Questions for Discussion & Reflection

James 5:19-20

1. Can you remember and list all six questions that we considered about these final two verses in James?
2. James begins in verse 19 by addressing, "my brothers." Are wanderers only believers? Who are they?
3. The word "wanderer" translated here is drawn from the wandering planets. These people wander from the truth... as Pilate asked, "What is Truth?" Our culture offers many conflicting views; what does the Bible tell us?
4. God is alive and well and is rebuilding lives one sinner at a time. Are we joining Him in this eternal work or are we too preoccupied with our projects?
5. How can you begin to implement James 5:19-20– today?
6. A formula for witnessing may be to care, prayer, dare, share, spare..... what does this mean and how can you begin?
7. Pray for those around you who need to repent – the unsaved, the wandering believers, and others.
8. What was the most powerful lesson you learned from James? Is true faith working on your life?
9. Consider finding someone who needs true faith and share with them what you have learned through the study of James.
