




Mr. Groppel speaks at May Meeting

According to the family, this is Lucy Woods and Carl Shelton. Lucy or "Lulu" was Carl's first wife. They were married in 1909 and she died in 1912 at the age of 23. "Lulu Shelton" is buried in the family plot at Maple Hill Cemetery, Fairfield.

Carl Shelton also had a baby sister that was called Lulu, who was married to Guy Pennington. The couple left town after being fired upon. Lulu Shelton Barger is buried in Florida.

Local churches awarded the

ILLINOIS SESQUICENTENNIAL HOUSE of WORSHIP AWARD

The Illinois State Historical Society recognizes Illinois houses of worship that have served their congregations continuously for 150 years or more. Local individuals submit church information that becomes part of the Illinois State Historical Society archives.

The Wayne County Historical Society will erect a bronze plaque at each of the following sites that have received State Historical Society recognition.

Brush Creek Community of Christ

Located in the Orchardville area, the Brush Creek Saints were organized by T.P and Sarah Green in 1842. The congregation used the Caudle log schoolhouse for many years before a church was built. A small replica of the log structure sits across from the church. Their story is of historical significance to the community, to the county, and to the history of the denomination. Saints still gather every Sunday within the walls of the 1880 sanctuary.

Lebanon North CP Church

The Cumberland Presbyterian churches of Illinois, White County and Wayne County were started by David Wilson McLin as early as 1819. The Lebanon North congregation is located south of Fairfield. This congregation began meeting in 1871. The first church building was erected in 1895 and used until 1956, when the current building was erected. The modern fellowship room and kitchen were added in 2003.

Oak Valley Free Will Baptist Church

Located just north of Geff, Illinois, the Oak Valley Free Will Baptist Church has a large and active congregation. Several persons can trace their roots back to the first group, lead by Rev. Samuel S. Branch from Meigs Co, Ohio. He moved his large family and congregation to Wayne County in 1852 and established the Oak Valley Free Will Baptist Church in 1854.


Heritage Churches
