
Helping Hand

Life in our cottages is intentionally safe, therapeutic, structured, and home-like. Our cottages are a place of growth and learning, where the love and grace of Christ are demonstrated while residents learn and practice the new behaviors and skills needed to pursue the twin challenges personal growth and family reconciliation. Our cottages resemble, to the greatest extent possible, a normal family home and are intended to create and mirror the lessons which will eventually be

Cottage life teaches structure, respect, and responsibility while building confidence, self-efficacy, and a willingness to fearlessly face challenges head-on in order to build a new and better life.

The relationships built in the cottage establish the foundation for healing and growth across the program, under the supervision of our Residential Life Specialist (RLS) couples. RLS couples are employed with us full-time and serve six children each, working as a team to manage their cottage, serve their residents, and model a healthy Christian lifestyle. RLS staff intentionally hold hope and demonstrate the unconditional love and value God has for all people independent of behavior, choices, or life circumstances. When faith, hope, love, and authentic relationship are at the forefront, everything else will fall into place. Hope Harbor has three full-time Residential Life Specialist couples. Get to know us!

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
