You may see the license plates on some of the vehicles; another way to help is buy that plate for your vehicle.

Keeping Your Pets Safe in Summer

As the beautiful days and evenings of spring and summer are soon here, it is fun to spend more time outside or to drive around with your pets. Yet we have



to remember to leave them home on any hot day as a stationary car becomes dangerous for a pet in only a few minutes. That's how quickly an animal can become a victim of heat stroke or even die

Everyone, all species, get thirsty and need extra water in the heat. Whether you are driving, hiking or just out for a walk, please be sure to have plenty of water to share with your pets. You can even get a collapsible bowl for the pups to use.

Many pets with lighter pigments in their eyes, ears, nose, belly etc. have a high chance of getting a sunburn. There is sunscreen formulated for dogs for this reason. Check with your veterinarian to see what kind would be best for your pet.

Many of us love to go swimming in streams, lakes, pools etc. but your dogs may not share your enthusiasm. Be aware of a dog's reaction to water and go slowly at first. Never force any animal into water. Dogs are very good at letting you know what they like or don't like. Listen to and trust your dog! If they do like to swim, be sure to give them a bath afterwards to remove algae, dirt or sand off of them. And just like with kids - watch your pets around water.

Make sure you know the signs of heat stress from exposure to high temperatures. Check the animal for signs of heavy panting, glazed eyes, a rapid heartbeat, restlessness, excessive thirst, lethargy, fever, dizziness, lack of coordination, profuse salivation, vomiting, a deep red or purple tongue, and unconsciousness.

If your pet is overheating:

- 1. Move your pet into the shade or an air-conditioned area.
- 2. Apply ice packs or cold towels to your pet's head, neck and chest or immerse him in cool (not cold) water.
- 3. Let your pet drink small amounts of cool water or lick ice cubes.
- 4. Take your pet directly to a veterinarian.

Many pets are afraid of fireworks - dogs and cats may start to panic, pant excessively and drool. If you know your pet is afraid of loud booming noises, give them a quiet area they can retreat when the fireworks are going off. Please bring them indoors as frequently when the fireworks are exploding pets will find any way they can to get away from the loud noise. They will run and easily get lost. If your pet suffers from extreme stress, talk to your veterinarian for their advice on other ways to calm its nerves. A lot of pets react the same way during a thunderstorm, so keep the weather in mind and again, allow them a safe place to retreat to help them feel secure.

As always during the nice weather, have fun, enjoy the sun and think about your pets' safety.


Adopting a new family member is a fun and exciting time but it can also come with many challenges. Let me share with you our experience to hopefully give you some perspective. Years ago, we adopted our dog, Priya. She came into the shelter a bit under a year old and pregnant. She was lucky enough to go into a wonder foster home with the Middleton family and I had the occasion to spend time with her and her babies.

We had lost our old girl and after many weeks and much family discussions we agreed to adopt Priya. It was my assumption that she'd fit right into our lives and home since she spent weeks with her foster family, and we spent weeks with her! That, I soon found out, was a total fantasy! This outgoing, loving, sweet girl was terrified when she walked in our house. She crawled on her belly and hid under a table all the while urinating across the living room carpet. She didn't want anything to do with my husband and barely tolerated me! It slowly did get better, but we knew we had a long way to go. After a few weeks we had a serious and tearful family discussion as we didn't know if we were the right fit for her or her with us. We knew if this was going to work it would take a family commitment. We researched on the internet, consulted a trainer and made a family plan. After a few more weeks we started to see her relax and become more confident with us and after a few months we knew that we made the right decision. Ten years later she is still with us, has her quirks, sometimes drives me crazy but makes our home whole!

Here are some thoughts and ideas that I have learned over the years

- Give your new pet TIME!
 - oTime to just be
 - Time to decompress
 - o Time to get to know you, your home and your rules
- Give them a quiet safe place that is theirs to go to when the stress is too much
- Be clear, calm, patient and kind as they adjust to this new wonderful life
- Establish clear communication with them so they know what is expected
- If things go awry DON'T GIVE UP! Seek training help either via a qualified professional or internet research

I will end this by reminding you that the HSWM is always here for you. When you adopted your new family member, we made a commitment to you and them!

HOW TO USE AMAZONSMILE USING THE AMAZON APP ON YOUR MOBILE PHONE

- 1. Open the Amazon Shopping app
- 2.Go to the main menu, look for the three horizontal lines in the menu
- 3.Tap on Settings and then select "AmazonSmile"
- 4.Select HSWM and then follow the instructions to turn o AmazonSmile in the mobile app

Edible Summer Delights

Who doesn't love something cold and refreshing on a hot day? Just about all dogs and cats would say . . . "WE DO! US! LOOK DOWN"!!



To please your furry pals, here are a few healthy, tasty recipes.

DOGS - Kongs are wonderful dog toys, especially when stuffed with yummy treats. Experiment with the recipes below to see which is your dog's favorite. After you make the mix, stuff it into a kong and freeze.

Ingredients: 1 mashed banana, 1 cup plain yogurt, 1 teaspoon honey

Ingredients: 1 cup cooked sweet potato or squash

handful boiled shredded chicken handful cooked carrots, 2 tablespoons plain yogurt

Ingredients: 1 cup low-fat cottage cheese

1 cup natural peanut butter (Xylitol-free, bad for dogs),

1 teaspoon honey

Ingredients: 1 cup of boiled potato ½ cup plain cottage cheese

½ cup grated low-fat cheese

CATS - Ingredients: 1 can tuna in water, drained, save water for extra treat. You can use other proteins if preferred by cat. 1 cup all-purpose flour, 1 tablespoon dried catnip, 1 large egg.

Mix together until a thick dough. Form dough into about 80 balls. Place on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Slightly flatten the balls. Bake in pre-heated oven about 15 minutes or until crisp and golden. Cool. Serve or store for 5 days or freeze for summer treats.
