as well as those from whom he learns.

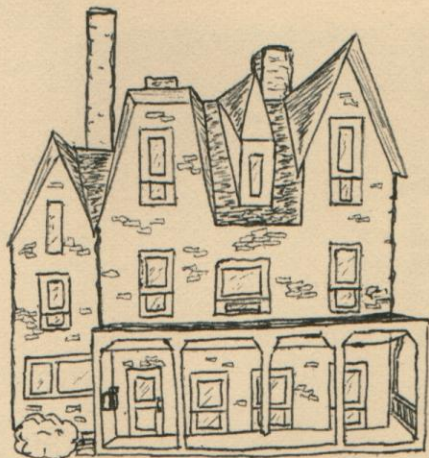
One learns to distinguish

the challenge of higher education and life.



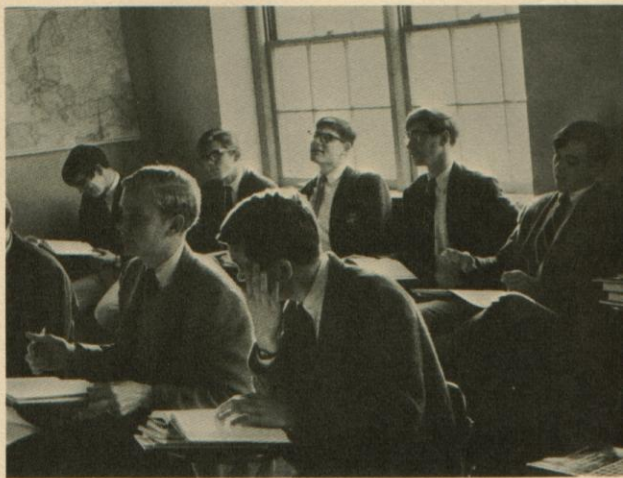

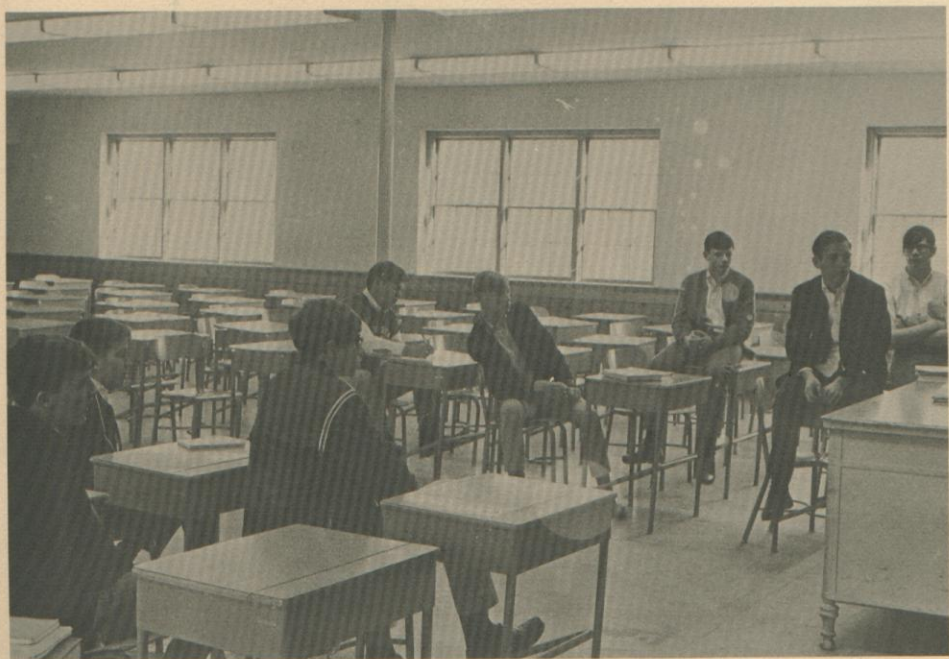


