



Greetings to our EHC Ladies!!

It has been such a wonderful and enlightening experience for which I am daily thankful. God has given us His Word with everything we need to defeat the enemy that seeks to "Steal, Kill, and Destroy." Our latest lesson was on "Bridge Builders." I have not been able to get this topic off of my mind so I want to share excerpts from this lesson in this issue of the Messenger. I trust it will be a help and a blessing to you all.

The Bridge Builder

Bridges serve a truly important purpose. They make a way. Bridges connect one part to another that is separated by an obstacle. Bridges provide a passage across a divide. There are many different kinds of bridges in this world. Some are wooden, some are stone, and others are fabricated of steel. Some are small some are massive, but they all function basically the same way. They span a chasm. They make it possible for someone to pass from one side of the chasm to the other side. Why were bridges built?

The builders were motivated by the need!

In our communities there are people all around us who are on the other side of the chasm. They need a bridge to cross over. The concept of being "bridge builders" as a weapon of spiritual warfare is not explicitly outlined in the Bible; however, the principle can be inferred from the broader teachings on unity, peace, reconciliation, and the power of love to overcome evil. In the context of spiritual warfare, the struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms (Ephesians 6:12). In this battle, behaviors that promote understanding, connection, and reconciliation can be seen as powerful weapons because they counteract the division, hatred, and misunderstandings that the enemy seeks to sow among believers and between people in general.

WHO NEEDS A BRIDGE?

- 1. LOST PEOPLE need a bridge.
- 2. DISCONNECTED PEOPLE (BACKSLIDERS) need a bridge
- 3. THE HURTING CHRISTIAN needs a bridge. God has given us this task of reconciling people to Him.

Isaiah 40:31 "But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint."

Imagine a bird, hatched within a cage. It sees the world outside, the vast expanse of sky, the dance of leaves on the wind. Yet, it has never known anything but the cage. The bars seem real, a permanent fixture of its existence. It may flutter at them, peck at them, but the idea of flight, of escape, feels impossible.

We are like that bird sometimes. We too find ourselves in captivity. We long for freedom but are locked in a state of bondage. Not one of iron bars and locked gates, but of self-imposed limitations. We build walls of fear, habit, and doubt, surrounding ourselves with a prison of our own making. The strange thing is, the door to this prison always stands wide open.

We build cages of comfort, routines that lull us into a sense of security. We cling to familiar fears, to doubts that whisper we are not good enough, strong enough, or worthy enough. Yet, all the while, the door to a fuller life stands open. We are sitting in a prison with the door wide open!

The key lies in seeing it. In acknowledging the prison we've built, not with blame, but with gentle understanding. Perhaps we built it out of a need for safety, a fear of the unknown. But we are stronger than we think. David said, "It is God that girdeth me with strength, And maketh my way perfect. He maketh my feet like hinds' feet, And setteth me upon my high places." (Psalms 18:32-33) We can take a tentative step, then another, towards the open door.

The world outside may be daunting. There will be challenges, moments of uncertainty. It is hard to face the unknown. Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths." We often think of this verse as a reminder to stop leaning or trusting in our own abilities, but when we look closer we see it also means to quit holding back. Step outside the prison!



This year I again had the privilege to teach the Littles at the Alabama Youth Camp. Our two day lesson was about faith. This was a two part lesson on 1 what it is faith and 2 how we grow our faith.

What three things does a plant need to grow and thrive?

Water, sunlight, and soil, of course!

Spiritual gardening necessity #1 is soil. Plants need a good foundation of soil to start their growth. For Christians, our "soil," our foundation, is Christ. Christ nurtures us and supports us. He gives us a place to extend our roots in safety. Just like a plant needs nutrient rich soil to thrive, Christ gives his children every possible nutrient we would ever need: Peace, Love, Encouragement & Wisdom... and His supplies are unlimited.

What else do plants need to grow? Sunlight. The Bible is our sunlight. Plants grow towards the light. They long for the warmth and strength that only sunlight can give. As children of God, we should also lean towards the light, His Word, for guidance, and strength. It can give us warmth and comfort in times of struggle, and lead us on the clear path in times of doubt. The Bible is a source of many things we need in our Christian life.

Last but not least, plants need water to sustain them. I like to think of that much-needed water as fellowship with fellow believers. God didn't intend for us to grow alone, but to be there to encourage each other in Christ. Fellow believers are meant to come together, loving one another and supporting each other as we grow. Fellowship can be refreshing to a soul, just like water to a plant. It can help us perk up on a particularly draining day or quench a thirst. Water can be a vessel for the nutrients we need to grow.
