Moberly, MO– October 28th, 2025 – Pheasants Forever and Quail Forever in Missouri is excited to share that Samantha Leonard was hired for the Moberly, MO Farm Bill Wildlife Biologist position. She started in her new position on October 6th, 2025.

This Farm Bill Wildlife Biologist position on the Missouri Team is funded through Working Lands for Wildlife (WLFW), a USDA initiative that works to conserve America's working land. Leonard will work with private landowners in Randolph, Macon, and Chariton counties, providing technical assistance and expertise in wildlife management planning and securing funds to implement those plans.

In her spare time, she enjoys birding, hiking, traveling, reading, and spending time with her family and friends.
