A Brother, A Friend: Jesse.

On March 30, 2023, our friend, Jesse Wilkins, went home to be with his Savior. He had been in our lives for close to 10 years; while initially standoffish, Jesse began to warm up to the different people at the church. The early years were rocky, and there were times when Jesse was up and down, in and out, and times where we did not know the next time we would see him. Mid-2020, however, Jesse decided that he wanted to return home and began his renewed pursuit of the Lord. All of his troubles didn't stop, nor was Jesse 100%, but he was dedicated to growing ever closer in his walk with Jesus. In late 2022, Jesse's efforts began bearing fruit; he had begun to walk closer with the Lord, and had found his battle cry. There would be times during services when Jesse would cry out the name, "Jesus!" to the top of his lungs. He was letting the world know that whatever may come, he was putting his trust in Jesus Christ. Jesse began going to church services with different people in our church, testifying more, teaching Sunday School, preparing devotions for our young adults, and feeding and witnessing with the homeless in a home missions outreach program. Jesse had never been happier in his life; he would always try to get us to laugh by telling "dad jokes" (he did his best to tell the dumbest ones in order to elicit reactions from Bro. David). But his happiness had shifted from just trying to make people laugh to being content in his life and loving the people around him. In March, Jesse testified one night that he was ready to go after his family that did not know Jesus; he was putting years of heartache behind him and living the Great Commission. The night before Jesse passed, he was talking with Bro. David, and told him two things: that he'd never been happier in his life, and that he believed that God was calling him to be a missionary and that he was going to accept that call. As of this writing, it has almost been two months since we lost our brother, but we are joyful in our report that Jesse's sister, niece, and nephew have gotten saved and have been in church faithfully since his passing. Jesse's new life in front of his family resulted in their salvation; Jesse's efforts were not in vain, and he got his family. We at Abe Branch are committed to continuing Jesse's mission of reaching his family and furthering his love of missions. Bro. Johnny Causey, our World Missions Director, informed us that a church in India would cost \$9,000, a sum that the Lord helped us raise in less than two weeks. Ground has been broken, and the construction of Jesse's Mission Emmanuel Holiness Church is progressing in India. We thank the Lord for the time he gave us with Jesse, the wonderful memories we have, and mostly, for the work that Jesus did in Jesse's life and for allowing us to be part of his life.

Missions in India

On April 26. Bro. Johnny Causey, our World Missions Director, came to Abe Branch to give us an report on what occurred during his recent mission trip to India. Before Bro. Causey could begin his report, however, the Holy Ghost began to move in the church. Saints of God began to worship and praise the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords, and conviction fell in the house. Three souls went to an altar of repentance and were saved that night. Afterwards, Bro. Causey began his report, and highlighted his story with pictures taken from the trip. He told the church of how that he initially thought that he would be unable to stay in the area for long, because certain types of Christian evangelism was illegal and punishable with jail time in that area. Bro. Johnny did not let that stop him, as he was able to purchase Bibles for the people, bring in a water truck to provide showers, provide food for the impoverished, and most importantly, bring the Gospel to those who had never heard the truth preached before. By the end of his trip, 6,000 souls had been saved, including the Governor of the region and the High Priest of a local Hindu temple. Bro. Causey was given a piece of land to build the first Emmanuel Holiness Church in India, a church that is currently being built (which you can read about in our remembrance of Bro. Jesse). We are so excited about what the Lord is doing in our World Missions Department, and cannot wait to see what else God has in store for us as we work to further spread his Gospel to a lost and dying world.
