Remail For Sacrifice & Service


Yesterday is gone but not its memories, and I am thankful for every one of them. I am still reflecting on the blessings of our General Assembly of 2022.

Ladies join me as we purpose in our hearts to become women of prayer.




make in our church, our families, and our community depends on our growing, thriving, fervent prayer life. HOW SHOULD WE PRAY?


Our **UP**reach will definitely effect our **OUT**reach.

Is David and Goliath just another story that we use to entertain children in Sunday School? Oh no! It is packed with powerful lessons for life! Today we unpacked a few things I'd like to share:

First, let's look at the setting of our story: The Philistines and the Israelites are at a stand-off, a showdown if you will. Both armies are on opposite sides of the Valley of Elah. For 40 days the great giant of a man Goliath comes forth taunting and challenging the Children of Israel to fight. Paralyzed with FEAR no one makes a move. But one day things change! David comes to bring his brothers food as his father had asked him to. While he is there Goliath comes with his challenge again calling for one to come and fight, but terribly afraid not one of the men volunteered! But the Spirit rose up in little David, and he ran out to meet and defeat Goliath in the name of the Lord!


So, what are the life lessons that we can take away? I believe if we look at David's 5 stones it will teach us what we need to overcome our giants:

- 1. FAITH David did not focus on the giant. His focus was on his past victories and they were faith builders! He knew if the Lord could deliver him from the lion and the bear that he had faced while taking care of the sheep that He was well able to give him victory over Goliath!
- 2. OBEDIENCE Without this one his faith would have been dead, but David demonstrated a life of obedience to God, his earthly father, and even to evil King Saul.
- 3. **SERVICE** Without service the stones of faith and obedience have no power or strength. Service is the action associated with faith and the implementation of obedience. Look at David's reply when he was scolded by his brothers for being on the battlefield:


And David said, What have I now done? Is there not a cause?

And David said to Saul, Let no man's heart fail because of him; thy servant will go and fight with this Philistine.

- 4. PRAYER David approached Goliath with a prayerful attitude: "Thou comest to me with a sword, and with a spear, and with a shield: but I come to thee in the name of the Lord of hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom thou hast defied."
- 5. HOLY GHOST POWER David not only had faith, was obedient, performed service, and prayed but he had the Spirit of the Lord with him which equipped him to defeat the enemy.















#### Be Still & Know

My son, Asher, doesn't sleep very well. He is a very active one year old, and truly hasn't slept through the night a day in his life. In fact, just getting him to sleep is a chore. He tosses and turns, pulls my hair, and rotates from pacifier to bottle endlessly. It's exhausting, but I can remember one night in particular, as I held him for over an hour, the Lord spoke to my heart through my little restless baby. It was well past his bedtime, and I knew he was tired. I watched as his little eyelashes fluttered against his cheeks, and felt his tiny body twitch as he'd began falling asleep, but as soon as he knew he was drifting off, he'd catapult himself up. I remember how frustrated I was when I laid him back down and proclaimed, "If you would just be still, you'd feel a lot better!" In that moment, I felt the Lord speak to my heart and say, "If YOU would just be still, YOU would feel a lot better too!" I immediately began to dwell on those words and to say that they were heavy would be an understatement. I asked myself how many times have I fought the very thing that would set me free, give me peace and rest? How many times have I grown weary from trying to fix things that I had no business fixing? Psalm 46:10 says, "Be still, and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth." There are two commands there. First, be still. I don't know about you, but it's especially hard for me to just "be still" when my world is spinning out of control. When my bills are due, my family is struggling, or my children are hurting. I want to get my hands all up in that, but I have found that it is most imperative during those times that I take my hands off, and just simply trust that He does all things well. We say He's a Waymaker, but we wouldn't know, because we are too busy making our own way. We want immediate results and when God isn't working fast enough for us, we tend to take matters into our own hands, usually making bigger messes in the process. Be still. Secondly, He says to know that He is God! He didn't say to be still and worry. Be still and wonder how things will be resolved. He said KNOW that He is God. He created the earth by The Word of His mouth. He tells the heart in your chest to beat, and His track record is flawless. When we truly fall in love with Jesus we can know Him. We can trust Him with our lives and all that entails. My mind goes to the children of Israel and how they must've been terrified as Moses instructed them to commute onto dry ground as two massive walls of water formed around them, but Exodus 14:13 says, "And Moses said unto the people, Fear ye not, STAND STILL, and see the salvation of the LORD, which he will shew to you to day..." Some battles aren't made for us to fight, but we can lean on His Word, and rely on His promises, because we've all experienced His faithfulness. Why on earth would we question His ability or even His timing when all He's ever done is make a way for our escape? I don't always know how to be still through heartache and pain, but it's in my hour of desperation that I've gotten to know Him more intimately. There are days when I feel restless and my carnal mind can't comprehend the mountaintop view from the emptiness of the valley, but what I do know is that He is God. He has everything under control. His heart aches every time yours does, and He promised to fight your battle for you. We don't have to carry the weight of our circumstances. We can rest in His promise, and trust that because of our obedience He is working behind the scenes on our behalf.

#### **Letter from the Editor**

Arise: one word. It's what Joshua had to do after Moses died. It's what Elijah was told to do before hearing the still small voice. Arise has two meanings depending on the speaker: 1) If man says arise then it means get up 2.) If God says it, then it's a command to get yourself to a higher level. Coming up higher is positioning ourselves i.e. getting ourselves in the right position where the blessings of the Lord are and where God can use us. This desire comes from spending time in God's Word. Prayer and worship help put us in this position.

Arise takes action but also takes faith - faith that the actions will lead to results. Rise from our circumstances to a new life. Move out of the natural realm into the spiritual. If we never arise we will never experience His glory. Worry and care will ensnare and position us in the wrong place. It affects everyone and weighs them down. The enemy cannot devour us unless we allow it. Instead of worry by prayer, and thanksgiving let our requests be known to God. This is being in the proper position with God - being in the peace of God, having his joy, not being robbed by cares and worry.

Arise: go higher! People often feel unqualified. They dwell on past mistakes, lack of education or funding - the excuses are endless. Let's get our priorities straight - put first things first regardless of our feelings. He must increase but I must decrease. Pride is trying to do it on our own. God wouldn't command us if we didn't have the ability. We are given grace. We have God's power! He gives us the ability to do what we can't do on our own. Arise is the command of God! Jesus is in you - He will help you arise.

Who art thou, O great mountain before Zerubbabel? What are these mountains that we can't seem to get over? For each the mountain is different, but the command remains the same. Isaiah 41 says, Behold, I will make thee a new sharp threshing instrument having teeth: thou shalt thresh the mountains, and beat them small, and shalt make the hills as chaff. Thou shalt fan them, and the wind shall carry them away, and the whirlwind shall scatter them: and thou shalt rejoice in the Lord, and shalt glory in the Holy One of Israel.

God equips us with everything we need to rise up. What once looked like a mountain is just a hill from heaven's point of view. Go higher! The higher you get over something the smaller that thing becomes. Whatever obstacles stood in your way in the past it is time to go over them. Let 2023 be the year your tests turn into testimonies!
