Diving Deeper in Scripture Together

Questions for Discussion & Reflection

Joshua 10:1-28

1. What are some of the challenges you face in being “strong & courageous” (in any area of life, but especially in spiritual matters)?
 2. Why is Adonai-Zedek worried?
 3. Why is it ironic that Gibeon now faces annihilation from the Amorites?
 4. Joshua agrees to help Gibeon – even though they had only agreed to a *peace* treaty. Have you ever faced a decision that may have been justified – but wasn’t godly? What did you do?
 5. What is the difference between a sin of commission & a sin of omission? Can you give an example of each? What does the Bible say about these?
 6. “Is there something you know the Lord wants you to do & you have been beating around that bush?” Ask your group for prayer to be courageous in obeying the Word of the Lord. Then set goals & consider asking an accountability partner to encourage you to follow through with it.
 7. Share examples of God’s faithfulness in your past as an encouragement to be strong & courageous when many foes surround you.
 8. What “foes” (spiritual, physical, relational, or otherwise) are you facing now?
 9. How does Galatians 6:9 encourage us when we are weary? What other passages of Scripture can encourage weary saints?
 10. What is Joshua most surprised at in verse 14? Read James 4:2 & 5:17. What does this suggest about the lack of God’s action in our lives? Do you fail to ask God? Take a moment together to ask God for what you need.
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
