- 1. If you have not taken time to do so, read the entire section (Joshua 13-19) aloud, or use an audio Bible to listen to it.
- 2. Read Numbers 23:19. What are some promises that God has kept? What are some that still wait for fulfillment?
- 3. Why does God (through Joshua) give Judah the right to rule? Why don't Reuben or Simeon or Levi get the privileges of the firstborn?
- 4. Why does Joseph receive the double portion?
- 5. How does God remember the faithfulness of Joseph, Caleb & Joshua? How does this encourage you in your work? Is there a place you are tempted to grow weary? Read Galatians 6:9 and share encouragement with one another.
- 6. Does it seem odd that the land is divvied up by lot? How does Proverbs 16:33 clarify this?
- 7. In Genesis 48, Jacob blesses Joseph's sons, but puts the younger ahead of the older. In a similar way, God has providentially placed you. What does God want you to do for Him in your unique context this week?
- 8. Consider the course of your Christian walk. Are you progressing in faith and maturity? Consider asking a trusted friend to give you feedback.
