



One day a man was walking along the beach when he noticed a boy picking up and gently throwing things into the ocean.


Approaching the boy he asked: "Young man, what are you doing?"







Fearfully & Wonderfully Tustified

In Genesis 6, we learn Hagar's story. Hagar was an Egyptian slave, a handmaiden of Sarai, whom Sarai gave to her husband Abram to bear him a child. She was running towards Egypt (sin) and wilderness (danger). Running from Sarai was possible, but running from God was not. God meets us in the wilderness. Verse 13 says, "And she called the name of the Lord that spake unto her, Thou God seest me." What a name-El Roi - the GOD who sees me! Psalms 139:1 reads "thou hast searched me and known me." God hears the cry of the afflicted. Hagar was imperfect; we too may feel unwanted, unloved, and rejected. God saw her in her weakness and in her sin and spoke to her. He didn't speak to her about past sins, but of her future - what she would become despite the present situation. The devil calls you by your sins, but God calls you by your name. When you feel you are empty or never measure up, like you're just not good enough, God sees how you feel. He sees all the scars that never healed. That wasn't the end of the story for Hagar. In the 21st chapter she finds herself again in the wilderness. In verse 19, God opens her eyes to a well of water. A well of water - a covenant of grace. God also will open our eyes to see the plan He has made for our lives!

Psalm 139:14 says "I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well." That means we were created with great reverence and heartfelt interest to be set apart, unique, a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, and a peculiar people. We hide and build up walls. We belittle ourselves. That's not what God says. Thank God we are enough!

Rehab didn't fit the mold. Hannah prayed, but was thought drunk. Sarah was old and impatient. Martha was a worrier. Elizabeth was old yet faithful. Mary was an ordinary poor girl. Luke 7:37 talks of the sinner woman who took the alabaster box of oil and anointed Jesus feet, washed his feet with her tears, and dried it with her hair. Ruth was a Moabite and a widow. Esther was an orphan. Starting in Mark 5:25, "And a certain woman, which had an issue of blood twelve years, And had suffered many things of many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was nothing bettered, but rather grew worse, When she had heard of Jesus, came in the press behind, and touched his garment." She pressed, fought, came from behind, and humbled down just to be able to touch His hem. Sometimes we too must press our way. Fight through the crowd to see the person that God sees!

You are who God says you are. You are chosen. Part of John 15:16 says "Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit." You are a Child of God. You are redeemed. Redeemed i.e. paid for, brought back, recovered. The price was paid by the blood of the Lamb. You are a new creation. If any man be in Christ he is a new creature. God makes a change! You are loved.

Jeremiah says I have loved thee with an everlasting love. Everlasting that is continuing without end! You are forgiven. You are accepted. You are precious. Isaiah 43:4, "Since thou wast precious in my sight, thou hast been honourable, and I have loved thee: therefore will I give men for thee, and people for thy life." You are strong. We don't always feel strong, but the Bible says let the weak say I am strong. We have the ability to mount up with wings of eagles, to run and not be weary, and to walk and not faint. You are unique. You are treasured.

You are created for a purpose. You are special. You are important. You are empowered. God gave us all the power and armor we need. You are not alone. He said, lo I am with you even to the end of the world. He's in the midst of every storm, wilderness, and desert we encounter. You are protected. You are beloved. You are a coworker - laborers together with God. You are delivered. You are established. I Corinthians 1:21, 22: "Now he which stablisheth us with you in Christ, and hath anointed us, is God; Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts." You are a saint. You are transformed. You are united. You are victorious. Romans calls us more than conquerors i.e. super victors. Over and above, we have the victory! You are washed clean. You are quickened. You are an overcomer. You are a prayer warrior. There is surely power in prayer! You are an

Romans 8:30, "Moreover whom he did predestinate, them he also called: and whom he called, them he also justified: and whom he justified, them he also glorified." That's a lot of big words so let's break this down. Predestinate: God planned from eternity. Called: opened our heart to hear God's voice.

heir of God and a joint heir with Christ. You are justified.

Justified: we are right in His sight because of His righteousness. God doesn't call trash. God doesn't call the qualified. He qualifies the called. When God calls you to do something He is not calling you to succeed He is calling you to obey. The success of the calling is up to Him, the obedience is up to you.

In 2 Corinthians 12:9, "And he said unto me, My grace is

sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me." It is a sustaining grace. Grace that meets us at our point of need. Grace that equips us with courage, strength, and wisdom. God is where we get our confidence from only He can give us the labels that matter. We may not have self-confidence but can have God-fidence, knowing that we can't but He can! The scripture doesn't promise absence of struggle. It promises the presence of God. For it's ultimately God's presence and power that qualifies people, not their personal strengths and weaknesses. It's easy to hyperfocus on our insecurities and get stuck in the comparison game. We look at others and think they are more loved, more worthy, more important, more popular, etc. We speak so negatively to ourselves that it feeds our insecurities. We lose focus on who God says we are.

Peter means rock. Jesus called Peter a rock long before Peter was stable and mature. He leads us by calling out what He sees, not by calling out our failures. He sees our potential. Progress is progress no matter how slow. Growth is growth. Everyone has a purpose. 1 Corinthians 12 talks of the body of Christ. There are many members of that body. The thumb

anyway!

may be small, but it is very needful. Even the unseemly parts are necessary. We each have different gifts and ministries. Remember: I am loved. I am chosen. I am redeemed. I am forgiven. I am empowered. I am precious. I am blessed. I am

- "Amen" if I do not also add "cost what it may". For to say this prayer honestly will cost everything.



A Letter from the Alabama Overseer

REV. GENE DIXON

Greetings in the Holy Name of Jesus Christ! I would like to say to everyone in our great Conference that I really appreciate your cooperation and attendance at our last conference. 
ALEXANDRIA EMMANUEL HOLINESS




