I'd like to share a bit about Emmanuel Holiness World Missions.

From February 17th to 25th, my grandson, Kayden Causey, and I went to India on a mission trip. While we were there, we held a two-night crusade where we fed 40,000 people and distributed 3,500 Bibles. Kayden preached on the first night of the crusade, and 12,000 people accepted Christ that night. In total, 27,240 individuals gave their hearts to the Lord. The cost of this crusade was \$18,000. Praise the Lord for this amazing experience!

<u> * *Active Projects in India:* *</u>

- We are feeding 400 children monthly. It costs \$200 to provide just one meal for all of them.
- We have 20 pastors who need monthly support.
- The church being built by David Clewis and Abe Branch is progressing well! This church is being constructed on land that was purchased during our trip.
- The church at Eastside Emmanuel EHC, built in honor of Brother Jackie Prickett, is expected to be completed within the next month or so. This project is also advancing nicely.

Active Projects in Kenya:


- Bethesda Church has been completed this year and was sponsored by Brother Tim Baggett and Bethesda Church. It is thriving and growing.
- Another older church in Kenya is in danger of being torn down by the government due to plans to build a road where it stands. A new church is currently under construction for this congregation, with the foundation and columns already built. However, the project has come to a standstill due to insufficient funds. There are 100 adults and 200 children that attend this church, and they will be without a place to worship our Lord and Savior if the church is not completed soon.





Imagine you have a really good friend, and you know they need help with something, maybe they're sick or sad. You would want to do everything you could to help them, right?

Well, a prayer warrior is like that super good friend, but instead of just talking to their friend, they talk to God about their friend. They pray really hard and don't stop asking God to help.

Think of it like this: if someone is in trouble, a regular person might try to help with their hands or their words. But a prayer warrior uses their prayers like a special kind of help. They believe that talking to God can make a big difference, even for things we can't see.
