







We will bridge Chapter 21 to Chapter 22 in a few weeks, but note quickly here that there are seven "news" in these two chapters. Again, seven is a number of completion, or of perfection, in Scripture (particularly in Revelation).

Scriptures teach us on numerous occasions that the old heaven and earth must disappear (Psalm 102:25-26; Isaiah 34:4; Isaiah 51:6; Matthew 24:35; 2 Peter 3:10, 12; Revelation 21:1).

The argument is whether the heaven and earth will be recreated or simply renewed and transformed. The plainest reading in the Greek suggest that the old will disappear and that the new will instantly appear (certainly this is possible given that God *initially* orchestrated all creation).



Some lament the loss of the sea, but the sea in Scripture represents chaos and disorder. Whether this is literal or not is up for interpretation, but to be sure, chaos and disorder will completely cease.

<sup>5</sup>Then the one seated on the throne said, "Look, I am making everything new." He also said, "Write, because these words are faithful and true." <sup>6</sup>Then he said to me, "It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. I will freely give to the thirsty from the spring of the water of life. <sup>7</sup>The one who conquers will inherit these things, and I will be his God, and he will be my son. <sup>8</sup>But the cowards, faithless, detestable, murderers, sexually immoral, sorcerers, idolaters, and all liars—their share will be in the lake that burns with fire and sulfur, which is the second death."

"The Lord does not delay his promise, as some understand delay, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish but all to come to repentance" (2 Peter 3:9).


"<sup>8</sup>On the contrary, what does it say? The message is near you, in your mouth and in your heart. This is the message of faith that we proclaim: <sup>9</sup>If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. <sup>10</sup>One believes with the heart, resulting in righteousness, and one confesses with the mouth, resulting in salvation. <sup>11</sup>For the Scripture says, **Everyone who believes on him will not be put to shame**, <sup>12</sup> since there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, because the same Lord of all richly blesses all who call on him. <sup>13</sup>For everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." (Romans 10).

Son of God" (John 3).






"Twelve can be found in 187 places in the Bible. Revelation alone has 22 occurrences of the number. The meaning of 12, which is considered a perfect number, is that it symbolizes God's power and authority, as well as serving as a perfect governmental foundation. <sup>15</sup> The one who spoke with me had a golden measuring rod to measure the city, its gates, and its wall. <sup>16</sup> The city is laid out in a square; its length and width are the same. He measured the city with the rod at 12,000 *stadia*. Its length, width, and height are equal. <sup>17</sup> Then he measured its wall, 144 cubits according to human measurement, which the angel used. <sup>18</sup> The building material of its wall was jasper, and the city was pure gold clear as glass. <sup>19</sup> The foundations of the city wall were adorned with every kind of jewel: the first foundation is jasper, the second sapphire, the third chalcedony, the fourth emerald, <sup>20</sup> the fifth sardonyx, the sixth carnelian, the seventh chrysolite, the eighth beryl, the ninth topaz, the tenth chrysoprase, the eleventh jacinth, the twelfth amethyst. <sup>21</sup> The twelve gates are twelve pearls; each individual gate was made of a single pearl. The main street of the city was pure gold, transparent as glass.

The City is a tremendous cube, 1,500 miles long, wide, and deep The Walls: 216 feet thick x 1,500 miles high The Twelve Gates: Each made of a single pearl. The Twelve Foundational Stones Colors: Diamond, deep blue, green, layered red, blood red, golden yellow, sea green, greenish/yellowish gold, gold green, violet, purple quartz. The Street: Polished, brilliant gold. The River: Crystal-clear from the main street to the Throne of God. The Tree of Life: Eternal access





Hitchcock states that if you draw "a square from Miami up to Maine then westward to Minneapolis then south to Houston and then back to Miami," that this measurement will be roughly the size of the city.

<sup>22</sup> I did not see a temple in it, because the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb are its temple. <sup>23</sup> The city does not need the sun or the moon to shine on it, because the glory of God illuminates it, and its lamp is the Lamb. <sup>24</sup> The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. <sup>25</sup> Its gates will never close by day because it will never be night there. <sup>26</sup> They will bring the glory and honor of the nations into it. <sup>27</sup> Nothing unclean will ever enter it, nor anyone who does what is detestable or false, but only those written in the Lamb's book of life.

"Genesis 1:3-5 describes God's spoken command, 'Let there be light.' God's pronouncement of his own creative light was that it was 'good' and resulted in the first evening and the first morning. That God created light in his first command using merely two words in the Hebrew language is extraordinary, indicative of his supremacy over the earth he created and perhaps of his introduction to the light thematic which would proceed intermittently through his inspired biblical texts. Revelation 21:23 states, "The city does not need the sun or the moon to shine on it, because the glory of God illuminates it, and its lamp is the Lamb" (Langner).

Greg Boyd proclaims, 'When God shines, in other words, it looks like Jesus.'

"Christocentric reality bursts forth in the very first words of the Bible; darkness itself is interrupted by the Word's brilliance" (Langner).

[According to] Bonhoeffer, 'If the preceding word about the darkness upon the deep was the first thing that pointed to the passion of Jesus Christ, so now the light that frees the subjected, formless deep so that it comes to have its own being points to the light that shines in the darkness.'

The light of Genesis 1:3 was not the sun, which would not be created until the fourth day. To the writer of Genesis, the visible source of light does not seemingly matter. The focus, instead, is on the Creator from whom the light derived" (Langner).


