Cancer update

My cancer journey is mostly unchanged. I'm feeling pretty good - still no cancer-pain these days (and all medical bills are getting paid). We are grateful for your ongoing prayers! The only discomfort I experience is the continued stiffness, weakness, joint achiness, etc. which are side-effects of the treatments I'm receiving. On August 2, I'm scheduled to get another bone scan. That should give us a better idea of what's going on inside me. As I process what's happening to me with this cancer, I'm reminded often that life is full of pain and loss and grief, but we have a kind and loving Savior who provides just what we need, when we need it. As I recently read, "the path to holiness, often runs straight through suffering." And as my friend Ray wrote, "We say, no pain no gain, We want the gain, but we don't want the pain. But they go together. And growth comes from the difficult times..." I'm trusting that God will use this affliction for His glory and that I will become, by His grace, more and more like Jesus in the process. And as I think about the fragility of life, I'm encouraged when I think of the resurrection. I sometimes tell students that our current bodies are version 1.0, but at the resurrection we'll receive the ultimate upgrade to version 2.0 - the glorified body like our Lord Jesus (Philippians 3:20). What an amazing God we love and serve! Hope continually rises in my heart!

Please pray that our group can meet, and befriend, many new students in early and mid-August. Pray too for our various welcome activities to be well attended (picnic, hikes, visit to Penn's Cave, etc.).
