- 1. Ultimately, Christ builds His kingdom. But what is our role? How do we build His kingdom?
- 2. Il Timothy 2:2 says we must "entrust" the gospel to faithful men... What does it mean to "entrust"? How do we do this? (hint: Il Timothy 1:5, 13)
- 3. Think about who entrusted the gospel to you. How did they impact your life? How can you imitate their example?
- 4. Read John 15:18 what assumption do Jesus & Paul have that we struggle with?
- 5. Read verse II Timothy 2:4. Christian, is there something so woven into the fabric of your life that service to Jesus is squeezed out by its presence? Are there lesser things (distractions, hobbies, kids' sports, career, leisure) which might be restricting you from effective kingdom service where God desires you?
- 6. Compare I Timothy 4:7 with II Timothy 2:5. How can we be trained for godliness?
- 7. What principles from the farmer can Christians learn? What will be the reward at the Harvest?
- 8. How can we improve or begin patterns of reflection on Scripture throughout our days?
- 9. What command appears in verse II Timothy 2:1? How does that create the foundation for all that is in the rest of the passage? How is it encouraging that Paul commands Timothy to be strengthened *by grace* rather than in physical prowess, mature leadership, or courageous boldness?
