

II Timothy 4:9-22 "Life on the Tracks"

Additional Notes:

- 1. How does Paul define his calling (I Timothy1:1, 11)? How does he define our calling (II Timothy 1:9, compare II Corinthians 5:20)?
- 2. What is a "Dead Sea" Christian? Are you in danger of becoming one? Who is looking up to you? Is what they are seeing in you worth looking up to?
- 3. Read I Timothy 1:2. What are "grace, mercy & peace?" How can those things change your life?
- 4. How did Paul live before Timothy (II Timothy1:3)? Can you say the same?
- 5. Read I Thessalonians 2:8. How does Paul share with Timothy? Are you doing the same? How can you pursue this sort of relationship?
- 6. How can the example of Timothy's grandmother Lois and mother Eunice inspire you? (Read II Timothy 1:5, Acts 16:1)
- 7. How does verse II Timothy 1:13 connect to mentoring?
- 8. Read Luke 9:23-26. How is Paul seeing the fulfillment of these words?
- 9. What is our usual reaction to suffering? How can we change our perspective to align more with Scripture? (II Timothy 1:12, Luke 9:23, 26; I Peter 4:16; James 5:10, Philippians 1:29)
- 10. How does the knowledge that Christ gave us a spirit of power, love & self-control shape our lives (II Timothy1:7)? How can we apply this verse?
- 11. As Paul took time to pray for Timothy (I Timothy1:3b), take some time to devote to earnest prayer for those who may be following you.
