

Discipleship: The Love of God Working through You!



Everyone will know that you are my talmidim (disciples) by the fact that you have love for each other."

John 13:35 CJB

Identity, purpose and discipleship are all birthed out of our relationship as children of God and co-heirs with Jesus Christ in the Kingdom of God. The above scripture tells us that the world will "know" we are Jesus' disciples from the "love" we have one toward another. This is not just something we can apply when it is convenient for us, but we must ponder what the Word of God is saying in this context. Yes, we have gifts; Yes, we have received salvation through accepting Jesus as our Lord and Savior, but are we His disciples? Do we have love for one another?

The word love, in this context, is <u>agape</u>. According to Biblehub.com, this is the definition for the kind of love we are to have with one another.

Definition: love, benevolence, good will, esteem; plur: love-feasts

26 agápē – properly, love which centers in moral preference. So too in secular ancient Greek, 26 (agápē) focuses on preference; likewise the verb form (25 / agapáō) in antiquity meant "to prefer" (TDNT, 7). In the NT, 26 (agápē) typically refers to divine love (= what God prefers).

In this lesson, we are going to look at discipleship in the life of Jesus and His disciples. We witnessed their initial contact with Jesus and how they followed Him in



John chapter one. We too have received the call to "follow Jesus" and replied, "Yes" to the call. Many principles we find (as it relates to the life of a disciple) will apply to your life and mine as a follower of Jesus Christ.

Discipleship in the life of Jesus and His disciples

In Hebrew, Talmid is the word used for disciple and it means "pupil". In Greek, it is translated as follows:

3101 mathētés (from math-, the "mental effort needed to think something through") – properly, <u>a learner</u>; a disciple, a <u>follower of Christ who learns</u> the <u>doctrines of Scripture</u> and the <u>lifestyle they require</u>; someone catechized with proper <u>instruction from the Bible with its necessary follow-through (life-applications)</u>. See also 3100 /mathēteúō ("to disciple").

When we look at the interconnectedness of Jesus and His disciples from this vantage, we clearly see there is a lifestyle that precedes them walking in the full call upon their life. They had to receive instruction from Jesus, The Word, and begin to apply it to their life in demonstration.

Lesson # 1-Pray and ask for the Holy Spirit (Teacher/Guide) to guide you through the Word of God as you study as a pupil (learner) of the Word.

Lesson#2-Make the necessary adjustments in your lifestyle, according to the Word of God and the Holy Spirit's prompting.

For this lesson, we are going to look at the Gospel according to Mark. I have a breakdown (separate document) if you would like to understand the difference between Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Many people are not familiar with the variations/similarities that are presented; therefore, it is helpful to do a little study so you will have a clear understanding of each writing style. I will send by request only.

Mark (2:2, 5; 8-11; 13-15; 17)

Jesus (Yeshua)

^{2:2} while he was preaching the message to them... (Preaching)



^{2:5} Yeshua said to the paralyzed man, "Son, your sins are forgiven (Forgiveness)

⁸ But immediately Yeshua, perceiving in his spirit what they were thinking, said to them, "Why are you thinking these things? ⁹ Which is easier to say to the paralyzed man? 'Your sins are forgiven'? or 'Get up, pick up your stretcher and walk'? ¹⁰ But look! I will prove to you that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins." He then said to the paralytic, ¹¹ "I say to you: get up, pick up your stretcher and go home!" (Discernment, authority over sin and sickness)

¹³ Yeshua went out again by the lake. All the crowd came to him, and he began teaching them. ¹⁴ As he passed on from there, he saw Levi Ben-Halfai sitting in his tax-collection booth and said to him, "Follow me!". (Teaching, calling disciples)

¹⁵ As Yeshua was in Levi's house eating, many tax-collectors and sinners were sitting with Yeshua and his talmidim, for there were many of them among his followers. (Fellowship)

¹⁷ But, hearing the question, Yeshua answered them, "The ones who need a doctor aren't the healthy but the sick. I didn't come to call the 'righteous' but sinners!" (Purpose & awakening)

Mark (2:3-5; 12)

