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Demographics: Key Insights

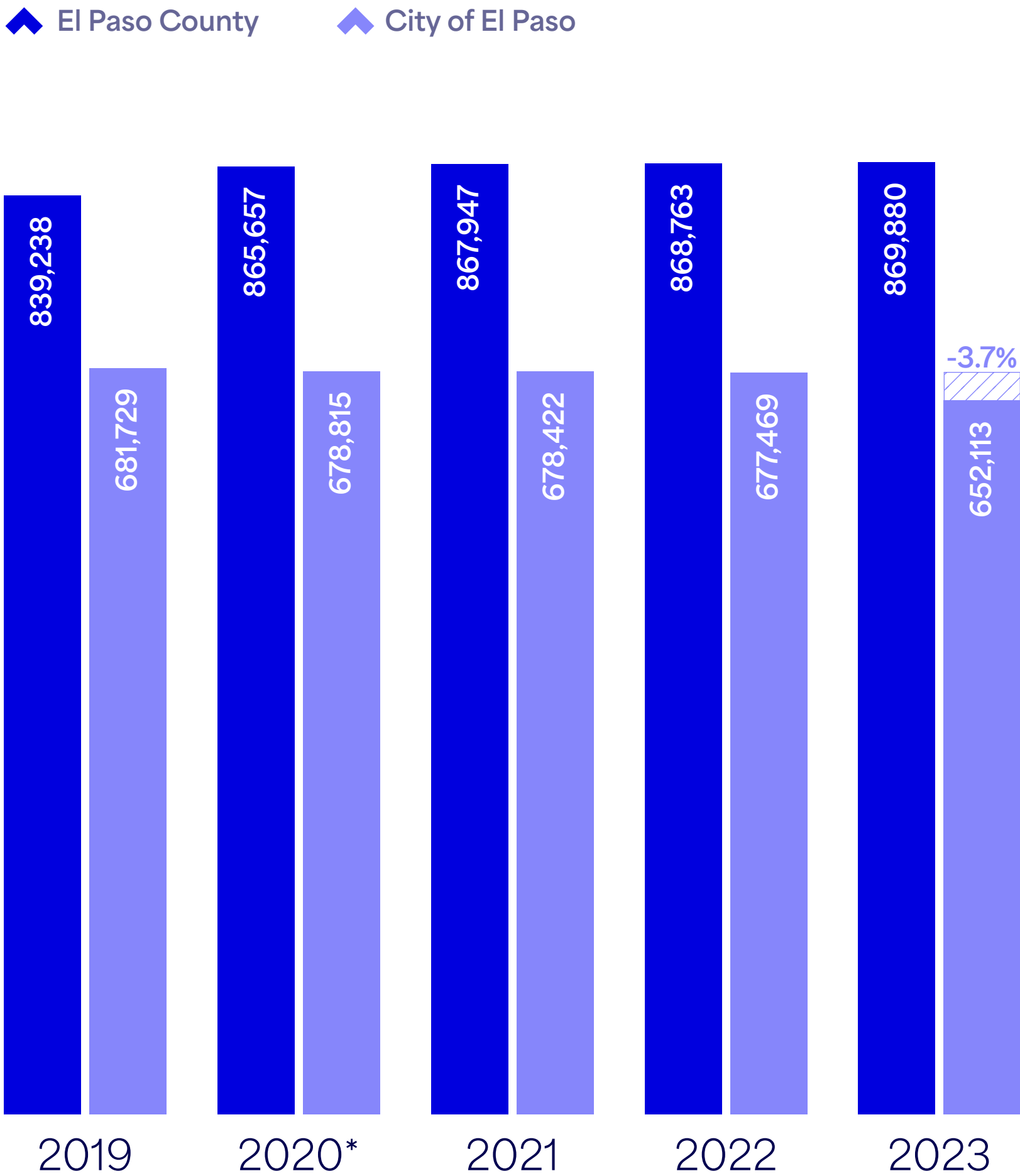
In 2023, the City of El Paso accounted for 75% of the county's population, but has seen a demographic slowdown since 2017, with a 3.7% decrease between 2022 and 2023.

The county's population pyramid shows a majority of young people (0-24 years old), indicating an increased demand for services targeting this group.

Ethnically, 77.2% identifies as being of Mexican descent, 10.9% as White, 4.4% as Hispanic or Latino, and 3.1% as African American. Other minority groups make up 4.5% of the population.

77% of the population are U.S.-born, and the most densely populated areas are in the East and Northeast growth zones of El Paso, presenting opportunities and challenges for urban planning.

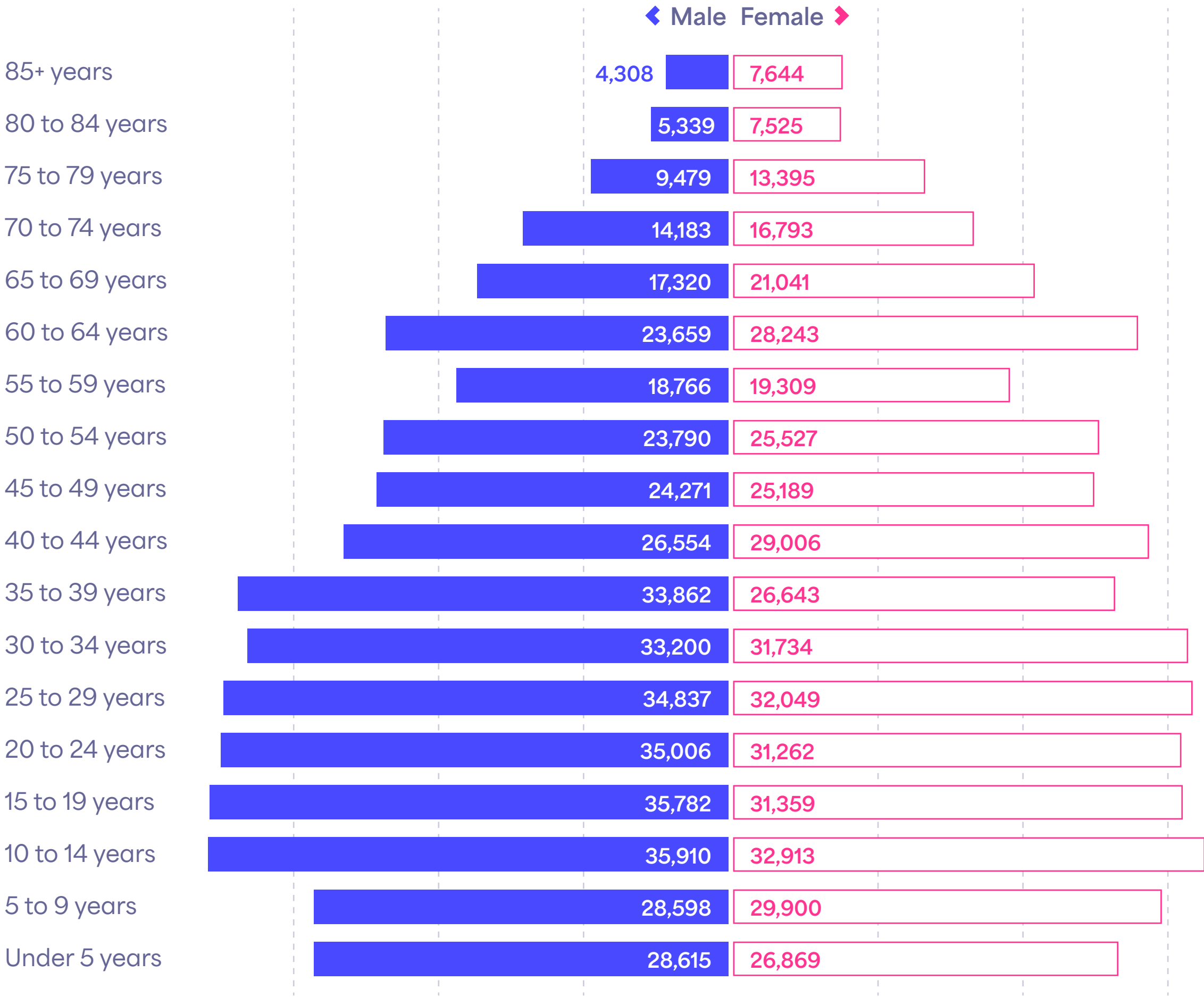
Total Population of El Paso

Population Pyramid

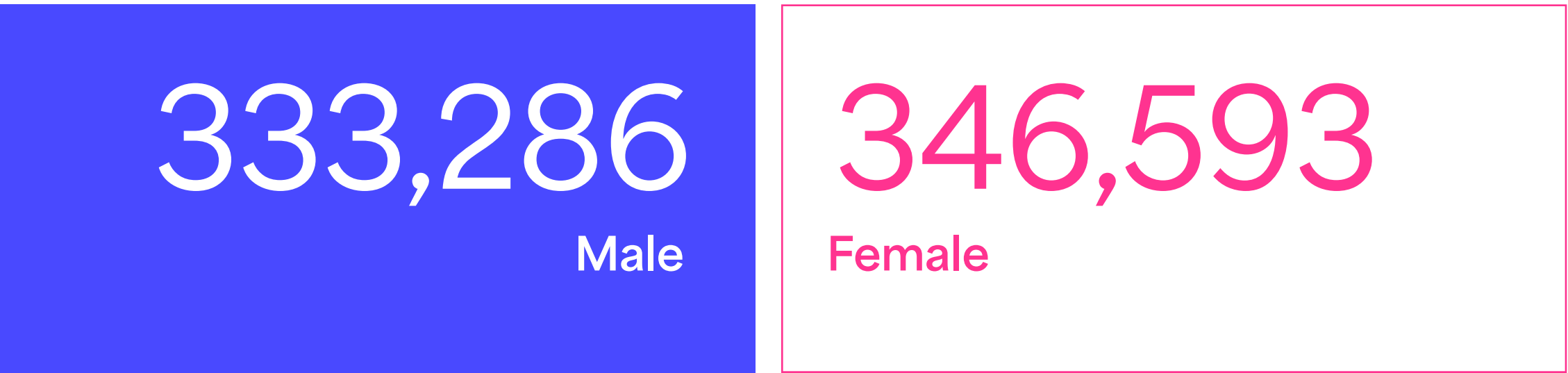

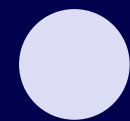

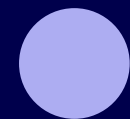

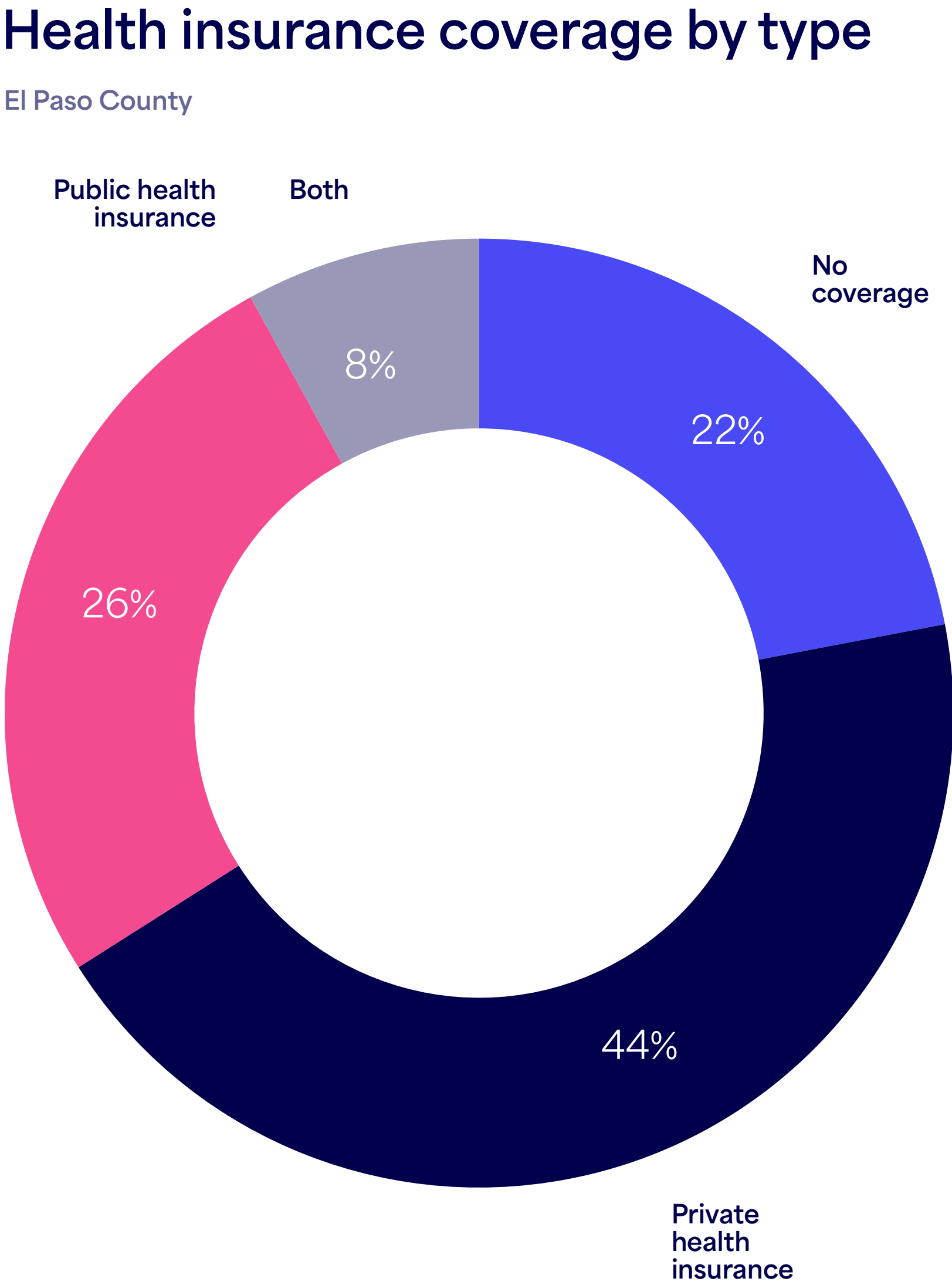


Healthcare: Key Insights

One out of five residents of El Paso have no health insurance, while a quarter of the population rely solely on public health insurance to access healthcare.

When analyzed by age, the population under 18 has nearly 90% insurance coverage, while residents over 65 surpass 95%. The most vulnerable age group is the 19-25 years range, with over 40% uninsured.

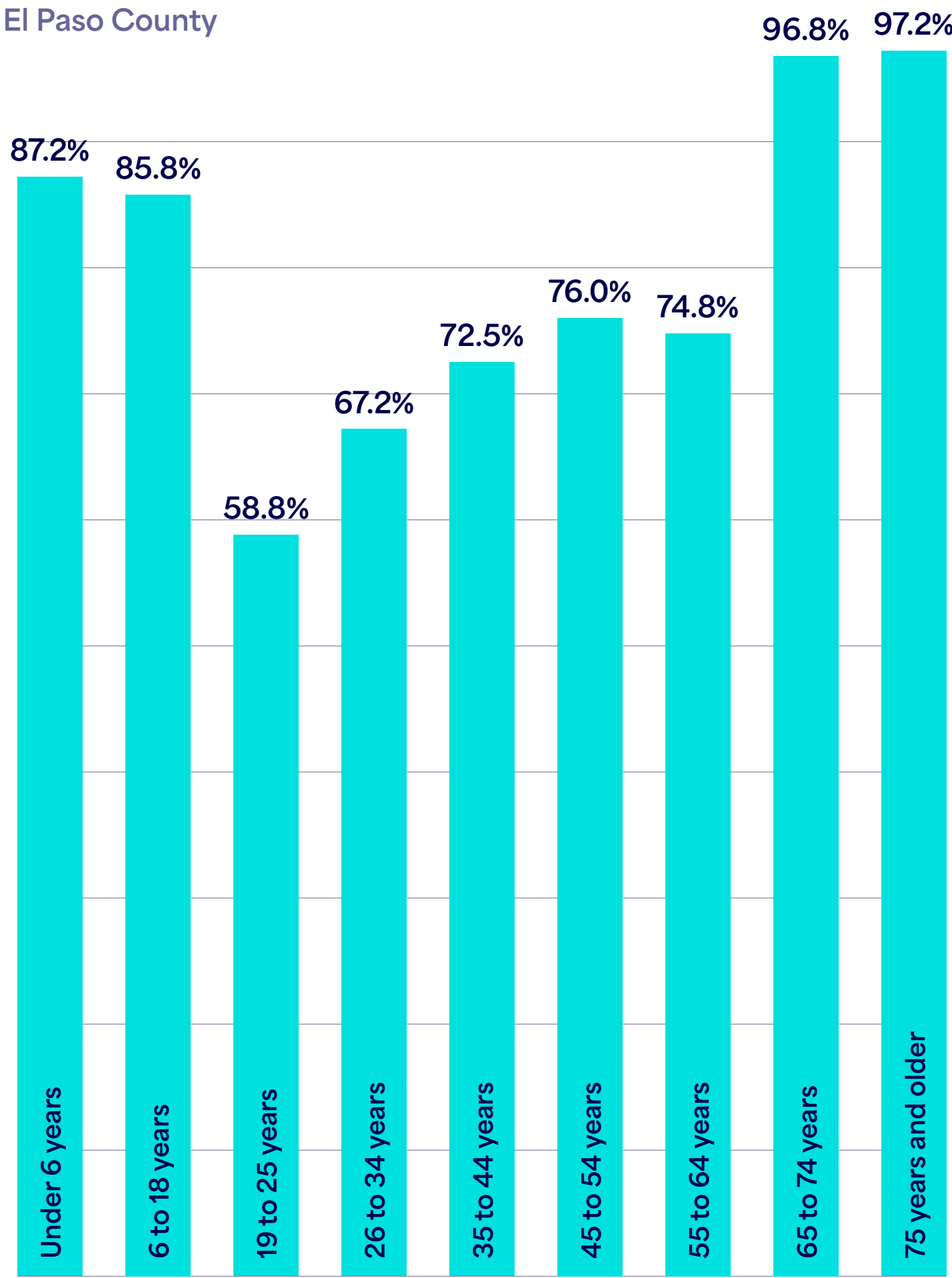
Overall, the population rates their experience with healthcare services with 8.6 out of 10. Timeliness of care is the biggest area of opportunity, with a notable lower rating over other aspects of the service.

Health insurance coverage by age

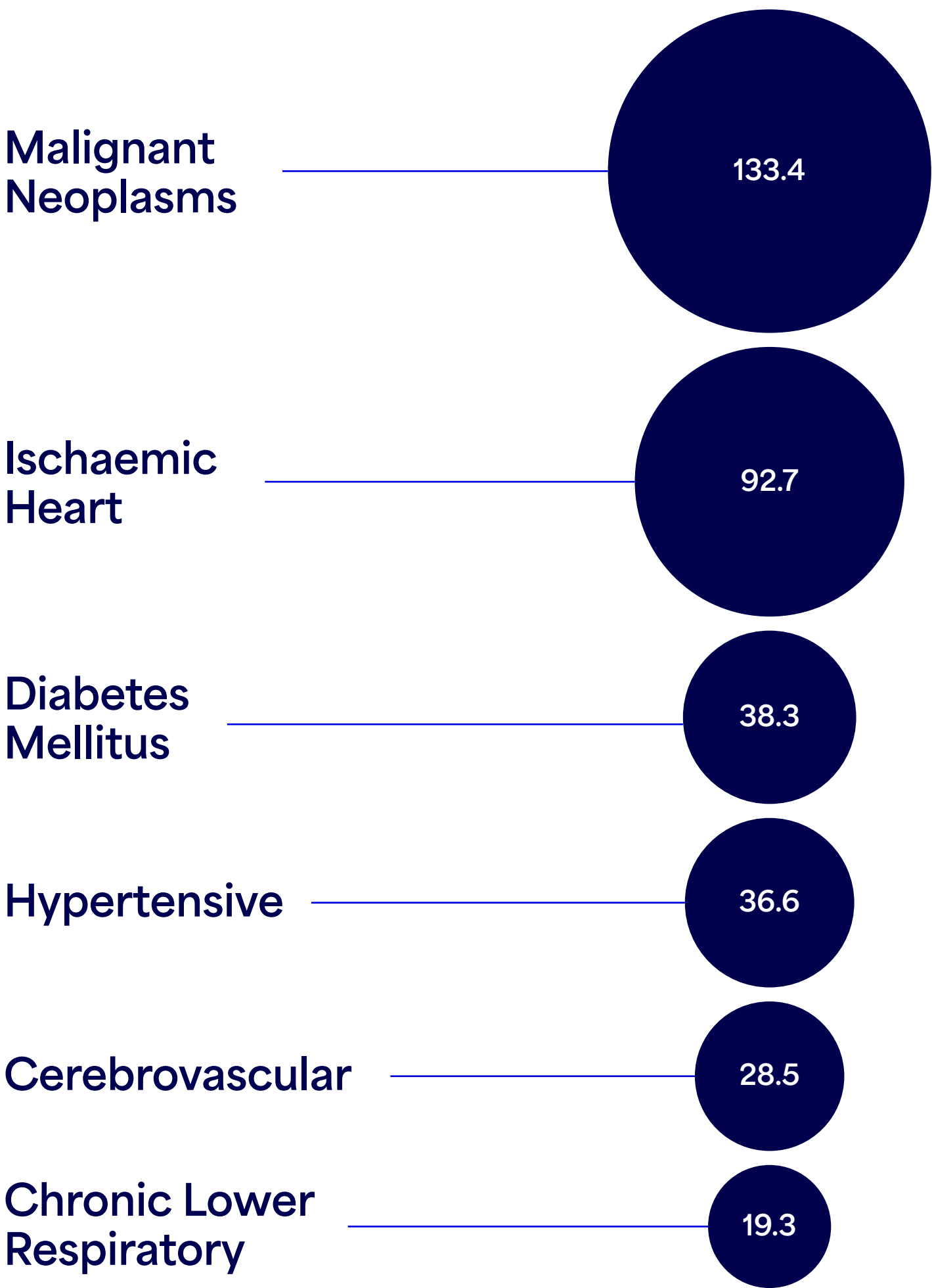

Main causes of death

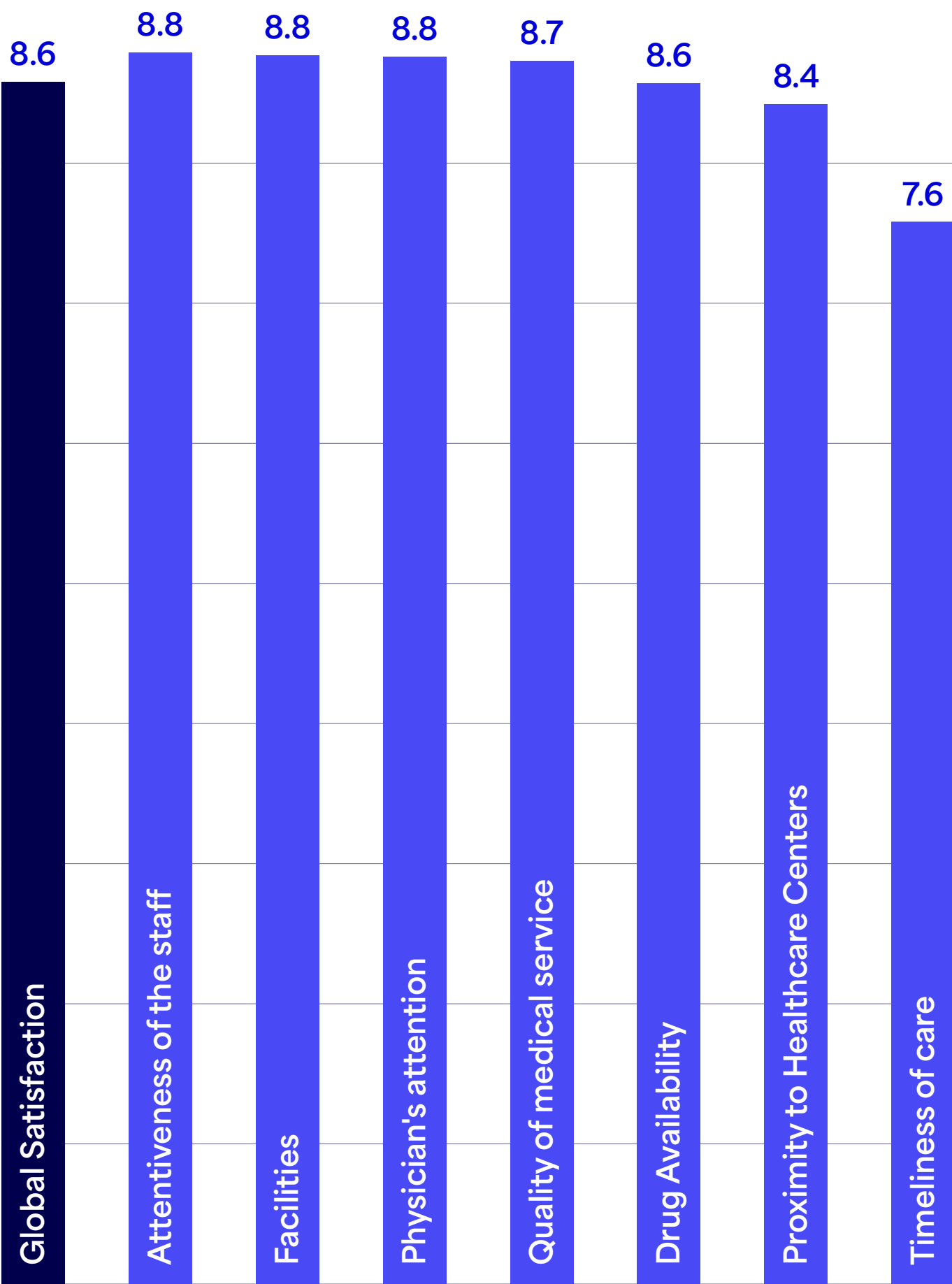

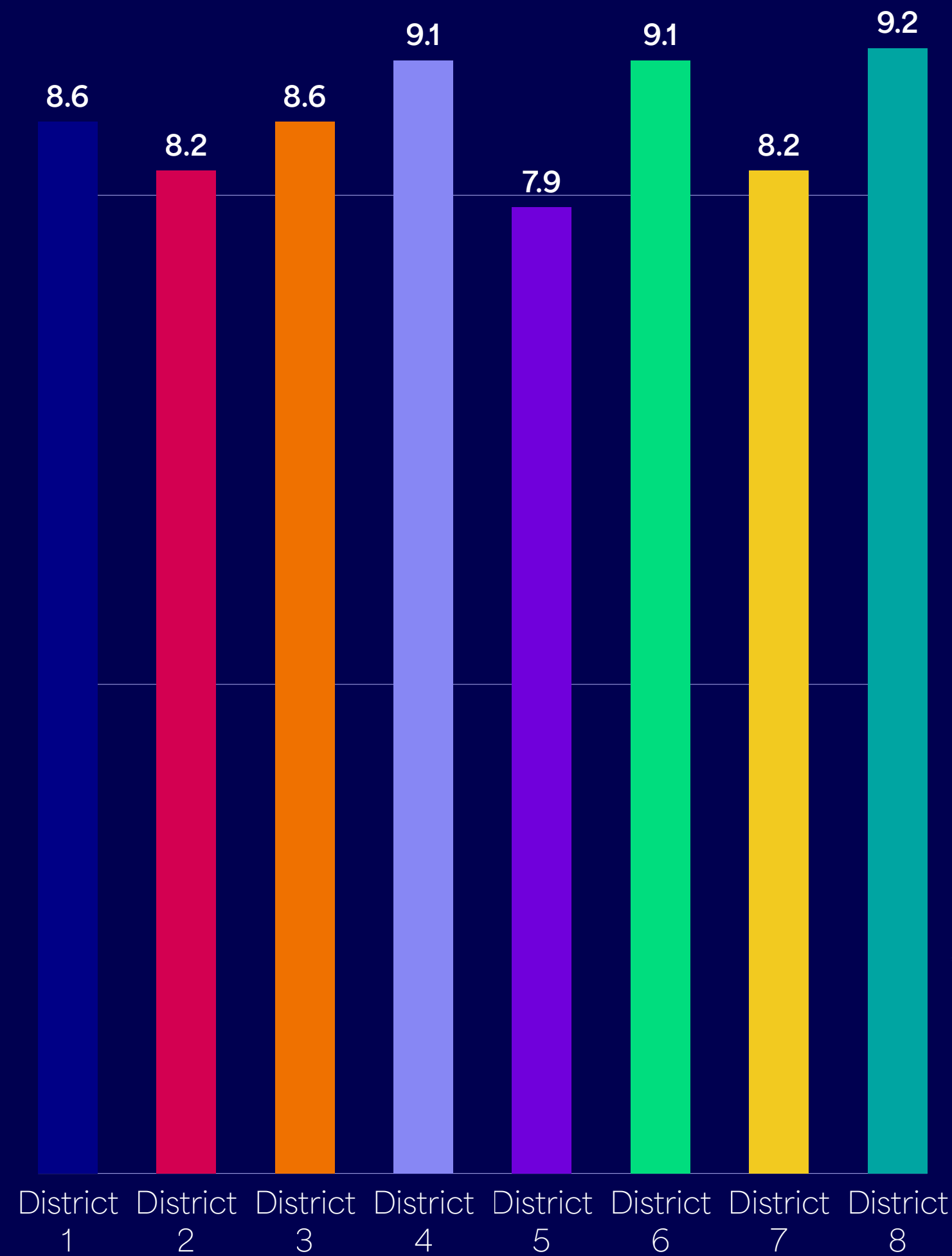

1-10 Scale



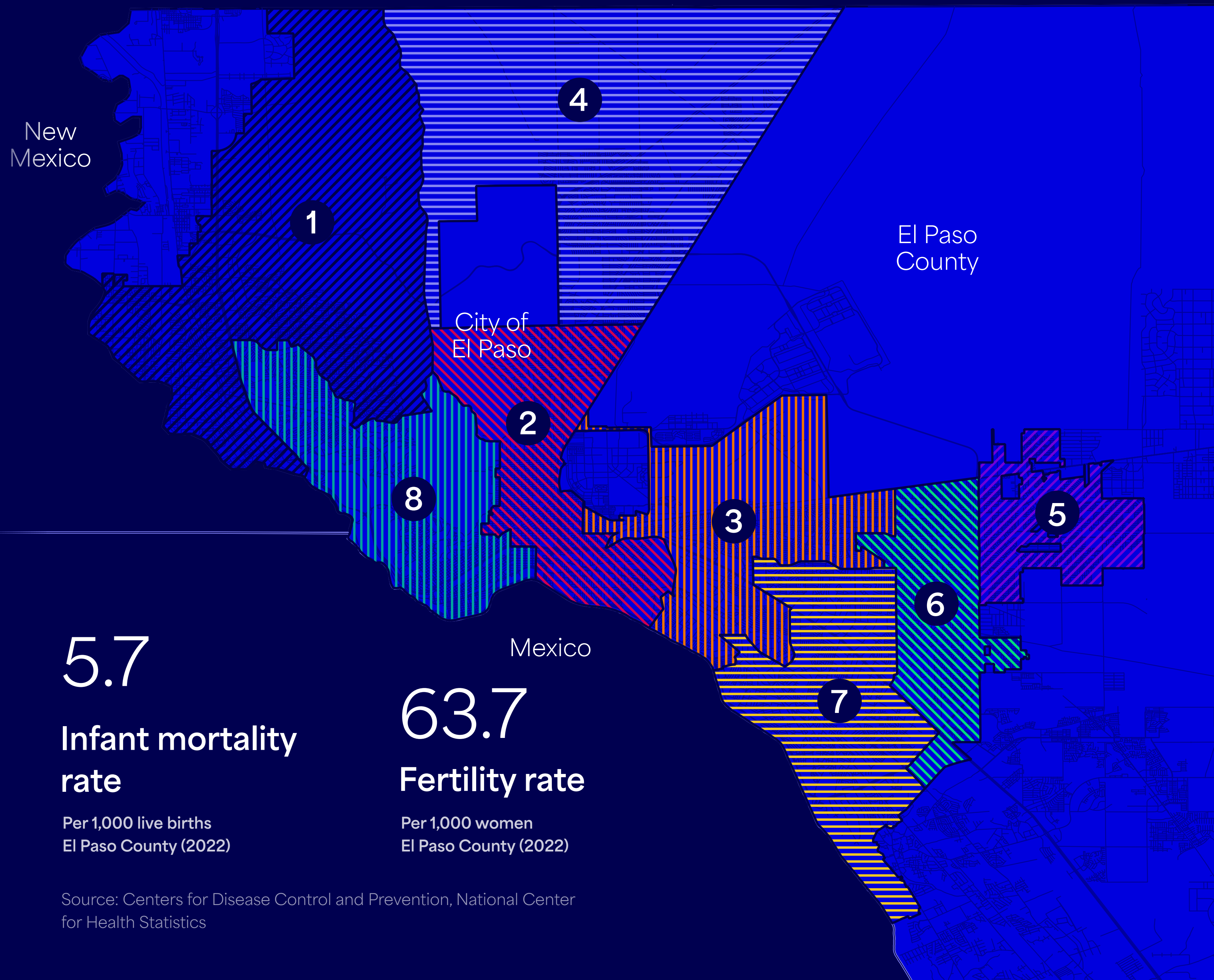

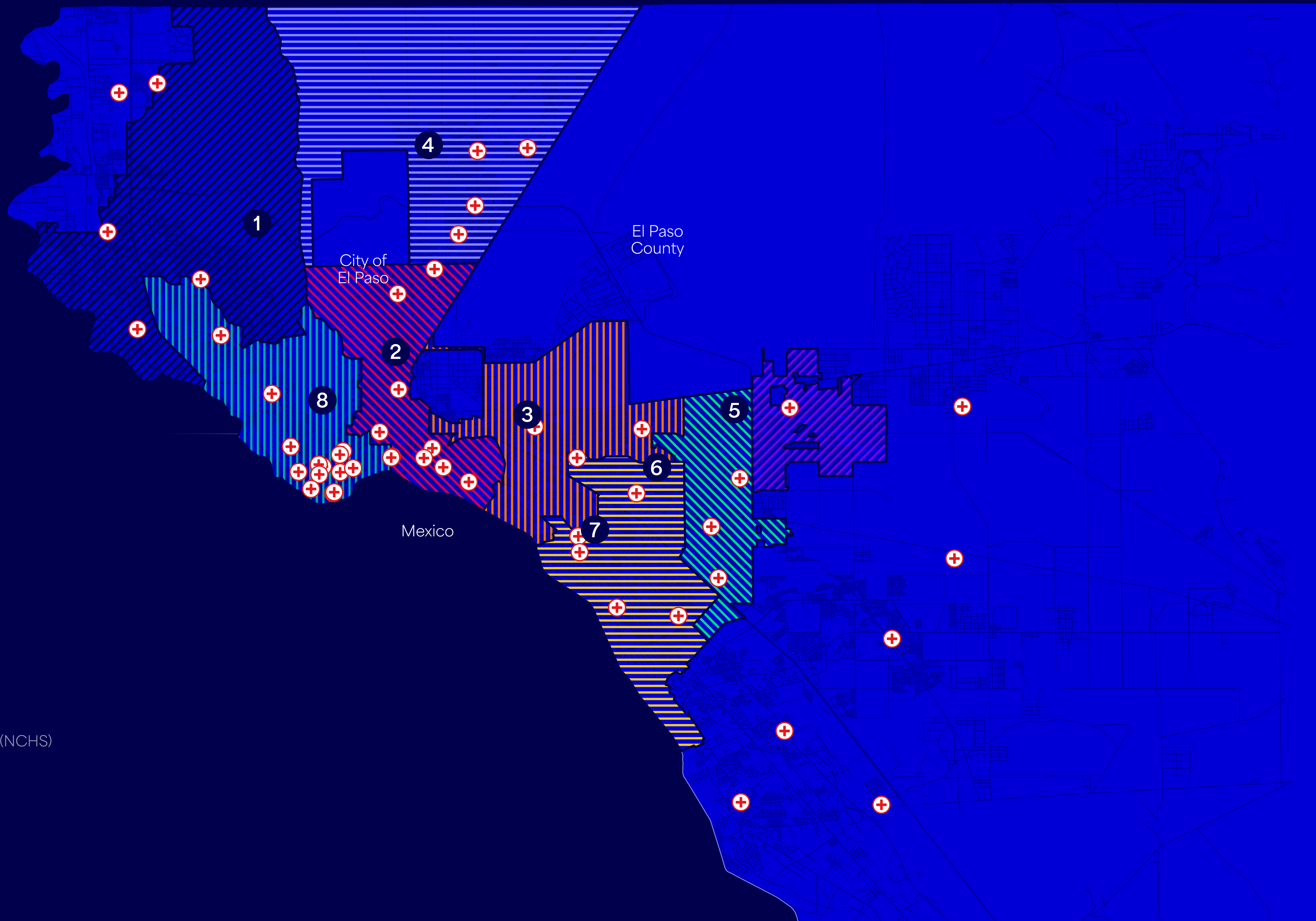

Education: Key Insights

12% of citizens are not satisfied with the education they receive. On average, they gave a rating of 8.7 to the different educational levels, with the highest rating going to college (8.90) and the lowest to middle school (8.68).

