Northland Career Center

Northland Career Center (NCC) is a public, not-for-profit, career and technical school located within the Platte County R-3 School District in Platte City, Missouri. NCC offers 12 secondary daytime programs to students at the 15 high schools in the Kansas City Northland.

796 students have been placed on the wait list in the past three years.



Wait Listed

There has been a 51% increase in students placed on waiting lists. This represents an enormous loss of potential, not only for our students, but for our community. The number of students on the waiting list for the past three years include:

Health Sciences: 213
Law Enforcement/CSI: 129
Diesel Technology: 116
Industrial Welding: 114
Culinary Arts: 72
Construction Technology: 59
HVAC: 42
Industrial Automation and Robotics: 30

Now, the Northland Career Center is partnering in the construction of a new, state-of-the-art career center, the Northland Workforce Development Center (NWDC).



Purpose: To empower the Kansas City and Northland communities through innovative workforce development, strategic partnerships, and supportive programs that build skills, create opportunities, and strengthen our regional workforce and local economy.


- Develop a workforce center in a demographically diverse and accessible area while ensuring inclusive, barrier-free pathways to opportunity for all individuals.

- Generate qualified candidates for local, in-demand, high-wage workforce positions by equipping them with the tools, support, and confidence to achieve their potential.
- Expand adult upskilling programs to serve as a community asset and resource for Kansas Citians and Northlanders of all ages, maximizing regional impact.

Most students will experience a 10-15 minute shorter commute.

Many students do not own or have access to private transportation and rely on their school districts for their commute to school and off-campus activities. The current location of NCC is in the northwest corner of the Northland, not near the geographic center of the school districts serviced.

The new 19-acre site, located at the epicenter of the Northland, will reduce travel time and costs for students while also increasing available time for instruction, career exploration, and opportunities to participate in more campus activities.



Filling workforce gaps with local talent



Together, NCC and Platte County School District will continue to forecast, quantify, and address the region's current and future workforce requirements. Their partnership has grown to include local and region Chambers, school districts, economic development organizations, and industry stakeholders. These partnerships will propel NWDC to serve as an economic engine for the entire Kansas City area.