Self-government allows

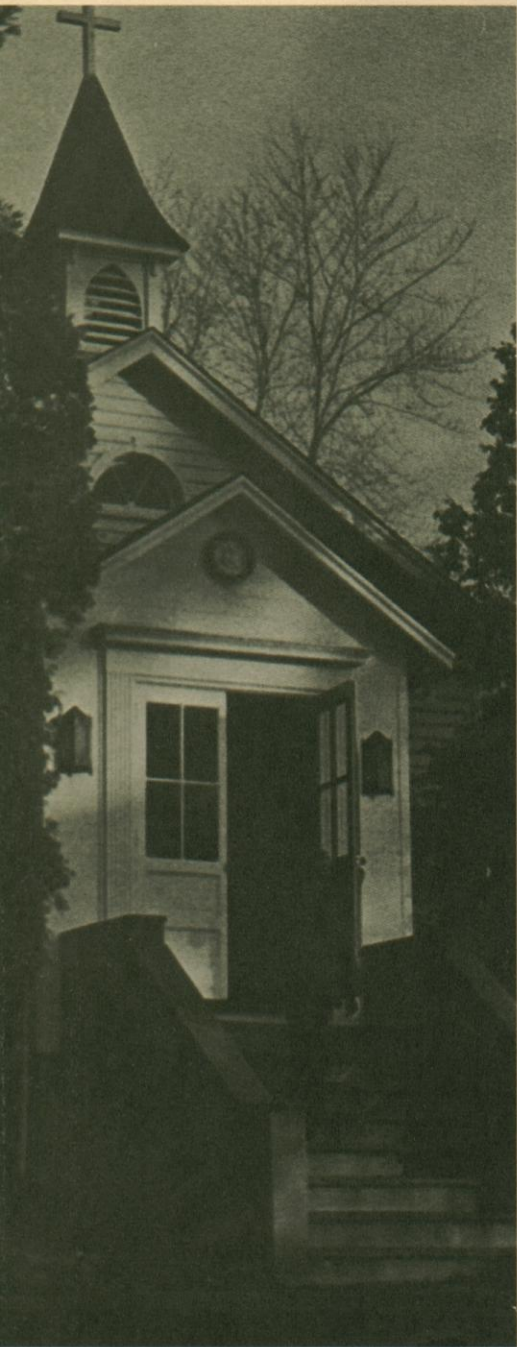




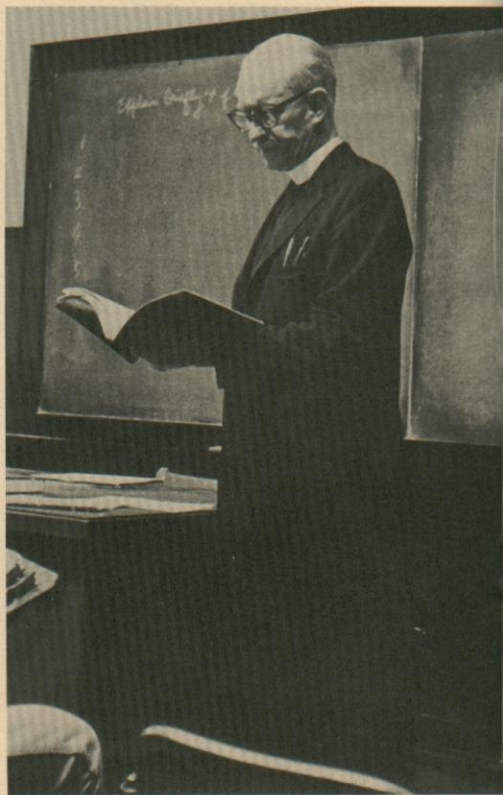

of studies and sports.





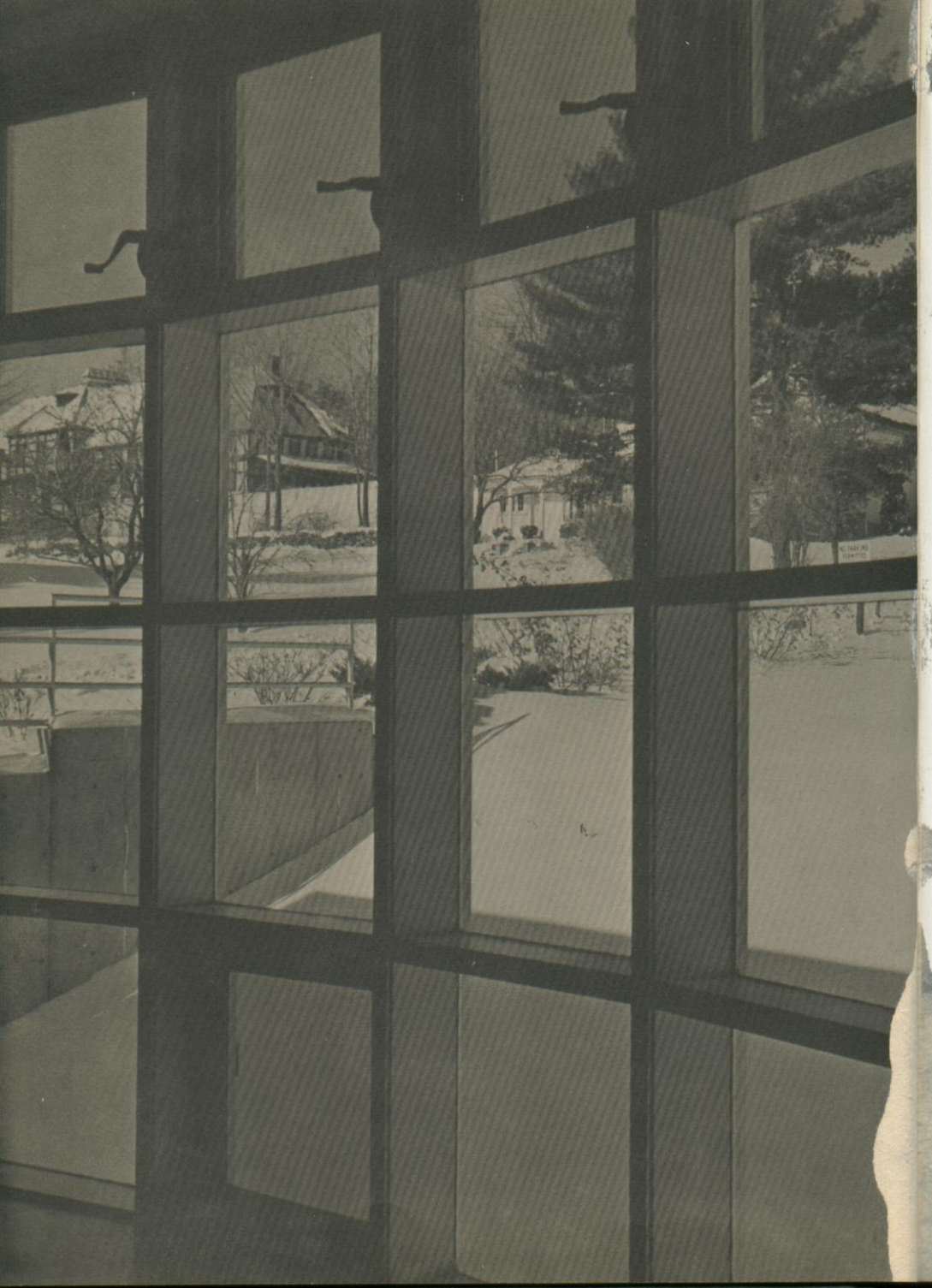
The church introduces to us
