







How Far The Fall?

Adam's sin was imputed with both physical and spiritual ramifications to the entire human race, notably meaning physical death is an absolute (unless Jesus returns) for every person and that each person has been separated by God through sin.

Those not of the age of accountability are not responsible for their sin until such age when God holds one accountable.







The Kingdom of God is one of the central themes in all of Scripture. Some people would say it is *the* central theme in the Bible.

Jesus personally instructed His disciples to pray, "Your Kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

To have a Kingdom, one must assume a King. During the Millennial Reign, it is God the Son, the Lord Jesus Christ.

"Kingdom of God" is stated four times in Matthew, fourteen in Mark, thirty-two in Luke, twice in John, six times in Acts, eight times in Paul's letters, and once in Revelation (12:10).

Satan Bound

20 Then I saw an angel coming down from heaven holding the key to the abyss and a great chain in his hand. ²He seized the dragon, that ancient serpent who is the devil and Satan, and bound him for a thousand years. ³He threw him into the abyss, closed it, and put a seal on it so that he would no longer deceive the nations until the thousand years were completed. After that, he must be released for a short time.



The Saints Reign with Christ

⁴Then I saw thrones, and people seated on them who were given authority to judge. I also saw the souls of those who had been beheaded because of their testimony about Jesus and because of the word of God, who had not worshiped the beast or his image, and who had not accepted the mark on their foreheads or their hands. They came to life and reigned with Christ for a thousand years. ⁵The rest of the dead did not come to life until the thousand years were completed.

This is the first resurrection. ⁶Blessed and holy is the one who shares in the first resurrection! The second death has no power over them, but they will be priests of God and of Christ, and they will reign with him for a thousand years.

"You made them a kingdom and priests to our God, and they will rule on the earth" (Revelation 5:10).

*Martyrs from the Tribulation will be present.

*Judgment is administered by people on thrones,
perhaps the apostles or the twenty-four elders.

*The Bride of Christ is present.



Resurrection:


The Resurrection is mentioned numerous times in Scripture including Daniel 12:2 which notes both the first and second resurrection: "Many who sleep in the dust will awake, some to eternal life, and some to disgrace and eternal contempt." John 5:25-29, which also confirm the two types of resurrections (read).

In the first resurrection, there are several phases in which this happens including that of Jesus providing the way for the resurrection in all who believe in Him (1 Corinthians 15:20 and John 11:25-26 (read).

Revelation 20:4 and Revelation 2):5 distinguish the two resurrections well: one is to eternal life with Christ and the other is eternal separation from Him.

Satanic Rebellion Crushed

⁷ When the thousand years are completed, Satan will be released from his prison ⁸ and will go out to deceive the nations at the four corners of the earth, Gog and Magog, to gather them for battle. Their number is like the sand of the sea. ⁹ They came up across the breadth of the earth and surrounded the encampment of the saints, the beloved city. Then fire came down from heaven and consumed them. ¹⁰ The devil who deceived them was thrown into the lake of fire and sulfur where the beast and the false prophet are, and they will be tormented day and night forever and ever.



"Predestination" is a term that has been argued for centuries in the Christian community; indeed, many books have been written on the subject (and rightly so given the numerous Scriptures regarding predestination).

What does it mean to be predestined?

Theologians generally fall into two primary camps regarding predestination: 1) those who believe it means that God already knows the choices people will make concerning His Son Jesus Christ and thus "predestines" them to the Church; 2) the other camp essentially believes that God predetermines one's destiny prior to birth.

I believe Scripture plainly teaches the free will of humans to accept or deny the urging of the Holy Spirit to accept and follow Jesus Christ; thus, I believe the first definition of predestination to be the correct interpretation of Scripture.



The Great White Throne Judgment

¹¹ Then I saw a great white throne and one seated on it. Earth and heaven fled from his presence, and no place was found for them. ¹² I also saw the dead, the great and the small, standing before the throne, and books were opened. Another book was opened, which is the book of life, and the dead were judged according to their works by what was written in the books. ¹³ Then the sea gave up the dead that were in it, and death and Hades gave up the dead that were in them; each one was judged according to their works. ¹⁴ Death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. This is the second death, the lake of fire. ¹⁵ And anyone whose name was not found written in the book of life was thrown into the lake of fire.

This is the Most Tragic Passage in all the Scriptures
