Diving Deeper in Scripture Together

Questions for Discussion & Reflection

II Timothy 2:8-13

1. What do you think of when you hear the word “remember”? What do you think is most important to remember? Why is it repeated so often in Scripture?
2. What does Paul call us to remember? Why is the order “Jesus Christ” (instead of “Christ Jesus”) significant?
3. Read Romans 1:4 and Philippians 3:10-12; compare to II Timothy 2:8. What is most important thing to remember about Jesus?
4. Read John 15:20. After remembering the gospel of Jesus, what must we remember about this gospel?
5. When those around you (especially bosses, family and others in close contact) judge you or look for your faults on account of your faith – what kind of witness do they see in your life? (Compare I Peter 2:12)
6. Read Paul’s declaration in verse 9. How can you remember the **power** of the gospel? How can this encourage you when you are suffering?
7. How do other passages in Scripture teach that the Word of God is not bound?
8. Read verse 10; why is Paul enduring? What is his target (purpose)?
9. If the opportunity arose, how would you summarize the facts of the gospel? Could II Timothy 2:11-13 help you with this?
10. How does the surprise of the last stanza of the song (II Timothy 2:13) challenge, surprise, convict & encourage you?
11. Commit verses 11-13 to memory. If it helps, try fitting it and singing it to the tune of another song you know.
