ear let hurting people experience Christ's love through us.
- Light is clear and pure. Our lives should be characterized by purity and clarity. The person we are in public ought to be the same person we are in private.
- Light reveals what's hidden in the darkness. When we're characterized by godliness, those who are unrighteous see the difference between their lives and ours.
- Light drives darkness away. It is important that we let God's love shine through us daily so that others will see the joy of the Lord shinning through us and be influential in leading them out of darkness into salvation.
- Light guides. God uses us like a lamp to guide the unbelieving onto the path of truth.
- Light warns. Without light we can't see the obstacles before us, and this is spiritually true for the lost. We can warn them that they're in danger and need the Savior.
- Light warms. We should never be cold and unfeeling toward those trapped in darkness. They need to know we care, so they can see Christ's love flowing through us.

Living as salt and light is a continuous journey.

It requires daily surrender to God's will, an open heart to love and serve others, and a commitment to live out our faith authentically. By living in this way, we can make a profound impact on the lives of those around us and bring glory to God.

The Church's presence in the world should be enriching, nourishing, and illuminating! Let's be Salt and Light!!

Restoration After Loss

I was raised in church by my mom, who was a single parent for the first seven years of my life. My mom and I were close; I could talk to her about anything. When I was fourteen my mom passed away from cancer. It was, and still is, the most difficult thing I have ever experienced. For several years I was angry and bitter. All I could do was shake my fist and scream, "Why?!" to God. Why did my mom have to die? Why did my brother and I have to lose her when we were both so young? I let my anger and bitterness cause me to turn my back on God.

After my mom died, my grandparents took my brother and me in. My grandma, much to my annoyance at the time, was at church every time the doors were open. Even though I told myself I was done with God, I still had to go to church with my grandma; it wasn't an option. I went through the motions and pretended everything was fine, but on the inside I was dying. I remember conviction falling on me a few times, but I did not want to let go of my anger and bitterness. I am thankful that one day I decided to act on that conviction and got saved at eighteen years old.

I still struggle with the loss of my mom. Sometimes her absence hits me so hard I lose my breath, but now I can let the Lord help me with that pain. He didn't have to give me multiple chances to serve Him, but He did. He restored happiness that I thought was gone out of my life forever. Loss is powerful, but He is more powerful.
