Gideon Servant Leadership Conference Calls Leaders to Faithful Stewardship at Museum of the Bible

Washington, D.C. — Rooted in the principle that “whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant” (Matthew 20:26), the Gideon Servant Leadership Conference gathered faith-based leaders at the Museum of the Bible for a transformative day of worship, teaching, and leadership equipping.

Hosted by Bernard Height, the conference focused on developing leaders who understand that influence is stewardship. Through structured sessions and interactive discussions, participants explored biblical models of servant leadership alongside practical organizational tools designed to strengthen ministry impact.

The day opened with praise and worship accompanied by live saxophone, creating a reverent and authentic atmosphere that aligned heart and mission. A guided tour of the Museum reinforced themes of legacy, generational responsibility, and the enduring power of faith.

Height’s keynote emphasized that servant leadership requires both humility and preparation. “Faith must be supported by structure,” he noted, encouraging leaders to pair spiritual conviction with accountability systems and strategic clarity.