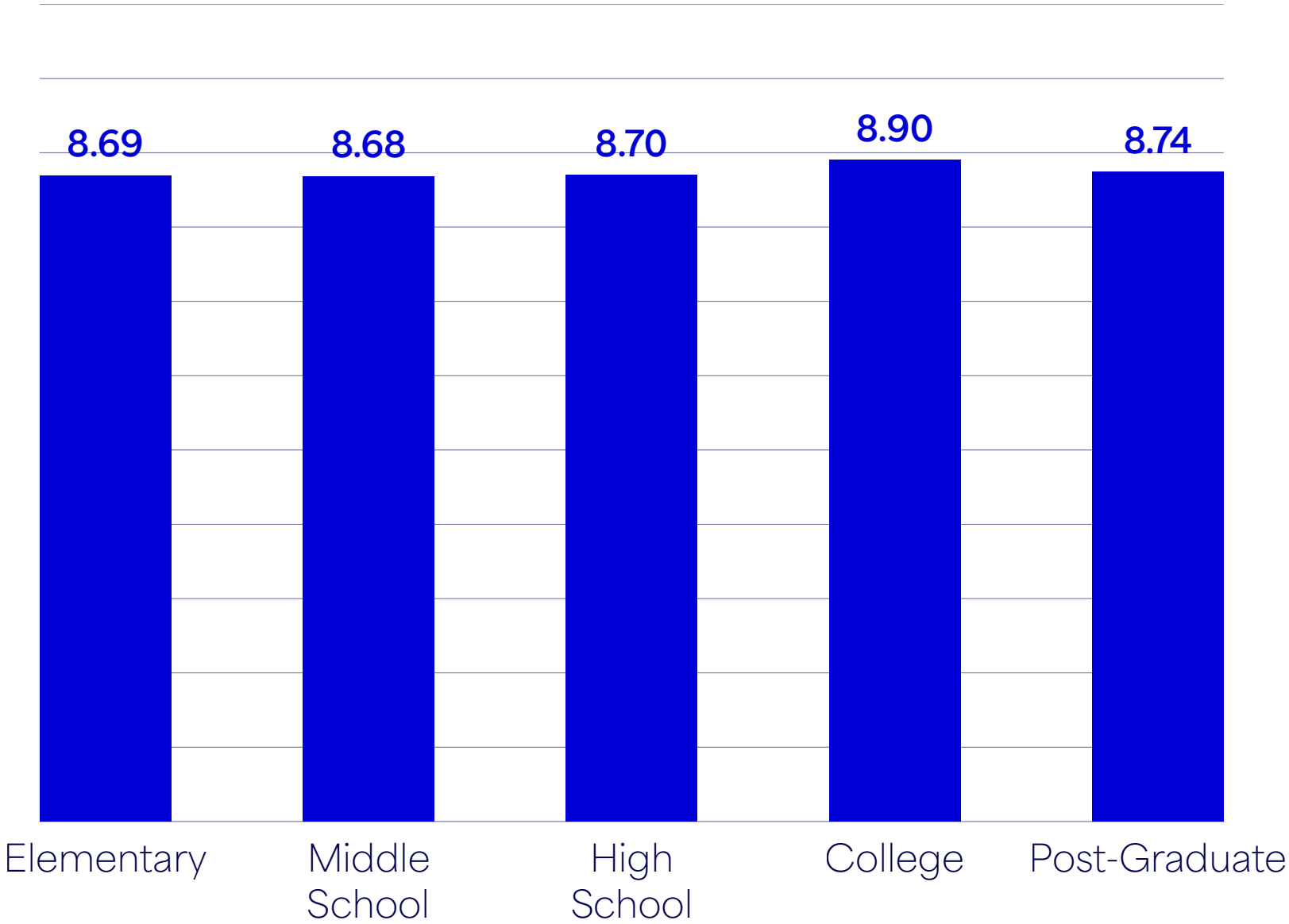
Regarding enrollment, approximately 33% of students are in grades 1-5, 21% are in middle school (grades 6-8), 34% in high school (grades 9-12), and 12% in Early Education and kindergarten.

Out of all the students graduating from grades 9-12, 92% of students are of Hispanic origin, 4% are White, and the remaining 4% consist of African American, Asian, Native American, and other ethnic groups.

In the 2021-2022 cycle, Fabens and Tornillo school districts had the lowest student-teacher ratios (12.3 and 12.4 students per teacher) but also the lowest STAAR test results, while San Elizario and Socorro had the highest ratios (18.3 and 21.6). The best STAAR results were in the Canutillo and Ysleta districts, with 48% and 47% passing rates.

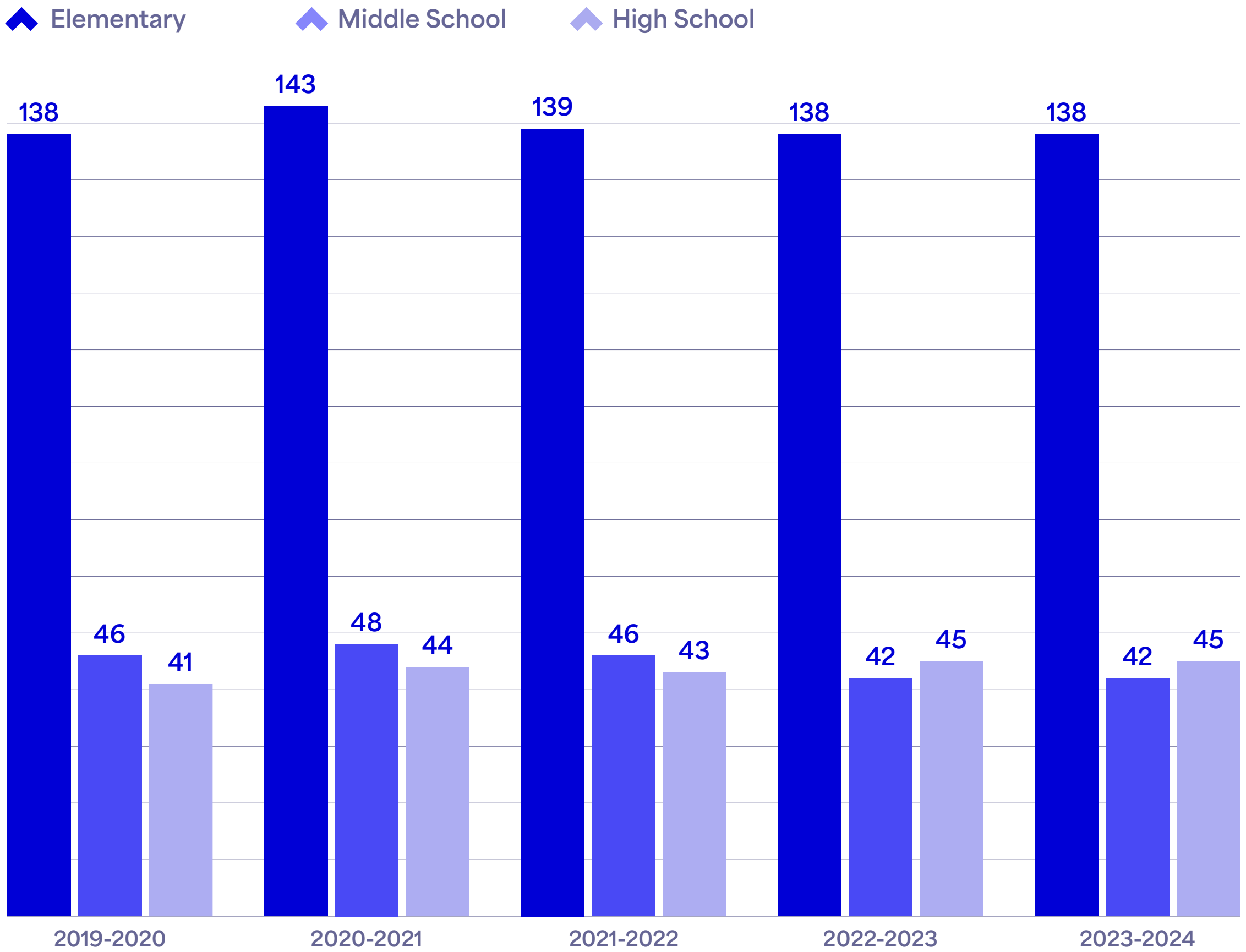

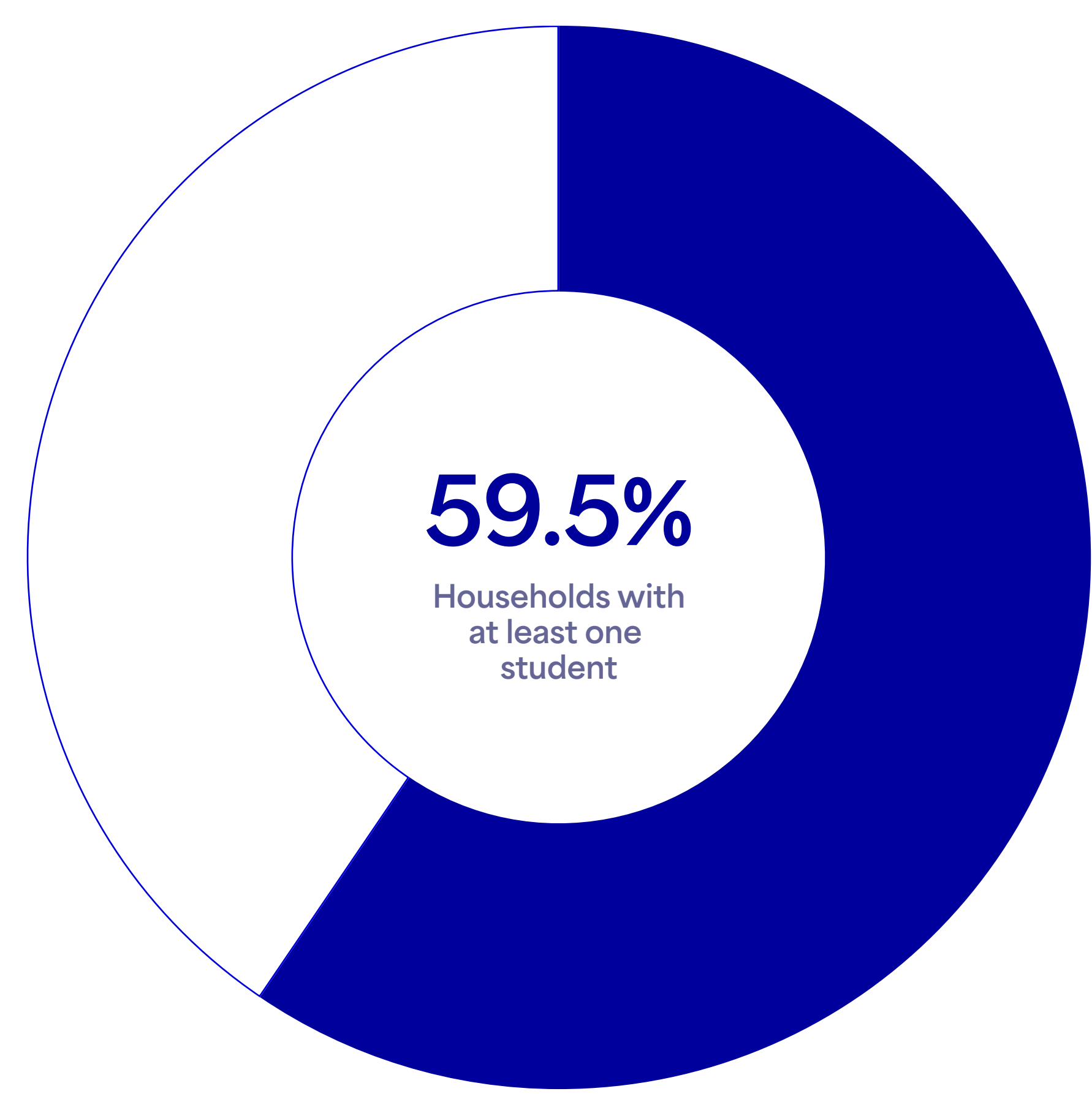

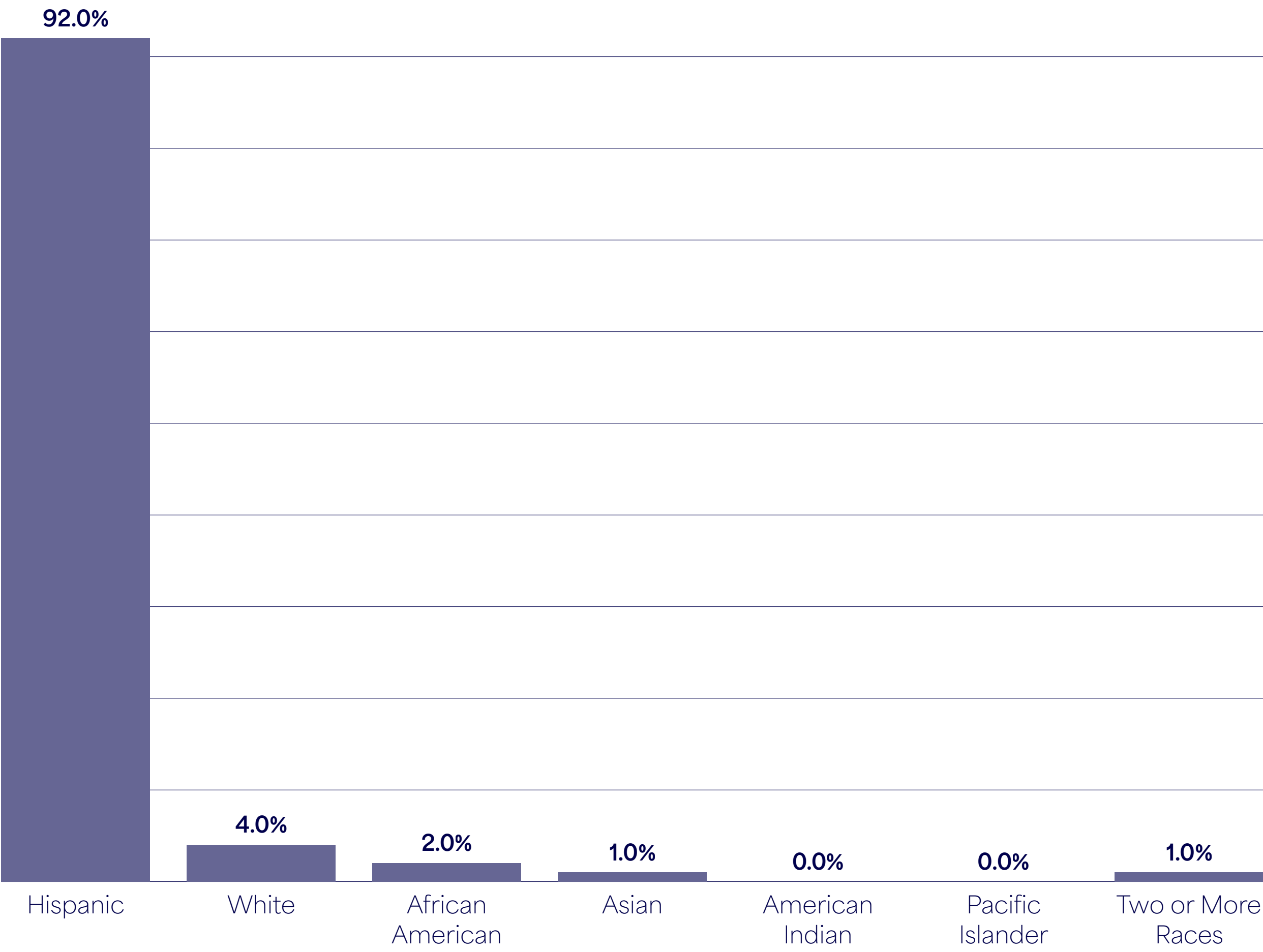
Households with at least one student

Completion of Grades 9-12 by Ethnicity

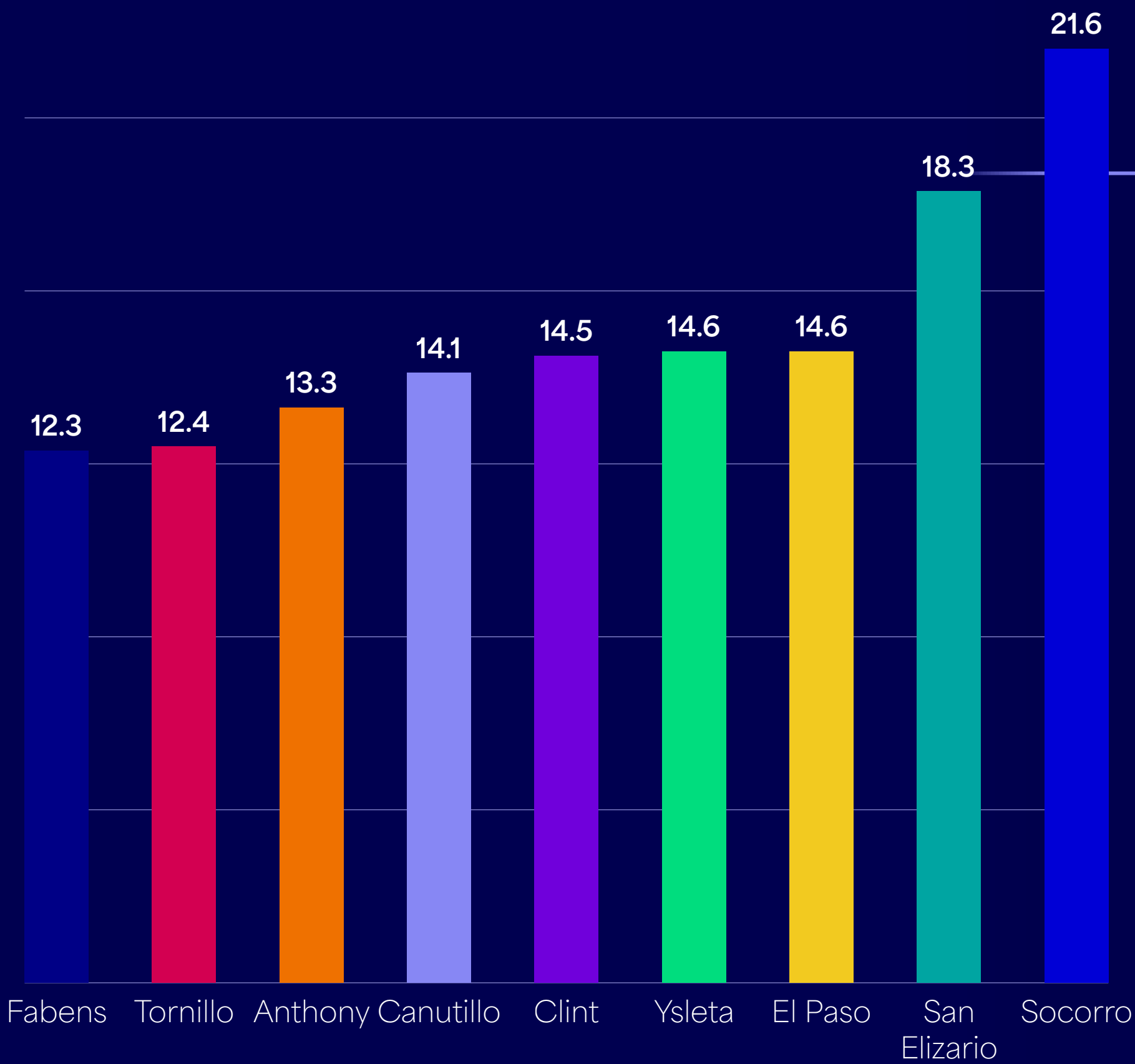

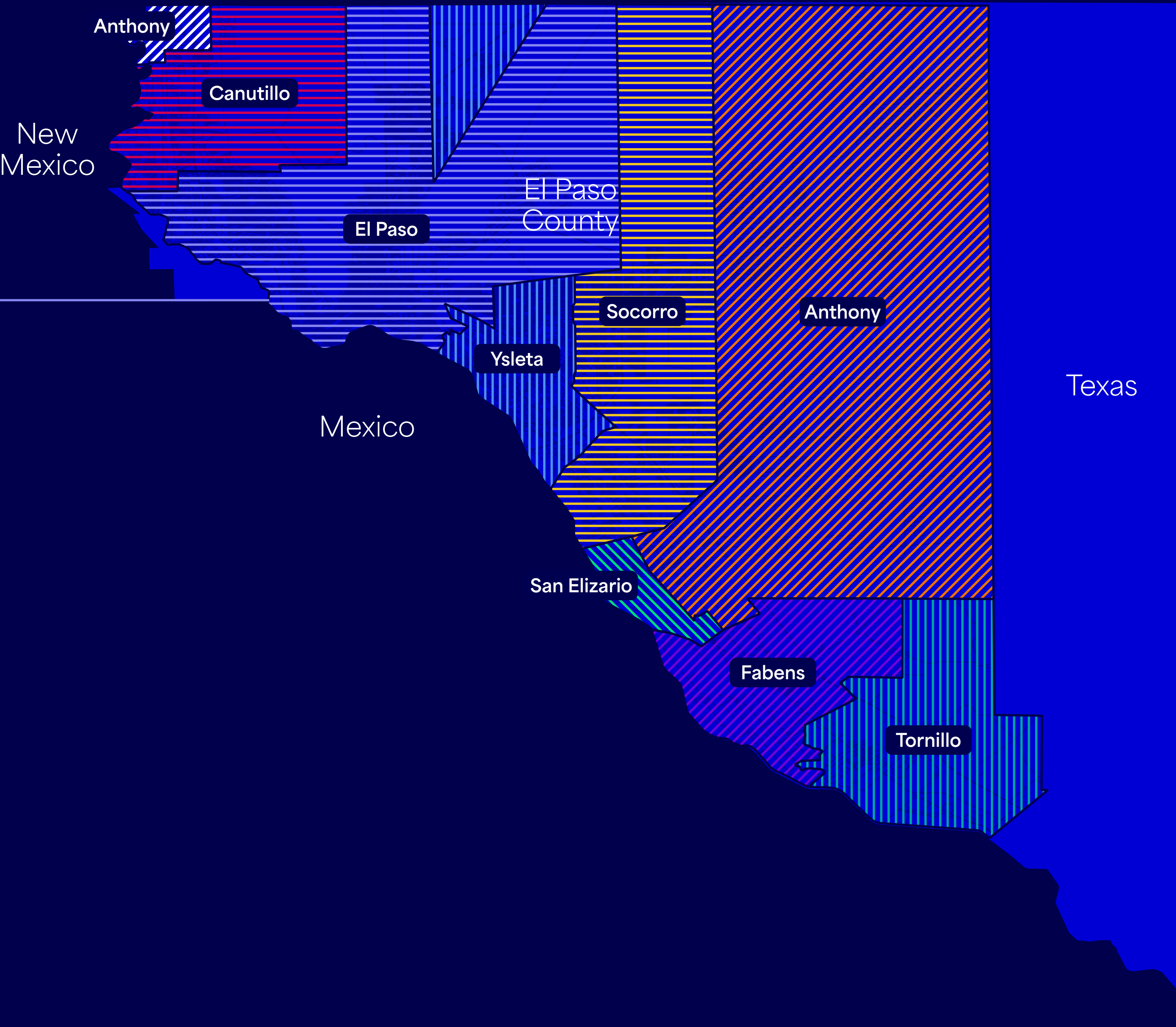

Traditional ISD/CSD, 2021-2022



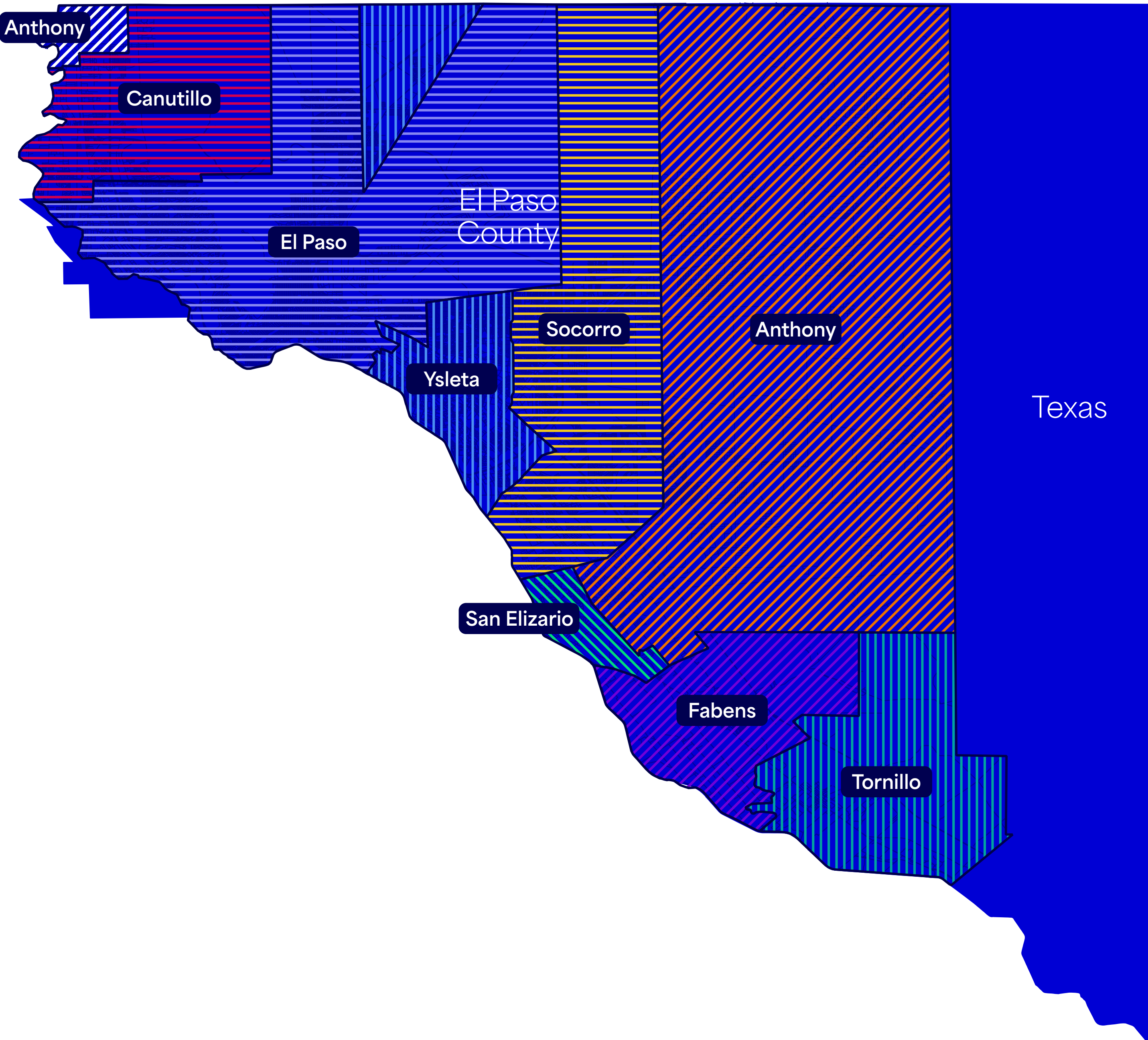

Cultural Identity and Immigration: Key Insights

El Paso is a blend of ethnicities, cultural origins, and traditions. Over three-quarters of the population identify as Mexican, followed by the White population at 10.9%. In addition to English, eight out of 10 El Paso residents speak Spanish at home.

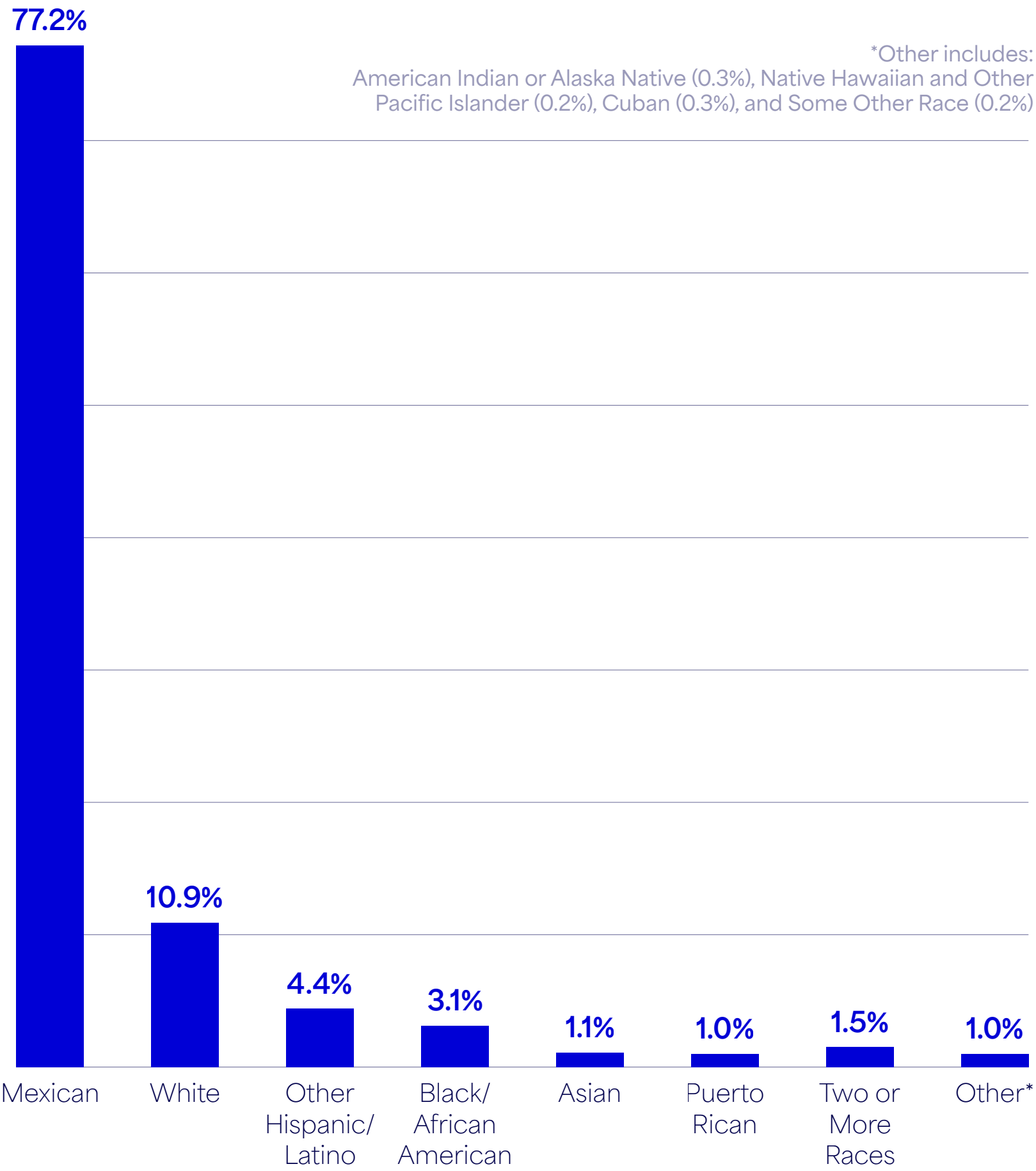
This cultural composition creates a cultural identity that makes 78% of the population proud to be El Pasoans or live in El Paso, while just 4.4% are not proud at all.

When rating the immigration policy enacted by the different levels of government, the population gives a failing grade – between 4.8 and 5.0 out of ten. The local government has a slight edge over the State and Federal administrations.

The latest data on CBP’s actions at the border suggest that the countries of origin of those apprehended are Venezuela (16.8%), Guatemala (13.7%), and Mexico (11.6%). Most encounters involve adults alone, while 4.8% involve unaccompanied minors.

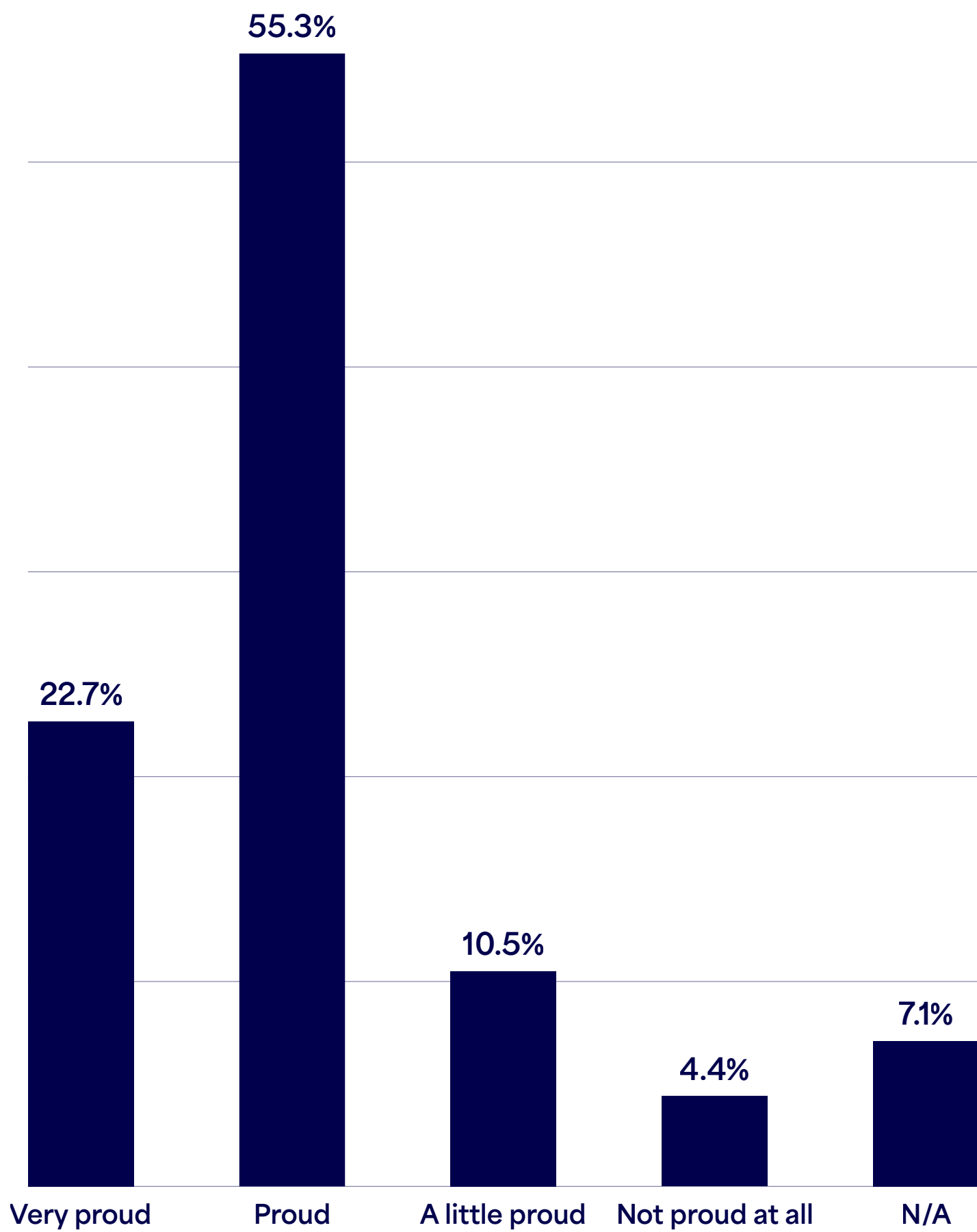
Population by Race/Ethnicity

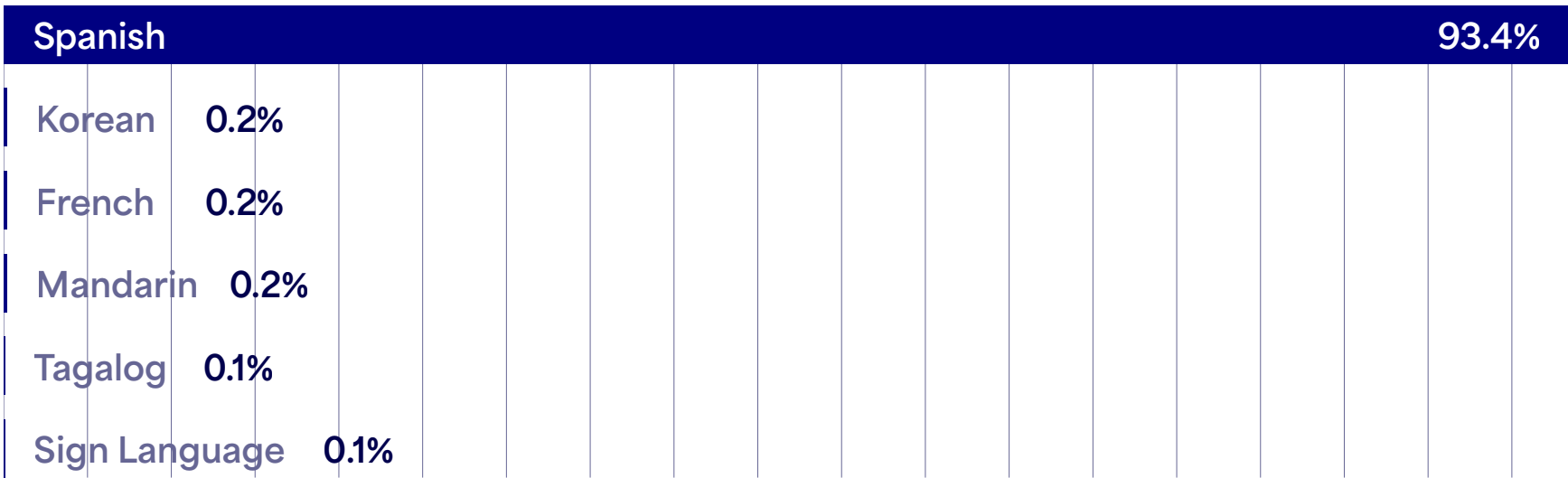
To what extent do you think that people in El Paso are proud to be in or live in El Paso?



