- 5. Read Proverbs 15:1. How does Gideon practice this principle? How can you?
- 6. Read Proverbs 19:11. How can you put this into practice?
- 7. Penuel and Succoth refuse to show generosity to support God's work. How can you support God's work even if you aren't on the "front lines" (for example, in full-time ministry)?
- 8. "Gideon's theology claimed that God was in charge, but Gideon's psychology became that he was in charge." Does your psychology match your theology? Do you align your behavior with the expectations of the culture around you?
- 9. How do you need to fight to maintain victory in your marriage, family, work and church? Are there places in your life where you might have let down your guard?
