William "Bill" Harry Barutio (April 5, 1936 - February 27, 2023), loving husband of 20 years to Nancy Barutio, went to be with his Lord and Savior on Monday, February 27, 2023.

Born in Philadelphia, PA, he was the son of the late Stephen and Evelyn Levinson Barutio.

From Valedictorian of his Graduating Class at St. Peter's High School in Peekskill, NY, Bill went on to earn his Bachelor's Degree from Yale and his Master's Degree from Pepperdine University. Bill proudly served his country as a Captain in the United States Marine Corps.

Bill was a big advocate of the Civil Rights Movement. He worked alongside Dr. Martin Luther King as well as John Lewis with whom he co-authored a book titled The Voting Rights Act: Ten Years After (1974). He also co-authored the book Andrew Young, The Path to History (1973).

Bill was the Fulton County Democratic Party Chairman and worked with Andrew Young and Jimmy Carter, helping to coordinate the Democratic Convention.

Bill was a very successful entrepreneur who owned and operated multiple businesses in both GA and NC. These included McBar Demographics, Inc. in Atlanta; Stiles, Wiles and Barutio, Inc., a realty company in Savannah; The John Wesley Hotel / Nancy Hanks Restaurant in Savannah; and the Trust General Store & Cafe outside of Hot Springs, NC.

In 1991, Bill built the St. Jude's Chapel of Hope on his property in Trust, NC that has been featured in travel magazines as well as Internet sites and has been visited by hundreds of people traveling Highway 63.

He was a sweet, caring gentleman who loved his family and was an amazing son, brother, husband, father, and grandfather. Bill loved the beach, especially Edisto, and was a member of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Greenville.

His legacy will continue in the hearts of his wife, children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren that he loved (whether biological or through marriage).
