Grace Maxine Talbert

102-year-old Grace Maxine Talbert of Fairfield, died at 4:25pm on Tuesday, August 3 at Ferrell Hospital in Eldorado.

Maxine was born on October 20, 1918, in Cisne, to Arthur and Rachel (McNeeley) Brach. She was married to Orville H. Talbert for 60 years, before he preceded her in death in 2002.

Maxine attended Fairview School in rural Wayne County, Fairfield Community High School, and graduated from Southern Illinois University, magna cum laude, with a Master's in Counseling. She taught school for 33 years, including the Title I Development Reading Program, and Junior High Language Arts. She was a member of the First Christian Church, PEO, Every Wednesday Club, Benedicts, Duplicate Bridge Club, and PHI Kappa Honorary Society.

Maxine knitted a few hundred baby caps and booties for new babies born at Fairfield Memorial Hospital. She was on the hospital auxiliary board, beautification board, and served on the teacher' s certification board from 2004-2006, until it was dissolved by the governor. In 2014, Maxine was chosen as the Outstanding Community Service Award recipient. She was also a life member of the NEA, IEA, a member of the Exemplar Club, Historical Society, and Arts and Crafts.

Survivors include one daughter Lonna Taylor of Geff, one son-in-law John Sterne of Evansville, IN, three grandchildren Robyn (David) Ewing of Fairfield, Benjamin Sterne of Virginia Beach, VA, and Teddy (Sarah) Sterne of Carmel, IN, two great grandsons Rylee (Tiffany) Ewing, and Addison Ewing both of Fairfield, three great great grandchildren, one brother Otis (Carol) Brach of Fairfield, along with several nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husband Orville, one daughter Cindy Talbert-Sterne, and two brothers Orlan Brach and Lon Brach.

Ruth Boggs Matthews passed away peacefully May 22, 2021 at the age of 94 due to advanced Alzheimer's Disease. She had resisted and endured the effects of the disease for more than a dozen years. Her medical care was overseen and managed by a dear friend with the indispensable advice and assistance of Aging Wisdom, Inc.


Ms. Matthews was born to Corrinne Steiner Boggs and John Dalgus Boggs, M.D, in St. Louis, MO, and spent her youth in the small town of Fairfield, IL. She was a graduate of Fairfield Community High School, 1944. She received a BA, Cum Laude, in English from McKendree University, Lebanon, IL, in 1957 and taught English at Belleville Township High School, Belleville, IL, 1957 - 1967. To be near her son, Ms. Matthews moved to Seattle where she earned a Master of Library and Information Science degree from the University of Washington in 1969. She then worked for the Lake Washington School District as a librarian until her retirement in 1995.

Ms. Matthews was preceded in death by her parents, her brother John D. Boggs, Jr., her sister, Sarah Lee Boggs of Kirkwood, MO, and her son, John Dunscombe Matthews, of Seattle. She is survived by a large community of friends and cousins.

Ms. Matthews was a wonderful photographer and poet. She enjoyed music, reading and writing, travel, history and friendship. Most of all she treasured moments shared with her son and her sister. She was an active member and officer of the Queen Anne Historical Society. Ms. Matthews was an inspiration to everyone at the Queen Anne Pool where she continued to swim early morning laps until her eighty-fourth birthday.

Even when ravaged by the effects of Alzheimer 's disease, Ms. Matthews continued to find moments of joy and beauty and often repeated her favorite expression: "Every day is a gift".

Ms. Matthews' remains have been interred in the family plot at Maple Hill Cemetery, Fairfield, IL, where she rests alongside her parents, sister and son. .