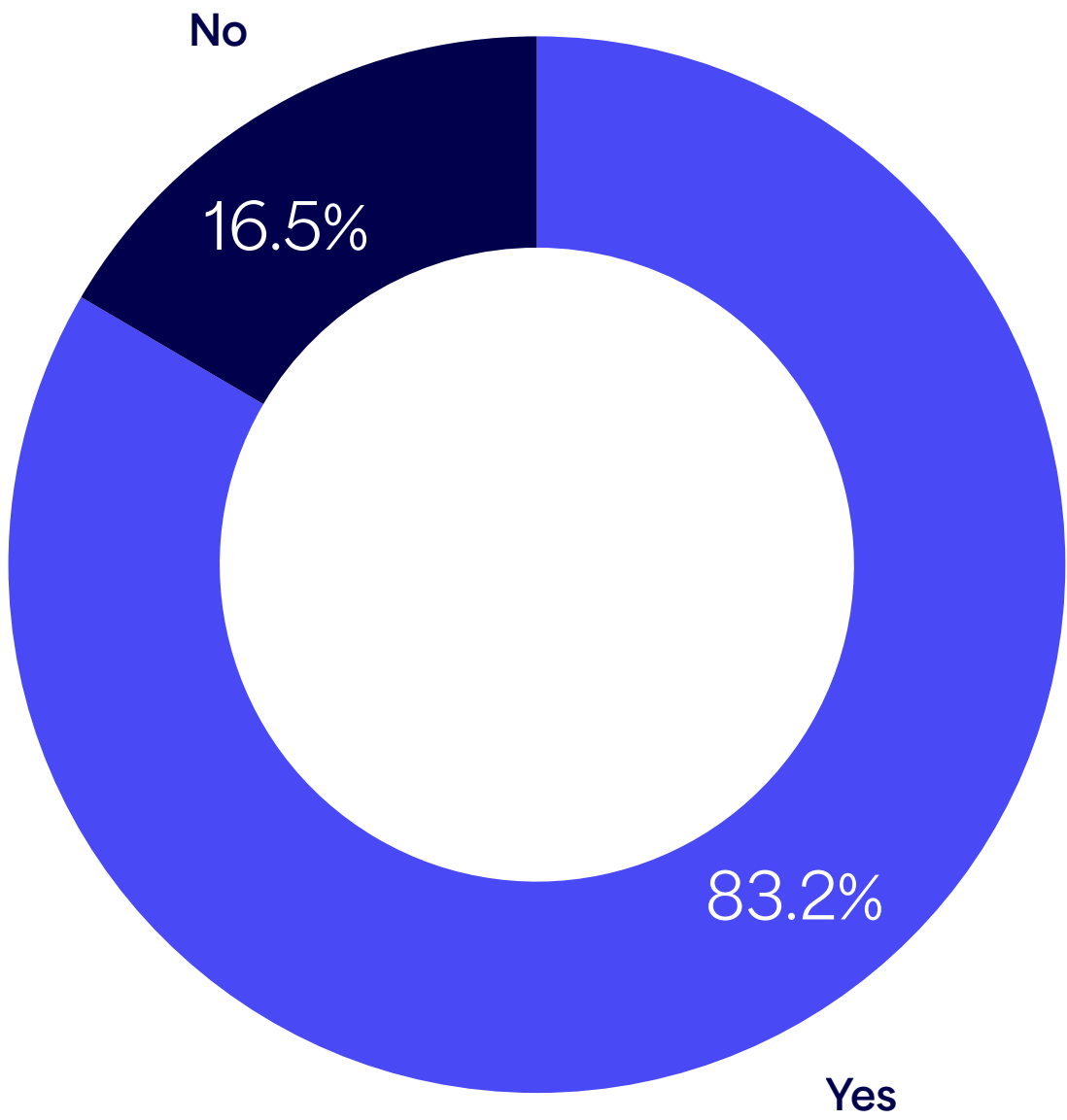

Top languages spoken other than English

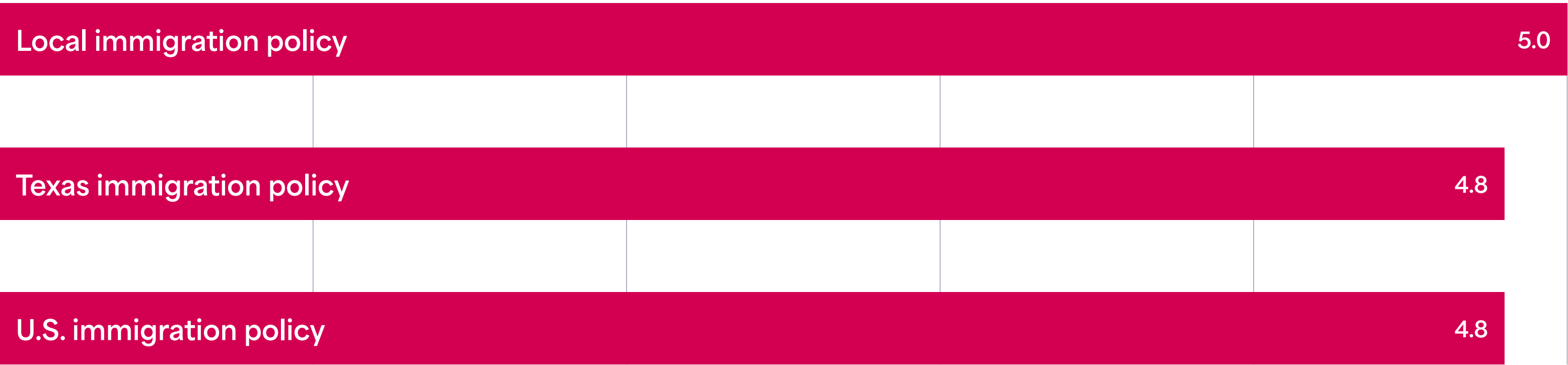

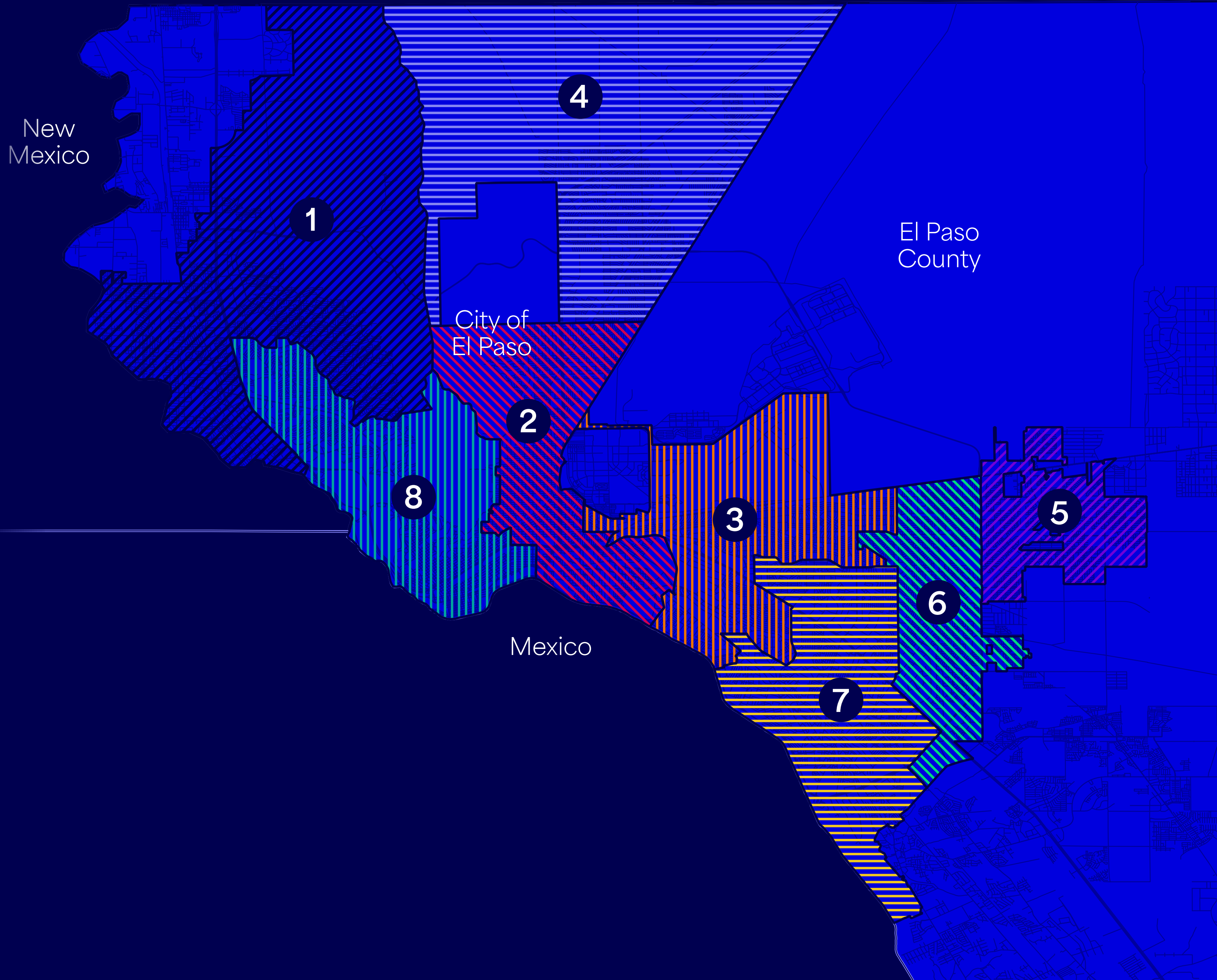
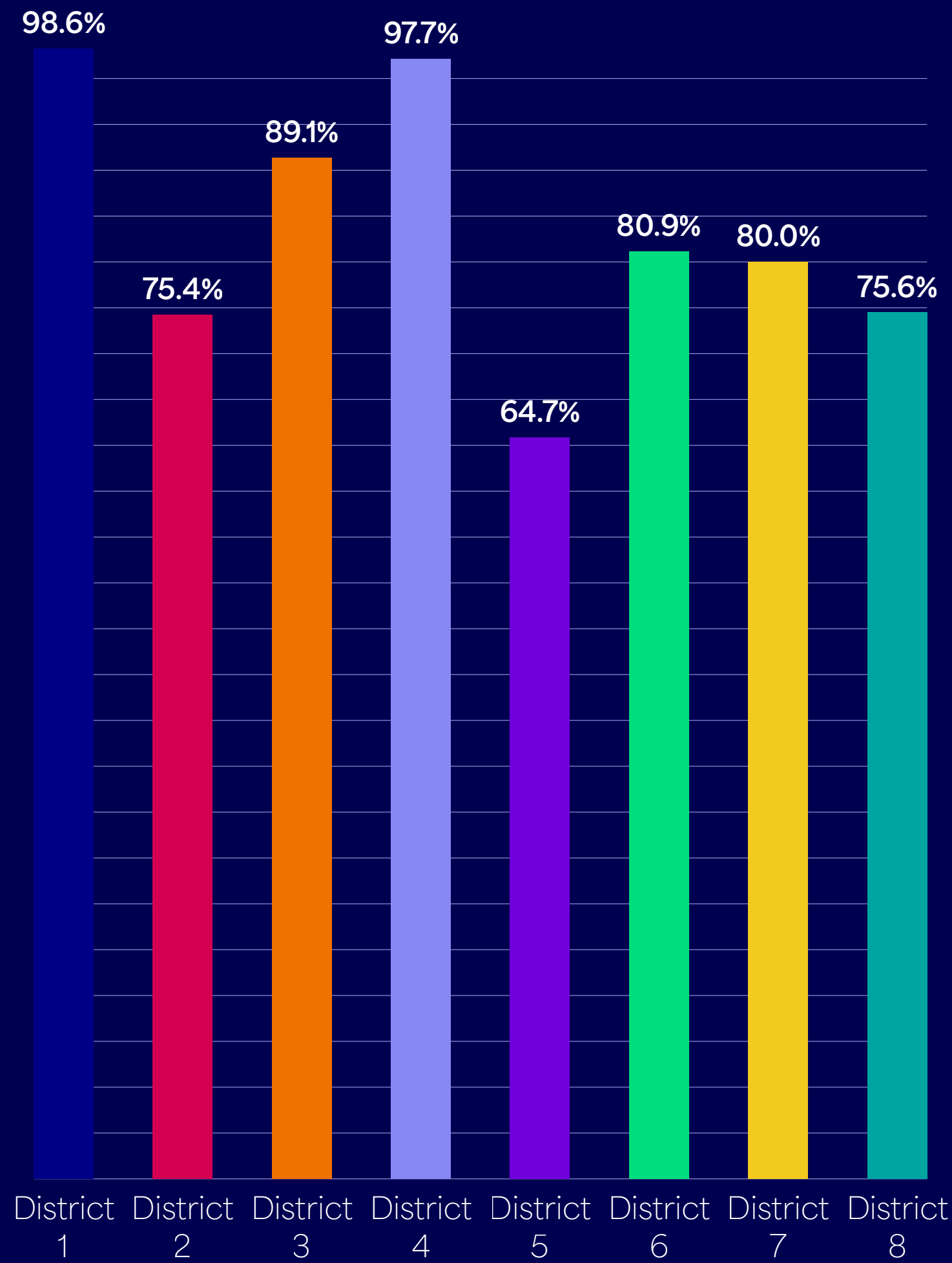


Satisfaction with immigration policy

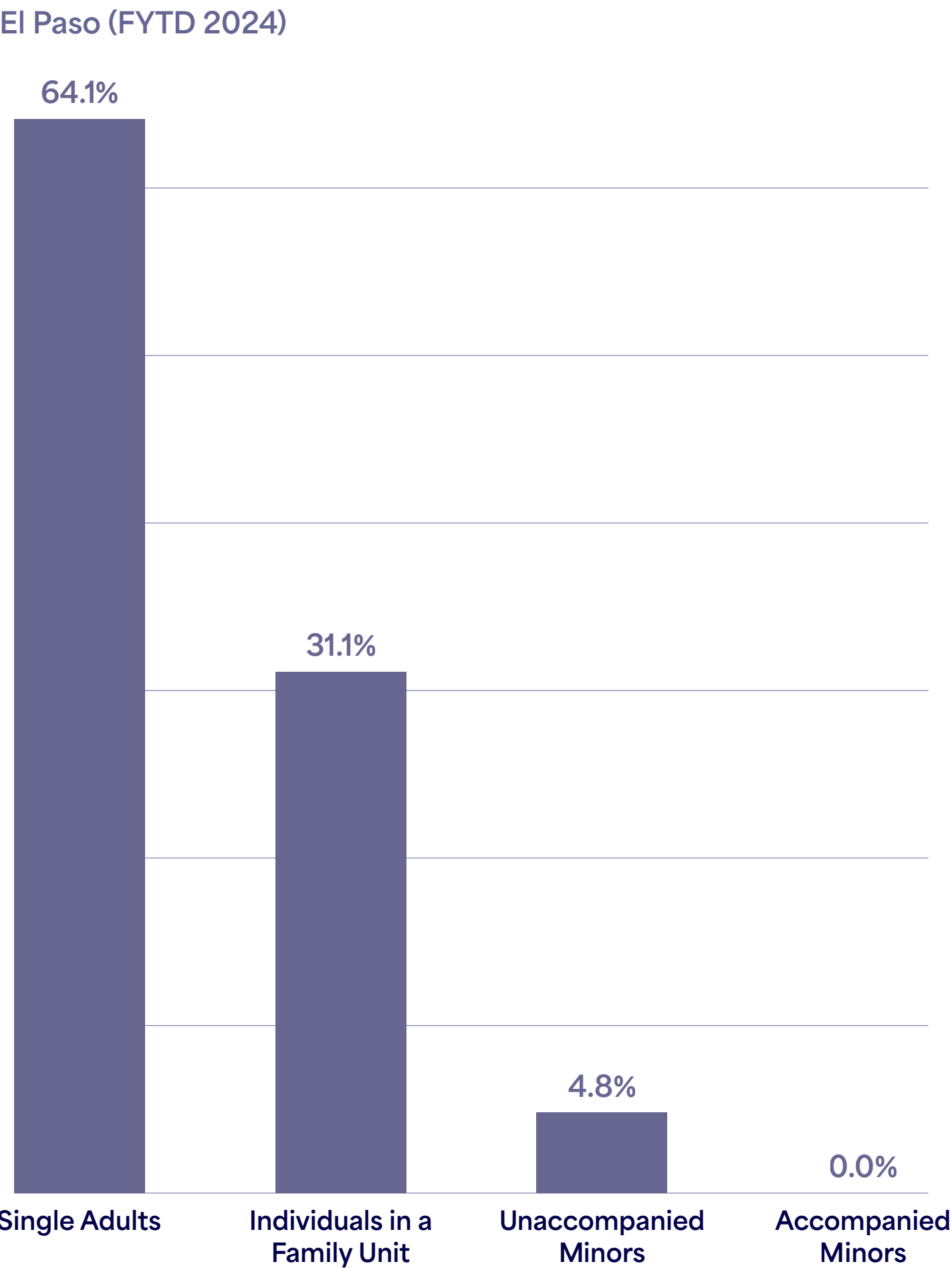

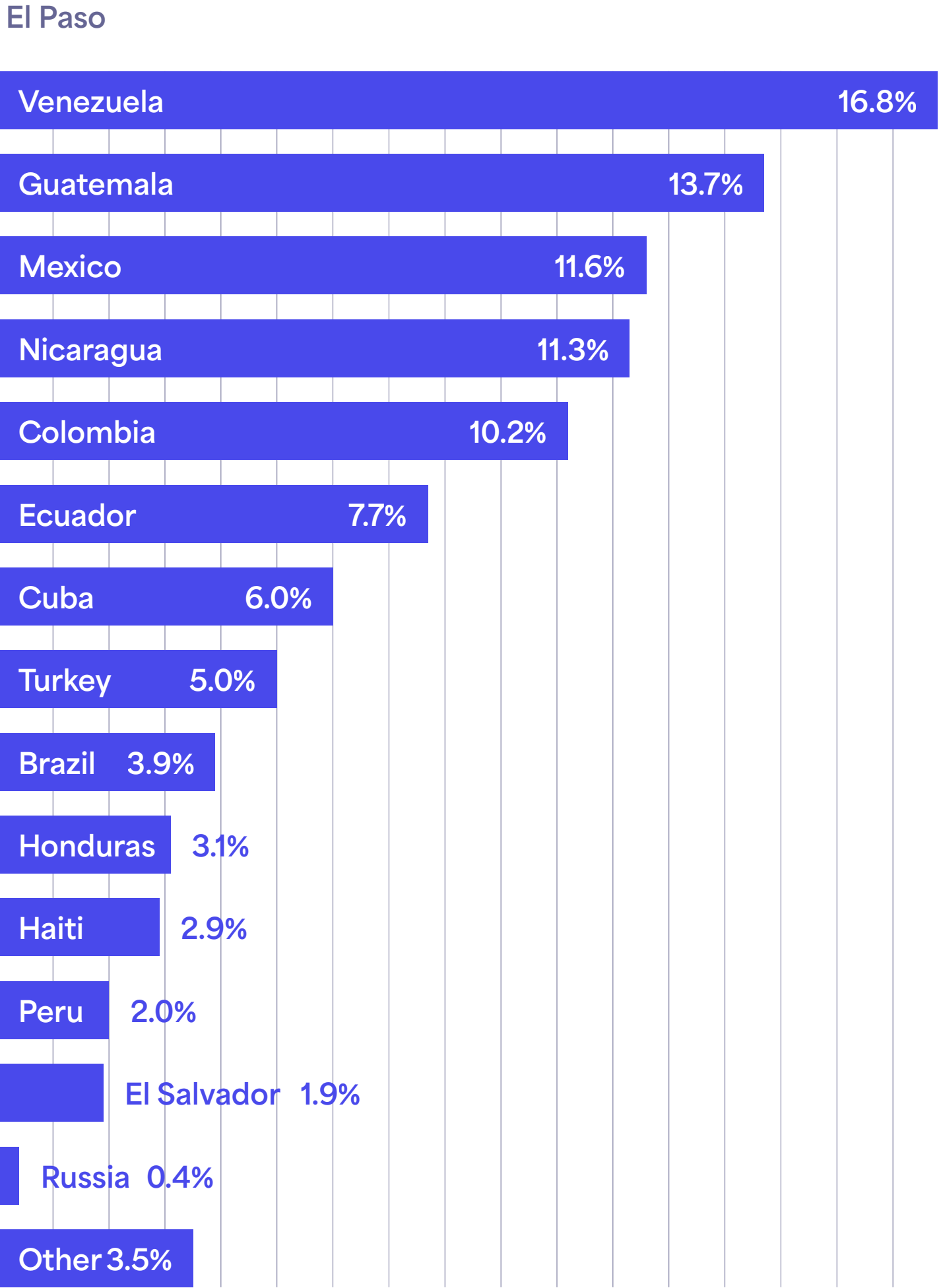

Inequality: Key Insights

The U.S. government uses the poverty threshold to determine if a household is in poverty, based on family composition. For 2023, a one-person household needs an annual income of at least \$15,480 to be above the poverty level, with thresholds varying by family size and member ages but not by geography.

18.5% of the population (158,190 people) live below the poverty threshold, with 57.3% being women. The age groups most affected by poverty are 5–17 years and 35–64 years.

Educational attainment is directly related to poverty levels. From 2018 to 2023, the highest poverty rates were among those without a high school diploma, while those with a Bachelor's degree or higher had the lowest poverty rates.

In 2021, 20% of El Paso County's residents reported incomes below the poverty line. The southern border areas, particularly Central and Mission Valley, had the highest poverty rates (29.3% to 64.5%), while northern areas had the lowest.

Population below the poverty threshold

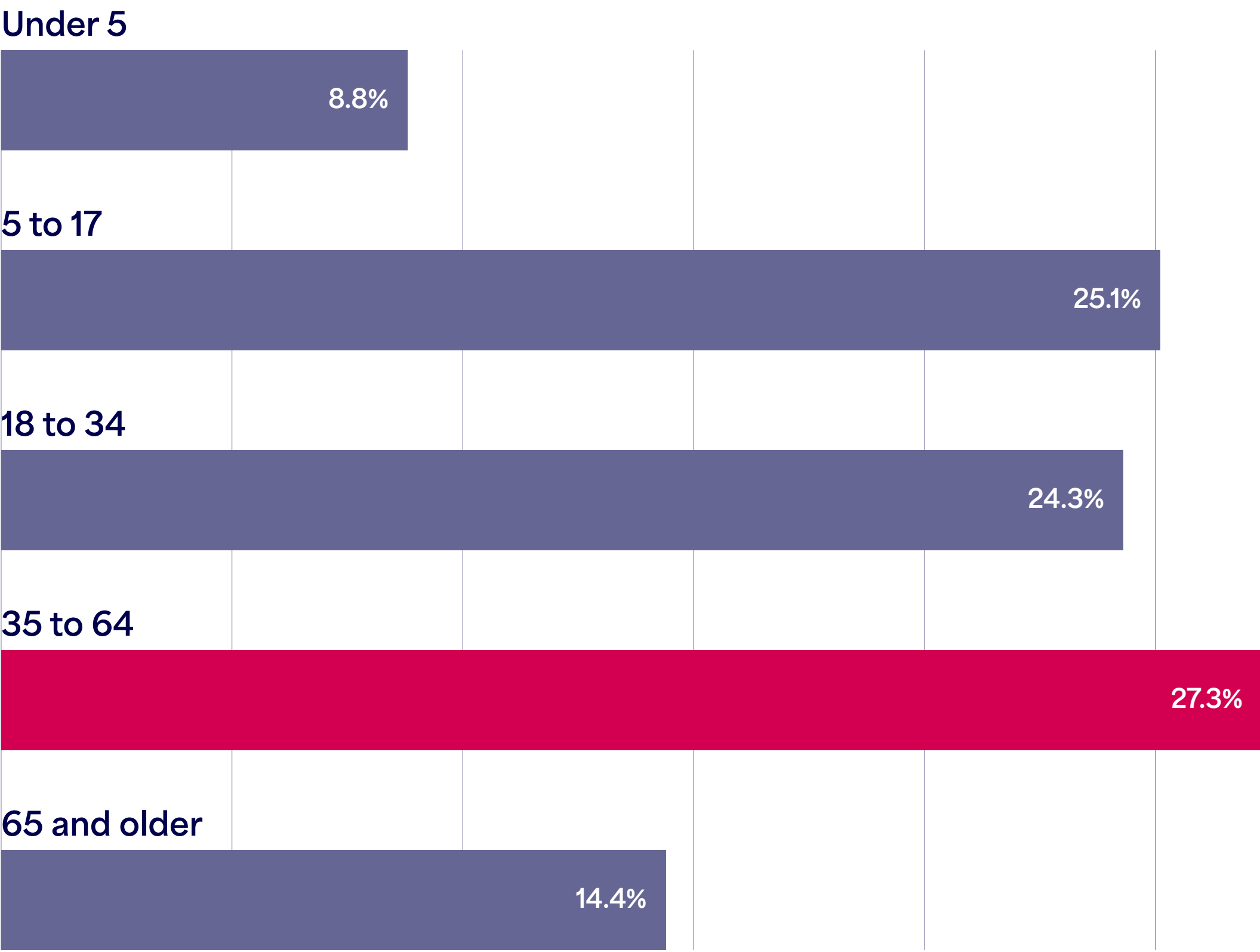

Population below the poverty threshold by age

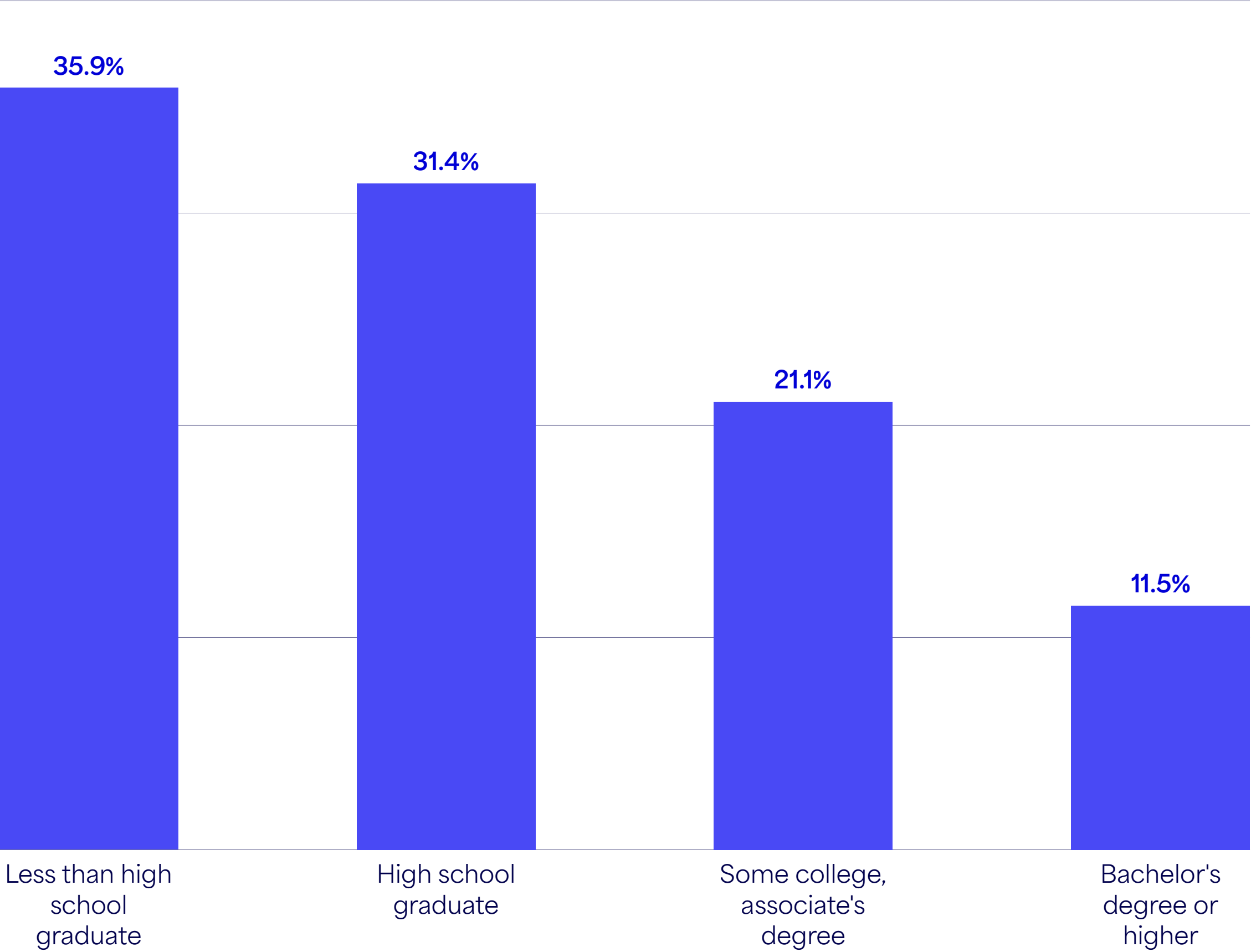

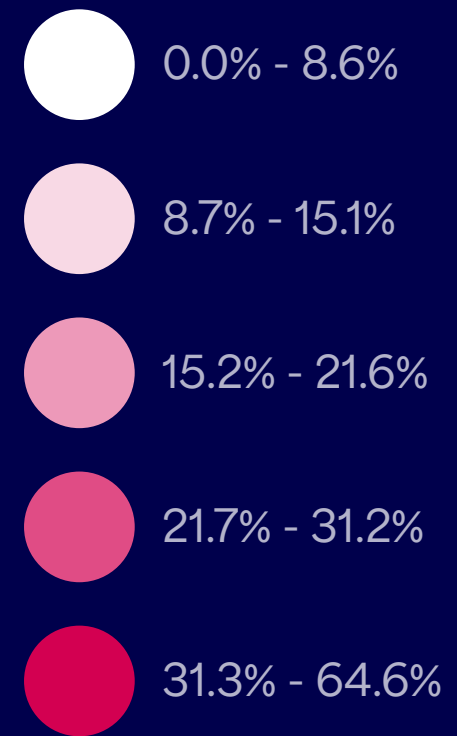
Population below the poverty threshold by educational level

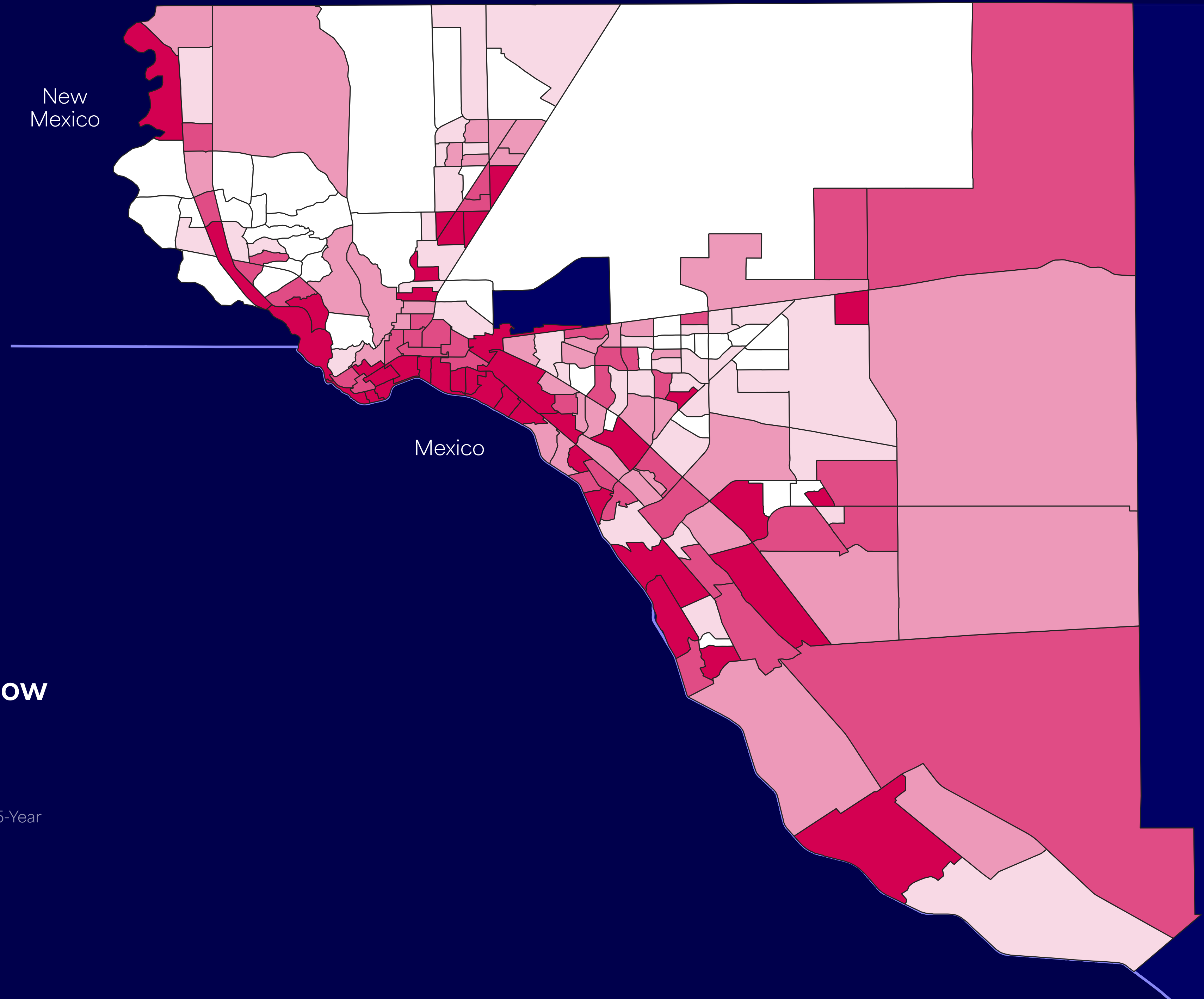
Population per Sq. Km



Percentage of the population below the poverty threshold

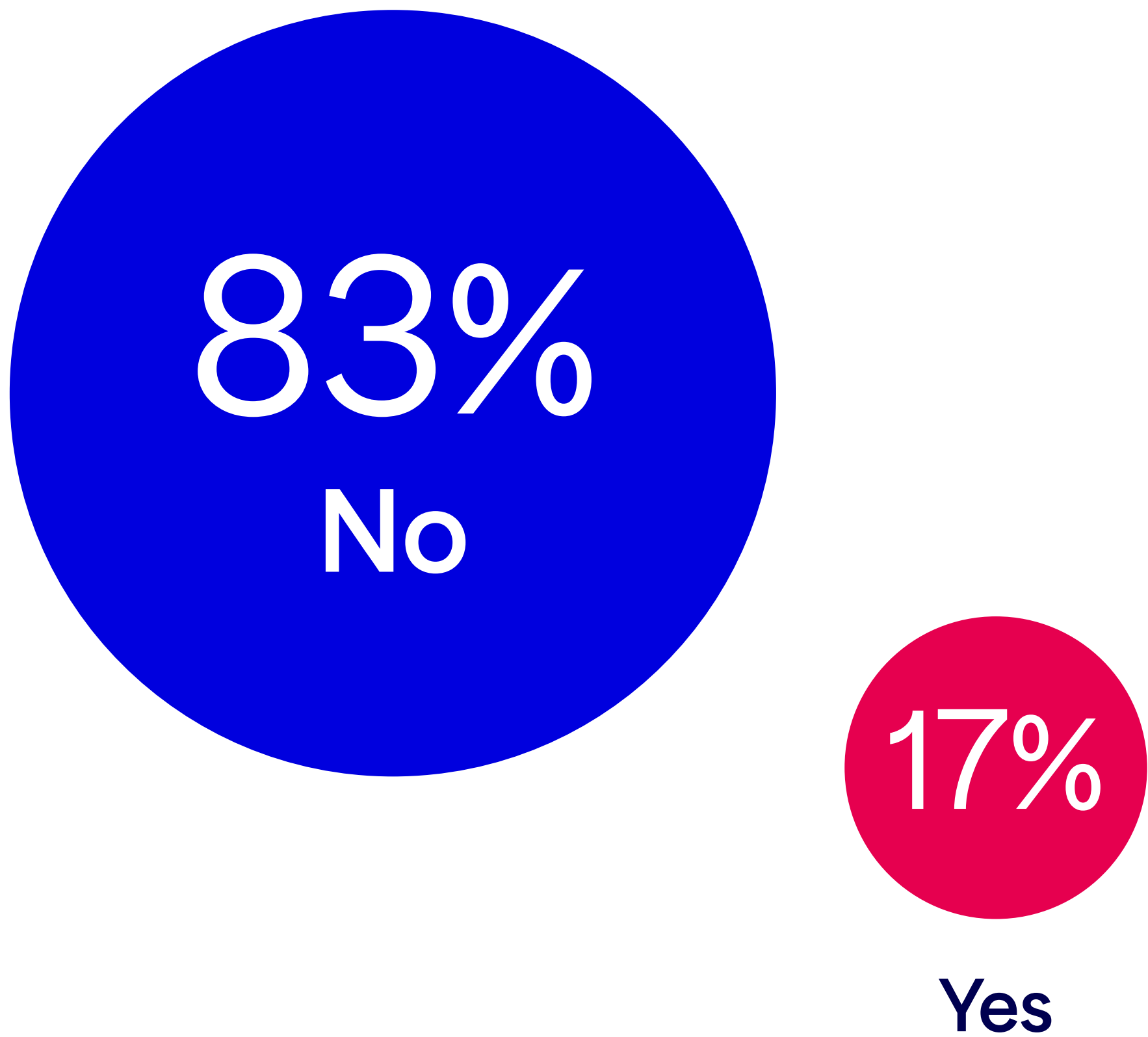

Have you been discriminated against or mistreated?

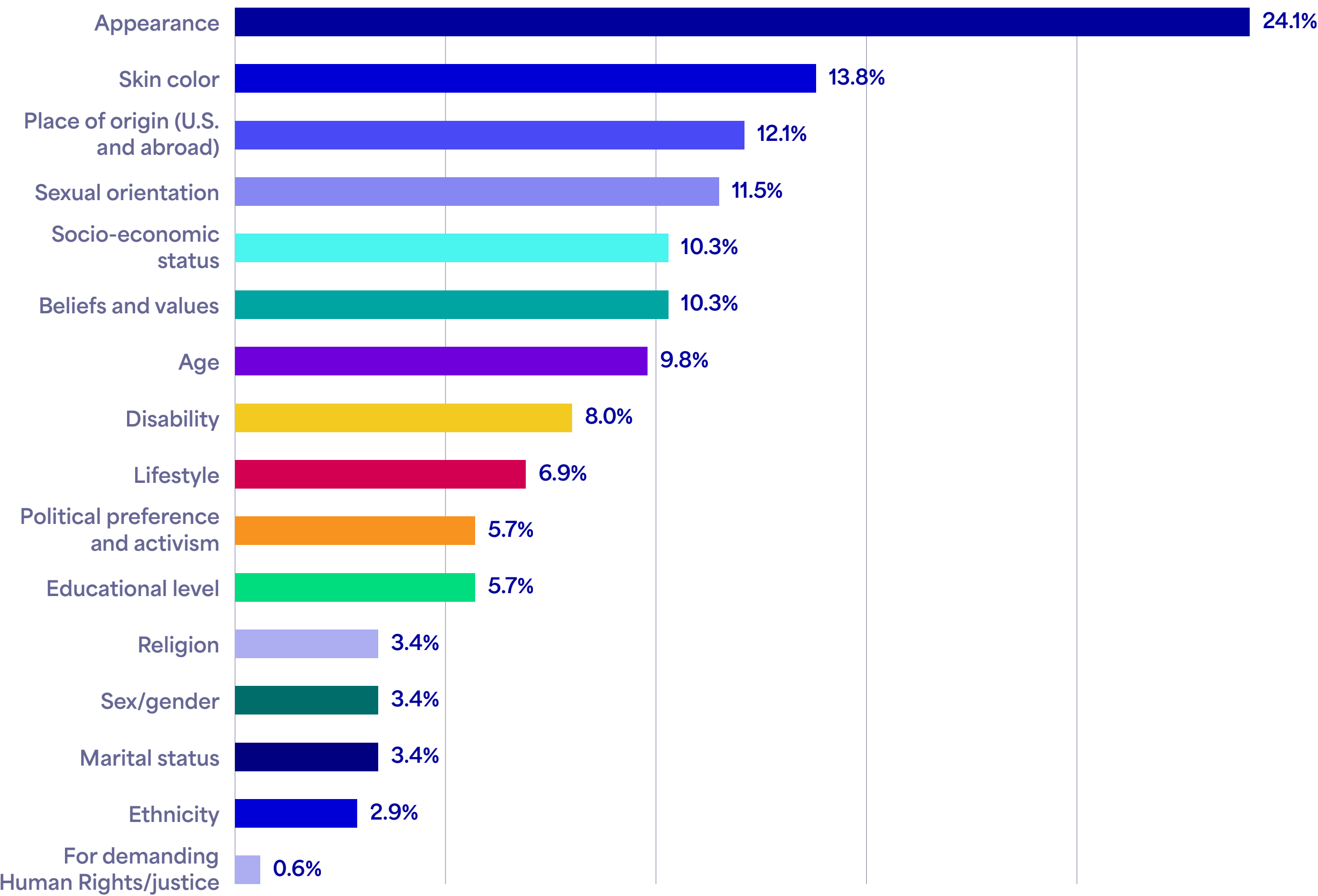

Public Safety: Key Insights

The FBI reports crime data nationwide, broken down by state, city, and metropolitan areas. El Paso County has eleven agencies reporting crimes, including schools, school districts, and police departments.

