Questions for Discussion & Reflection

Joshua 13-19

1. If you have not taken time to do so, read the entire section (Joshua 13-19) aloud, or use an audio Bible to listen to it.
 2. Read Numbers 23:19. What are some promises that God has kept? What are some that still wait for fulfillment?
 3. Why does God (through Joshua) give Judah the right to rule? Why don't Reuben or Simeon or Levi get the privileges of the firstborn?
 4. Why does Joseph receive the double portion?
 5. How does God remember the faithfulness of Joseph, Caleb & Joshua? How does this encourage you in your work? Is there a place you are tempted to grow weary? Read Galatians 6:9 and share encouragement with one another.
 6. Does it seem odd that the land is divided up by lot? How does Proverbs 16:33 clarify this?
 7. In Genesis 48, Jacob blesses Joseph's sons, but puts the younger ahead of the older. In a similar way, God has providentially placed you. What does God want you to do for Him in your unique context this week?
 8. Consider the course of your Christian walk. Are you progressing in faith and maturity? Consider asking a trusted friend to give you feedback.
