

Superbowl Squares

Every employee at GTG Automation has been given a randomized square, courtesy of GTG. To fill 100 squares, we have given nine employees an extra square based on seniority with the company.

Rules:

For each quarter a random number 0-9 was drawn for each column and row. The numbers were changed for each quarter to give each employee four combinations of numbers, a better chance to win.

Each square will receive a number from the top and side rows, which represent the final digits of the score for each team. Every square on the board represents a potential score outcome for the game.

For instance, the Chiefs score 14 points and the 49ers score 25 points. The players with a 4 (the second digit of the Chief's score) on the Chiefs side of the board (left) and a 5 (the second digit of the 49ers score) on the 49ers side of the board (top) wins for that quarter.

Each quarter will have One \$500.00 winner and Three \$100.00 winners. In the above example, if this were the score at the end of the first quarter, you will find the score in the yellow squares. In our grid, Roger Brock would be the winner of the \$500 for the first quarter. Andrew Luna, Anabelle Burciaga, and David Higginbotham would be the \$100.00 winners for having the correct numbers but not in the correct quarter. The "Final Score" includes Overtime!