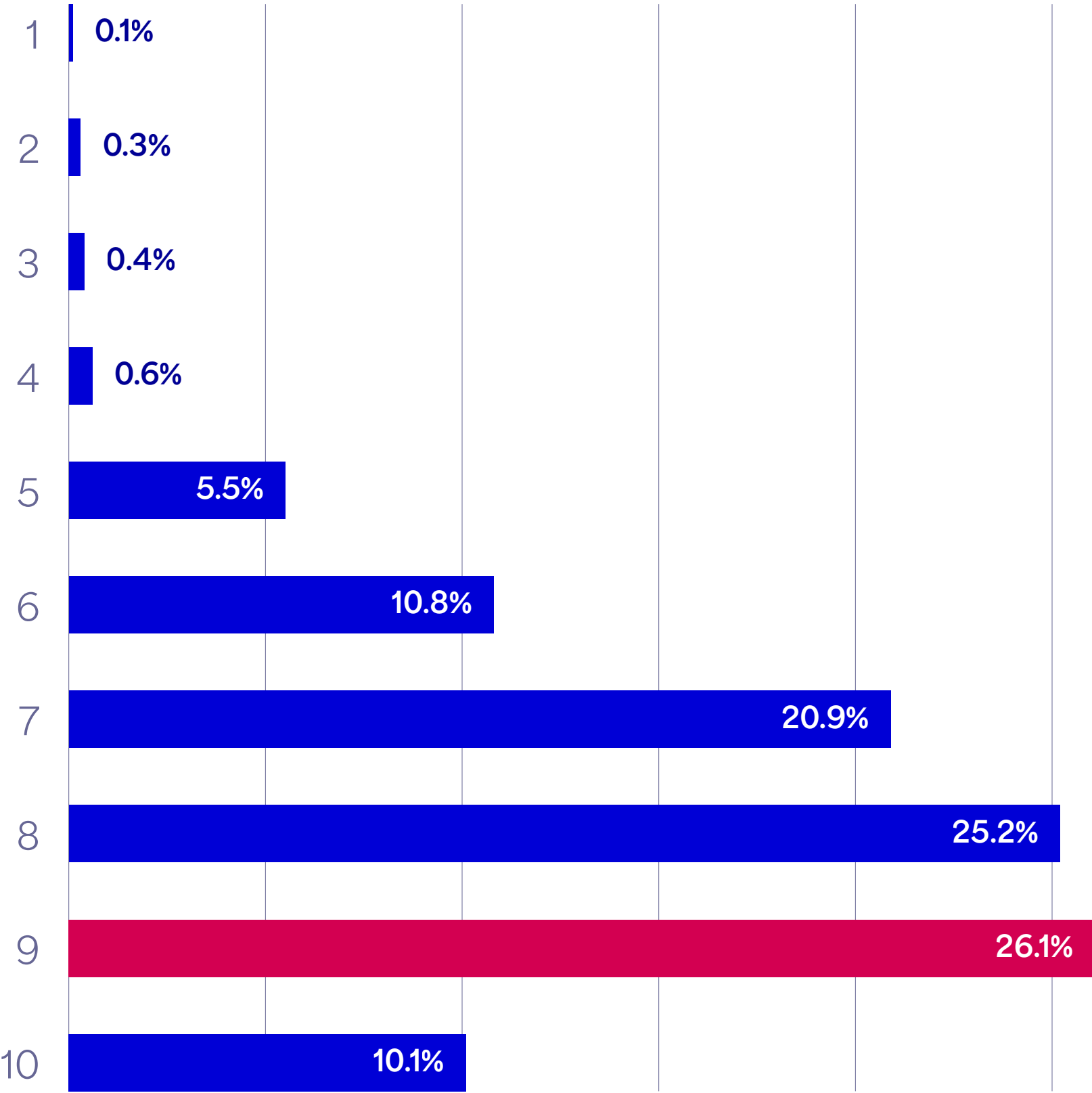
By the end of 2023, El Paso County recorded a total of 15,843 crimes, with 81% being property crimes and 19% violent crimes. The most common property crime was larceny (67%), followed by vehicle theft (21%), burglary (10%), and arson (less than 1%).

Among violent crimes, 65% were aggravated assaults, followed by rape (21%), robbery (12%), and homicide (less than 2%).

Crime rates in El Paso have increased over the past three years, with 2023 seeing the highest number of crimes in five years, while the clearance rate (crimes resulting in arrests or identified suspects) has declined over the last five years, reaching its lowest point in 2023, with only 15% of cases closed.

How safe do you consider the City of El Paso?

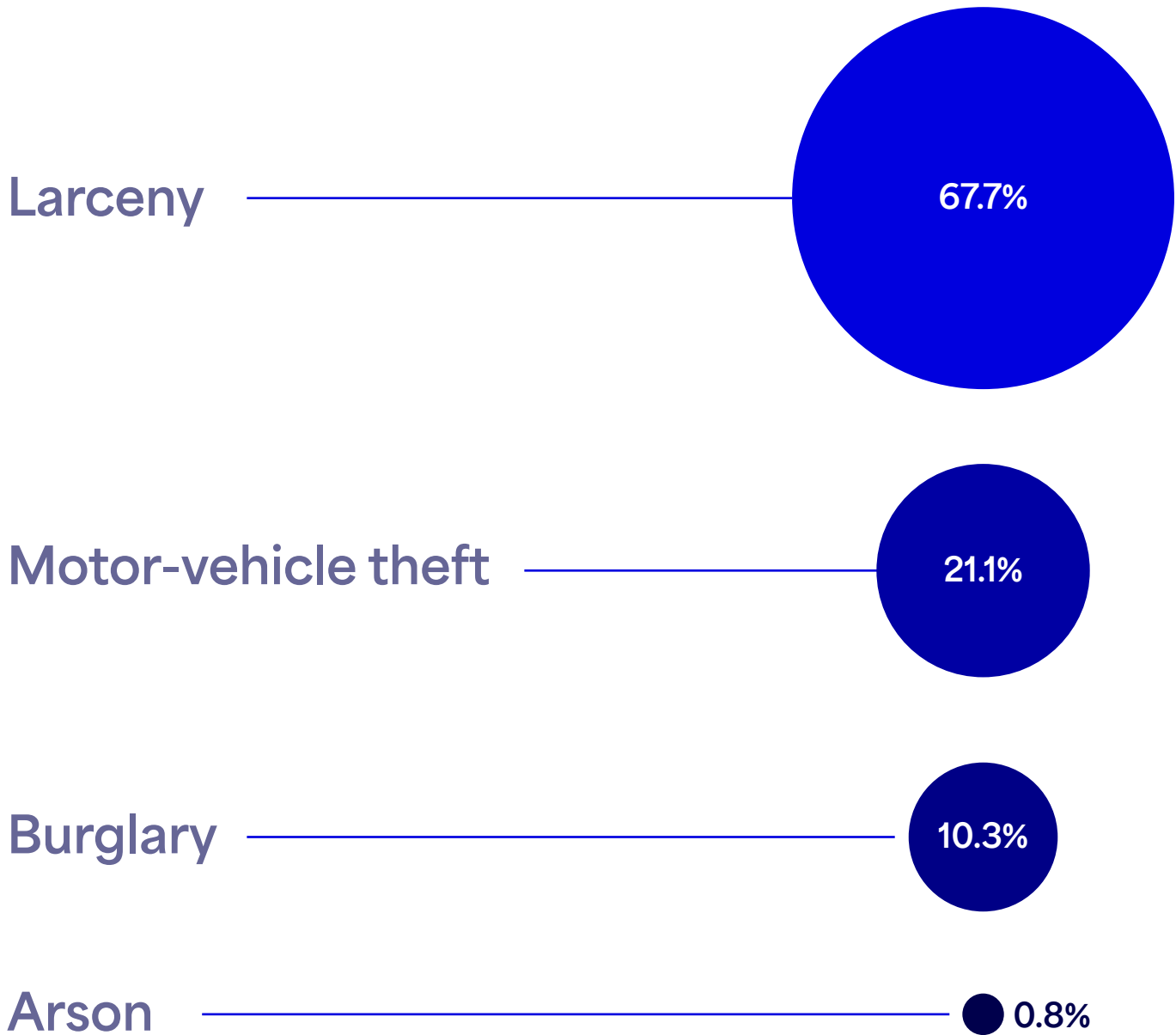

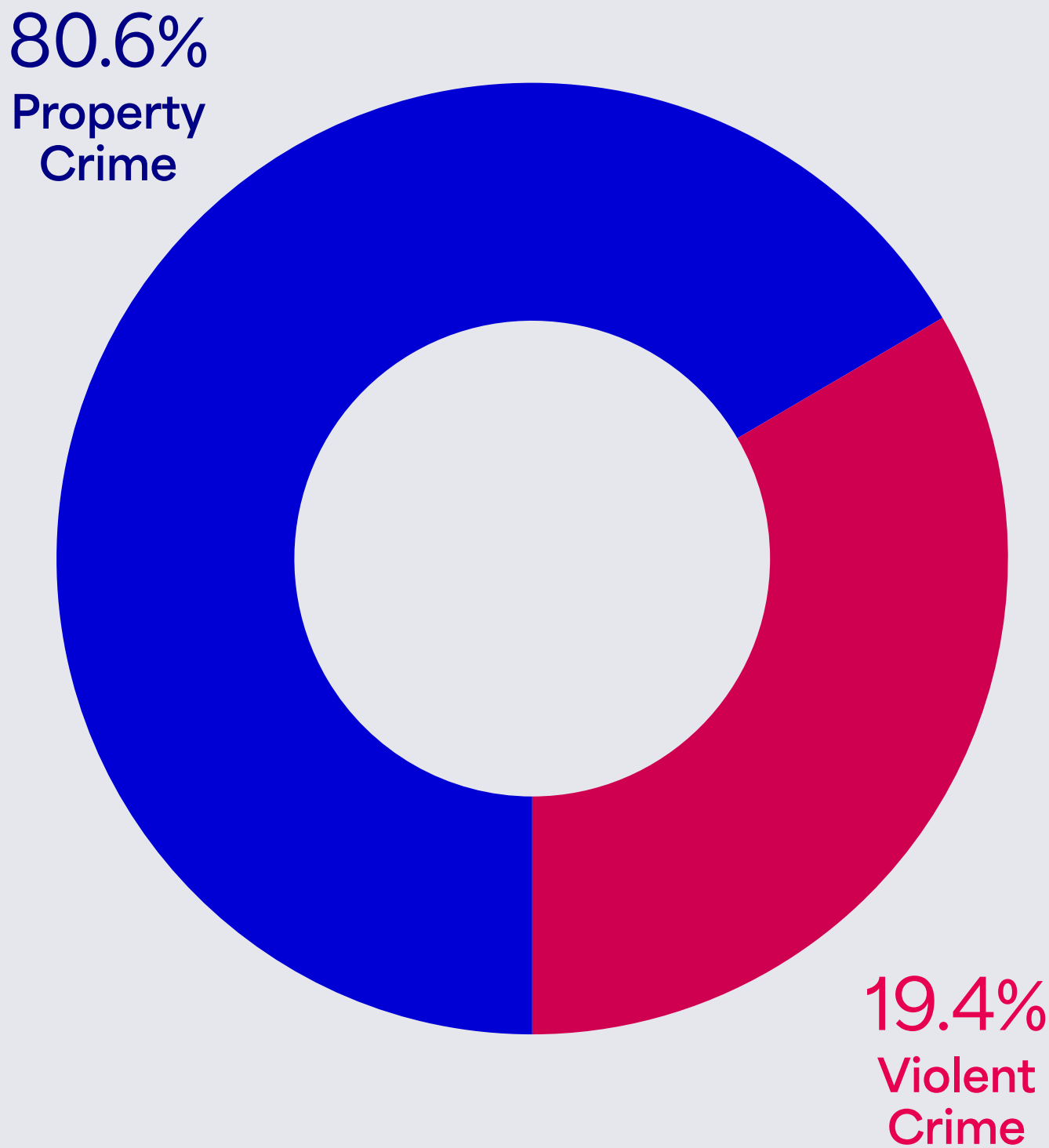

Crime by type

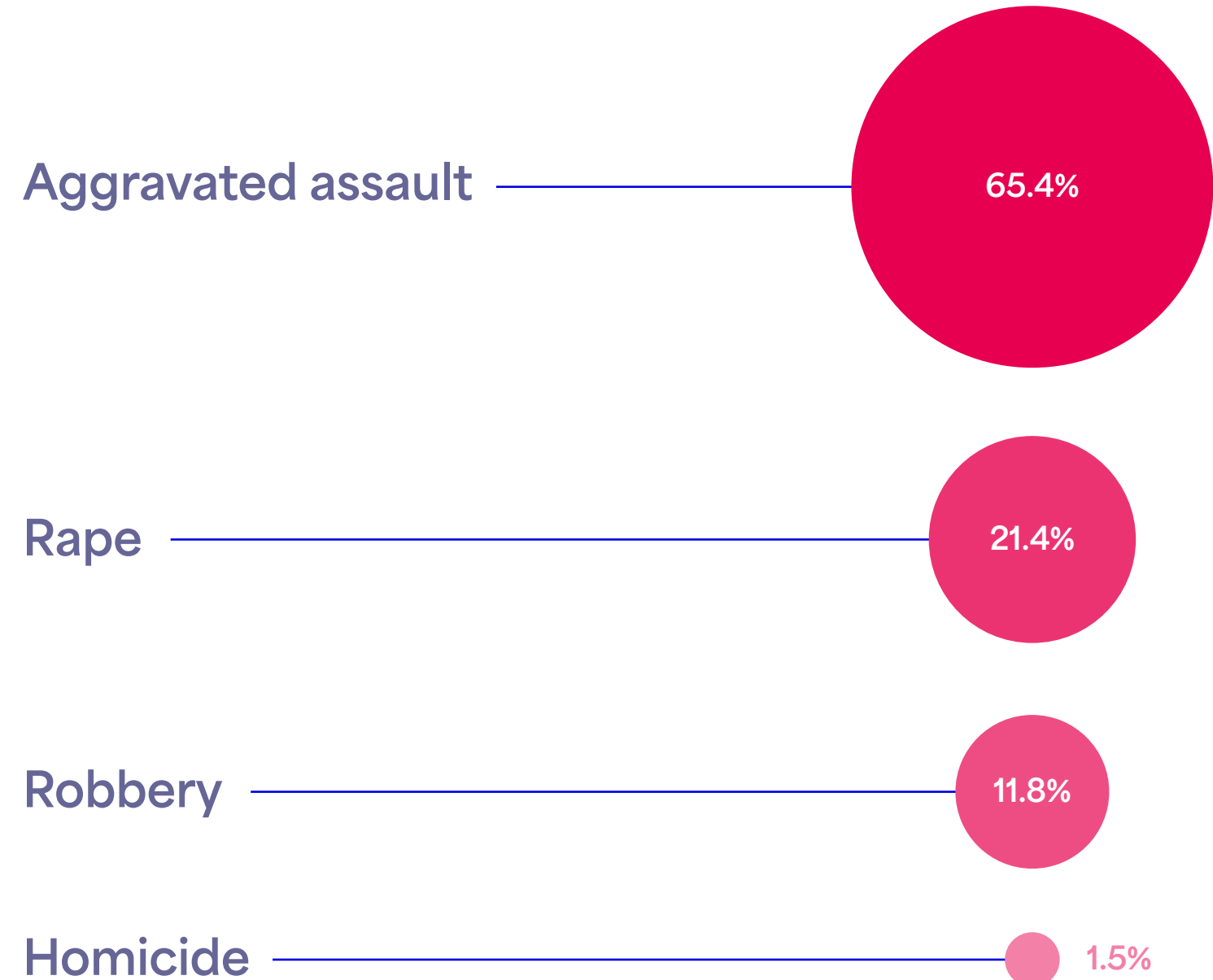

Violent Crime by type

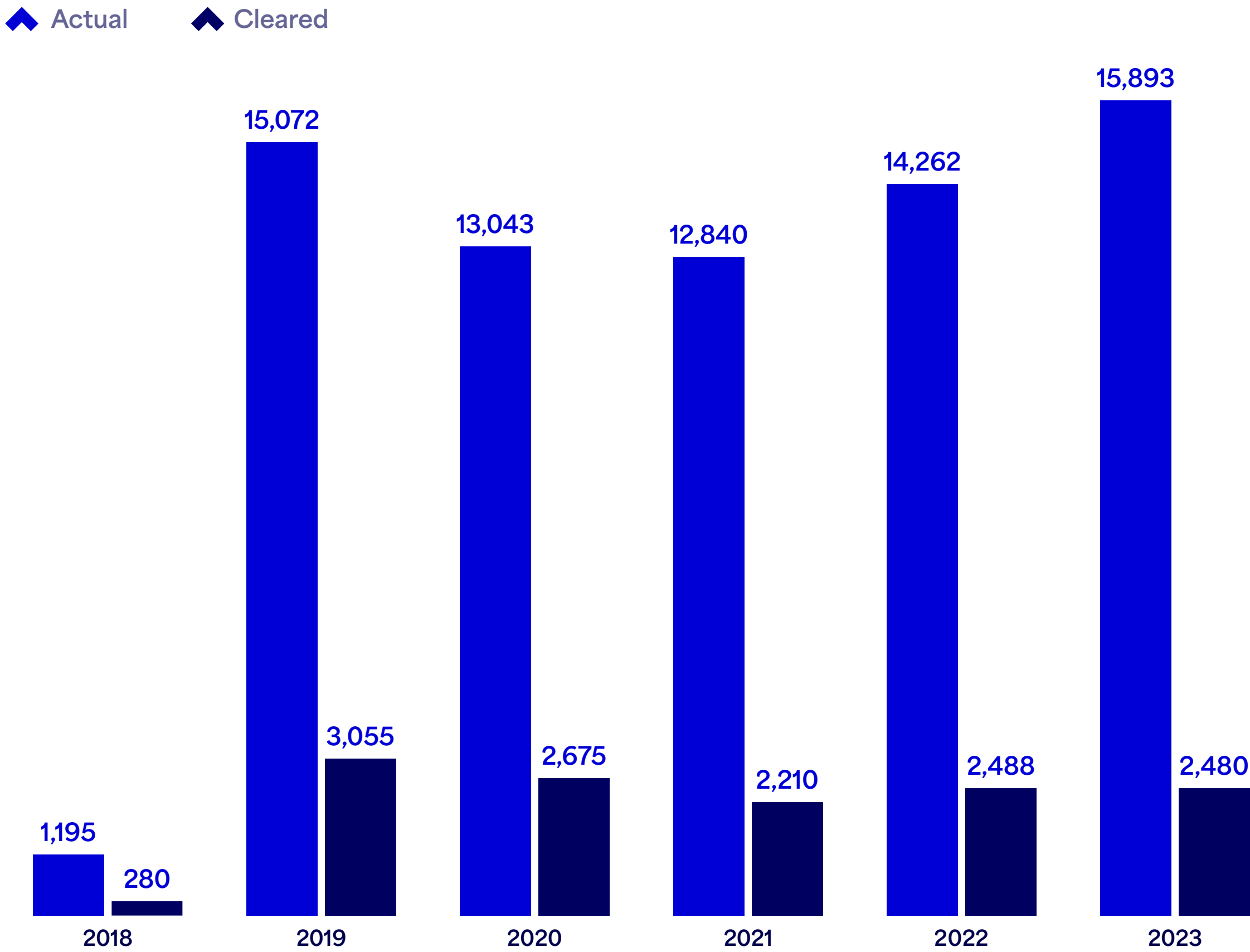

Total crimes

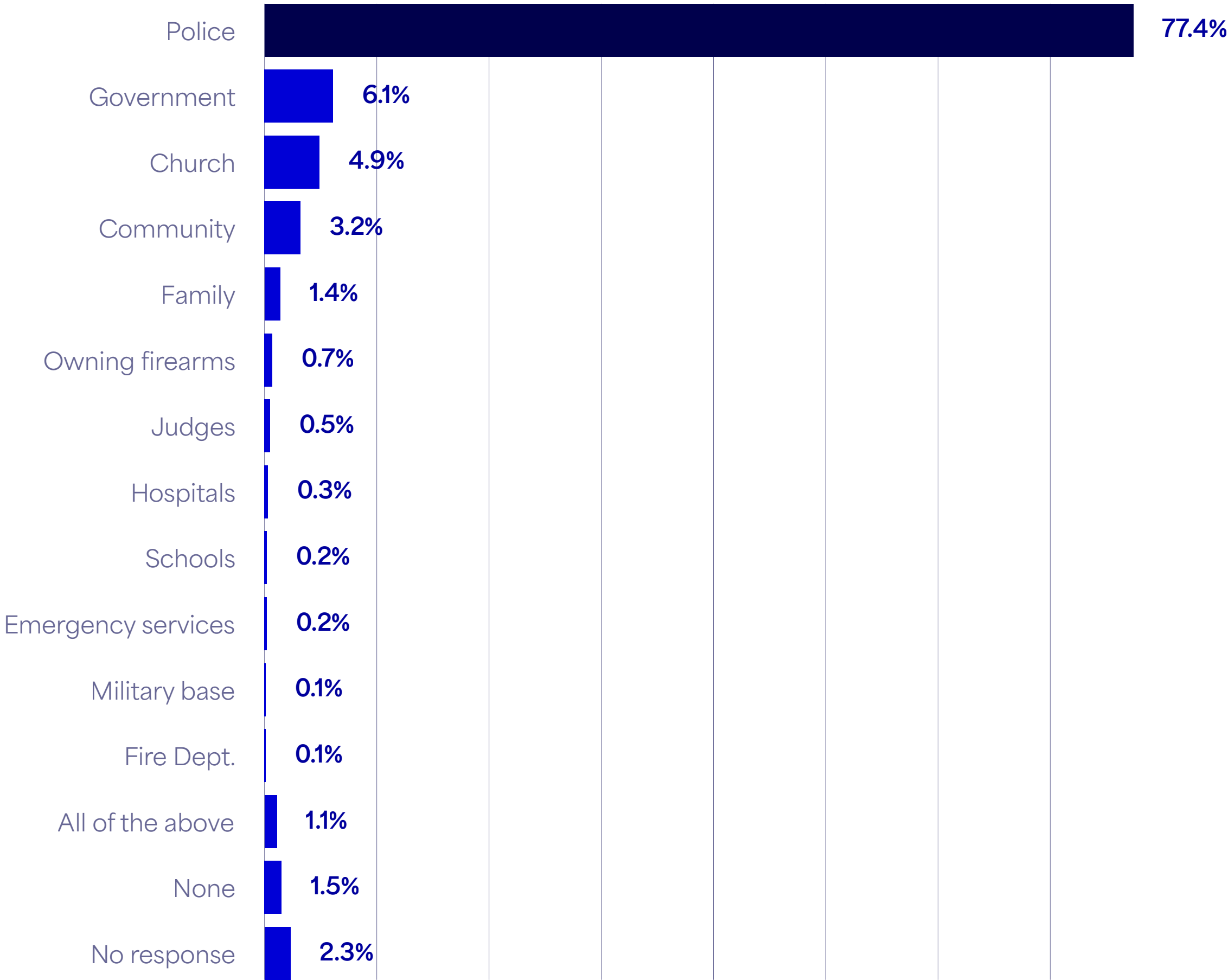

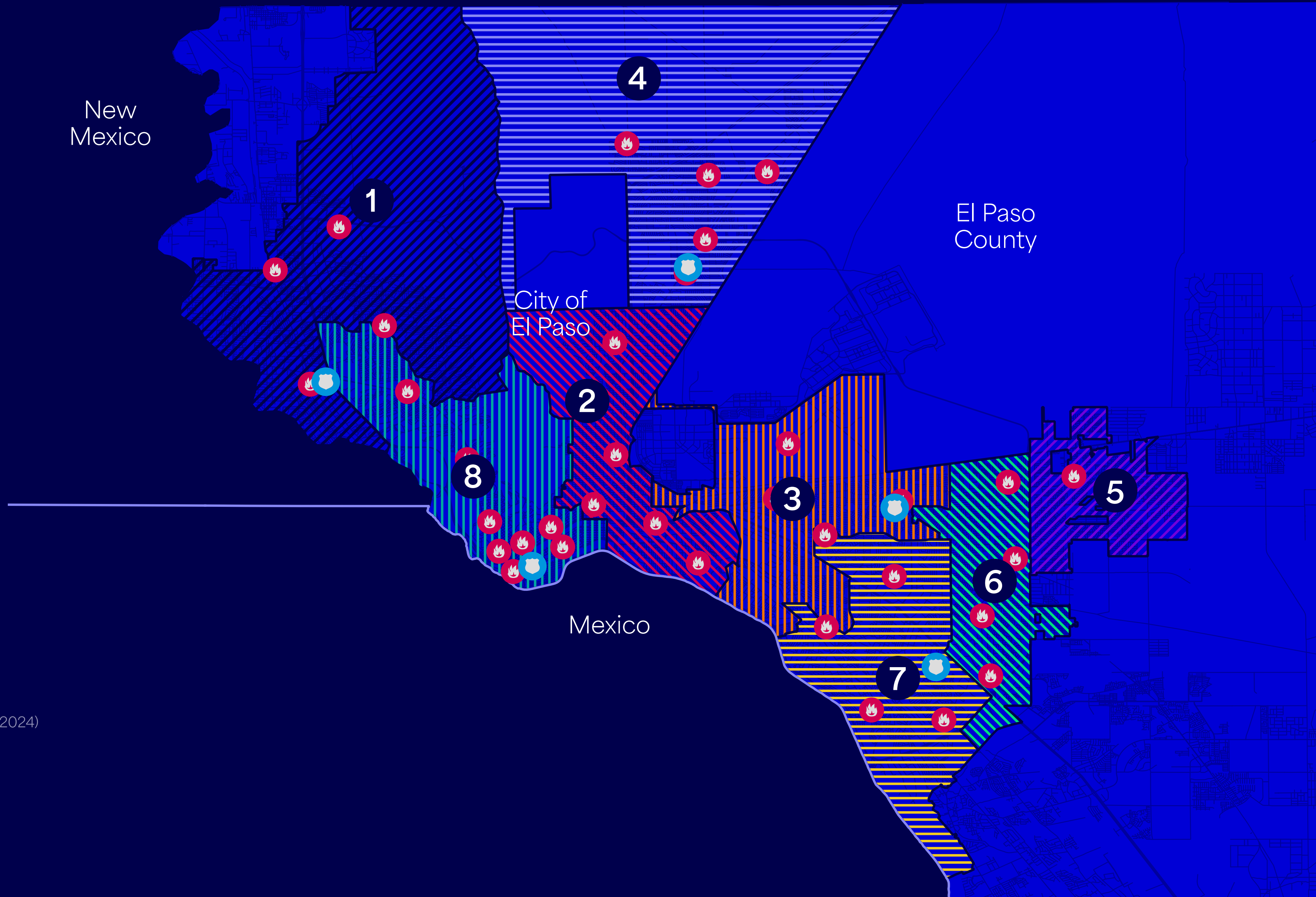

Mobility and Transport: Key Insights

Between 2019 and 2023, about 90% of workers aged 16 and older in El Paso County used a car as their primary mode of transportation, with only 1% using public transport and the remainder walking, cycling, using taxis, motorcycles, or working from home.

A significant increase in remote work occurred in 2021, rising from 4.4% in 2020 to 10%, closely linked to changes in work patterns due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

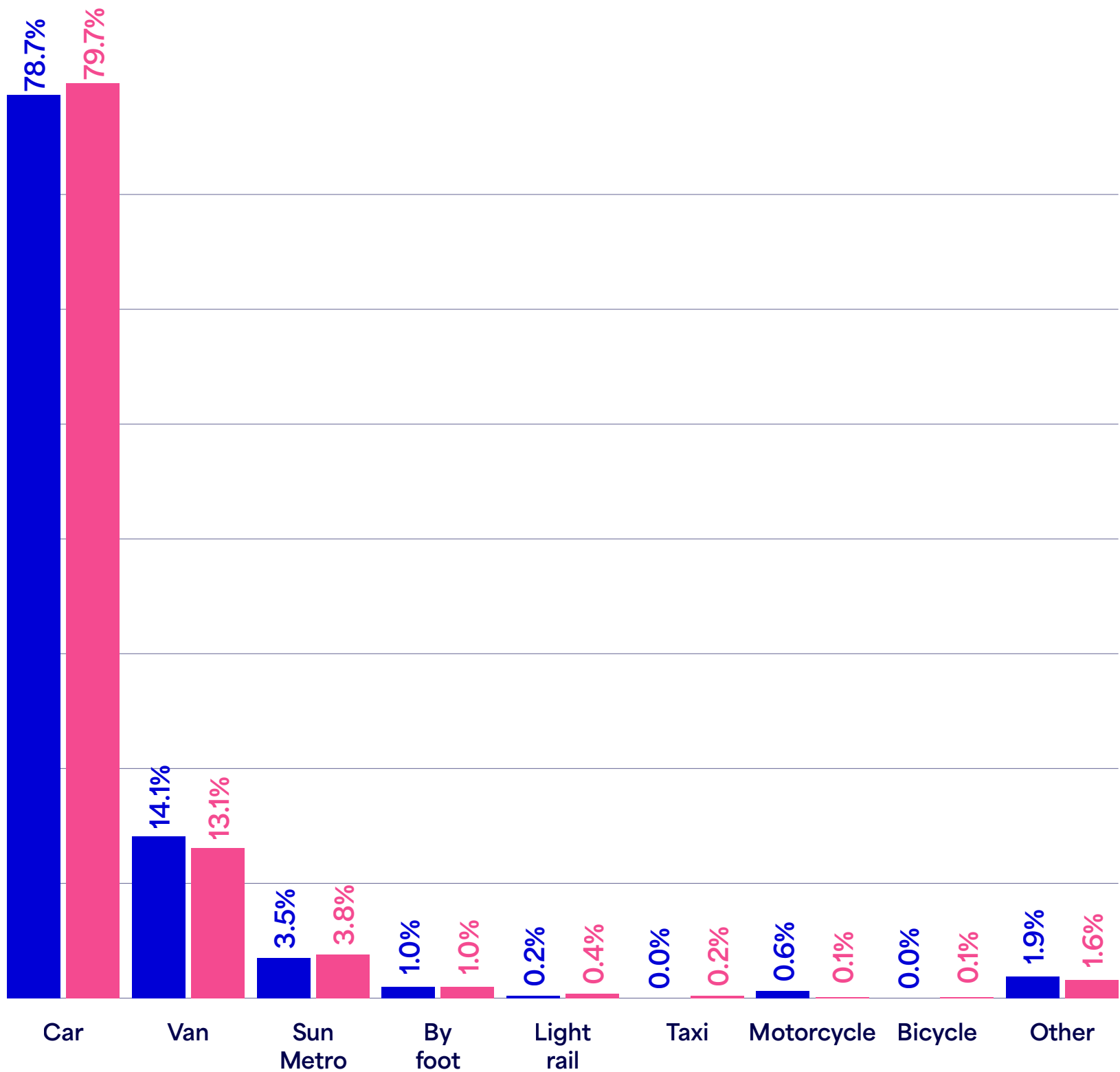
The average commute time in El Paso County is about 24 minutes, with most workers employed within the county. In comparison, the state average for Texas in 2023 was 27.2 minutes, with 21% of workers commuting outside their residential area.

By 2023, 41% of workers aged 16 and older lived in households with three vehicles, while only 2% lived in households without a vehicle, a trend consistent since 2019.

How do you commute to work or anywhere else?

