Coach's Corner

One Hand or Two?

An increasingly controversial topic that's important for bowlers trying to figure out their style to know. The "traditional" way of bowing involves one hand with three fingers inserted in the ball. The swing of the ball comes from the shoulder and revs are generated by the hand motion as the fingers come out of the ball. Two handed bowling has become increasingly popular, especially in youth bowling. Two-handed bowling is more of a full body effort to release the ball. Bowlers using two hands can generate more revs which typically translates to more hook and more pin action.

New bowlers should always use the style that's more comfortable for them. The goal is to score high using whatever technique is the most efficient for you.

As always, if you plan to bowl in a tournament, be sure to consult the <u>USBC Rulebook</u>. There are specific rules for two-handed bowlers and equipment.
