Coach's Corner

An Intro to Oil Patterns

Ever wonder why your bowling ball comes back slippery? Have you seen a machine slowly creeping down the lanes before a tournament or league day? Bowling alleys put down a special concoction of oil on the lanes to help protect the surface of the lane which in turn influences how your bowling ball hooks (or doesn't hook).

Each bowling alley has their day-to-day pattern called a "house pattern." This is what's normally put out for leagues and is typically very forgiving. Meaning that you can miss your mark with a reactive ball (see last week's coaches corner if you missed this lesson) and still have a decent chance of the ball getting to the strike zone.

Some houses, like Mt. Lebanon, host sport shot leagues. That means the oil pattern that's put on the lanes is more like what you would see the pros bowling on.

If you're new to tournament bowling, or you've gone to tournaments and wondered "why isn't my ball hooking?!", you should check to see what kind of pattern they have down. Googling the name of it might get you a good idea of how to play it!