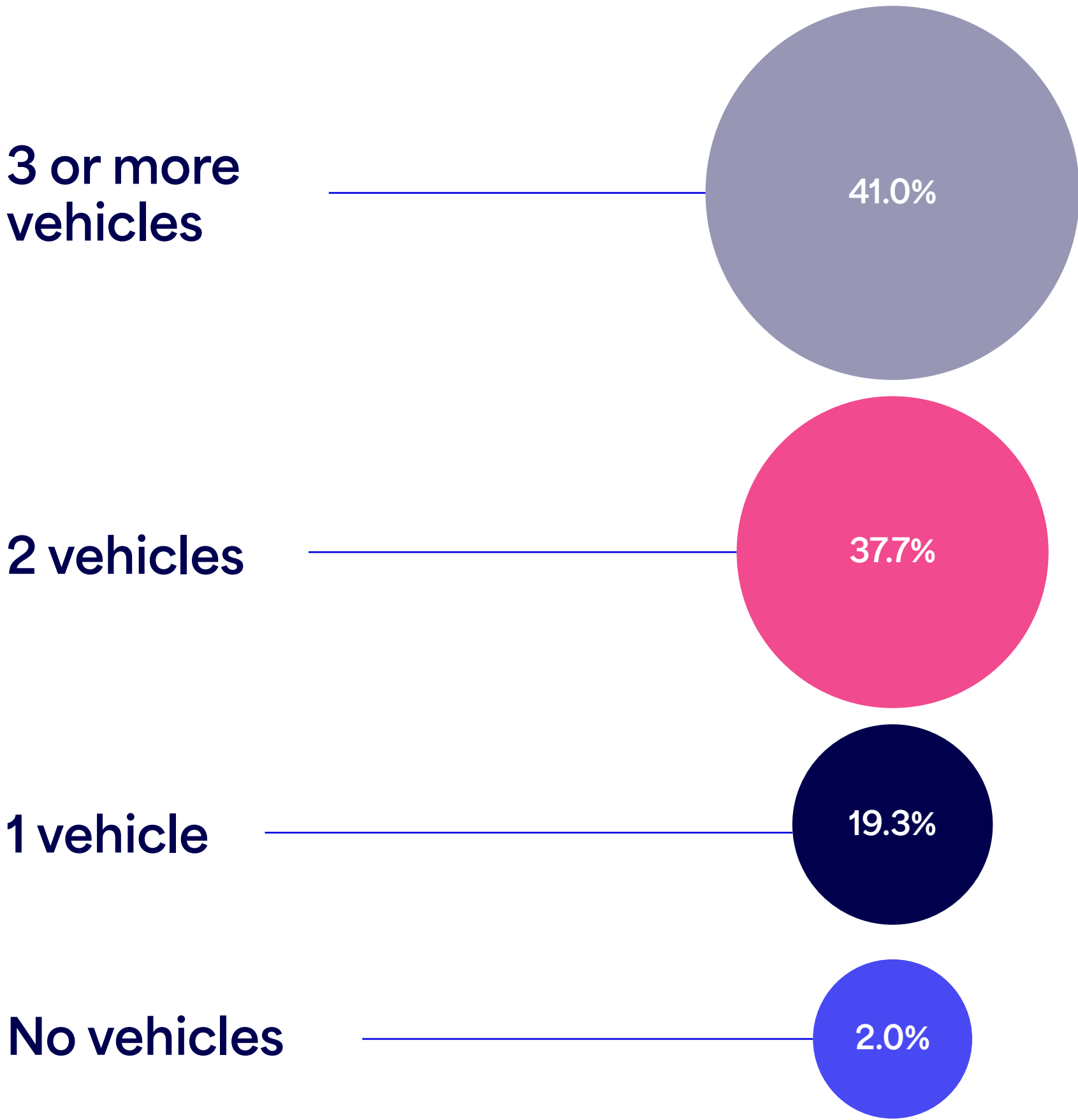
By transportation type

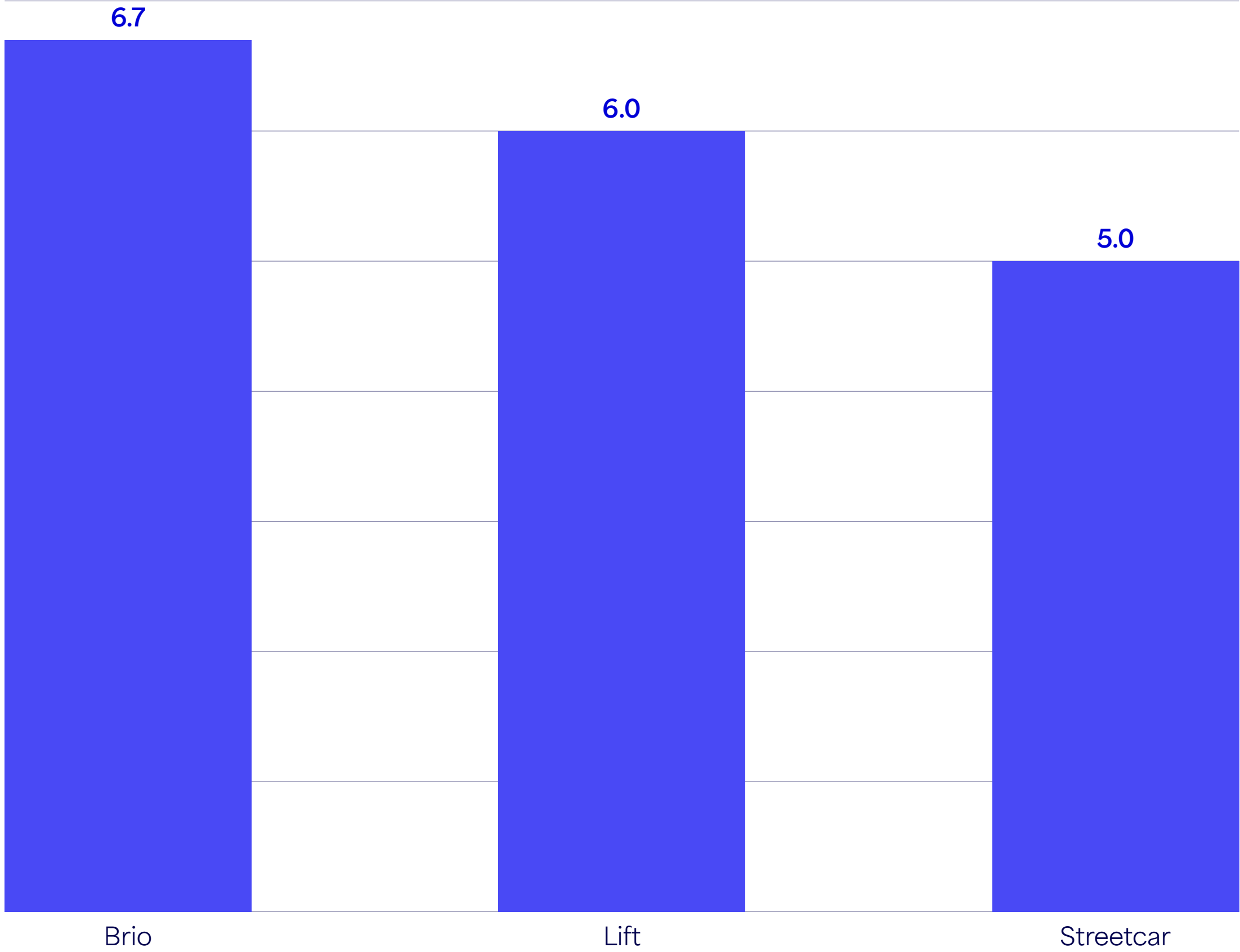

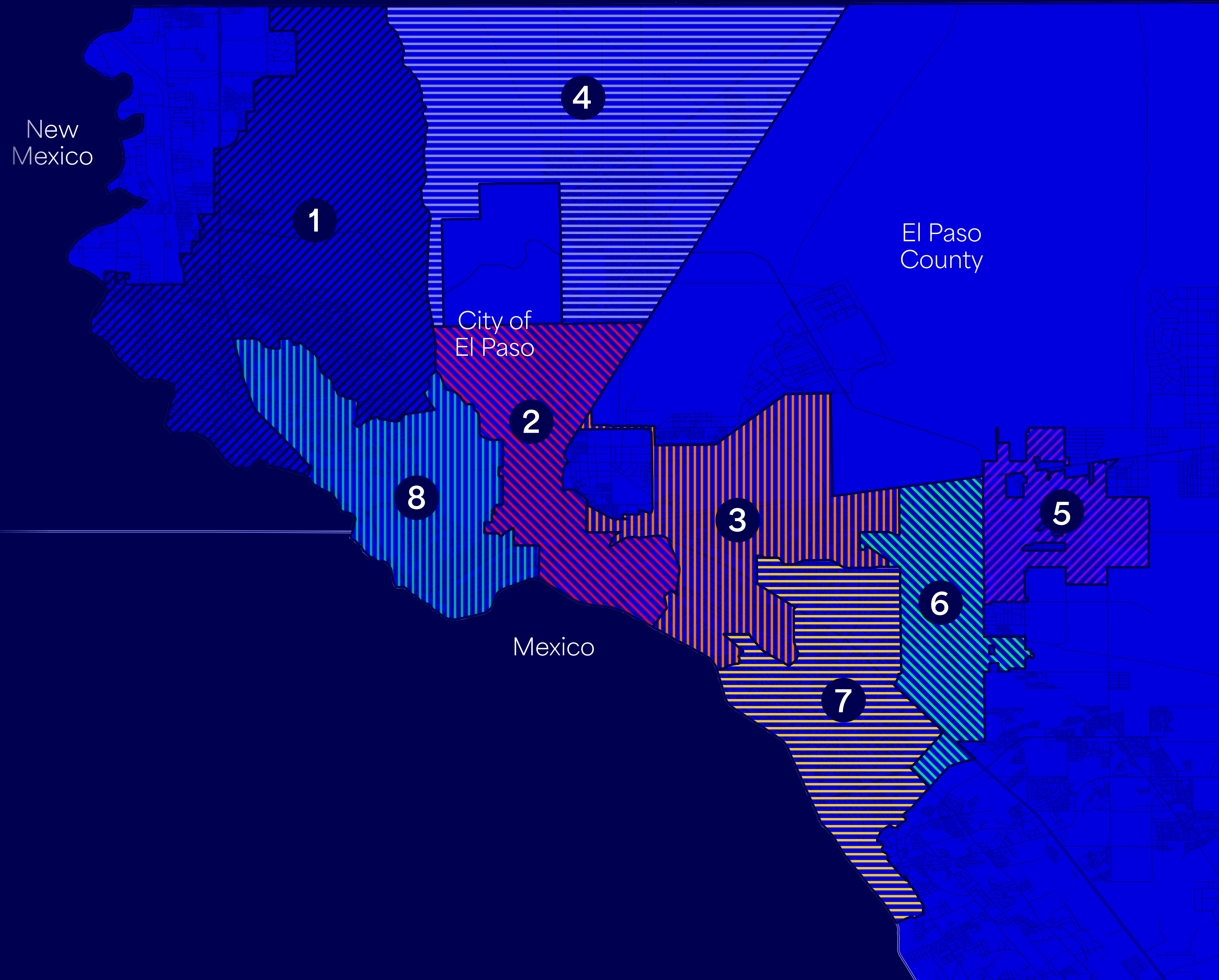

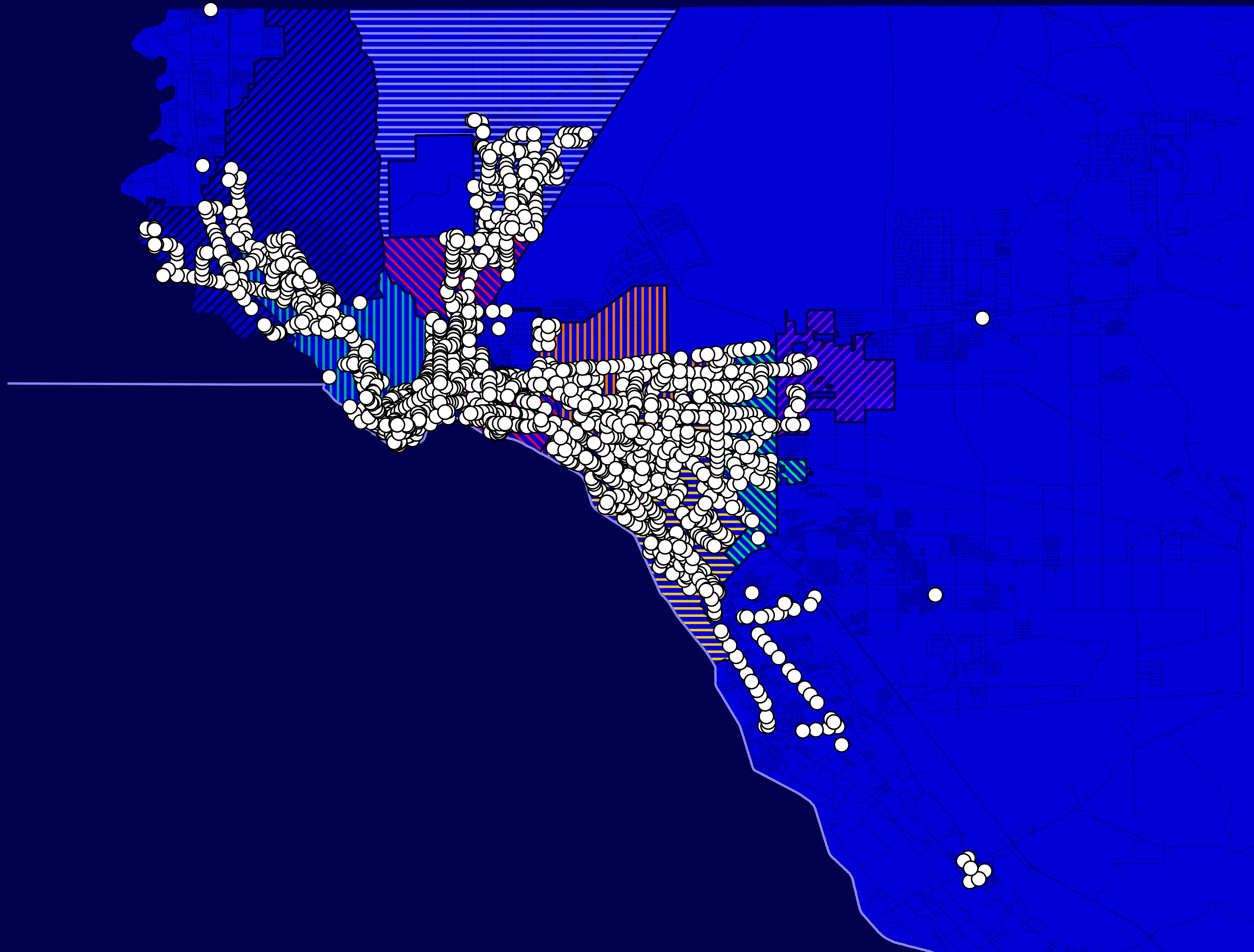

Utilities and Public Spaces: Key Insights

Overall, the El Paso community gives its utilities and public spaces a similar score, around eight on a 1-10 scale.

Garbage collection stands out as the most highly rated service at 8.4, whereas basic utilities like electricity and water receive the lowest ratings at 7.8.

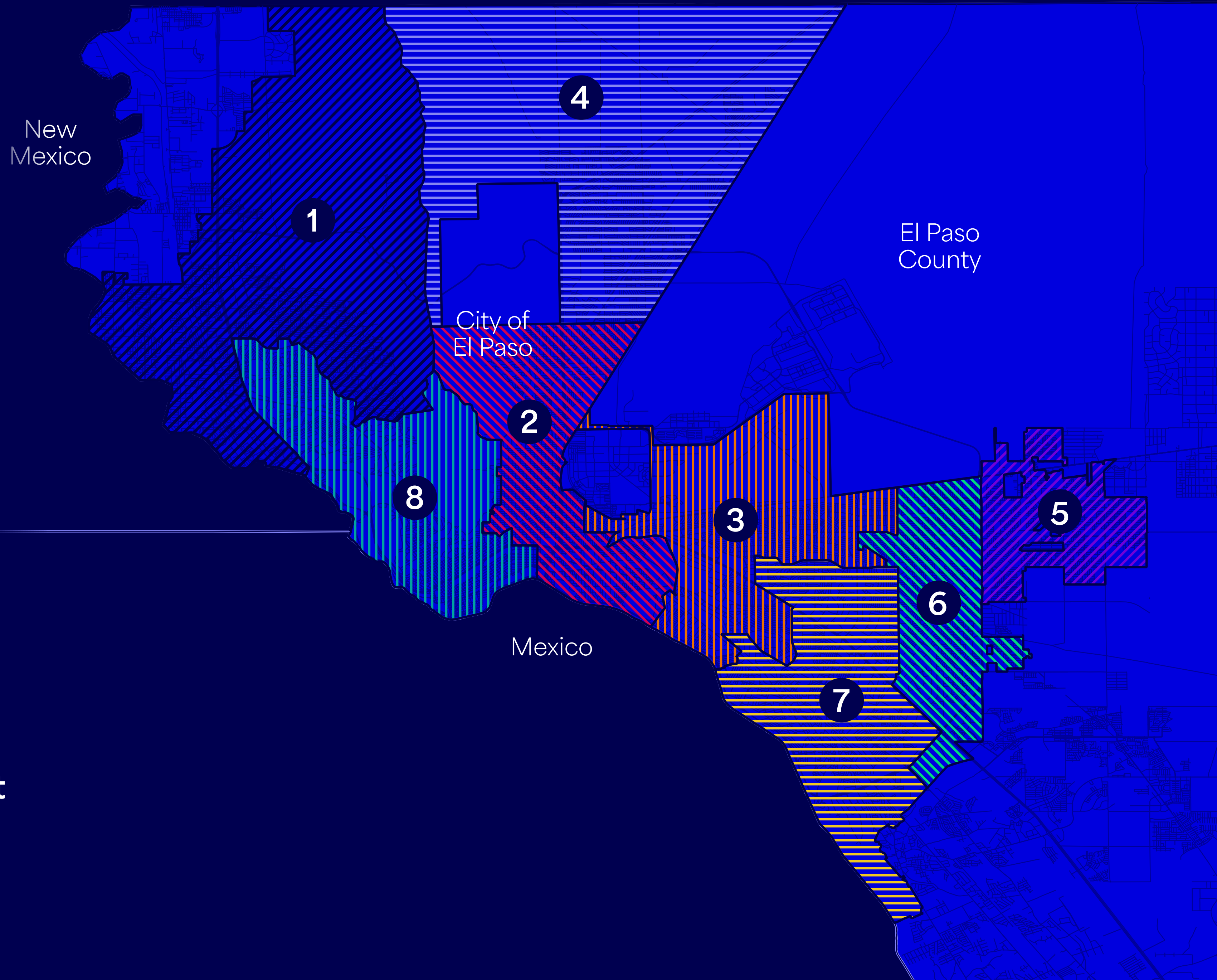
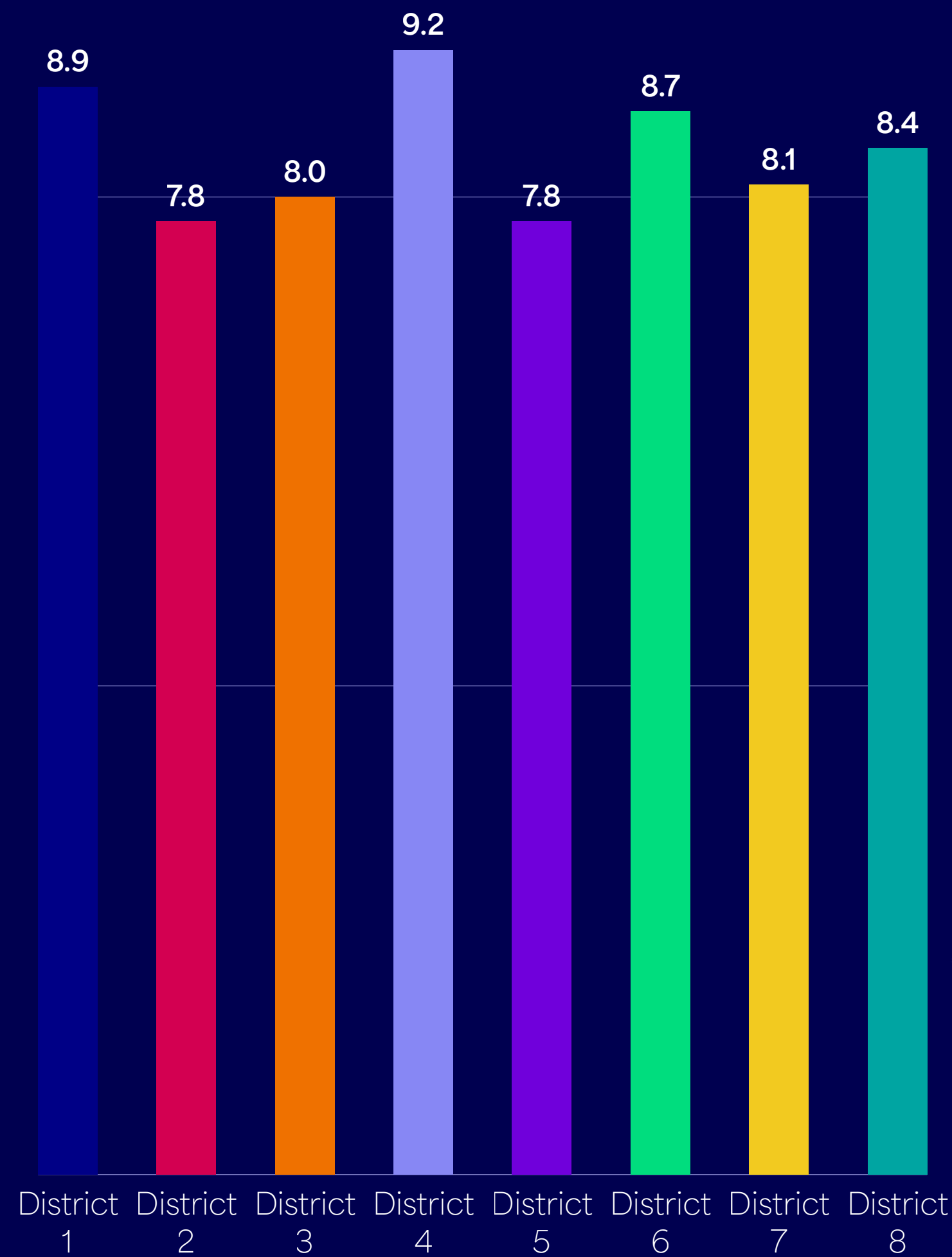
Evaluating the ratings by districts, districts 1 and 4 consistently express the highest satisfaction with their utilities and public areas, with ratings reaching up to 9.2.

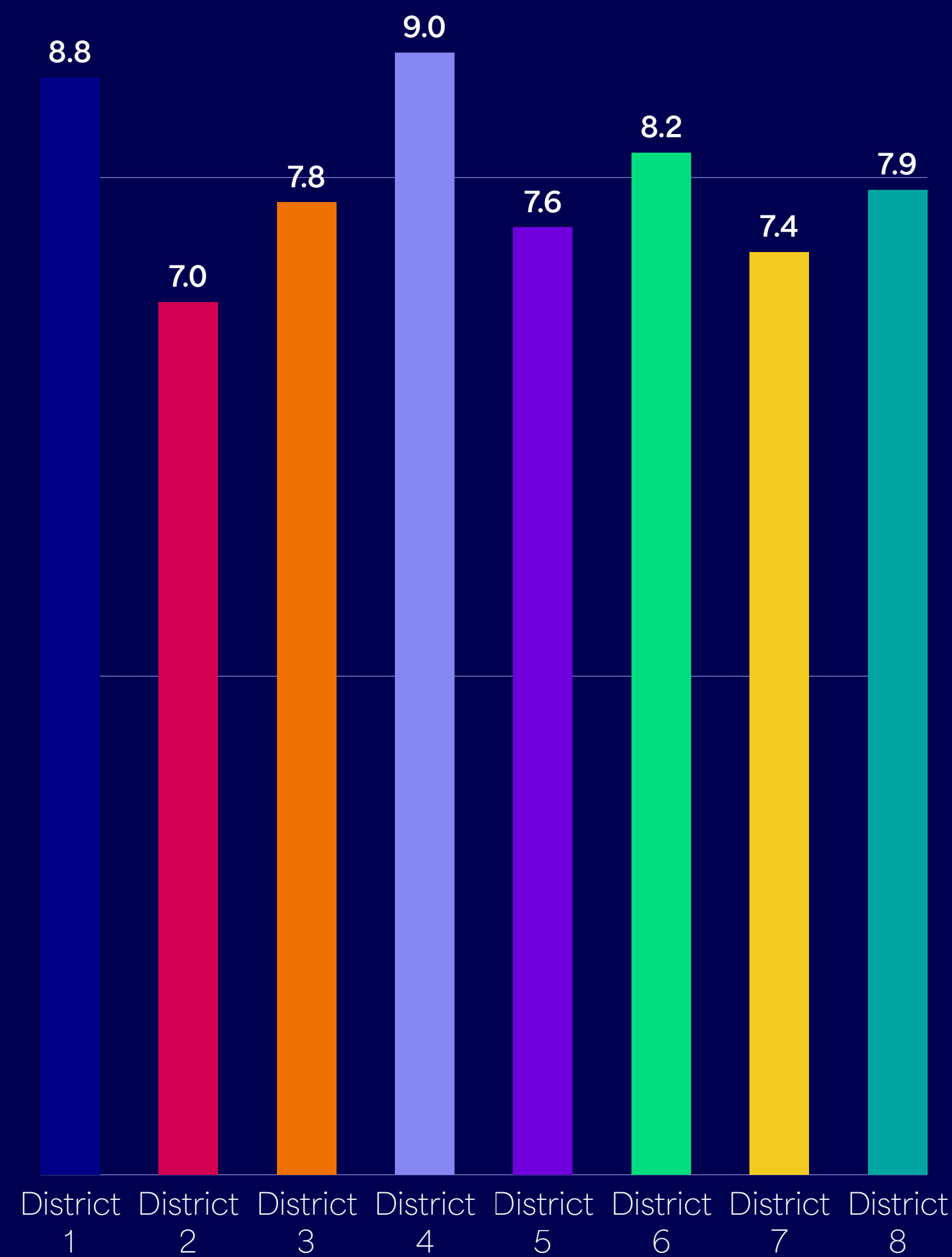

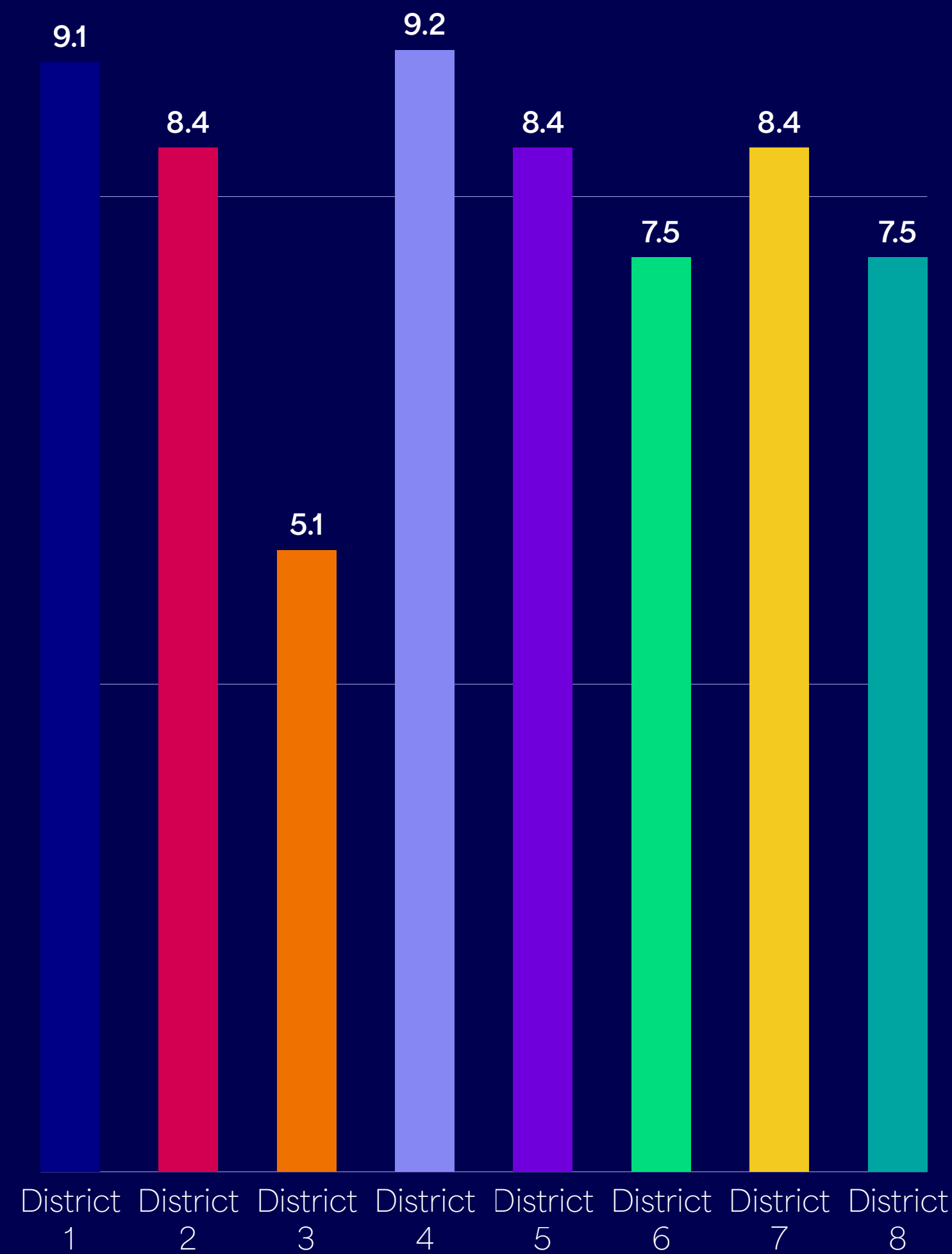


Average satisfaction with street lighting

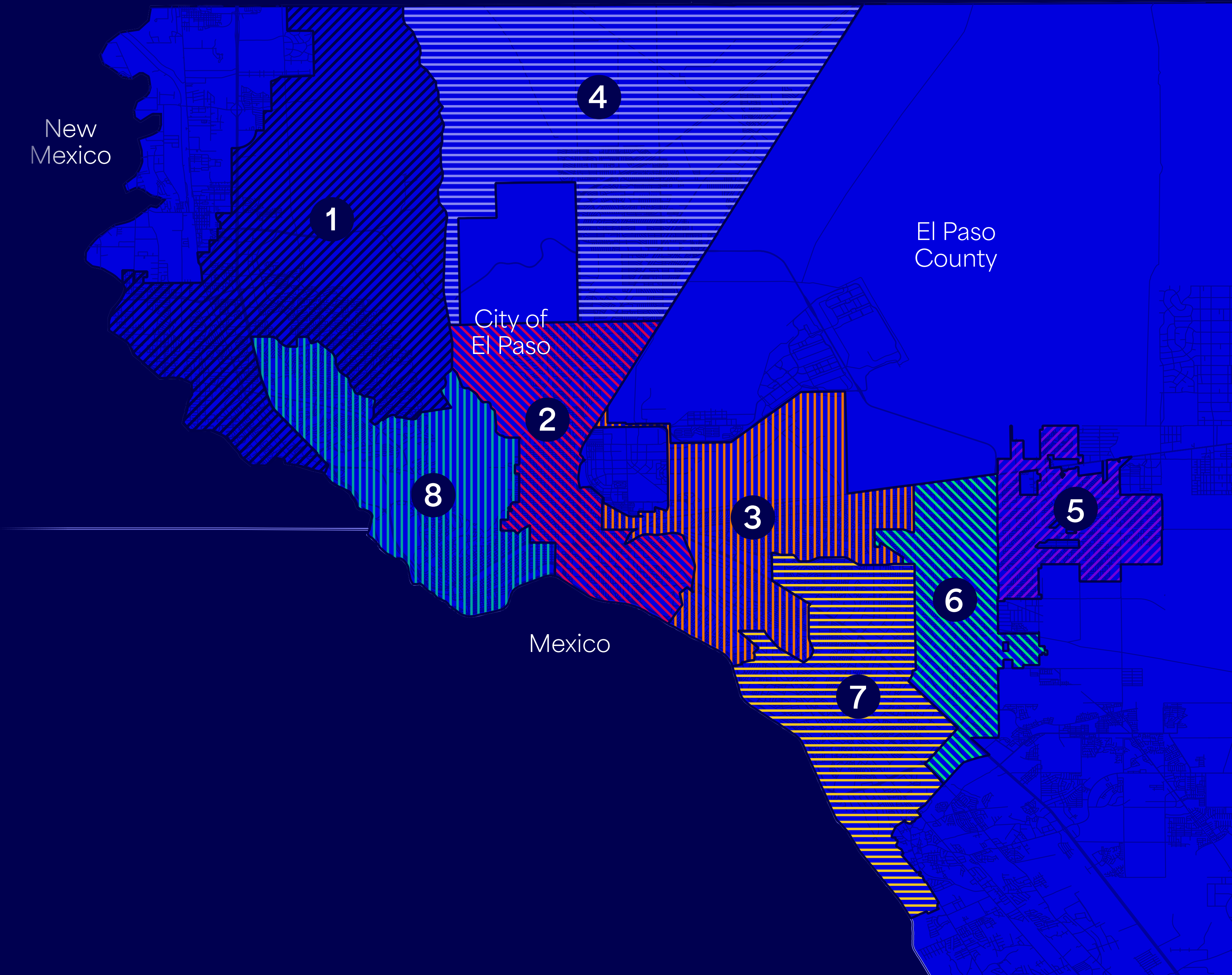


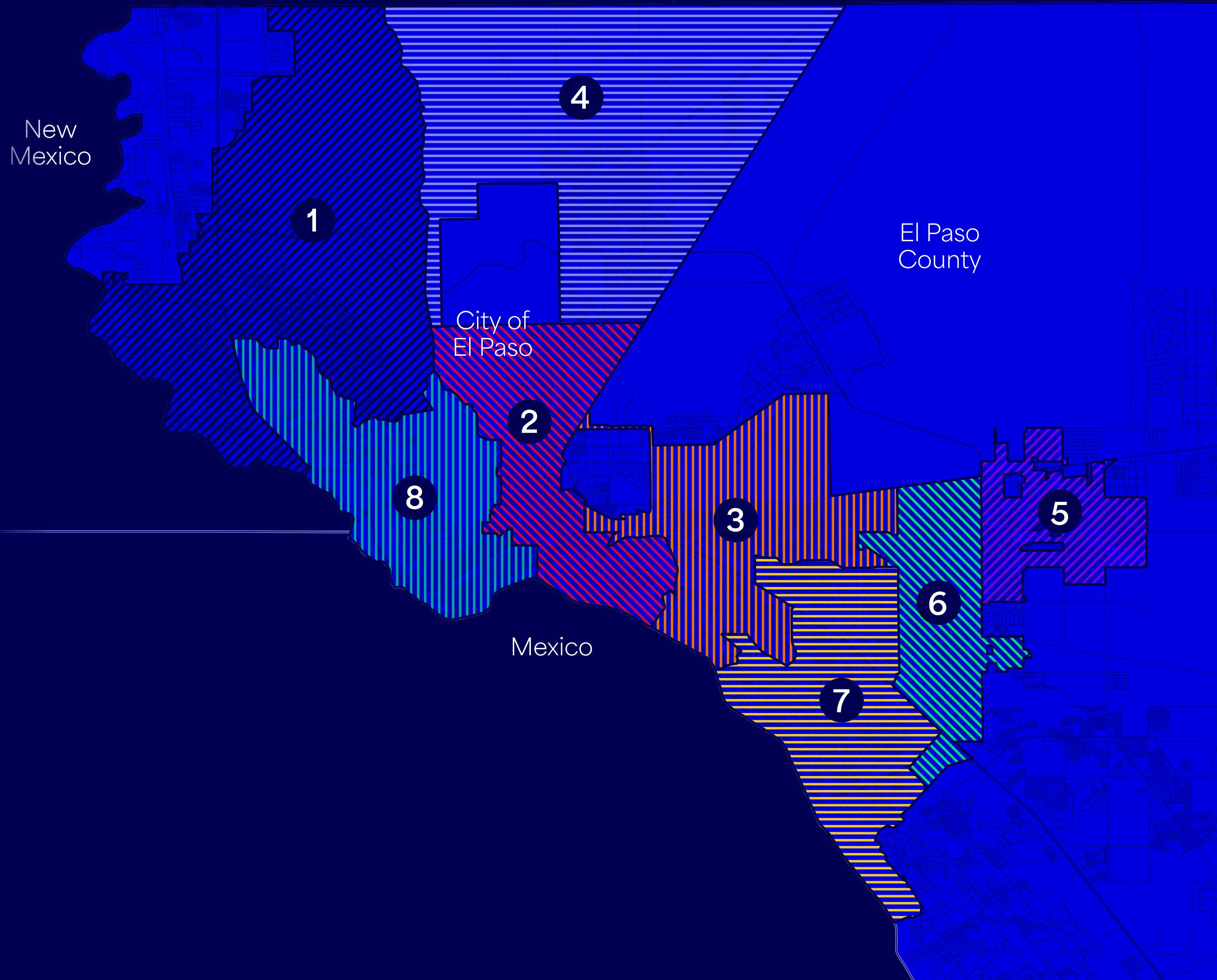
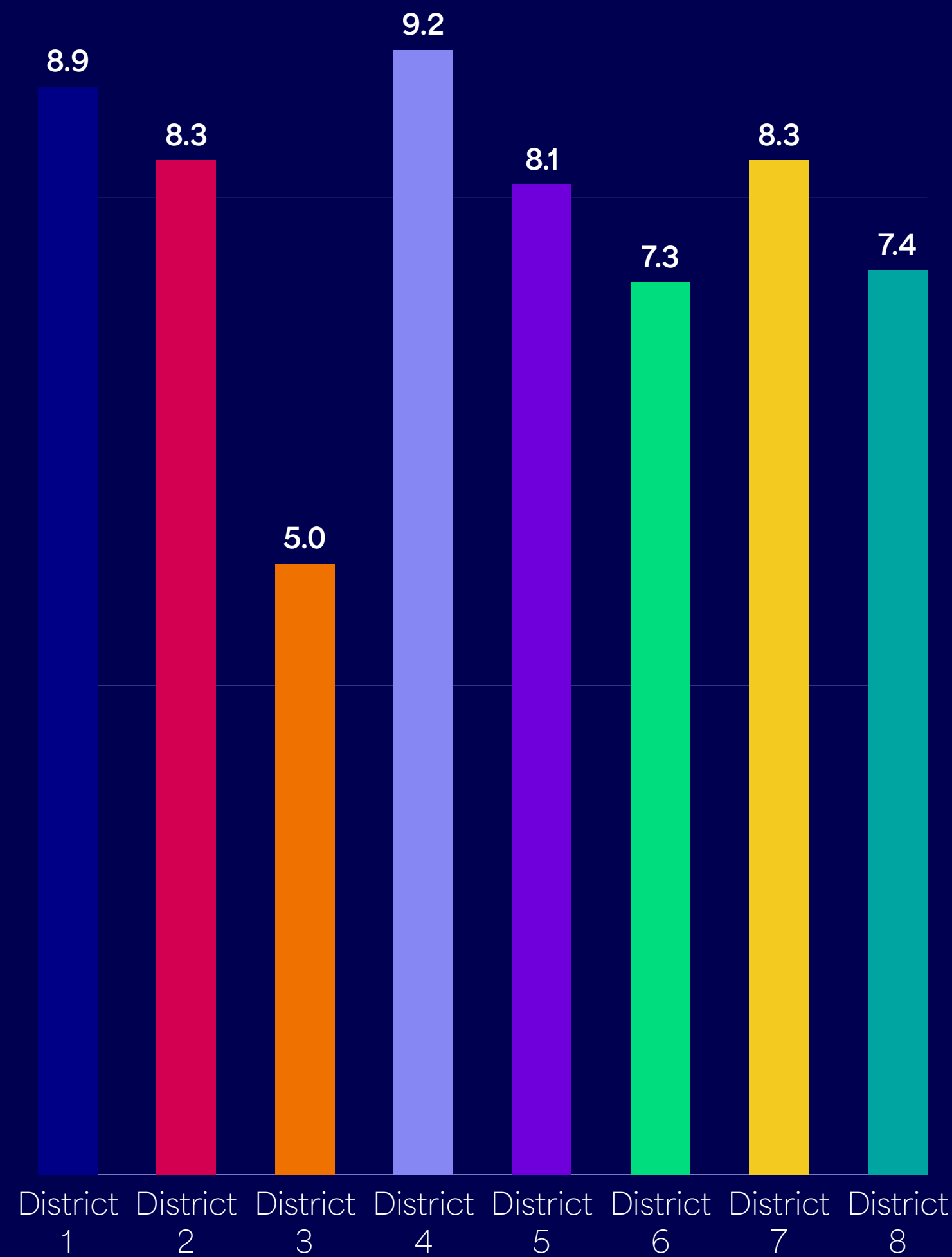


Average satisfaction with natural gas

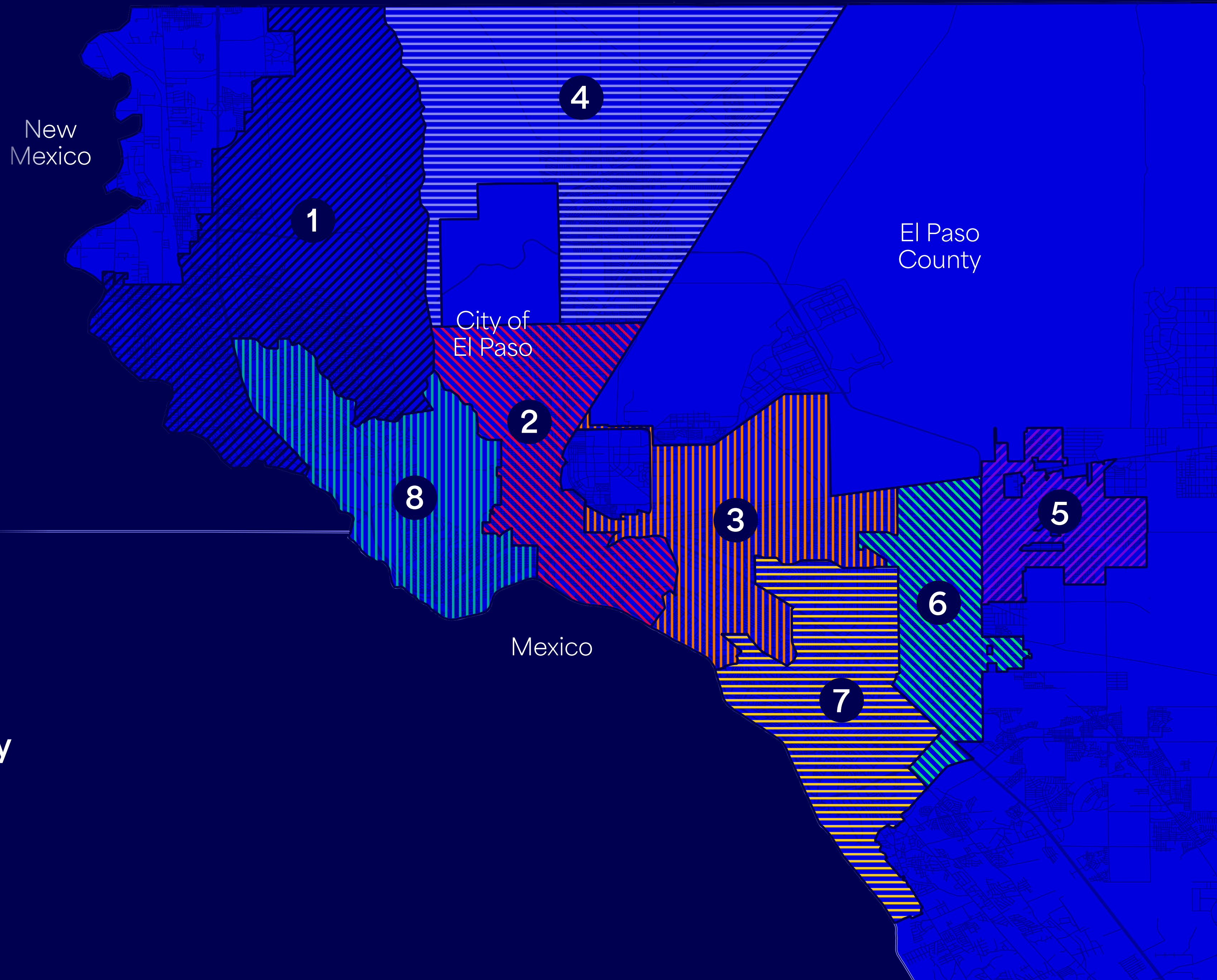
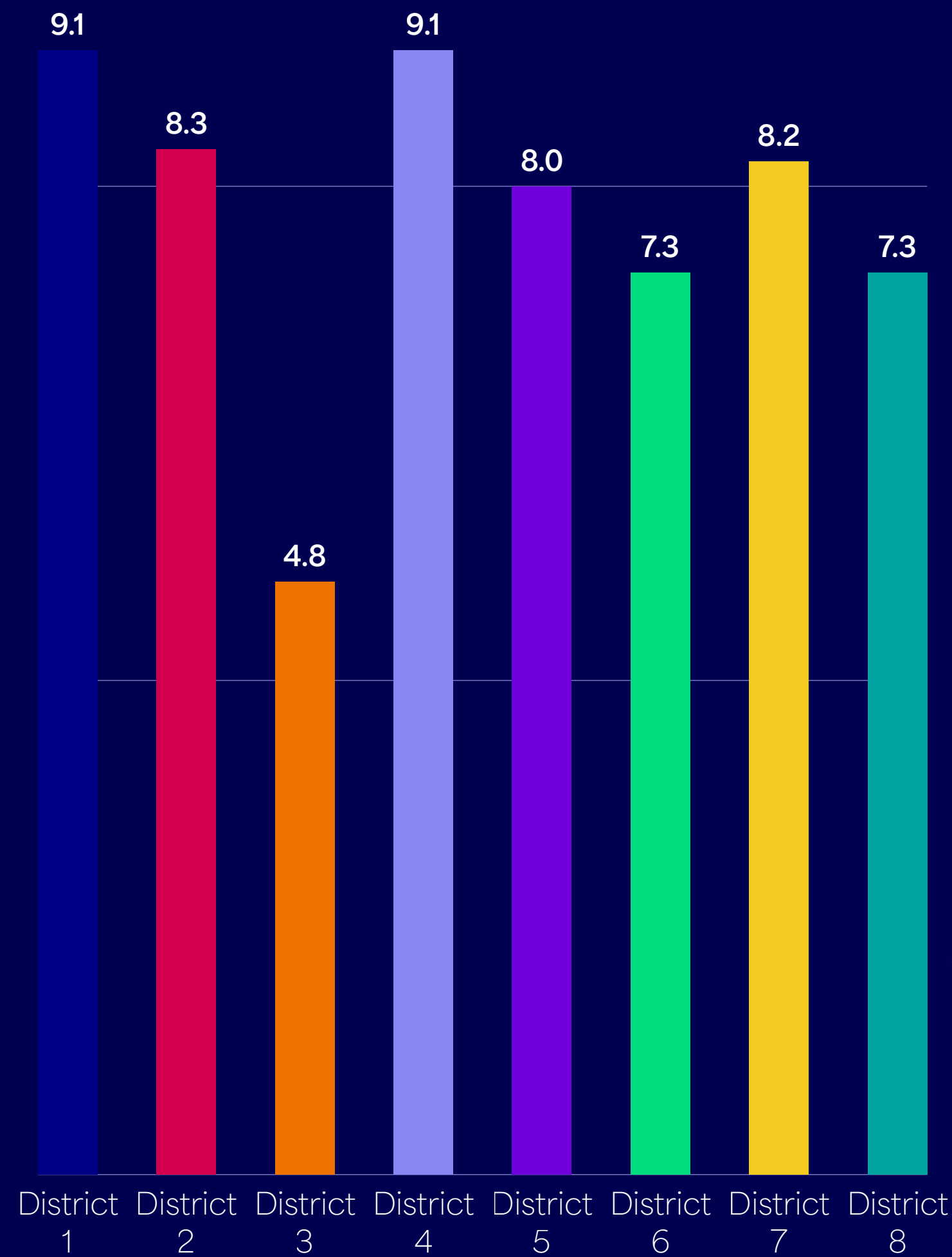




