

Joshua 8:1-35 Getting Back on Track

l.	We need to remember that is not usually for those who follow the God of Grace (Joshua 8:1-3).
II.	We must look to the for towards our obedience instead of listening to the world, the flesh, & the devil's about our past (Joshua 8:1a).
III.	We must follow plan & not lean on what makes sense to us (Joshua 8:1-29).
IV.	We must learn to follow God's Spirit's & & not merely our intellect, emotions, experience or traditions. (Joshua 8:10-29).
V.	We must saturate ourselves in and surround ourselves with kingdom committed (Joshua 8:30-35).

- 1. Have you ever wondered if God could ever use you again after a failing? If you are comfortable, share what you happened & how God guided you after that.
- 2. Complete this sentence: "We need to remember that failure is not usually *final* for...." For who? Why this group?
- 3. Read 1 Peter 5:10. What title does Peter give to God? How does this encourage you when you have failed?
- 4. What does the Devil use when we have failed or sinned? How should we respond? (hint: James 4:8 & 1 John 1:8-9)
- 5. Can you think of other examples of people who failed, but God restored them & used them? (In Scripture & in history)
- 6. Read Joshua 8:1. Of what might Joshua & the Israelites been afraid? What does God command them to do? How does this verse encourage you?
- 7. Do you struggle to not listen to the world, the flesh, & the devil? How can you prioritize the voice of the Lord over those competing voices? Share ideas with each other & encourage each other in this endeavor.
- 8. Are you tempted to do what makes sense to you instead of seeking God's plan? Ask others for encouragement, ideas, & prayer in this area.
- 9. Why does God demand the slaughter of all the Canaanites? How is this just? (hint: Check our Deuteronomy 7:1-2, Genesis 15:16)
- 10. Did the Israelites disobey by saving the King of Ai? Why did Joshua treat him the way he did? (hint: Deuteronomy 21:22-23).

11. How do you seek to saturate yourself in Scripture? Share ideas to encourage one another. Pray that God would make you more faithful & open your eyes to see wonderful things in His law (Psalm 119:18).