Brotherly Love

³ four men came to him carrying a paralyzed man. ⁴They could not get near Yeshua because of the crowd, so they stripped the roof over the place where he was, made an opening, and lowered the stretcher with the paralytic lying on it. ⁵ Seeing their trust, Yeshua said to the paralyzed man, "Son, your sins are forgiven. In front of everyone the man got up, picked up his stretcher at once and left. ¹²They were all utterly amazed and praised God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!" (Faith, compassion, agape love, forgiveness of sin and obedience)

Mark (2:6-7, 16)

Religion



⁶Some Torah-teachers sitting there thought to themselves, ⁷ "How can this fellow say such a thing? He is blaspheming! Who can forgive sins except God?" (Religious spirit)

¹⁶ When the Torah-teachers and the P'rushim saw that he was eating with sinners and tax-collectors, they said to his talmidim, "Why does he eat with tax-collectors and sinners?" (Self-righteousness)

Discipleship

Mark (2:14-20)

¹⁴ As he passed on from there, he saw Levi Ben-Halfai sitting in his tax-collection booth and said to him, "Follow me!". And he got up and followed him (Obedience)

Also Yochanan's talmidim and the P'rushim were fasting; and they came and asked Yeshua, "Why is it that Yochanan's talmidim and the talmidim of the P'rushim fast, but your talmidim don't fast?" ¹⁹ Yeshua answered them, "Can wedding guests fast while the bridegroom is still with them? As long as they have the bridegroom with them, fasting is out of the question. ²⁰ But the time will come when the bridegroom is taken away from them; and when that day comes, they will fast. (Fasting)

1 Peter 4:7-19 (CJB) (Click on Scripture Verse(s) for Extended Commentary)

⁷The accomplishing of the goal of all things is close at hand. Therefore, keep <u>alert</u> and <u>self-controlled</u>, so that you can <u>pray</u>. ⁸More than anything, keep <u>loving each other</u> actively; because love covers many sins. ^[a] ⁹Welcome one another into your homes without grumbling. ¹⁰ As each one has received some <u>spiritual gift</u>, he should use it to <u>serve others</u>, like good managers of God's many-sided grace — ¹¹ if someone speaks, <u>let him speak God's words</u>; if someone <u>serves</u>, <u>let him do so out of strength that God supplies</u>; so that in everything God may be glorified through Yeshua the Messiah — to him be glory and power forever and ever. *Amen*.

¹² Dear friends, don't regard as strange the fiery ordeal occurring among you to test you, as if something extraordinary were happening to you. ¹³ Rather, to the extent that you share the fellowship of the Messiah's sufferings, <u>rejoice</u>; so that you will rejoice



even more when his *Sh'khinah* is revealed. ¹⁴ If you are being insulted because you bear the name of the Messiah, how blessed you are! For the Spirit of the *Sh'khinah*, that is, the Spirit of God, is resting on you! ¹⁵ Let none of you suffer for being a murderer or a thief or an evildoer or a meddler in other people's affairs. ¹⁶ But if anyone suffers for being Messianic, let him not be ashamed; but let him bring glory to God by the way he bears this name. ¹⁷ For the time has come for the judgment to begin. It begins with the household of God; and if it starts with us, what will the outcome be for those who are disobeying God's Good News? —

1 Thessalonians 1:3

Calling to mind before God our Father what our Lord Yeshua the Messiah has brought about in you — how your <u>trust</u> produces action, your <u>love</u> hard work, and your <u>hope</u> perseverance.

Ephesians 5:1-3

So <u>imitate God</u>, as his dear children; and <u>live a life of love</u>, just as also the Messiah loved us, indeed, on our behalf gave himself up as an offering, as a slaughtered sacrifice to God with a pleasing fragrance. Among you <u>there should not even be mentioned sexual immorality</u>, or any kind of impurity, or greed; these are utterly inappropriate for God's holy people.

In my earlier letter I wrote you <u>not to associate with people who engage in sexual immorality</u>. Patient (2 Peter 3:9)-The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some people think of slowness; on the contrary, he is patient with you; for it is not his purpose that anyone should be destroyed, but that everyone should turn from his sins