Average satisfaction with the water service (El Paso Water)

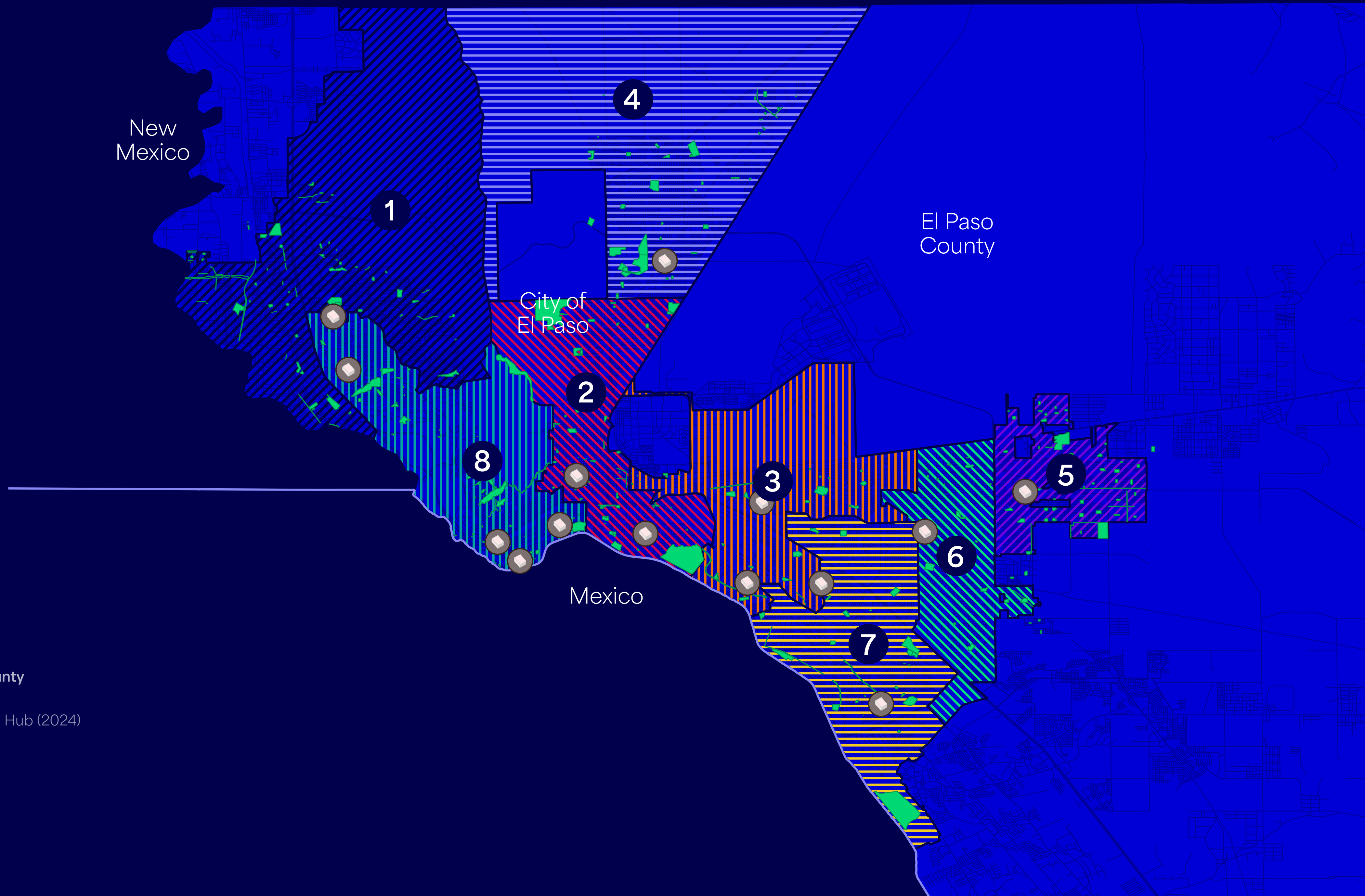

Economy: Key Insights

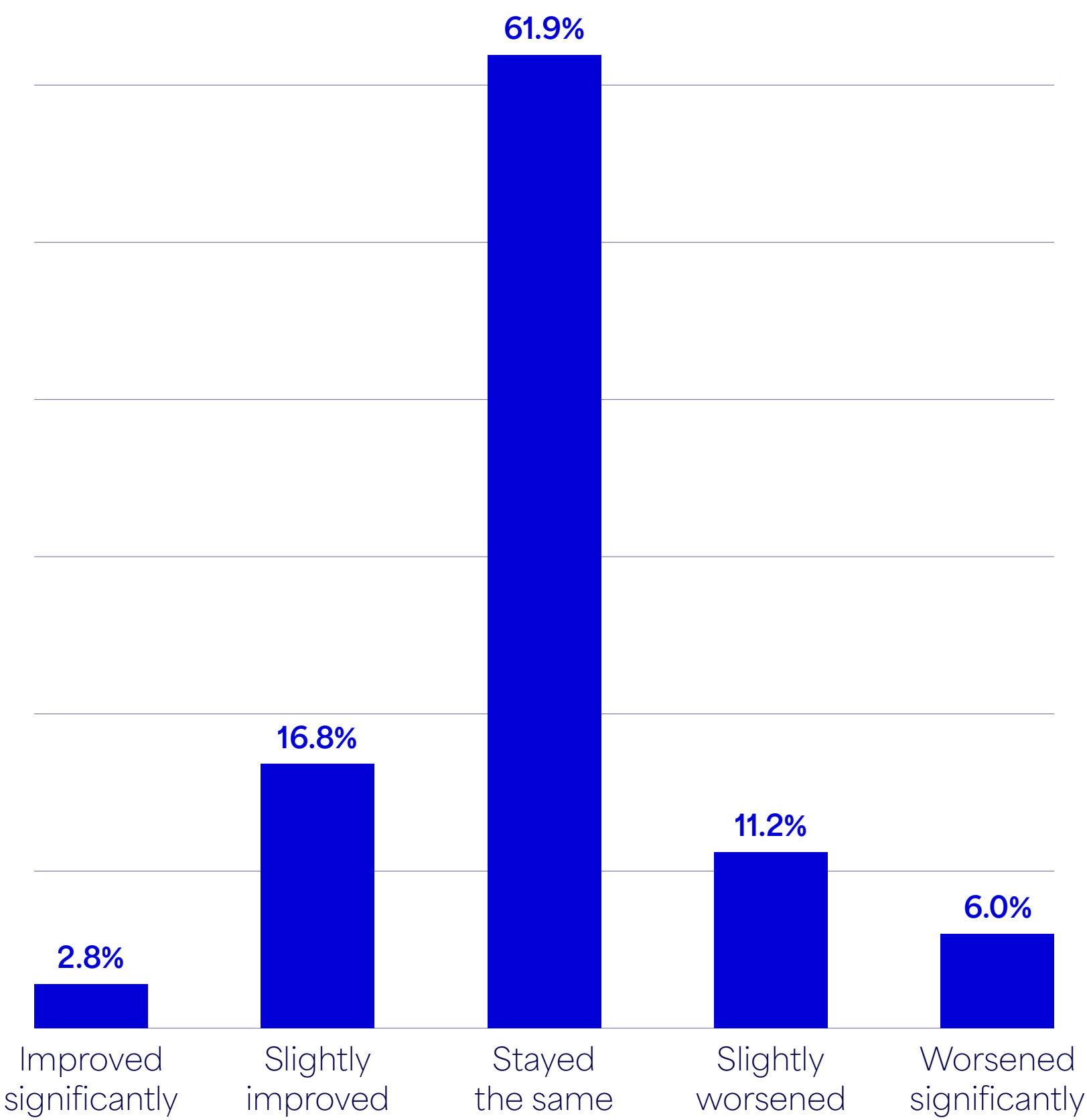
Unemployment rate peaked at 8.3% in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic but has gradually decreased to around 4%, indicating a recovery in the labor market.

Total employment in El Paso also rebounded, rising from 311 thousand jobs in 2020 to almost 348 thousand by June 2024, surpassing pre-pandemic levels.

For 79.1% of the population, their personal economic situation remained stagnant or worsened when compared to 2023, while only 2.8% report a significant improvement.

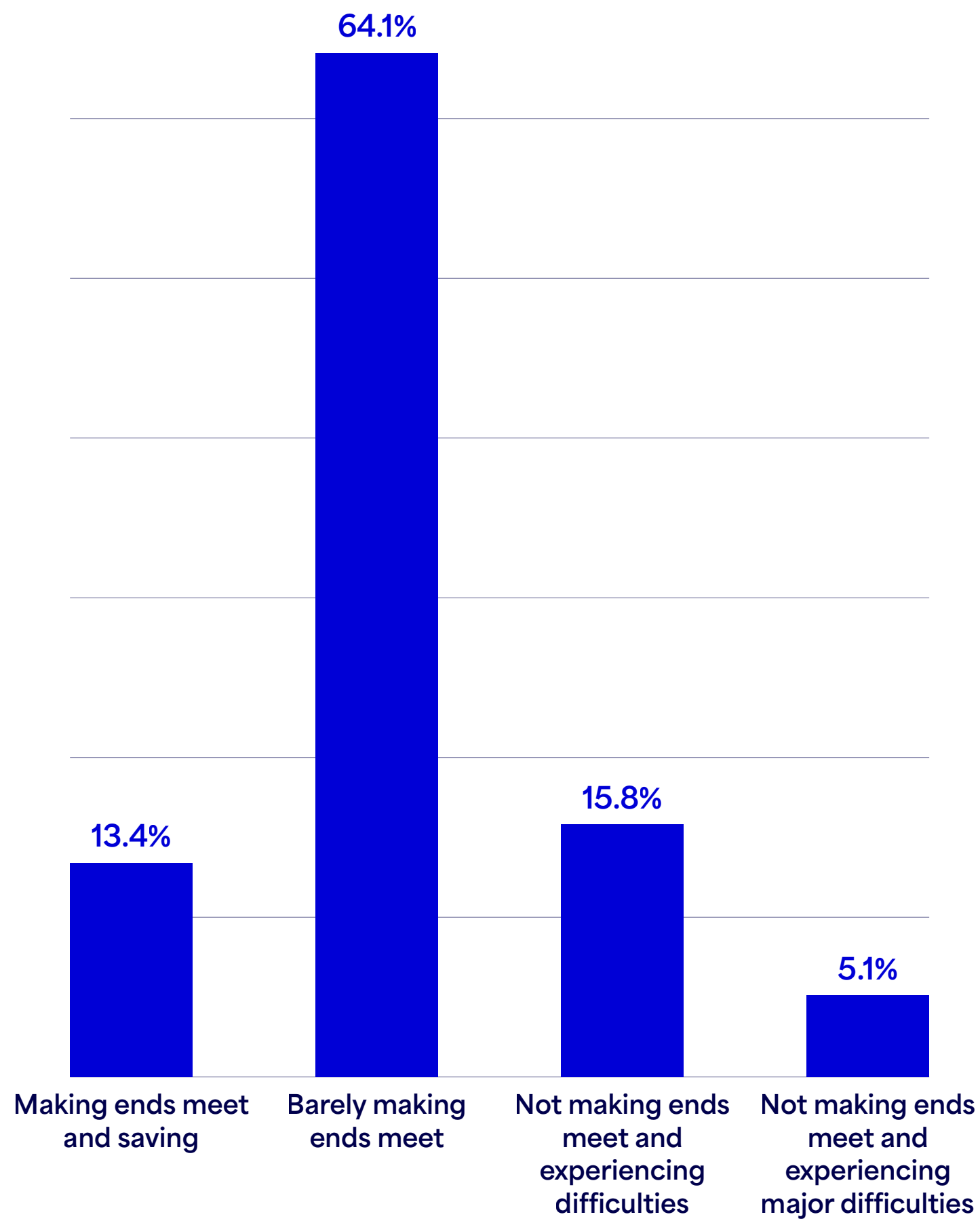
One in five people (20.9%) declared that their household income is not enough to cover for their expenses. Out of those, almost half (49.1%) consider inflation to be the main culprit.

Compared to last year, would you say that your personal economic situation has improved, worsened, or stayed the same?



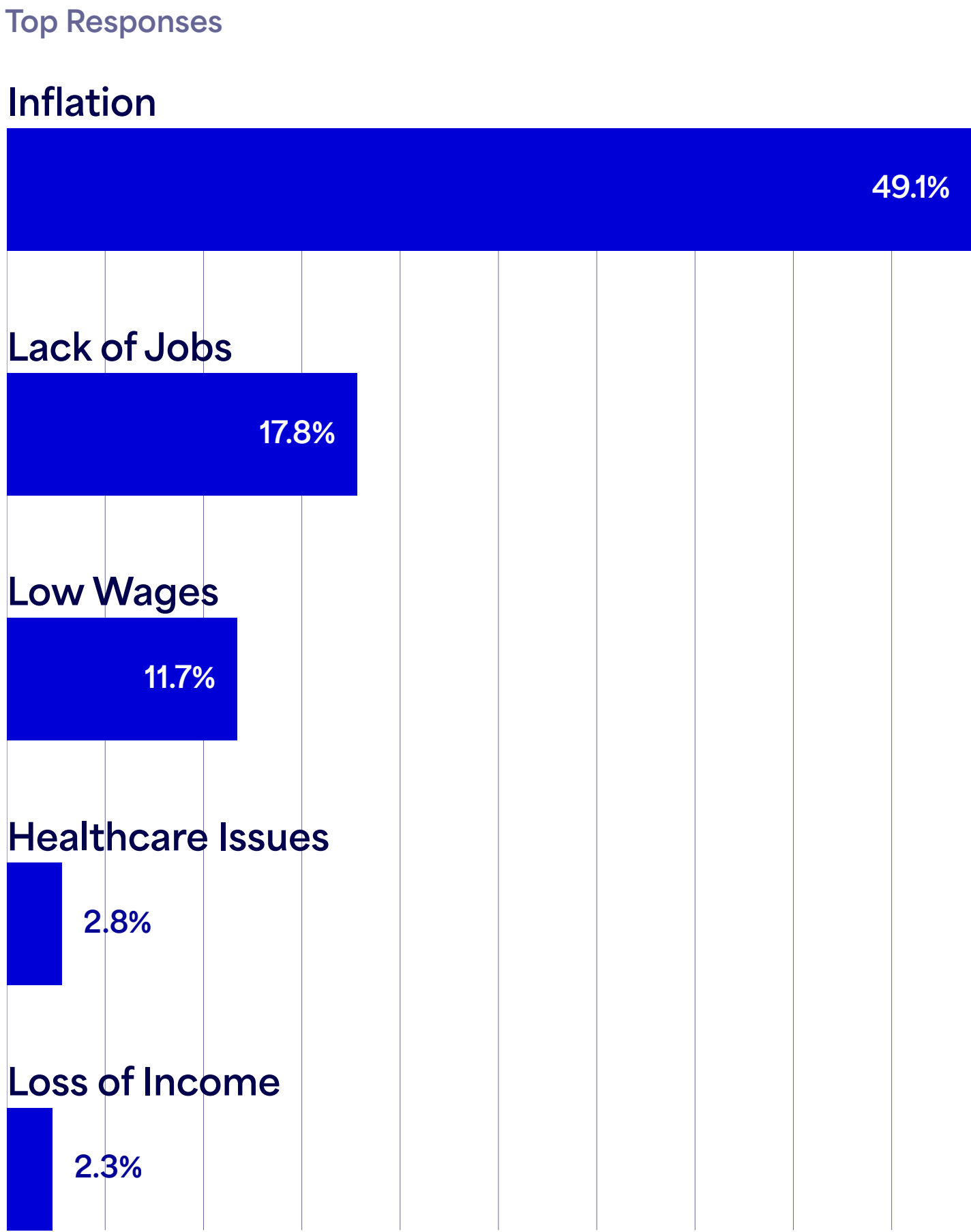

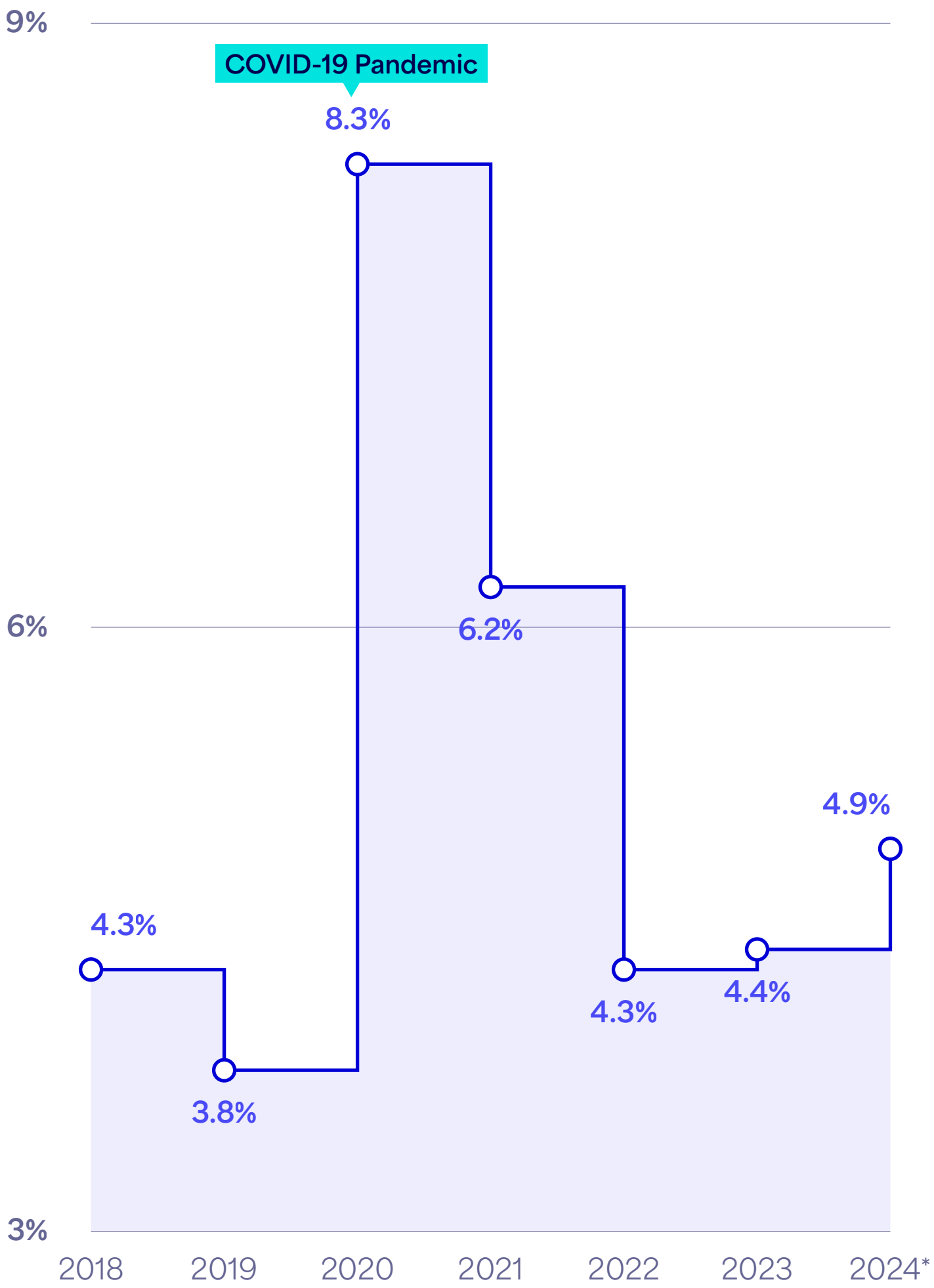
If you are not making ends meet, what do you think is the main cause?

Unemployment Rate

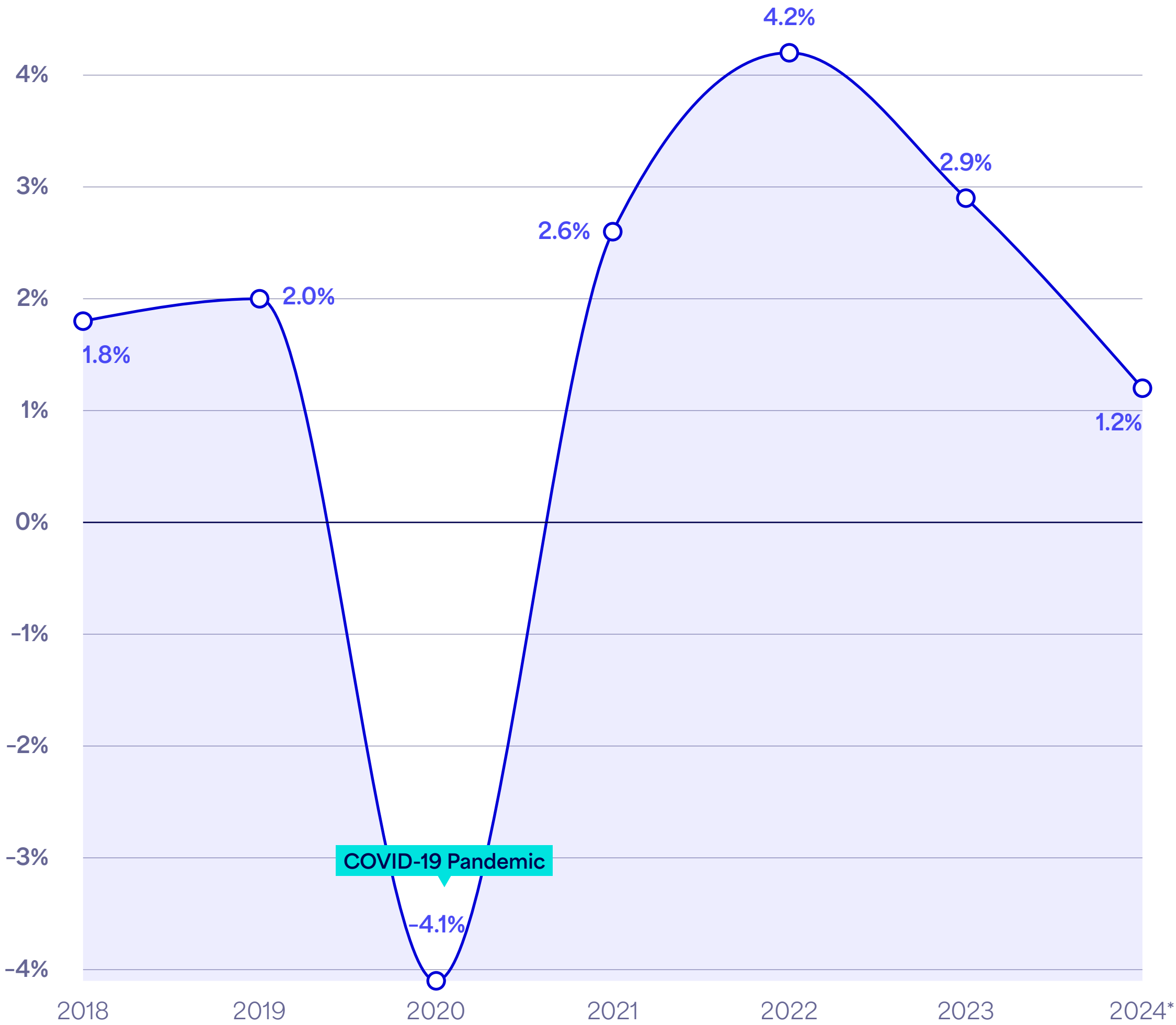

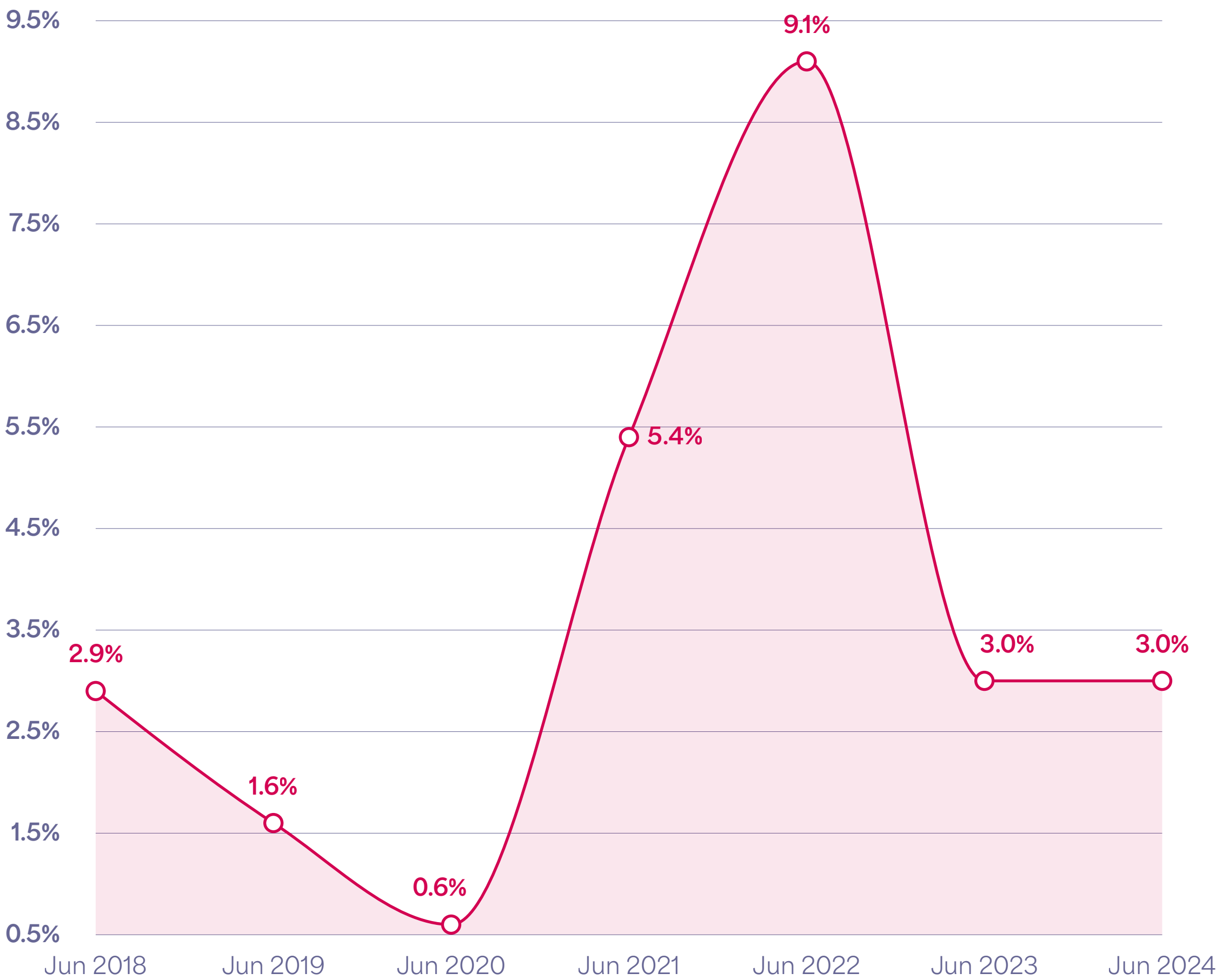
Avg. Annual Changes in Employment

Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers, 12-Month Percent Change

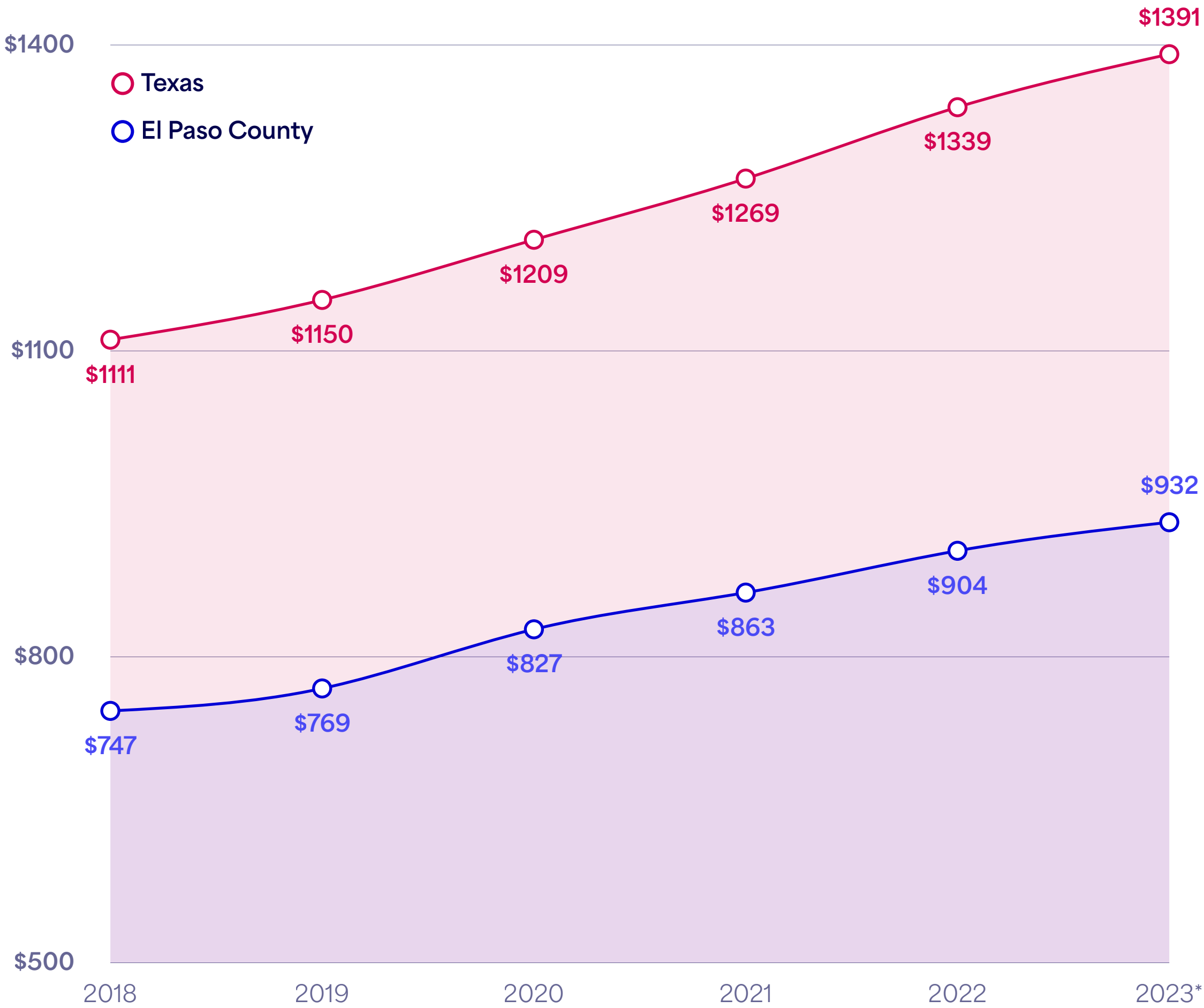

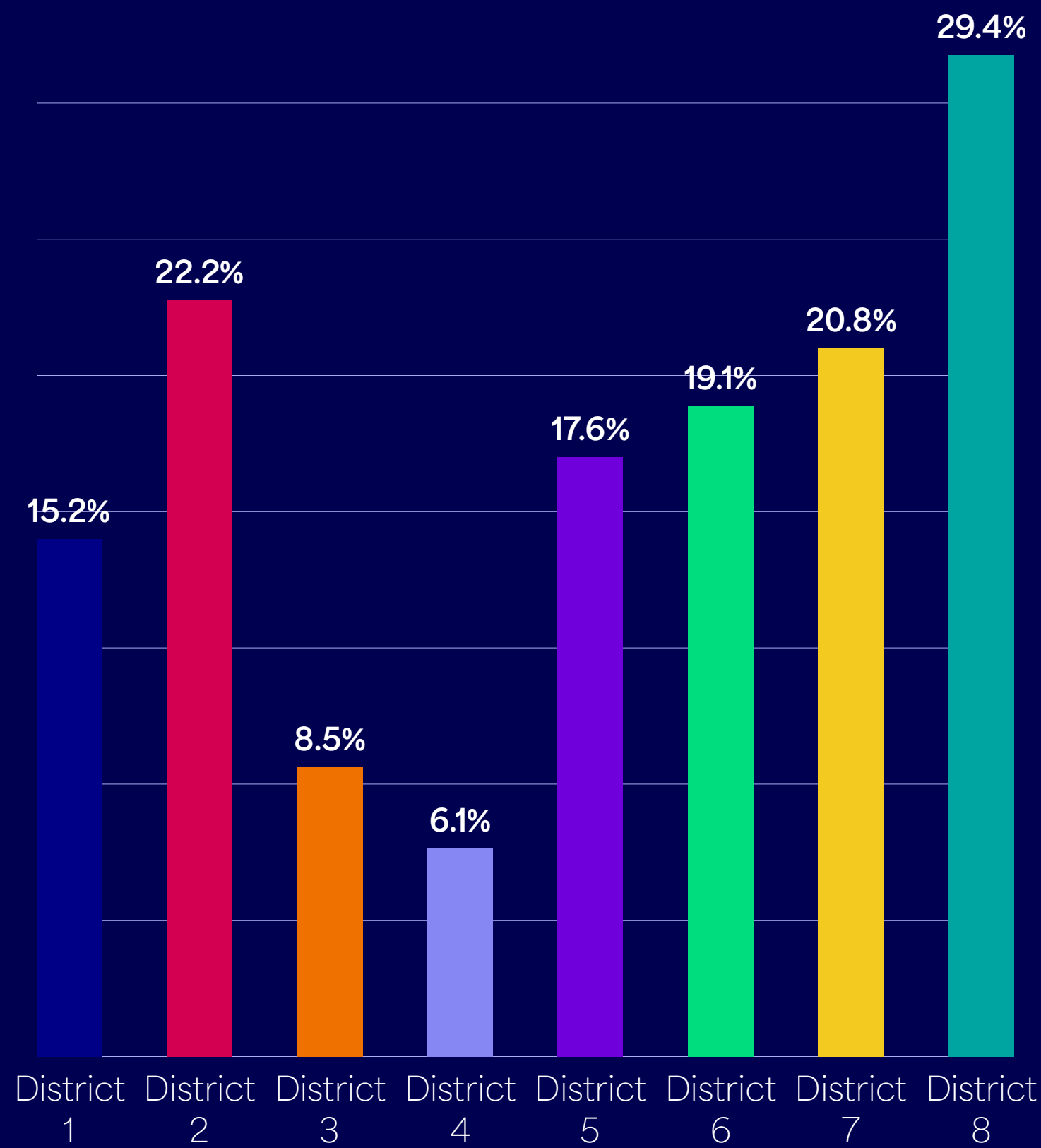

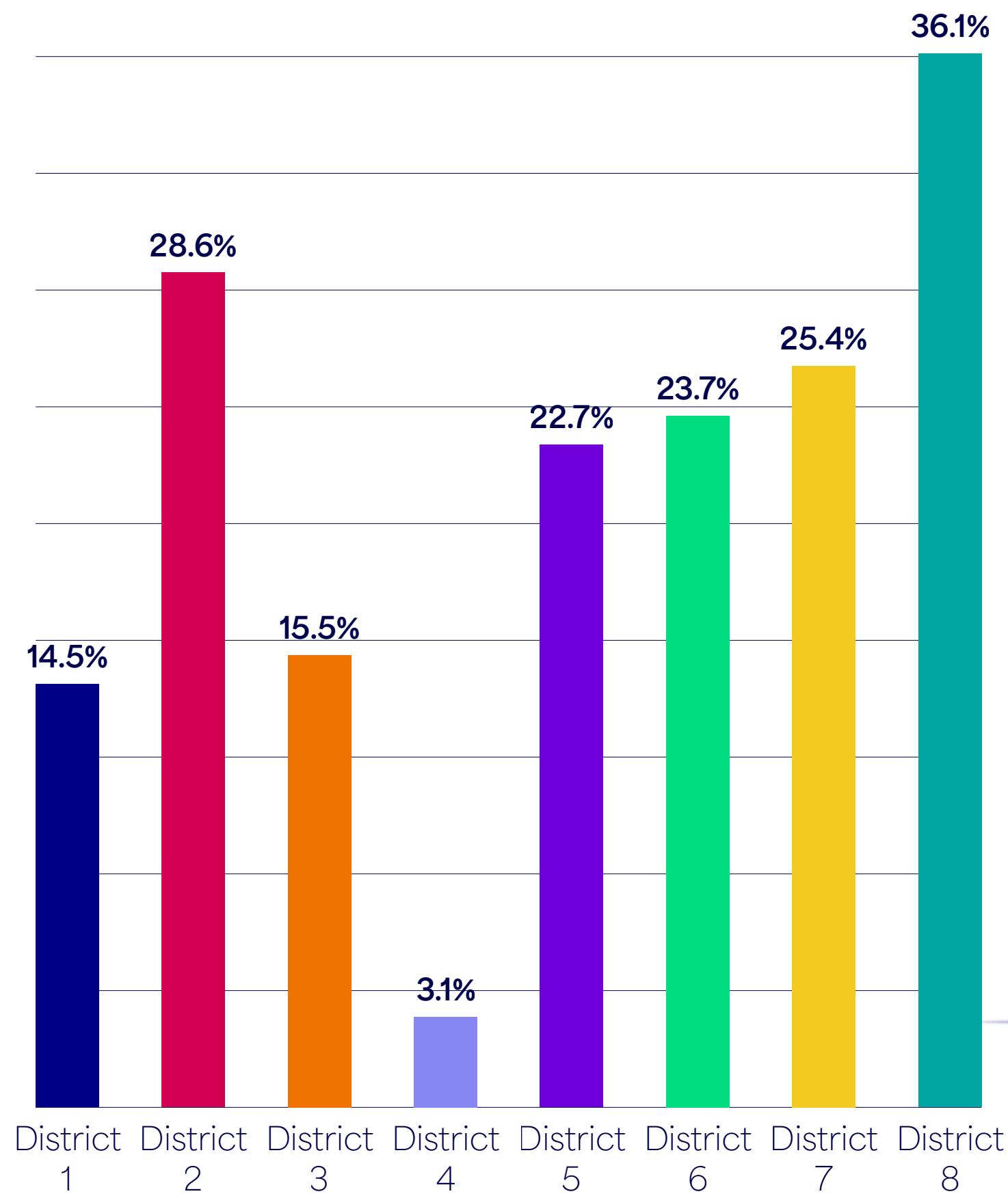

Government Performance: Key Insights

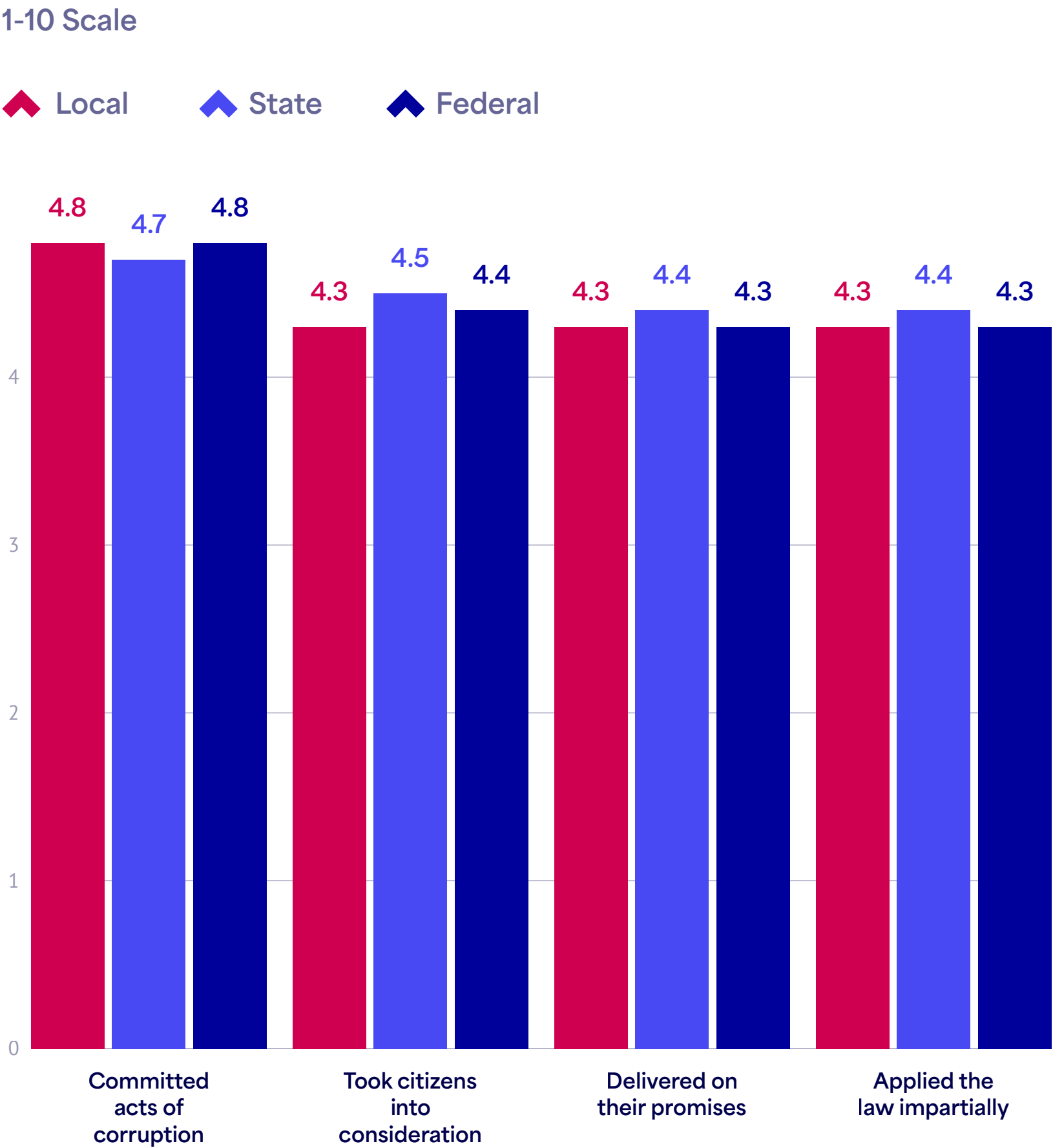
The state government received the lowest score (4.7) on a scale of one to ten when asked to rate how much they believe the government engages in committing acts of corruption.

