Farm Bill Wildlife Biologists on the Missouri Team are partnership positions supported by the Natural Resources Conservation Service, the Missouri Department of Conservation, and the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation. Hoerr will work with private landowners in Linn, Livingston, and Carroll counties, providing technical assistance and expertise in wildlife management planning and securing funds to implement those plans.
