Questions for Discussion & Reflection

Joshua 10:29-12:24

1. Regarding "Morality" – How can a good God call for the annihilation of the Canaanite people?
2. What two reasons does the Bible give for the destruction of the Canaanites? Hint for Reason #1: Genesis 15:16, Leviticus 18, Deuteronomy 9:4. Hint for Reason #2: Exodus 23:33.
3. Regarding "Morality"- Can you trust God to be holy?
4. Regarding "Idolatry" - What is idolatry & why is it so dangerous?
5. Regarding "Idolatry" - Can God trust you to worship the Giver & not the gifts?
6. Regarding "Fidelity" - Can we trust God? Can God trust you?
7. Regarding "Fidelity" - Can it be said of you that you leave "nothing undone of all the Lord has commanded" (Joshua 11:15)?
8. Who is the ultimate cause of the destruction we see in Joshua chapters 10-12? Hint: see Joshua 11:15 & 20.
9. "A just God will judge sin. But a patient God will bear with a sinner, giving him time to repent." How does the rest of Scripture demonstrate this? Does this comfort you?
10. "Justice delayed is not justice denied." How can this comfort you and give you hope?
11. Read Romans 1:21 & 26 and Exodus 10:1. Compare these verses with Joshua 11:20. What do we learn?

12. If our hearts are idol factories (John Calvin), what forms of idolatry do you see as common in our day? Are there some that particularly tempt you? Pray for each other in these areas.
13. If the modern trinity of idolatry for many is our comfort, convenience, & security, how do these tempt you? What remedy can we use when facing these temptations?
