## Diving Deeper in Scripture Together

### Questions for Discussion & Reflection

Nehemiah 11:1-12:26

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1. What does David's refusal to offer "that which costs me nothing" (II Samuel 24:24) reveal about the nature of true worship?
2. How does the tithing of *people* in Nehemiah 11 expand our view of stewardship beyond money to our very selves (Romans 12:1)? What would it mean for you to "tithing" your time, energy, or skills for kingdom work this month?
3. In what ways does grace-giving under the New Covenant surpass the obligation of the Old (II Corinthians 9:7)? How does this principle point forward to Christ, who gave not a portion but His whole self?
4. Why does God often advance His purposes through those willing to take costly risks (Esther 4:16; Daniel 3:16-18; Acts 20:24)? What "comfort zone" might God be asking you to step beyond for the sake of His name?
5. How does "bearing reproach outside the camp" (Hebrews 13:13) shape our understanding of discipleship? What would kingdom risk look like in your workplace, friendships, or community involvement this week?
6. Nehemiah was called to serve at the pleasure of the king. Why might calling feel both like a privilege and a constraint - freeing us to obey, yet forbidding us to self-appoint? What helps you stay faithful in seasons when God's calling feels unclear or costly?
7. How does blessing others mirror God's own delight in those who serve Him faithfully? Who in your church or circle needs encouragement to keep serving courageously?
8. What does the people's praise of the "men of valor" teach about honoring obedience, not merely outcomes? What would it look like for you to finish your current assignment *well*?

9. Why is perseverance itself a form of worship, declaring God worthy of lifelong obedience? How can the community of faith help sustain perseverance when motivation wanes?
  
10. How does the long list of faithful priests in Nehemiah 12 illustrate the quiet heroism of endurance? Where do you feel tempted to grow weary in well-doing, and what truths strengthen you to continue?
