The Praefects

Each year the school meets in the chapel on Ascension Day for Mass and the Ceremony of Institution of the new praefects. These praefects who are elected by the student body, serve as its leaders throughout their Senior year.

The praefects are an intricate part of the school. The praefects in fact govern the student body. A praefect resides in each house. With the housemaster he is in charge of that dorm. The praefects conduct the assemblies and chapel lines. They serve on the Student Council. They are indeed responsible for the conduct of all the students at all times.

The Senior Praefect holds an especially important position. He is the President of the school. Appointed by the headmaster from the four elect-

ed praefects, he is the primary advisor to the headmaster.

Not every school has a system such as ours. In many schools the headmaster simply appoints the praefects. In other schools there are no praefects and the school is run entirely by the faculty. Only in fairly recent years have the students here at Saint Peter's elected their own praefect.

This past year the school was fortunate in having four capable and devoted praefects. They did much to nurture the perfect harmony which characterized one of the most successful years in the history of the school. They have done much to further the tradition of their office. They leave a record hard to equal.

Student Council

Two years ago the Student Council was reorganized. A new Constitution was drafted for it. From its reorganization it has emerged as one of the strongest student governing organizations in any school.

The Student Council at Saint Peter's is a board of nine members presided over by the Senior Praefect. A faculty advisor is present at all meetings as a liason between the students and the administration.

Though the Council possesses necessary punitive powers in conjunction with the administration, its main function is of a preventive nature. It seeks to help boys stay out of trouble by both its recommendations and its counseling. To this end it formulates a code of conduct for the student body. In addition it sets up the social calendar of the year and advises on the extra-curricular activities.

In the two years following the reorganization of the Student Council Mr. Ennis more than adequately served as its advisor. It is largely due to his guidance and understanding that the organization now holds its position of esteem. This year, as dictated by the Constitution, a new faculty advisor was elected. Mr. Adkins, who has become the successor of Mr. Ennis, has continued in the ideals formulated by his predecessor.

The Student Council has continued to gain in prestige as an organization which provides a voice for the student body and a liason between student and administration.

In January we sang for Saint Peter's Guild of Saint Peter's Church in Peekskill and at the Church of the Resurrection and St. Thomas Church in New York City.

In March we were at Trinity Church in Os-

sining and at churches in Brooklyn, N. Y. and Paterson, N. J. On March 10 we left Peekskill for the tour. Starting with the first concert at Saint Mary's Hall in Burlington, N. J., we then went on to Washington, D. C. where we sang two concerts. The next stop was Waycross, Georgia, and then on to Tampa and Bradenton, Florida. Probably the most interesting thing we did was to sing for the three-day Mission at the Church of the Redeemer in Sarasota. Following the Mission we sang a concert at the Civic Auditorium there. The final stop was Atlanta, Georgia after which we went home, arriving in New York March 20.

All in all it has been a good season and a very busy one. Those of us who have had the privilege of being in the Glee Club have enjoyed it.



Varsity Club

A Varsity letter constitutes the highest athletic award which may be given to any boy for athletic achievement. The select group who have received this honor compose the Varsity Club. The officers for this year were as president, Tom McCormack, as vice-president, Andy McLaughlin, and as secretary-treasurer, Dick Boss.

The Varsity Club has evolved from a small Athletic Council in 1947 to an organization of prestige and importance. It concerns itself with almost every aspect of the sports program. It helps the Athletic Director in determining policies and running the athletics of the school.

As one of the Varsity seasons comes to a close the Varsity Club convenes to consult with the coach concerning who is to receive Varsity letters. The awarding of the letter depends upon the approval of the Varsity Club.

Unfortunately the Varsity Club sometimes must take disciplinary action against those who break training rules, but the aim is towards prevention of recurrence rather than punishment.

In the spring the Varsity Club is responsible for the organization of the Crimson and Gold games in track, soccer and basketball. 
