Shelter Life

The world is in turmoil right now - otherwise known as the pandemic, which has resulted in things being a

little crazy here in our shelter world. We are considered essential so our dedicated staff have been at work every day, caring for and loving our homeless animals as per their usual. Because of the pandemic, we temporarily changed our hours of operation to close at 4:00pm each day instead of 5:00pm. Starting Monday, May 12th we are back to our regular, pre-pandemic business hours. Things have been a little quieter here, which has given staff a little bit of time to clean and organize in some areas that they usually do not have time for. We have still received stray animals; some were fortunate to be reunited with their families and surprisingly, we have also had many adoptions - which is a great thing for the animals!

Our DOGhouse Thrift Store was not considered essential to the public (even though it is essential to the animals!), so it was closed April 1st and will reopen on May 12th. During the down time, staff have re-varnished the floors, remodeled some things and moved merchandise around to make room for spring and summer items. Come on by and see the changes we have made! Of course, being compliant with our governor's orders, safe distancing will be followed, as well as staff having appropriate PPE and disinfecting often.

As we move forward into summer, we are uncertain if some of our scheduled events will take place, however, we are planning as though everything will go as scheduled. We start with Critter Camp June 8 -June 26, then on June 20th we will celebrate our 50 years in business, serving our community and so many homeless animals, followed by the 4th of July parade and then our 15th annual Happy Tails on August 29th in the Orchard at Charlie Clark's.

We have met the challenges we've faced so far this year and we will continue to care for all the homeless animals. With the help of our staff, volunteers and donors, we will get through these challenging times and come out stronger in the end!

Arizona Gives Day 2020 - What a Success!!

We begin planning for AZ Gives Day months in advance, so when we started working on our entry application and we listed our monetary goal for 2020, we decided to increase the amount we raised last year by a few thousand dollars. We thought if we worked hard, we might just be fortunate enough to reach our 2020 goal of \$20,000.

Then Covid-19 happened. Holy cow - how things changed. We continued on with our AZ Gives 2020 campaign as planned, but we feared that with the financial impact of the pandemic, we would be lucky if we raised half our goal. Nonetheless, we moved forward with our efforts as planned and felt whatever we ended up raising would be a blessing for the shelter, regardless. We had adopters and staff write stories of just a few of the animals that came through our shelter in 2019; the message we hoped to express is that, for these animals, all they needed was a chance - and hope - and love, and the most important part is that we were able to give them a chance, hope and love because of the generosity of people who believe in animal rescue and in us!

So, we emailed the wonderful stories of these animals out and hoped for the best, but prepared ourselves for what we thought was the likelihood that we would not come close to our goal.

Donations began rolling in a few weeks before the actual 'day' of AZ Gives Day; we were excited to see these donations, but we remained doubtful that we would come near the goal we set. Then Arizona Gives

Day came, April 7th. When we logged onto the AZ Gives Day website, we saw the total raised for the animals was \$10,000. We were thrilled—but it wasn't even 12 noon yet and we had hours to go before the fundraiser ended! By time we left work, the money raised for the animals had not only allowed us to reach our goal, but actually exceed it! In the end, we raised a total of \$22,302, which qualified us for an additional prize of \$500!

We so often struggle to find the words to express the depth of thankfulness we feel towards all of you, the amazingly generous supporters! All of us involved here, whether staff, volunteers, fosters, board members, etc. feel so very privileged to serve these animals for the time they are with us and we only can do it because of your support. **Thank you so very much!**


