Come join us on Monday, June 24, 2019, at Beaver Meadow Golf Course in Concord, New Hampshire, for the third annual Patrice Marie Haggerty Memorial Golf Tournament. There will be tournament prizes, great food, loads of fun, and all for an extremely important cause: promoting awareness of Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease and raising money to help the Patrice Marie Haggerty Memorial CJD Fund.

This is a charity event. The tournament format is that of a scramble with four-player teams. Players can either sign up individually and be assigned to a team, or recruit friends to play as part of their own team. Mulligans will be available for purchase.

About Us:

Patrice Marie Haggerty (August 24, 1954 - July 3, 2016) was an exceptional human being who was a devoted wife, mother, daughter, sister, friend and grandmother. Her physical beauty was only humbled by her inner beauty. Her life was cut unnecessarily short when she developed Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease (CJD). And all those whose lives she touched have an incurable void in their lives as a result of her death. Her sense of joy and humor are greatly missed.

The Patrice Marie Haggerty Memorial CJD Fund was founded in 2017 by her widowed husband, Bill, and her two sons, Tim and Dan, in an effort to promote CJD awareness and raise money to help find treatments and a cure for CJD so that others in the future might be spared the ravages of CJD. We also provide annual college scholarships to qualified students in Patrice's name. This annual golf tournament is our primary fund-raiser. As a result of the proceeds from our first two tournaments, we have so far been able to donate

\$7,000 to the Creuzfeldt-Jakob Disease Foundation and have awarded \$2,000 in college scholarships.

About Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease (CJD):

CJD is a rare, degenerative, invariably fatal brain disorder that was first uncovered in 1920. It is a prion disease that is caused by a malformed protein in the brain that starts to attack healthy brain cells while self-replicating. This results in accelerating deterioration of brain tissue. About 90 percent of individuals die between three weeks and one year from onset. In the early stages of disease, patients may have failing memory, behavioral changes, lack of coordination and visual disturbances. As the illness progresses, mental and neurological deterioration becomes pronounced. Involuntary movements, paralysis, blindness, weakness of extremities, and coma may occur.

Public attention and understanding of CJD within the medical community is currently only just beginning now. It is only in the last few years that CJD has started to become more than an obscure footnote in medical literature. Because of the relative lack of awareness by many healthcare professionals, many cases are misdiagnosed as other diseases with similar superficial symptoms.

There is currently no single diagnostic test for CJD. There is also no treatment that can cure or control CJD. Research into CJD will no doubt not only help in developing the means to treat and cure prion diseases, but also unlock the means to address other more common disorders of the brain such as Parkinson's Disease, multiple scoliosis, Lewy Body Demetia, ALS and Alzheimer's Disease.

Procedure:

- 1. Tournament Scores will be based on team score.
- 2. Mulligans will be available for purchase for \$5.00/stroke.

Cancelation Policy:

- 1. The golf tournament will proceed rain or shine.
- 2. If player cancels, 48-hour notice is required to receive 50% of entry fee.
- 3. If player is a no-show, entry fee is non-refundable.

Golf Scramble Rules

USGA Rules will govern play unless amended by local course rules or Intramural Sports modifications.

- 1. Competition will be a 4-person scramble. Teams may form their own foursome, or those entering as an individual will be assigned to a group.
- 2. Please be at the course and ready to begin at least 30 minutes prior to the start time.
- 3. To facilitate play, carts will be included.
- 4. Each foursome will play 18 holes. All members of the group will hit from the tee. The team will then select the best drive. From that point, all members of the group will hit a second shot. Again, the team will select the shot providing the most advantageous lie. This procedure will continue until the ball is holed out. Only one score per hole per team is to be recorded. Scorecards must be signed, attested, and turned in at the conclusion of the round.
- 5. A player's lie may be improved by one club length (no closer to the hole) through the green with the exception of hazards. For example, if you elect to play a ball from a sand trap, the player whose ball you have chosen to play must play the ball as it lies and then the other team members will be allowed to place the ball (no closer to the hole). Once players have reached the green, the ball may not be placed to improve a player's lie (must be placed at spot where it lies).
- 6. Out-of-bounds are marked.
- 7. All putts must be holed out. **No gimmies**.
- 8. Each member of the team must use his/her tee shot once. Mulligans will be available for purchase.
- 9. In the event of a tie in score, a hole's number will be drawn at random and the team recording the lowest score on that hole will be declared the winner. In the event the score is still tied, a progression will begin from that hole until the tie is broken. For example, if hole number 6 is drawn and the score is still tied, scores on hole number 7 will be used to break the tie, and so on.