The local government received the lowest score, 4.3, for considering citizens in public decisions. Federal and local governments were rated the lowest for keeping their campaign promises and impartially enforcing the law.

One in five respondents knows the name of their district representative, with Districts 5 and 6 having the highest percentages of people who know their representative's name.

Mayor Oscar Leeser received the highest rating across the three levels of government, with a score of 5.9. Joe Biden received a score of 5.8, and Gregg Abbott received a score of 5.3.

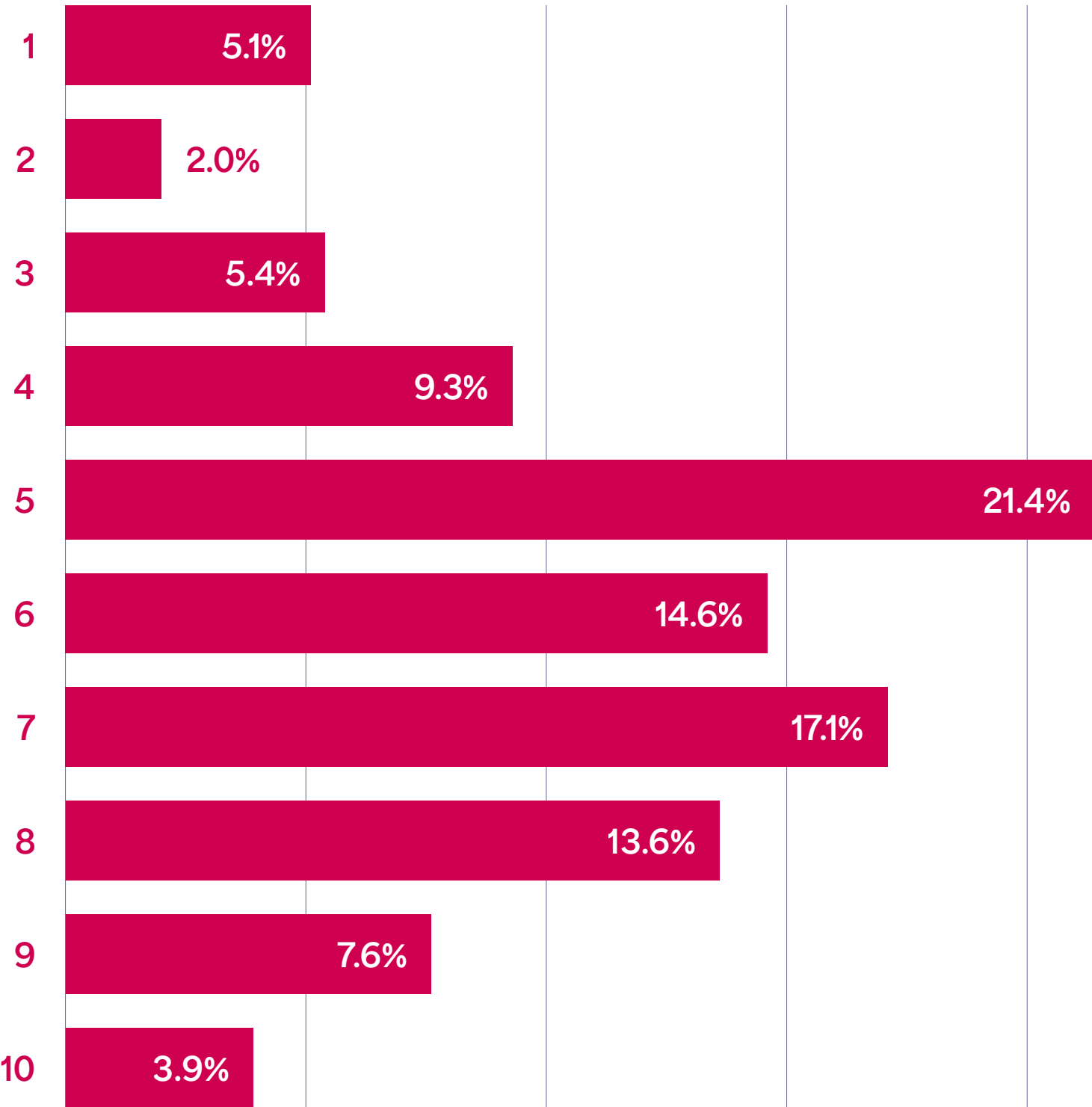
Considering all of 2024, how much do you think each of the levels of government did the following:

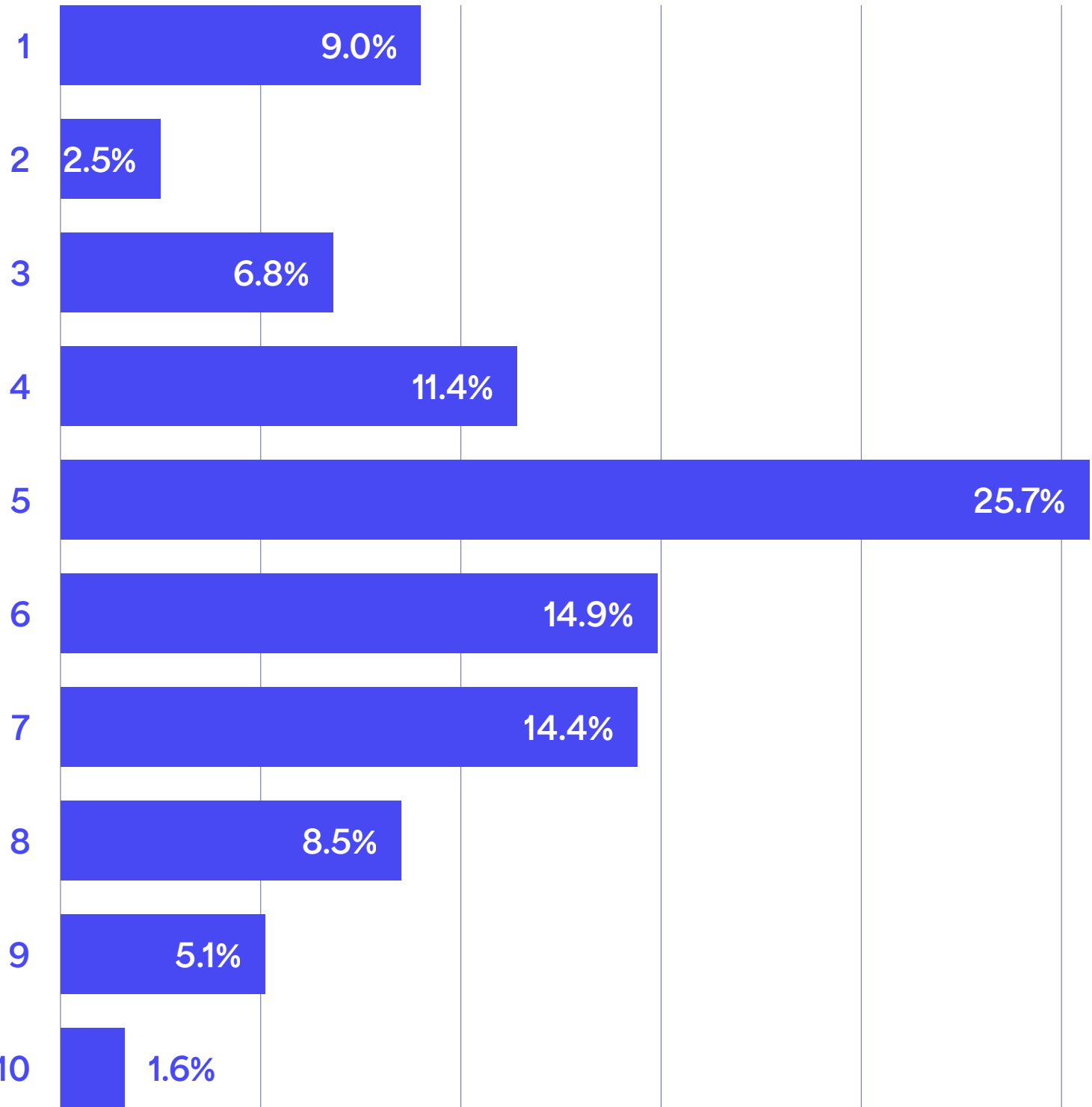

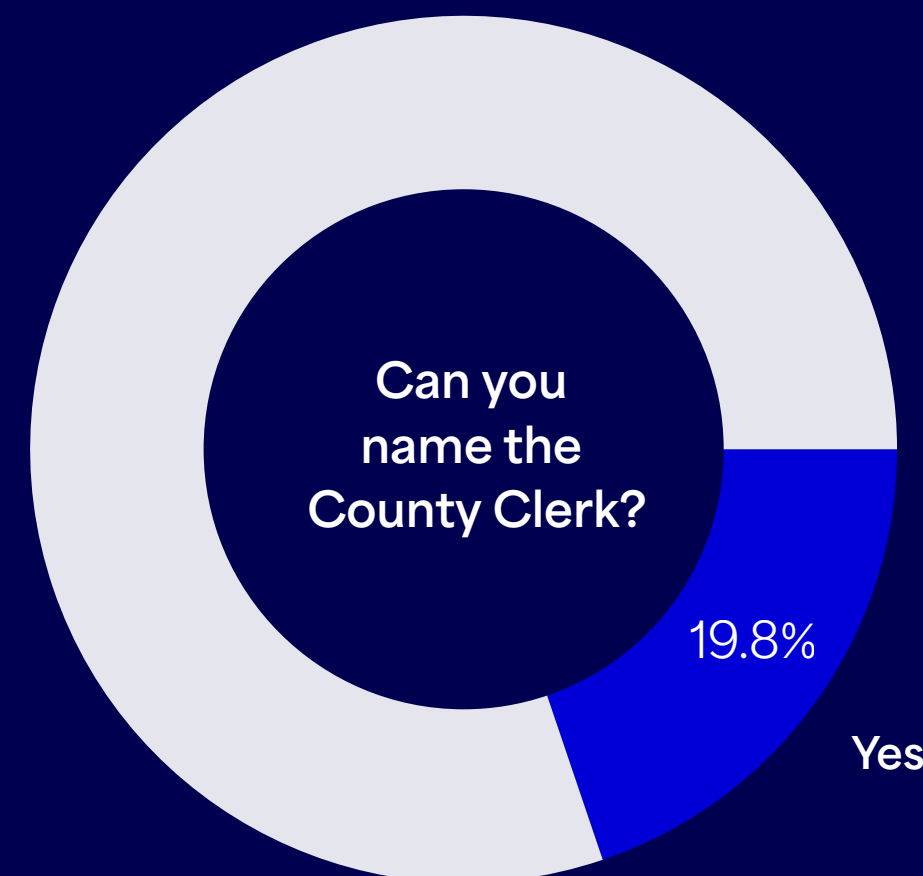

Can you name your current district representative?

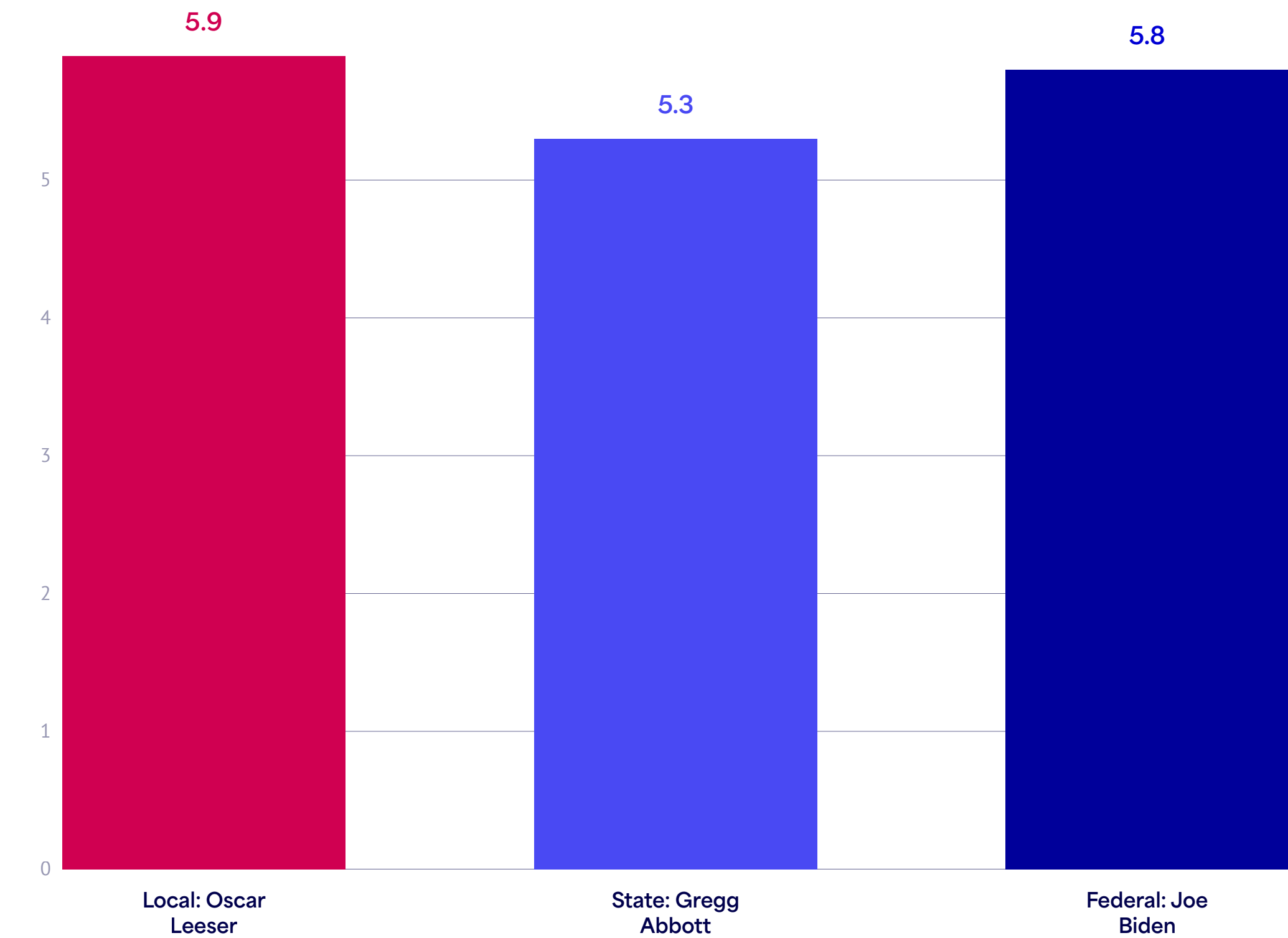

Average rating of government by level

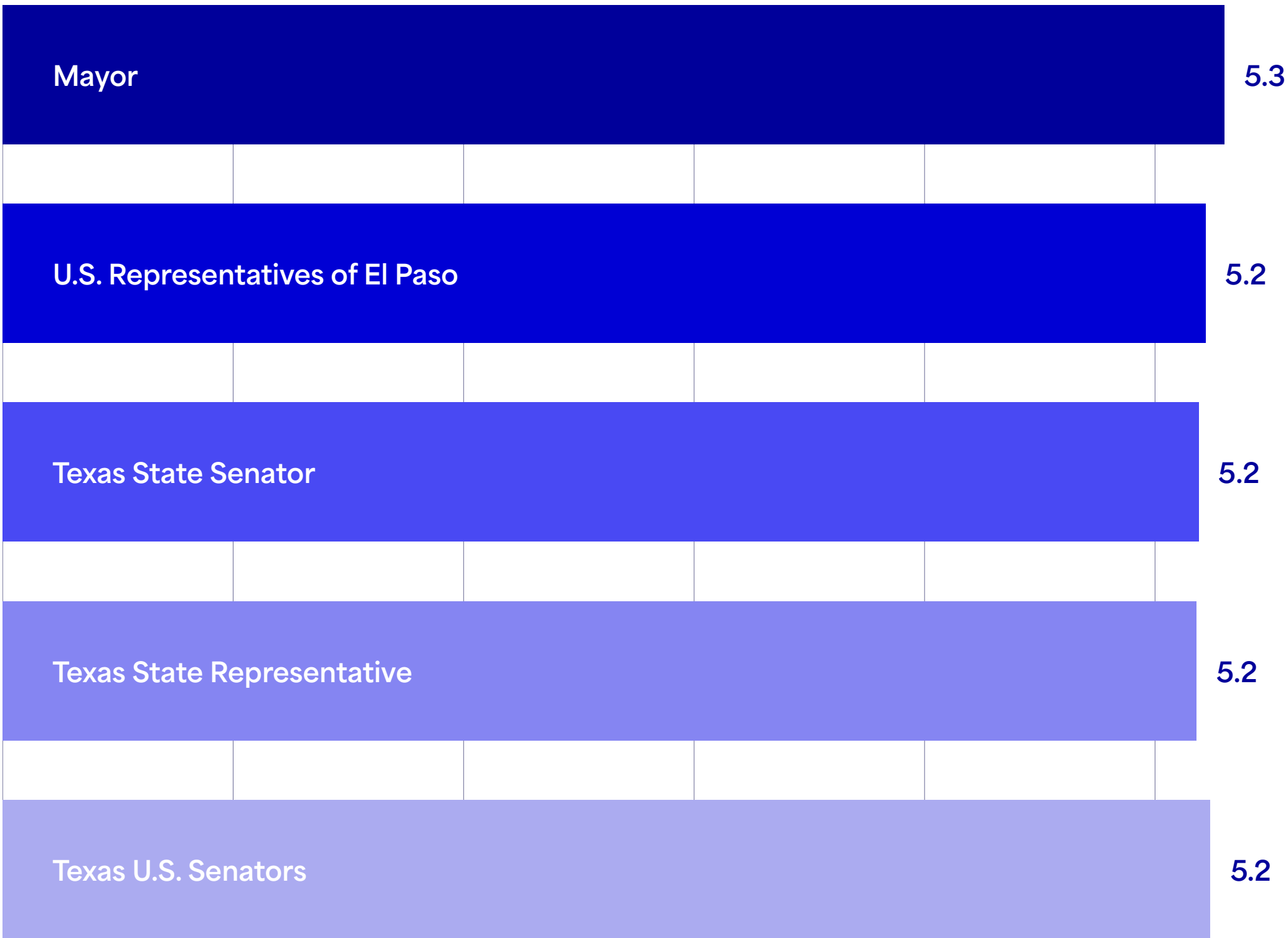

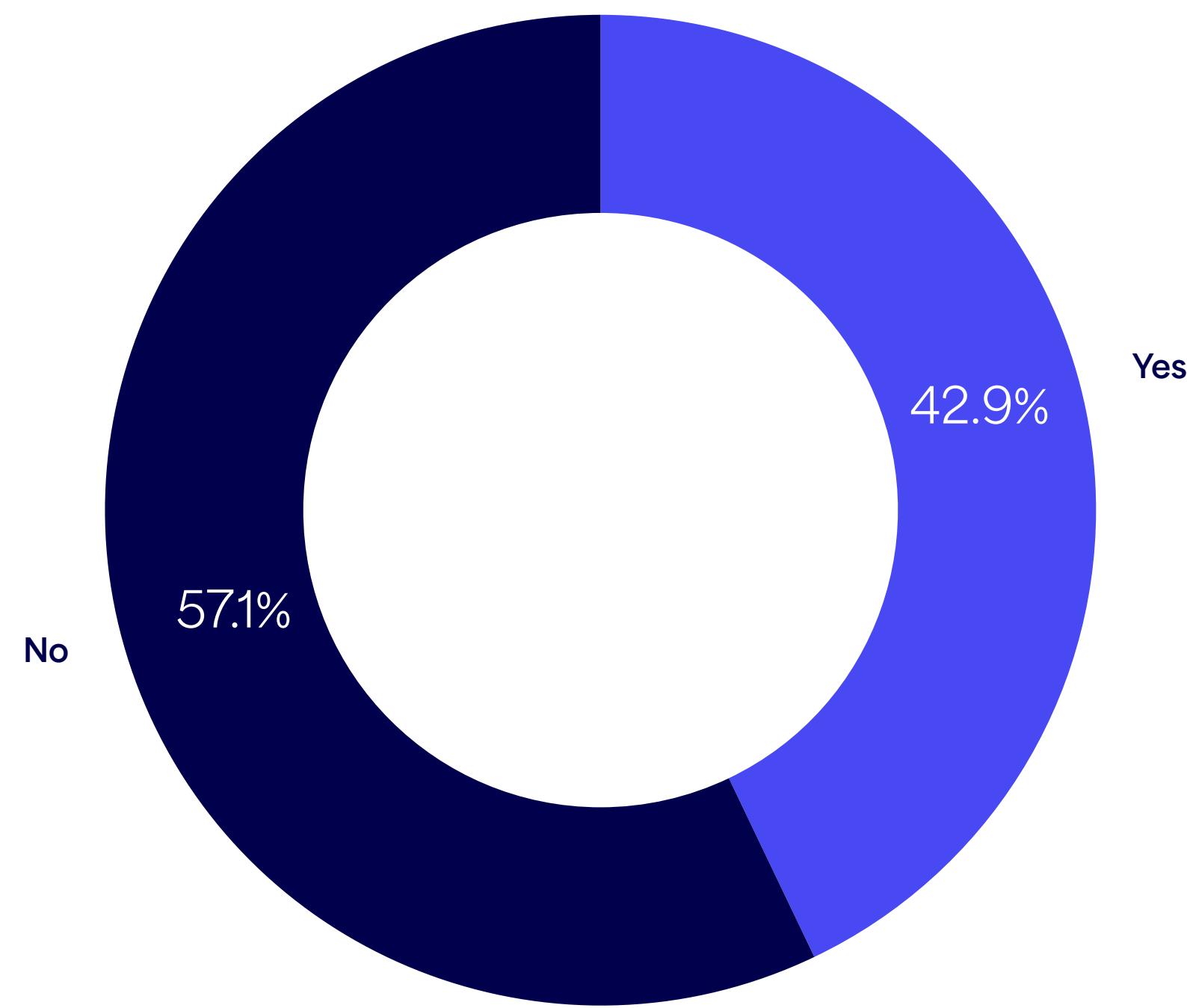

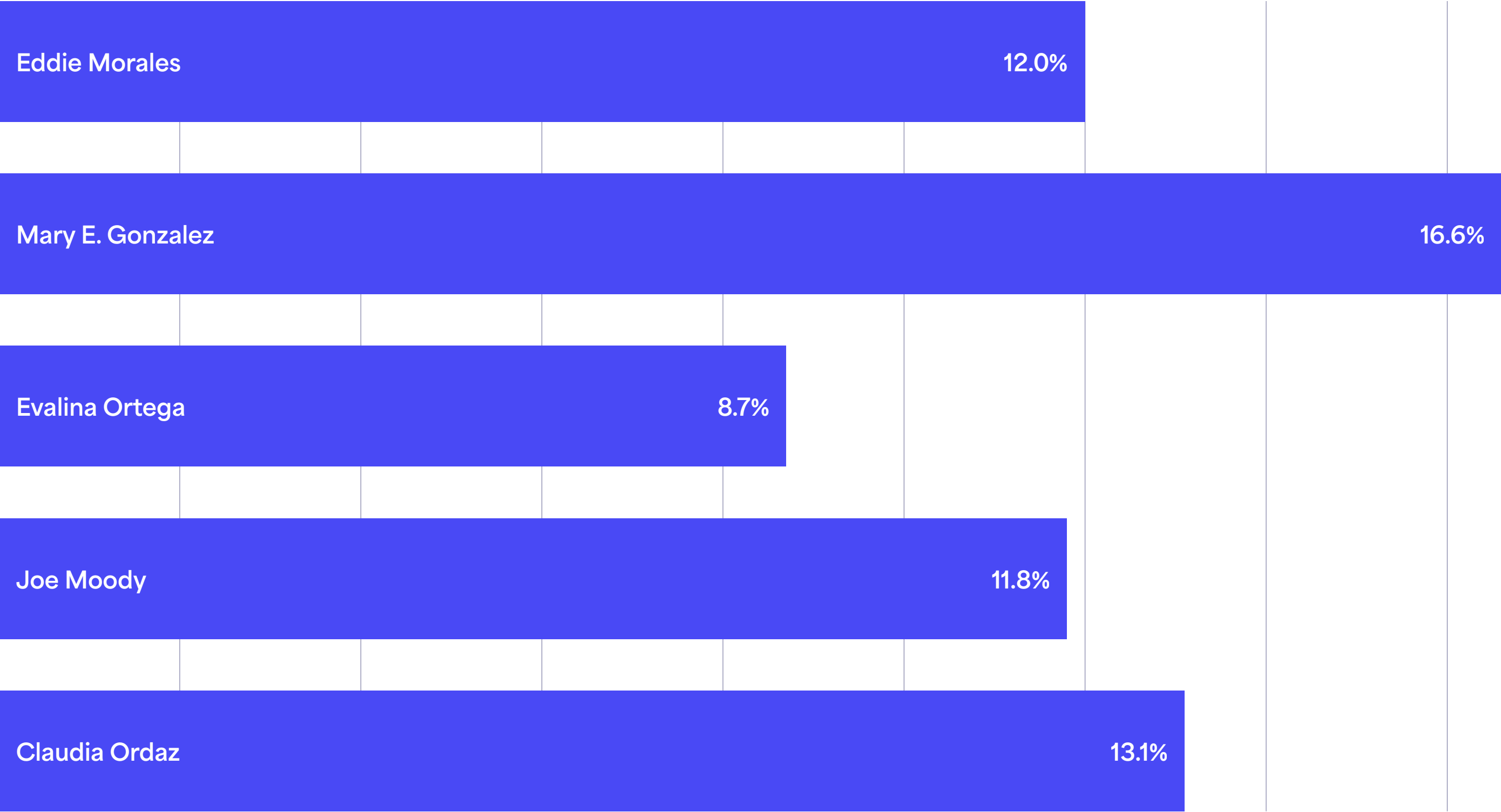

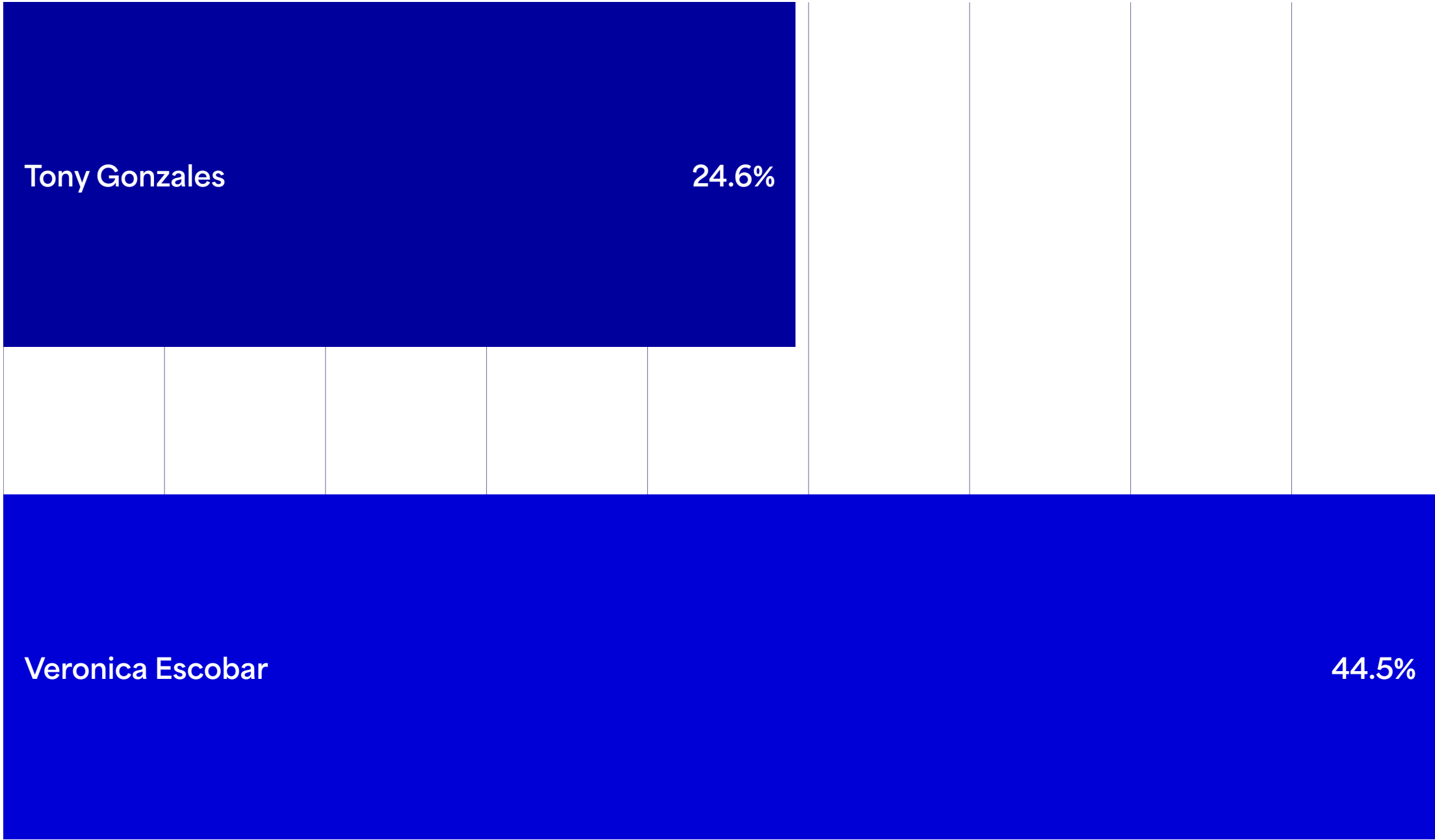

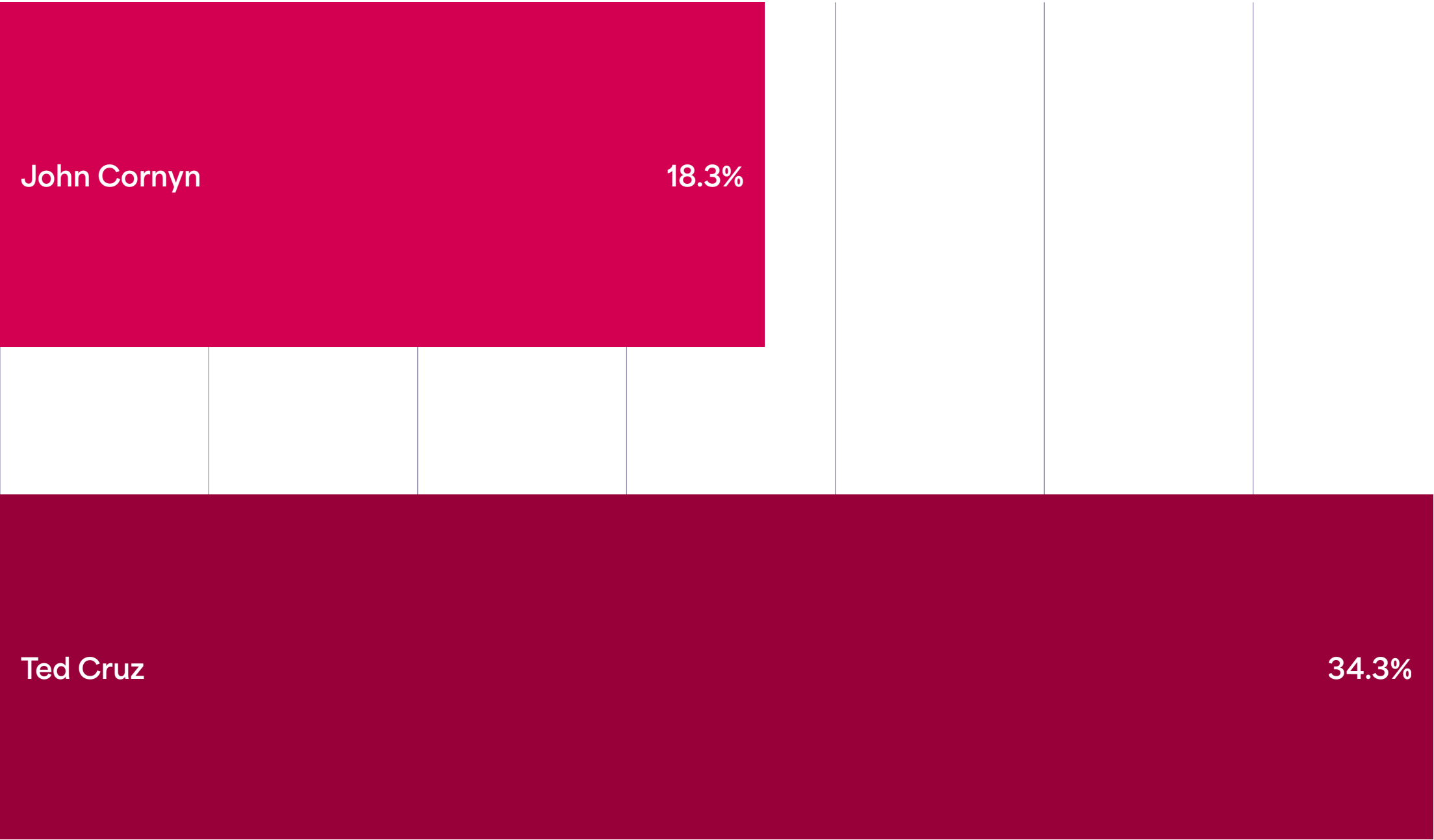

Civic Engagement: Key Insights

Key issues identified by El Paso residents include inflation, crime/insecurity, lack of jobs and low wages, immigration, and road traffic, reflecting economic and safety concerns as the most pressing for the community.

