PASTOR'S PAGE

By the end of August we will be exploring how Radical Love Triumphs! On the 5th Sunday we will hear Jesus lift up the mysteriously gracious and life-transforming values of the kingdom of God.

- Jesus lifts up the humility required to take the lowest seat at the table, never hoping to be invited to a place of greater honor or status.
- Jesus invites his followers to practice the hospitality that offers a banquet of the finest of foods for people who cannot repay.
- Jesus invites his followers to embody the kind of radical-yet-relational love of Jesus himself.

This radical love is taught by both individuals and congregations. Communities of faith by their practices of generosity and compassion embody the love of Jesus in their communities.

We begin the month however working through the human propensity of Dying to be Rich as Jesus tells the parable of the rich fool. It is first told to brothers squabbling over an inheritance, and now it is told to us, some of us squabbling with our relatives or neighbors over wealth and possessions. The rich fool, despite his great wealth, is poor in every other way, eating alone, and even dying alone. In Jesus' depiction of this fool our own sinful hearts are exposed.

We will explore the tremendous irony of how The Kingdom of God is given to a little flock! Jesus says, "Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." Jesus promises the kingdom to us, his little flock, straining our minds with this uninhibited generosity.

We will confront The Reality of Division as throughout the Gospel of Luke, Jesus calls on his hearers to turn their hearts away from greed and instead to generosity, to turn away from anxious self-preservation and instead to faithful self-giving. But such practice rubs against humanity's deepest-seated sin, so conflict is born out of Jesus' peace-filled activity. Jesus' words and actions had already pitted him against the religious leaders and will lead him to the cross.

While fully aware of the realities of conflict and division, we are to live as hopeful people, praying fervently for God's compassion and for the restoration of right relationships.

God's Verbs help us to best follow God's will and way. Through the lens of the gospel, today's texts offer a clear identification of God's work. What is God doing?

- God is reaching out to the bound-up to proclaim release from captivity.
- God is lifting up the oppressed.
- God is satisfying the needs of the afflicted.
- God raises up foundations.
- God restores and rebuilds, reconciles and sets free.
- God, whose word can shake the very foundations of the earth, speaks a better word than we've ever heard, or that we could ever speak.

These texts focus us on the *verbs*, the actions, of God. When we're attuned to the verbs of God within passages like these, it might make it easier to see and give witness to God's work and the verbs around us right now.

2025 STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM—Go and Do the Same—Give Thanks

Today we're looking at a text that assumes two things, and then puts us in a position to think and choose. The text assumes, first, that God does great things for us. God loves us and offers us that love freely. That is a given. Then, second, the text assumes that we must decide how to respond to God. God's love for you is a given. You cannot choose whether or not God loves you. You can choose how you respond.

In the text, we encounter an unnamed woman who had engaged in sin but whom God had forgiven. She responds one way. We also encounter a Pharisee named Simon. He responds another way. Luke puts you on the spot. Would you rather before be like the Pharisee, or like the woman?

Building on the woman's response to Jesus, we get a little add- on to the main text telling about women who provided for Jesus and the other disciples "out of their own resources." They make possible the continuation of Jesus' ministry. Our choice for generosity enables us to do the same.
