GREGORY R. WELLS, 68 of Dingmans Ferry, Pennsylvania lost his struggle with Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML) on Saturday July 12, 2014 at VNA Hospice House of Monroe County in East Stroudsburg, Pennsylvania. He was married to Joy (Freeland) Wells. Greg and Joy met at Muhlenberg College in Allentown, Pennsylvania and were married shortly after graduation in July 1968. He is survived by Joy and their only daughter Dawn Nadeau, who resides in New York City with her husband Philip and their children Julia and Abigail.

Born November 28, 1945 in Washington, D.C., he was the son of the late John and Marjory (Rogers) Wells formerly of Doylestown, Pennsylvania and Stuart, Florida. In addition to his wife and daughter, he is survived by his sister Brenda Jennings of Bedford, Pennsylvania. Greg was a proud veteran, attaining the rank of Chief Warrant Officer 4th Grade and served with the U.S. Navy as a pilot and Pennsylvania Army National Guard for over 25 years. He was very proud of the roles he played in the rescue efforts for the Three Mile Island disaster in 1979; the Johnstown Flood in 1977; and his participation as a civilian contractor with the U.S. Army in Operation Desert Storm and the Iraq War, during which he worked overseas in both Afghanistan and Iraq. He received his Bachelor of Science Degree from Muhlenberg College in Allentown, Pennsylvania in 1968 and earned his Master of Business Administration from Lehigh University in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania in 1972. He was a member of the Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity (ATO). Greg worked as a computer analyst and consultant for over 35 years with companies such as Sperry Univac, AT&T and as an independent consultant. He and Joy resided in Wellsville, Pennsylvania; Clinton, New Jersey, and for the last 15 years at Blue Heron Lake in Dingmans Ferry, Pennsylvania.

A memorial service is scheduled for 1:00PM Sunday July 20, 2014 at Blue Heron Lake Lodge, Dory's Road, Dingmans Ferry, Pennsylvania 18328. A reception for all will follow the services. Memorial contributions may be made in his memory to your favorite charity of choice.