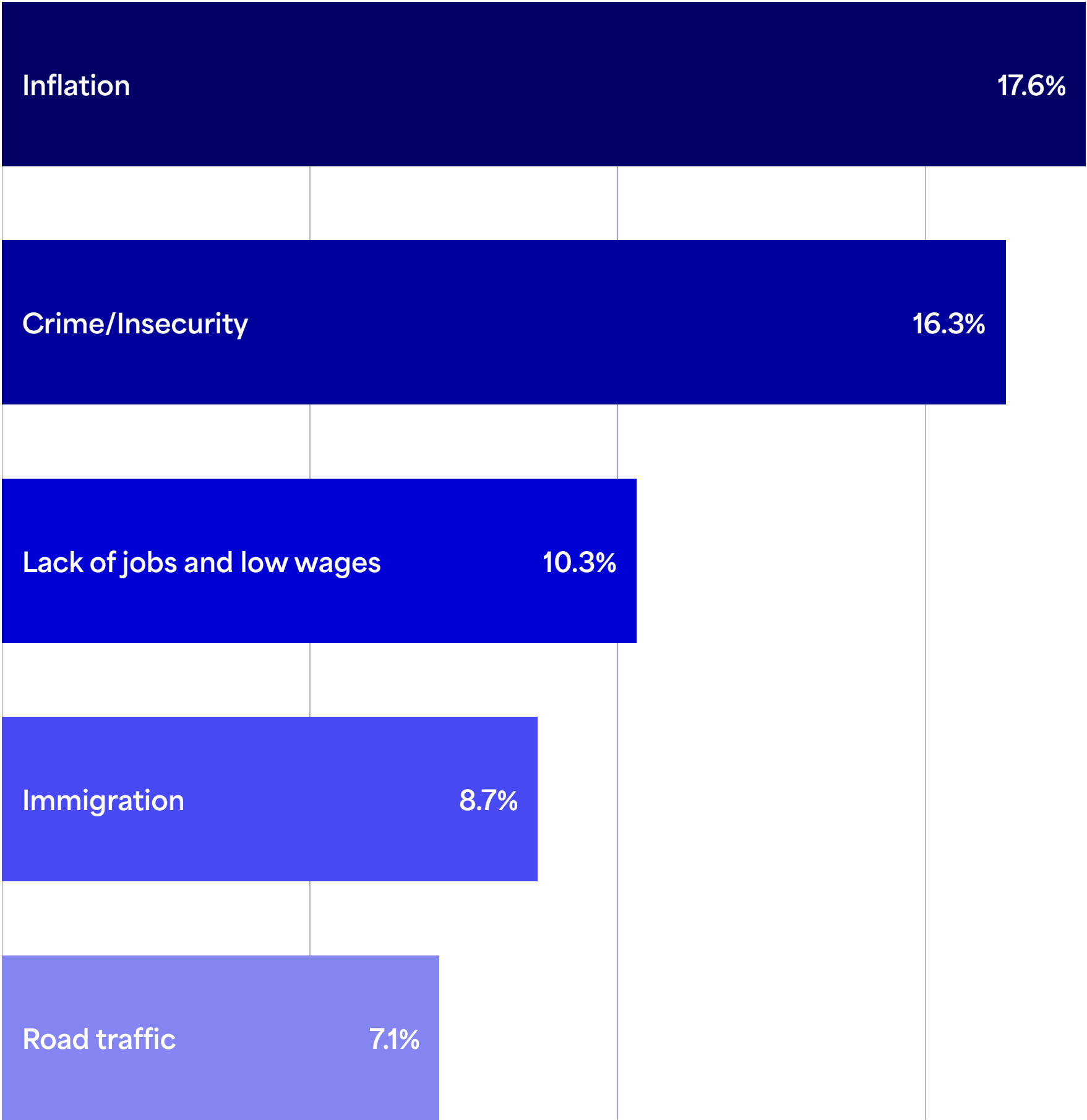
Only 12.9% of El Paso residents actively participate in social or political organizations, suggesting a low level of civic engagement. The primary barriers include lack of information, trust in institutions, and public spaces to participate.

43.9% of the surveyed citizens mentioned being highly disinterested in participating in local politics, whether by making decisions or carrying out actions of public interest

Voting is considered important by 86.1% of respondents, with most believing it allows them to express their opinions and drive change, yet only 32.7% voted in the last election.

Most important issue in El Paso

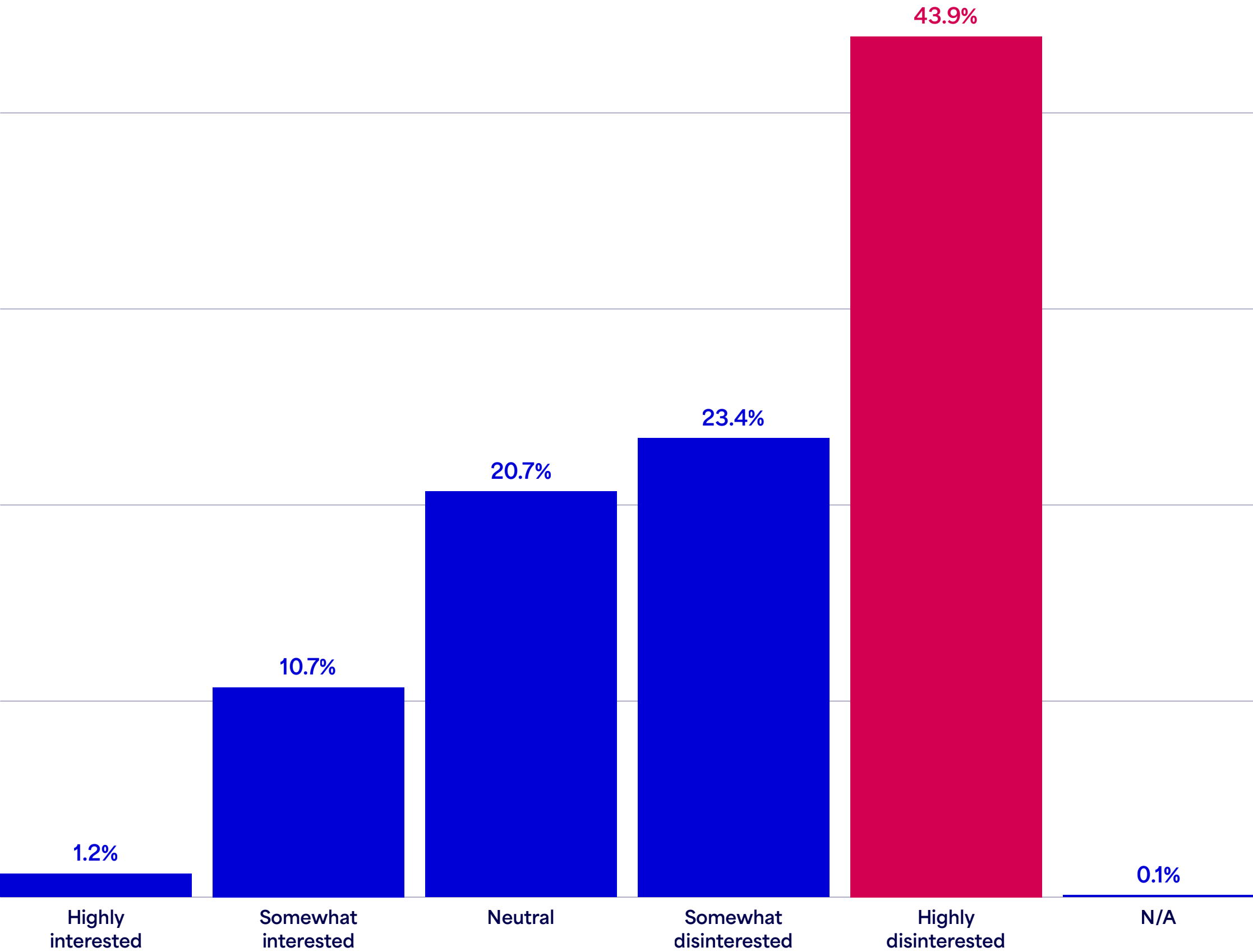
Top 5 responses (Top of mind)

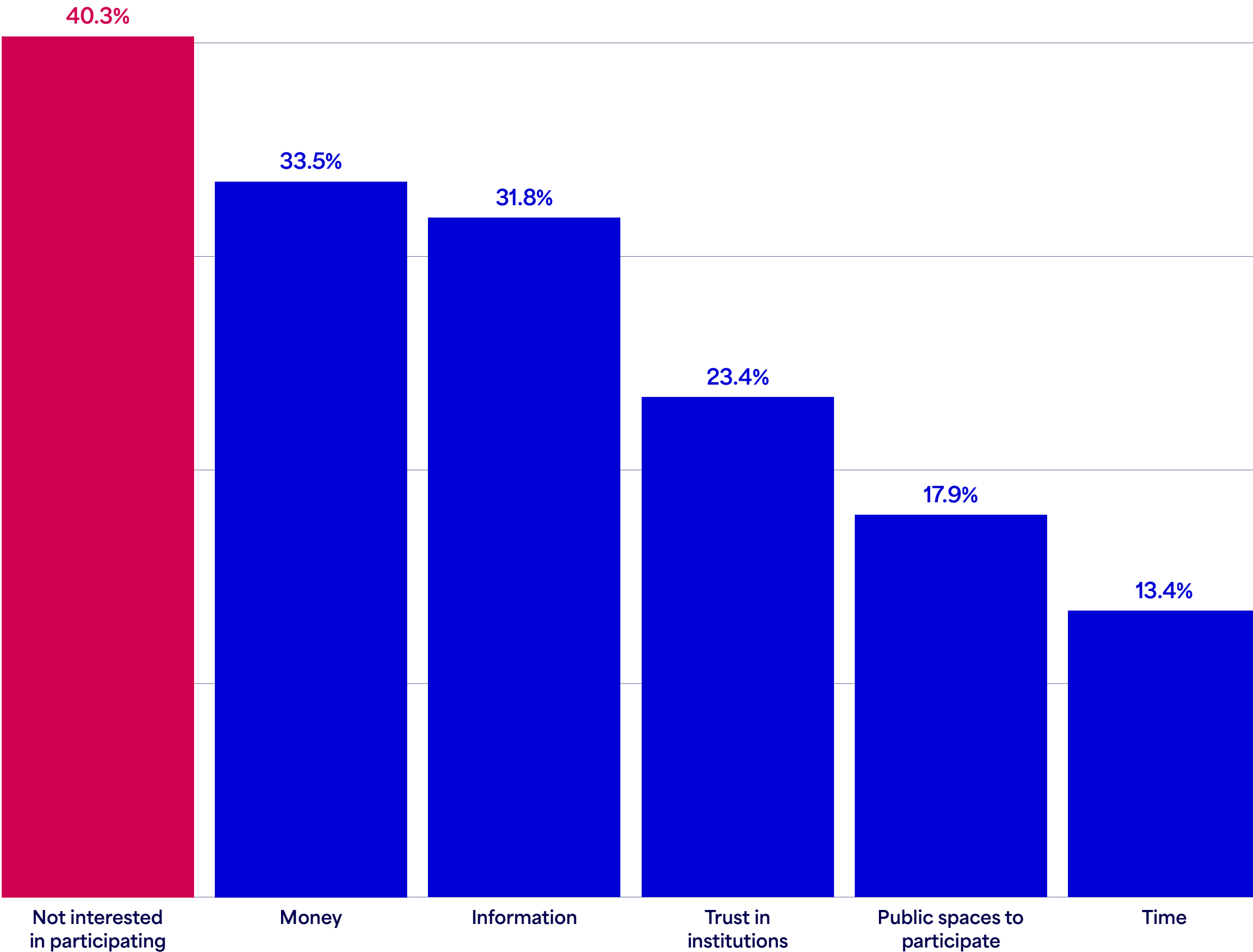

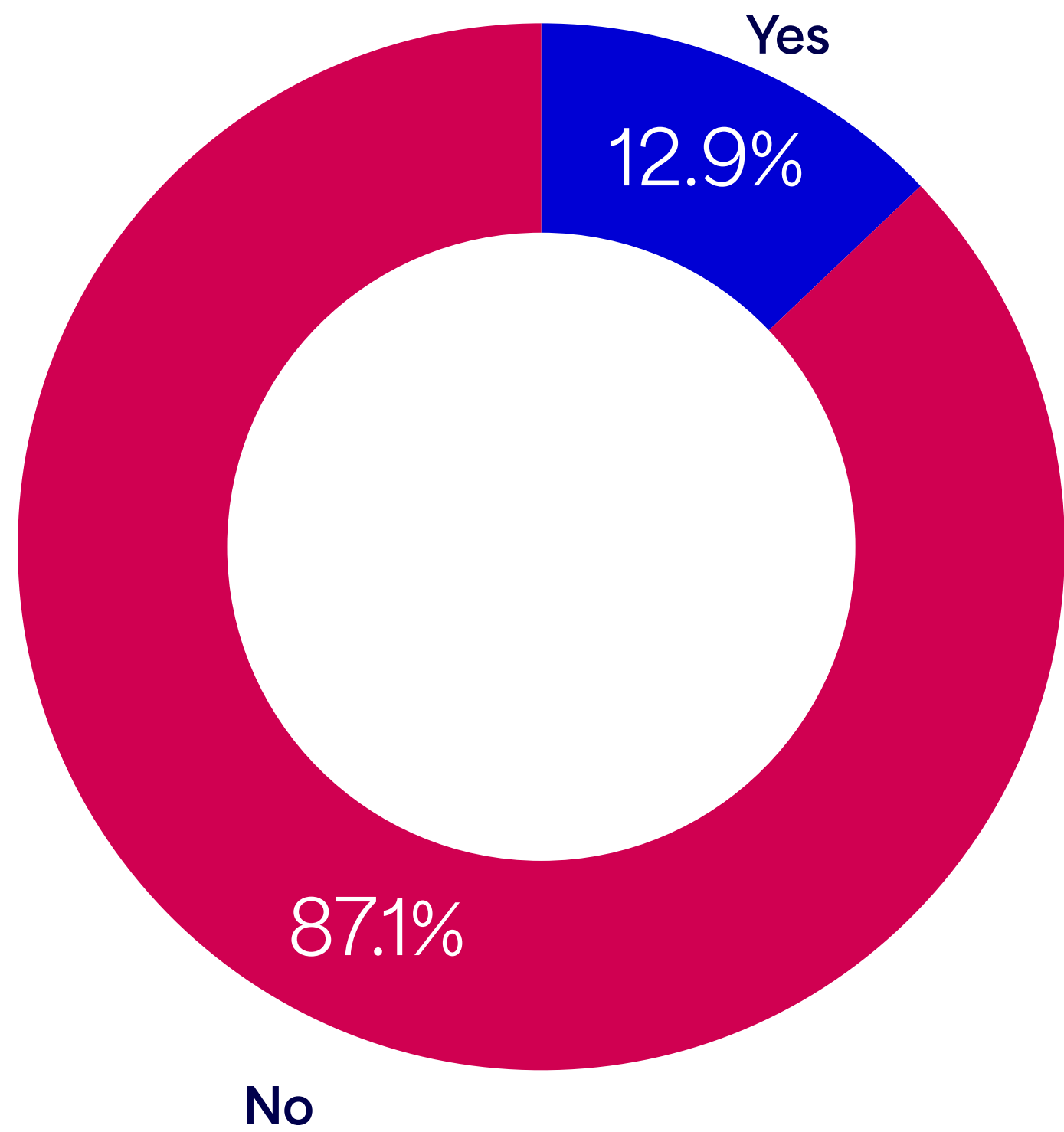

People who consider voting important, by representative district

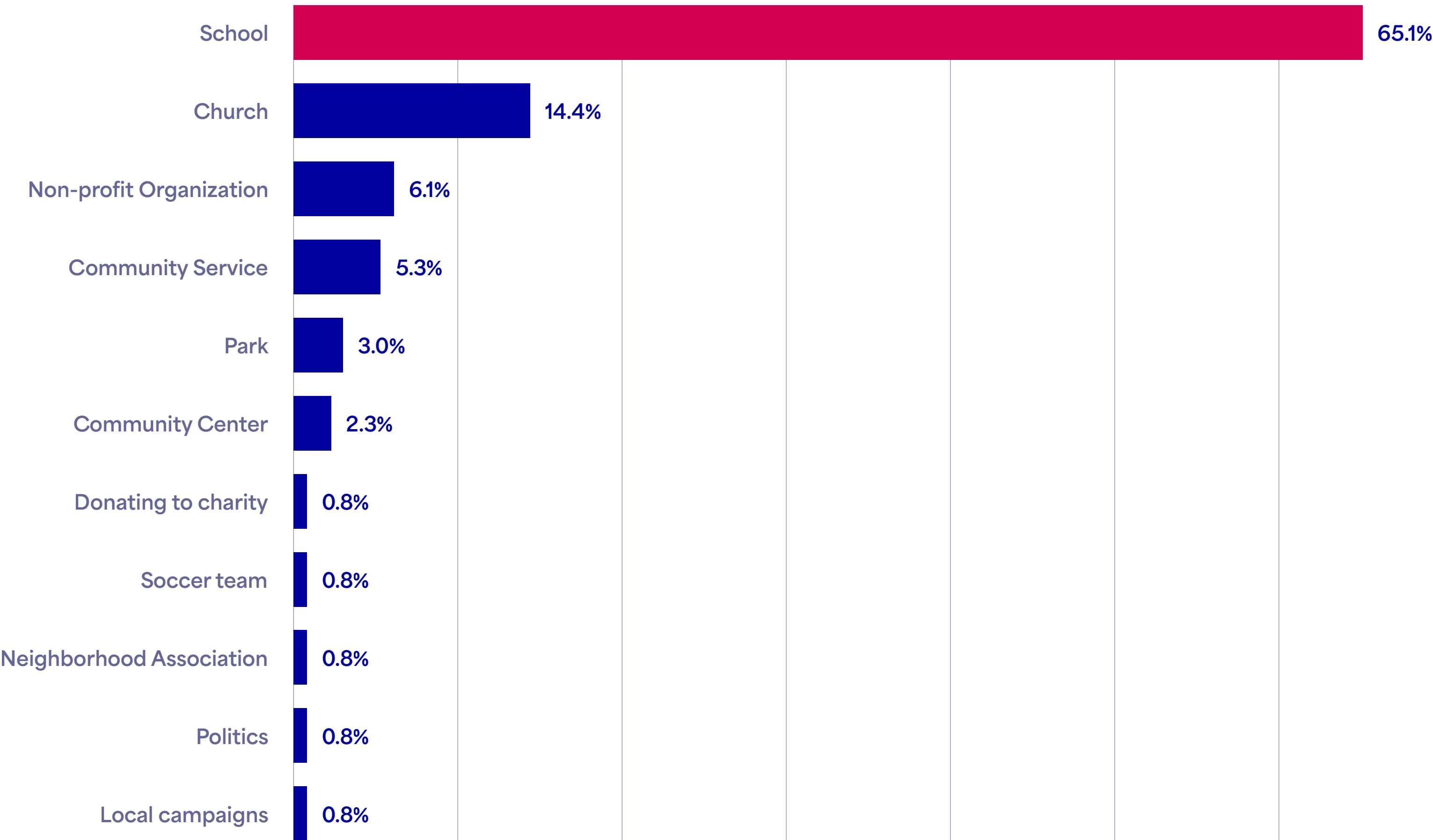

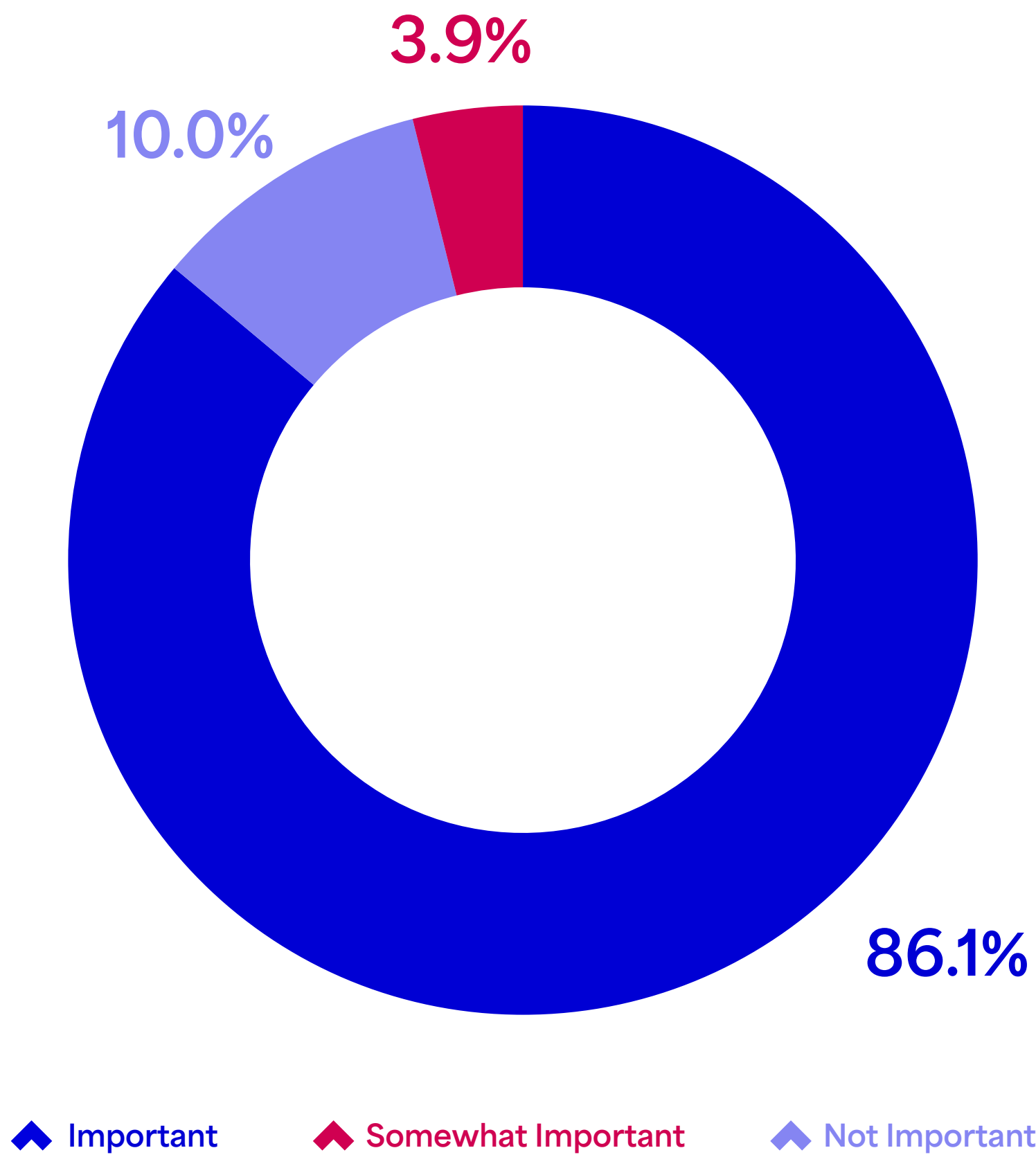

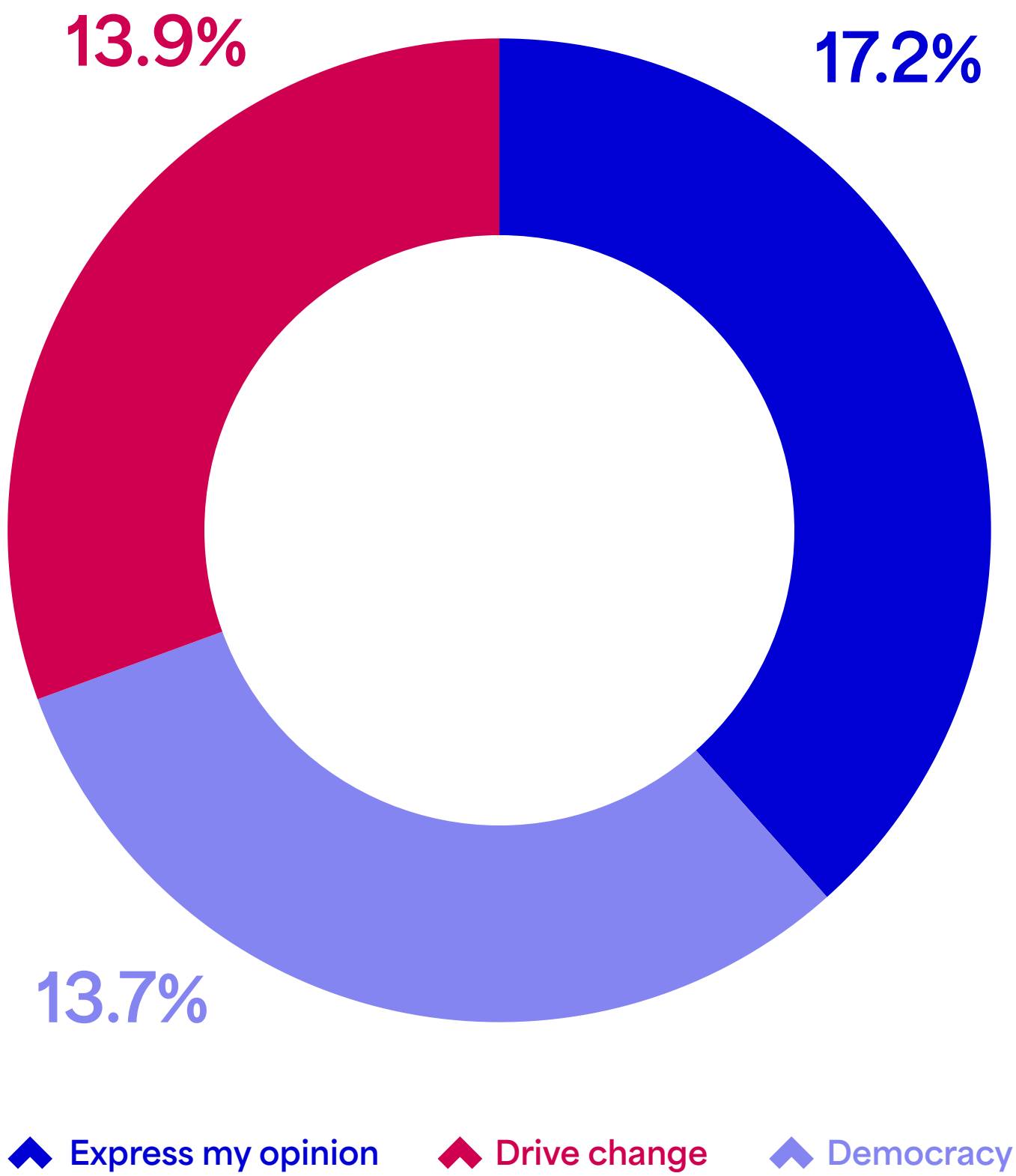

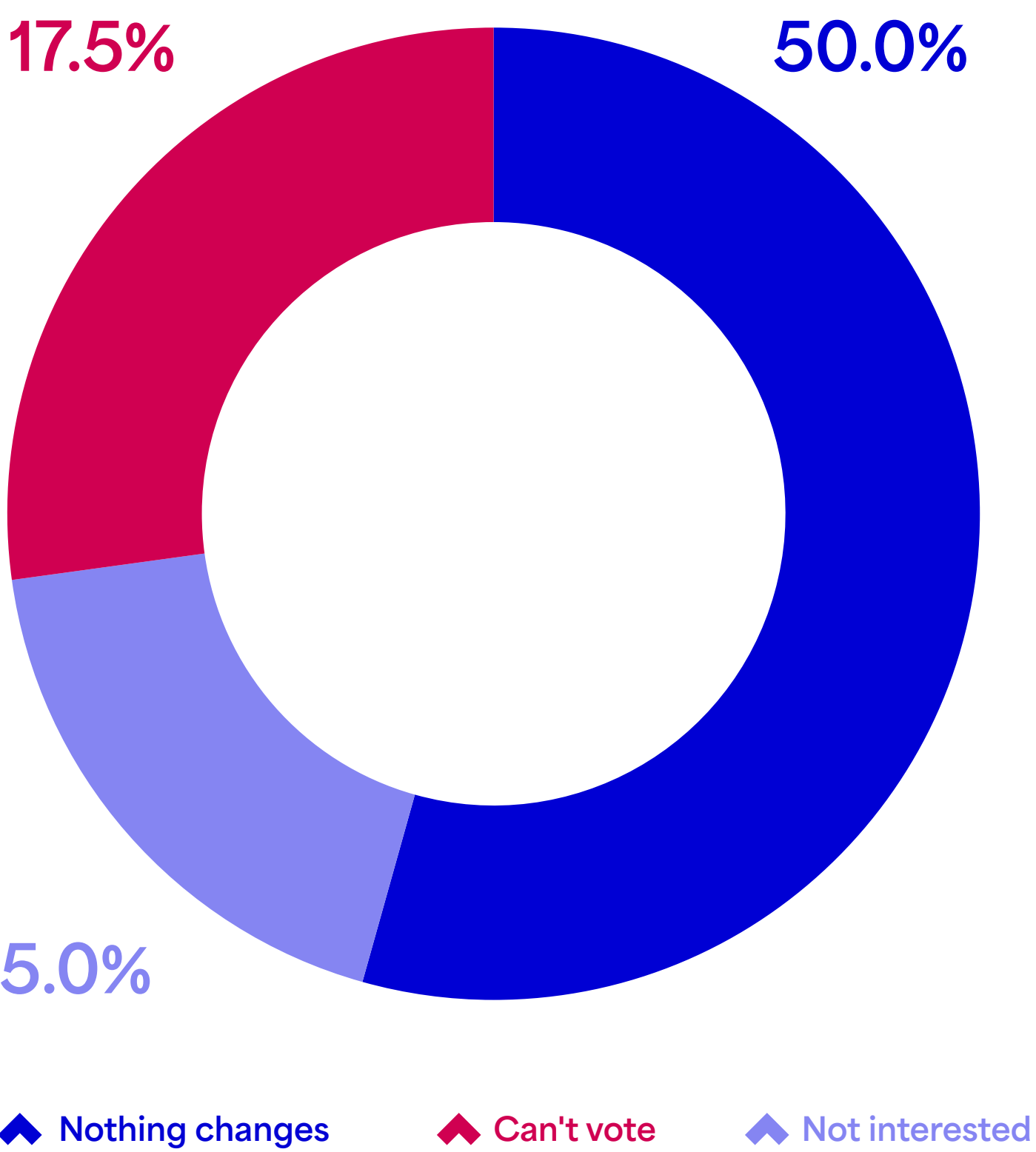

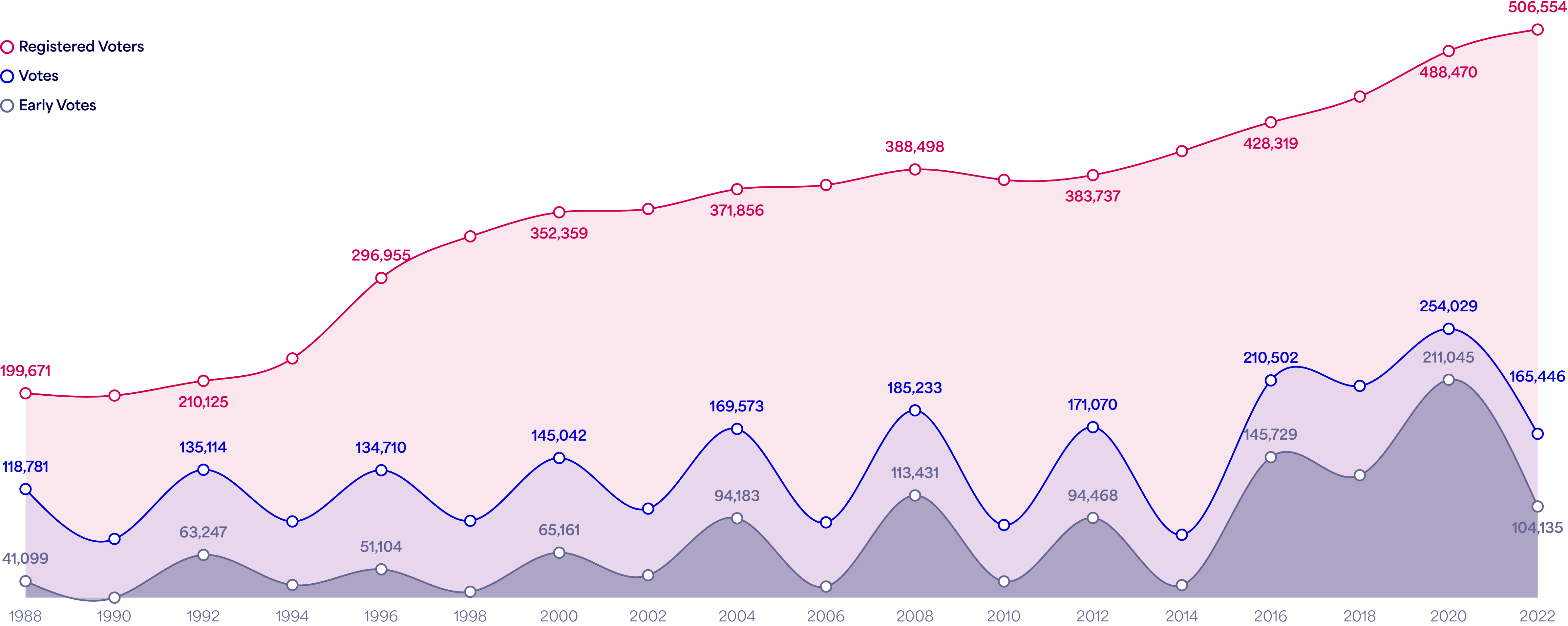

Methodology

The 2024 QoL Index El Paso Survey constitutes a cross-sectional statistical exercise in the form of a survey, applied to a representative sample of residents from the urban area of the city of El Paso, Texas. Therefore, the results reflect the opinions of the residents during the period in which the questionnaires were administered.

The sampling frame was based on the statistical population of the city of El Paso, Texas, which, according to data from the City Government of El Paso, consists of 678,815 residents. To determine the sample size, Cochran's sample size formula for finite populations was used.

Using this equation, the sample size was set at 1,066 residents to be interviewed, achieving a 95% statistical confidence level and a margin of error of +/- 3%.

Given these parameters, the results obtained are statistically representative of the population and can be projected to the total number of residents in the City of El Paso, Texas.

For sample distribution, a multi-stage process was implemented to ensure the highest statistical likelihood of participation from any resident and to maximize the representativeness of the population under study. These stages are:

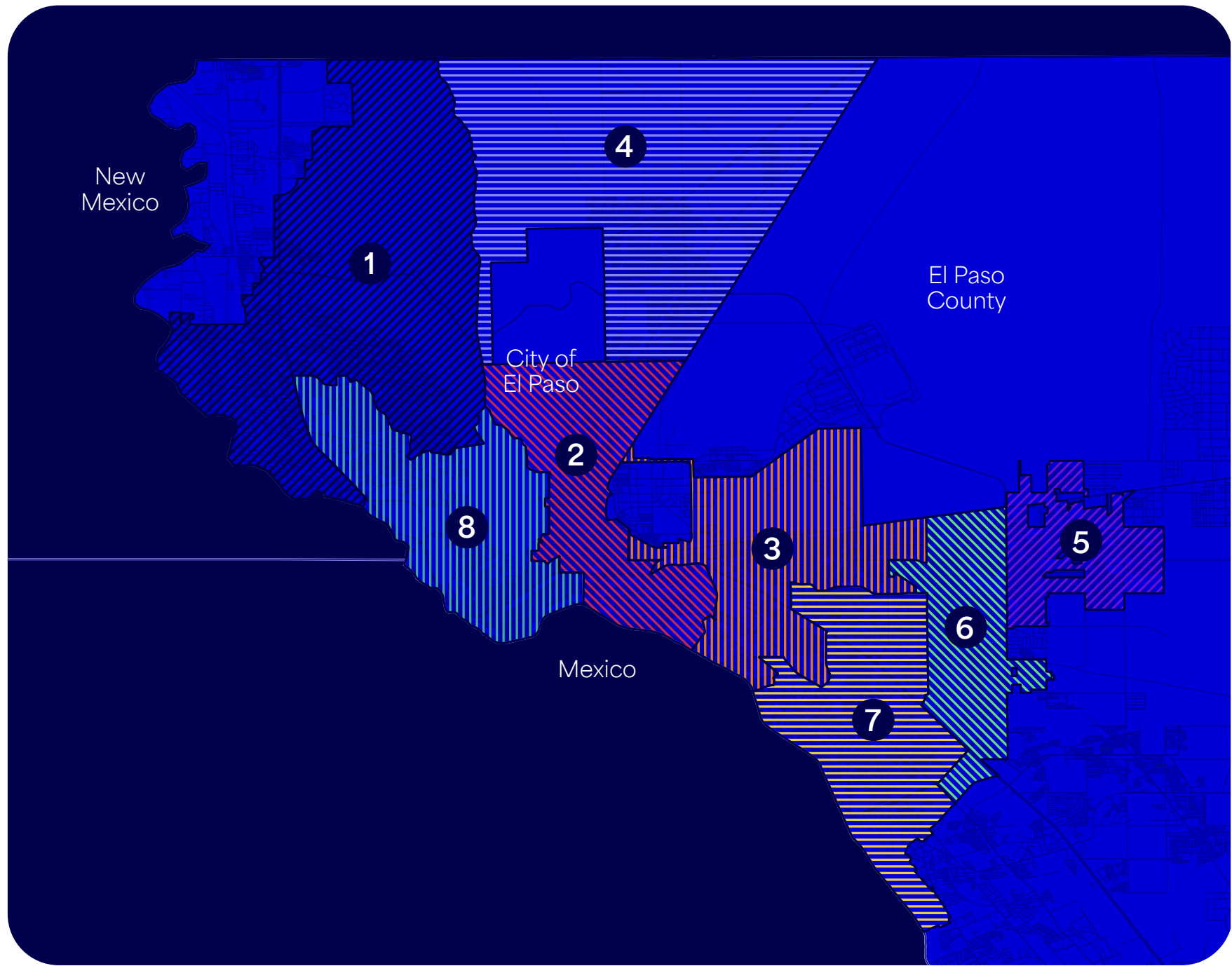
- 1. The eight representative districts of the city of El Paso were used as the basis for geographic segmentation, with population density considered to proportionally distribute the sample according to each district's population.

2. Within each district, the sample was distributed ensuring that participants resided in the corresponding district. Respondent selection was carried out using the systematic random sampling method. All interviews were conducted face-to-face by trained interviewers who asked each question and recorded the responses on an electronic device. A mixed technique was employed in the selection process, prioritizing the administration of questionnaires at residences, with only one questionnaire per household, using systematic intervals between households. Additionally, questionnaires were also administered in high-traffic areas within each district, where systematic random selection was applied. Only one person was interviewed in the case of groups or families, and several people were passed before approaching the next respondent.

Final Notes

Only residents of the city of El Paso aged 18 or older were interviewed, whether citizens or legal residents living within the corresponding district.

For the questionnaire administration process, the interviewers underwent a training workshop that covered the survey questions in detail, the use of visual aids, correct survey administration, and technical details for the use of electronic devices. Throughout the questionnaire administration period, progress monitoring, supervision, and database audits were conducted.

Additionally, supervised control was maintained over methodological aspects to ensure correct distribution, adhering to all expected quality standards.

In total, 1,087 questionnaires were administered. However, after the data review process, adjustments were made, leaving a final sample of 1,023 fully completed questionnaires.
