


## TRAGEDIES AVERTED ON ROSEDALE BEACHES VICKI SMITH

This summer Rosedale's treacherous rips have embroiled a number of swimmers. On Christmas Day, a young girl swimming in the middle of main beach suddenly found herself out of her depth in a channel. Despite struggling against the rip, she was steadily being pulled away from the shore and starting to panic – unable to hear her dad calling to her to swim across the beach. Luckily, local surfer Tom Hickey spotted her, jumped back on his board and headed out to get her.

#### **RECENT RESCUES**

- January 2016. Bill Legge assisted a young teenager, who raised his arm for help when caught in a rip in front of the main entrance to the beach.
- January 2015. John Gasson assisted a man boogie boarding in jeans.
- February 2016. Murray and Christine Sheil spotted a middle-aged woman waving for help, clinging to rocks at the far north of Boatshed beach. She had lost her footing and panicked when the rip swept her into a deep gutter. Murray managed, with some difficulty, to get her back to shallow water.
- 2014. Yvonne Brennan went to the assistance of four children in a rip on the southern side of the rocks near the cabins. She managed to get two of them out - but was unable to get herself and a teenage girl from the rip until bystanders threw boogie boards out towards them. Yvonne has a Bronze Medallion, Bronze Cross and Award of Merit for lifesaving and was a volunteer co-trainer of the Bronze Star and Medallion programs in Sydney. One of the teenagers also had her Bronze Medallion and had attended Nippers for five years. This incident prompted our increased focus on beach safety issues.
- New Year's Day, 2012. Tim Brown helped a number of people from a rip at the northern end of Boatshed Beach.
- 2012. David and Kay Graham assisted a woman who got into difficulty while swimming beside the rocks between Boatshed and main beach.
- March 2012. John Gasson rescued a couple who had stepped off the sand bank and into the trench that often appears in front of the cabins. With some difficulty, he managed to return them both to the sand bar.
- 2010. John Gasson assisted another man caught in a rip in front of the cabins.

#### STAY SAFE ON OUR BEACHES

All these swimmers were safe, thanks to the quick thinking and actions of locals. But we're aware of four people who have died in the surf over past decades.


#### SEWERAGE UPDATE DAVID BOARDMAN

Our sewerage work for Rosedale and Guerilla Bay is progressing.

Stage 1 (the sewage pump station and the new Tomakin flow tank) is progressing well. Just before Christmas the NSW Government signed off on the tender for Stage 2 and in mid-January Council appointed Ledonne Constructions to complete the system. Transport and Infrastructure Minister Andrew Constance has also announced an additional \$2.48 million towards the project (state's financial assistance now \$3.76 million).

Ledonne will begin site work in April and anticipate substantially completing the work by the end of the year. They held an info session in the Rosedale carpark in January and they'll have a Community Liaison Officer on site for most of the construction period.

### FEATHERTAIL GLIDER COLONY ALANA LEGGE



This feathertail glider (Acrobates pygmaeus) caused a disturbance in my folks' home in Knowlman Road last April. It was found scratching at a flyscreen, trying to get out one night. At first glance, they thought it was a mouse but it wasn't behaving like a mouse. They

then lost track of it until the morning, when they found it huddled in the bathroom. They caught it and noticed that it had grey-brown fur on top and white fur underneath.

It also had a distinctive fringed tail. They took it to Mogo Zoo to have the vets check it out. Mogo Zoo staff later phoned to say that the glider was healthy and had been released by them in Knowlman Road, so it could return to its colony in the tall trees.

Feathertail gliders are relatively common in Australia and live in the tall, mature, moist forests along the eastern coast, extending all the way from Cape York Peninsula to eastern South Australia. This glider is the smallest gliding mammal in the world, weighing only 10 to 15g. They are very social little animals too, with records of up to 30 in one nest.

Keep an eye out for these acrobatic gliders at night, as they feed on pollen, nectar, manna, sugary sap and small insects found on the trunks, foliage and blossoms of trees. They can volplane 20 metres in one glide, with the long stiff hairs on their fringed tails assisting them to volplane, steer, brake and anchor themselves.

It seems only a few weeks since the Christmas newsletter and already Easter is rushing up on us. I'd like to thank the other members of the committee for all their support - they are (in no particular order), Jane Enright, David Mackenzie and Ian Holmes.

I'm pleased to report that the Landcare committee has been making some positive steps to ensure that we get the best outcomes for our community.

Two submissions have been lodged with Council.

- The first is to have Council endorse all reserves in Rosedale to ensure they are approved for Landcare volunteers. This will ensure all volunteers are insured on working bees beyond the limited locations of the past, giving us greater scope to explore the broader needs of Rosedale safely.
- The second submission is a bid for funding to install properly designed stairs at the end of Yowani Road, providing safer access to the beach while at the same time protecting the landscape from further erosion and damage.

I would like to make a special mention of the new owners of The Retreat, David and Jennie Sutherland, who have been

incredibly generous of spirit by continuing the public access to Nun's beach. Thank you to you both. I'd also like to note the huge amount of work they've undertaken in clearing their block of large volumes of weeds. I look forward to building on the cooperative relationship fostered by Jane Enright between Landcare, Council and the owners, past and present, of The Retreat.

Landcare has also commissioned work on Banksia Flats and continues to work with Council to nurture the public face of Rosedale in our beachfront car park. We're doing lots more too - I'm looking forward to talking to you at the AGM and hearing about what you think Landcare should be focusing on in the future.

Can I please encourage as many of you as possible to attend our annual Easter weedathon on Saturday 26 March. We plan to have a weed swap stall providing native endemic plants in exchange for identified weeds.
