
The Dedication

Administration

The praefects of the school are responsible for the general conduct of the student body. They must enforce the rules and set a decent example. They control the the Chapel line and conduct the assemblies. In dormitories, they hold secondary responsibility, subordinate only to the housemasters, They are not appointed, but elected from the Fifth Form late in the spring. The results of the voting are made known on Ascension Day, when the new praefects are installed in the Chapel. Immediately after the service, they are taken out to dinner by Father Leeming and Mr. Ennis. The entire conversation at the meal is confidential. At that time, the inspectors are chosen.

The inspectors are an important group of boys. Depending upon their thoroughness is the success of the self-help system of Saint Peter's. Their responsibility is that of running the work crews which keep the campus clean and in order. There are inspectors in the gymnasium, schoolhouse, chapel, dining room, studio, all dormitories and on the outside grounds.

The praefects and the inspectors are of the Senior Class. Their tasks center upon general control of the student body. The Student Council however, is a more representative body. It acts as a liason between the administration and the students. It has its own constitution and is run on a democratic basis. The members are: the praefects; the presidents and vice-presidents of the upper three forms; the president of the Third Form. It has power to pass positive legislation, subject to Father Leeming's approval, and to act as a judicial body in dealing with student offenses.

Music

Music is a highly developed phase of activity at Saint Peter's. Its focal point centers upon the work of the Glee Club. A successful glee club here, is the result of much effort put forth by Father Leeming and a responsive effort by the boys.

Throughout the school year, the Singing Peers sing the Mass in local churches, and also make secular appearances. The program of the latter is variegated from English folk songs to ballads of the West. It always has contained Broadway show music. This year it had scores from two shows; "Gigi" and "The Sound of Music."

The initial performances of the Glee Club serve to accustom the boys to audiences and provide opportunities for Father to spot its weaknesses.

The group does not hit its stride until March, when it embarks upon the Annual Spring Tour. The itinerary extends through Dixie, as far as Florida.

The highlight of the Glee Club year is the Annual Spring Concert, which is held in the Roosevelt Hotel, New York City.

From the Glee Club, twelve voices are chosen to be in the Bishop's Men. This smaller group specializes in vocal selections which are in general, more light, more difficult, or more colorful than those of its parent group. Mr. Fall trains and directs the Bishop's Men. Although the extra rehearsals are a minor disadvantage to membership, the fun of performing its vivid program is full compensation. This year, Mr. Fall attempted to arrange to have the Bishop's Men depart from the Glee Club in Florida and go to Bermuda. The plan could not be realized, because the group's profits could not cover its expenses. Perhaps some future group will have better luck concerning this proposition.

The "Senior Sinners" was formed this year to provide a humorous, barber shop group. The seven boys in this group had a great deal of fun.

Finally, Mr. Grant Smith, who accompanies the Glee Club on the organ and piano, also gives piano lessons to students every Monday morning.

Religion



Evening Prayers at Main House

The strong concern of the Administration for the moral welfare of the student body is shown by the firm place which religion occupies at school. Its influence reaches everyone. Not a day passes by in which the students go without exposure to the teachings of the Church.

The school day is begun with prayers at the morning assembly and closed with prayers in the dormitories. Grace is said before all meals, and a Thanksgiving pronounced after them. The Holy Eucharist is attended by the whole school prior to breakfast on Sunday morning. Each dormitory has its own day set aside for a House Mass, before breakfast. The Mass is celebrated every Wednesday in remembrance of the Alumni. Finally, a brief Evening Prayer service is held every day before supper.

Weekly Sacred Studies classes supply students with necessary religious education both in Church history and in basic doctrine. Seniors are grounded in a basic understanding of Communism by Father Leeming's Sacred Studies class.



The first game, against Oakwood, proved to be a foreshadowing of things to come as the Saints lost 13-7.




The following Saturday the Saints lost to Concordia 19-0, as all the opposition's points were scored in the first quarter.

In the next two weeks the Saints met defeat at the hands of Millbrook and Gunnery. In each game the Saints were unable to start their offensive attack rolling, as they scored one lone touchdown.

Finally the last football day arrived. The entire student body travelled to King School, in Stamford Connecticut, to witness the game. The Saints fought hard, and although they outgained King School in total yardage, they failed to outscore them, and lost 22-6.



The following game the Saints played Scarsdale High School. Although the Saints lost the game, by a score of 2-0, they played well against one of the top teams in Westchester County.



Wrestling




Wrestling was instituted at Saint Peter's two years ago. It met with immediate popularity from the students. The team itself was successful, as the boys had a winning season.




