- 7. What do each of the cities look to for their security? How does this security fail? Take some time to consider where you put your security and trust.
- 8. What is the temple of El (or Baal) Berith? What two events take place there in this chapter? How is Satan using this to challenge the one True God?
- 9. What was reaped & sown in this passage? Which event impacted you most?
- 10. What are you sowing in your life? What has God promised to those who sow in righteousness?
