Course Description:	This course emphasizes skills and strategies for independent reading of, analyzing, and writing about works of American literature, with a focus on how that literature reflects social, political, and moral issues in the United States. Select literature by American authors will come from the period of exploration and settlement to the present. Students will study works of prose, poetry, drama, and fiction in relation to their historical and cultural contexts. Texts will be selected from among a diverse group of authors for what they reflect and reveal about the evolving American experience and character.

Minimum Number of Grades

Each student should receive a minimum of eighteen (18) grades per subject each semester. Grades should be evenly distributed across the grading period and the grading categories in order to consistently reflect student progress towards mastery of the standards.

Academic Recovery

Students who have not yet provided evidence of mastery should have opportunities to receive reteaching and be reassessed prior to final grades being entered. This may occur during regular instructional time, during "lunch and learn" sessions, or at other times when students are able to attend that are not disruptive to required instruction.
