## Diving Deeper in Scripture Together

### Questions for Discussion & Reflection

#### Judges 16

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1. Read Judges 16:1 – what is shocking about this verse?
2. How did Samson pursue his own desires instead of God's plan for him as judge in the city of Gaza?
3. Where is the Valley of Sorek? What does it promise – and what does it deliver?
4. Why doesn't Samson run away after the first time Delilah says the Philistines are upon him? What warnings can we take away from this?
5. How does Samson repeatedly descend into further sin?
6. How does sin cause a progression of destruction in our lives? What symbolism can we take from the Philistine revenge on Samson (16:21)?
7. What evidence is there that Samson's hair didn't just grow back – but that his heart finally changed to the Lord?
8. Compare & contrast the life of Samson and Jesus.
9. Consider the final statement in Judges 16. How do we see this in play in our world today?
