Hope Harbor's New "Jenesis"

The word genesis comes from a Greek term meaning origin, source, or beginning. It is fittingly the title of the first book of the Bible, the book that begins God's revelation of Himself to humankind. Genesis tells how God created the heavens and the earth, how life began, and how His relationship with humanity was first established. Interestingly, the same word reappears in Matthew 1:1 and 1:18, where it marks another divine beginning, the genesis of Jesus Christ, when God begins His redemptive work through His Son. In both cases, genesis signifies that God is doing something new, something purposeful and transformative.

In that same spirit, Hope Harbor is entering its own genesis, a new chapter of ministry and mission. After many faithful years operating as a residential care facility, Hope Harbor has transitioned into a foster care ministry. This shift is more than a change in structure; it represents a renewed way for us to partner with families, churches, and communities in carrying out the work God has called us to. And in a beautiful reminder of God's timing, our very first child under this new model is named Jenesis, a living testimony that every new beginning is a part of His greater plan.

This new season brings with it a profound shift in how we live out our mission. Two areas in particular define this transformation:

1. Supporting Our Ministry Partners (Foster Families)

Under our former residential care model, House Parents were employees of Hope

Harbor, being trained, supported, and compensated to care for the children in residence. In our new foster care model, however, foster parents are missionaries (not employees of Hope Harbor) who are answering God's call to serve. These families open their homes and hearts out of faith and compassion, often stepping into challenging circumstances with limited external support.

Statistics show that nearly 60% of foster parents stop fostering within the first year due to burnout and lack of support. If our volunteer foster parents leave, the state must reassign their foster children to other homes, which means those children must leave our campus community as well. Because of this, we must surround our ministry partners, our foster parents, with encouragement, practical help, and prayer. Every foster parent who stays provides stability, and their faithfulness directly contributes to the healing of our foster children.

2. Investing Intentionally in Foster Children

Our commitment to the children in our care remains steadfast. Hope Harbor seeks to provide targeted activities and avenues that nurture each child's emotional, social, educational, and spiritual growth while they are on campus. Whether through mentoring, faith-driven programming, tutoring, or therapeutic engagement, we are dedicated to helping every foster child experience belonging, growth, and the transformative love of Christ.

While the methods have changed, our mission remains rooted in the same calling: to bring hope and restoration through Christ. Just as Genesis reveals the beginning of God's story and Matthew marks the beginning of Jesus' work on earth, this genesis at Hope Harbor is a new work to which God has called us.

We celebrate His faithfulness in every season and look forward to seeing how He will use this new chapter to reach more children, strengthen families, and continue writing His story of grace, one life at a time.

Workday Blessings: Preparing the Heart of Our Campus

Children Mean the World to God

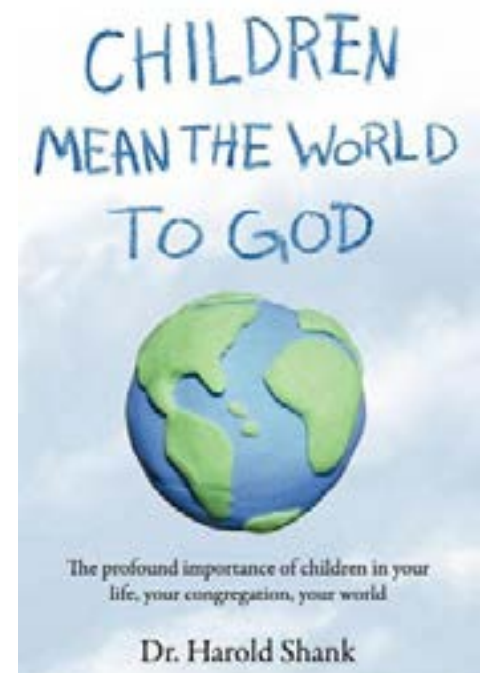

Two new foster families are preparing to welcome children and their houses are ready, but the rooms are still empty! Your donation will fill homes with warmth, comfort, and belonging. Each gift helps provide the essentials: a soft bed, a dresser for clothes, a sofa for story time, a dining table where laughter and conversation nourish as much as the food on the table. Our goal is to raise \$40,000 by midnight on Giving Tuesday to fully furnish both (large seven bedroom) homes and replace one washer/dryer set. Every donation transforms an empty space into a refuge where a child feels safe and loved. Will you join us in Lighting the Way and being part of this special story of provision?

Imagine this scenario:

It's after midnight when the knock comes. Eight-year-old Tonya clutches her little sister Tessa's hand while Trent, just six, tries to be brave. In minutes, their world changes...three small children carried from chaos into the unknown.

Inside, a soft lamp glows beside a neatly made bed, not too bright, not too crowded. Just safe. A new plush friend waits on the blanket. A foster family, called by faith and love, whispers "You're welcome here."

At Hope Harbor, we believe the first step toward healing begins with a place that feels safe, gentle, and full of grace. We want every child who walks through our doors to experience a cozy, uncluttered room — designed with trauma-informed care in mind — where they can breathe, rest, and begin to trust again.

This Giving Tuesday, your gift helps us create those healing spaces. Your generosity will:

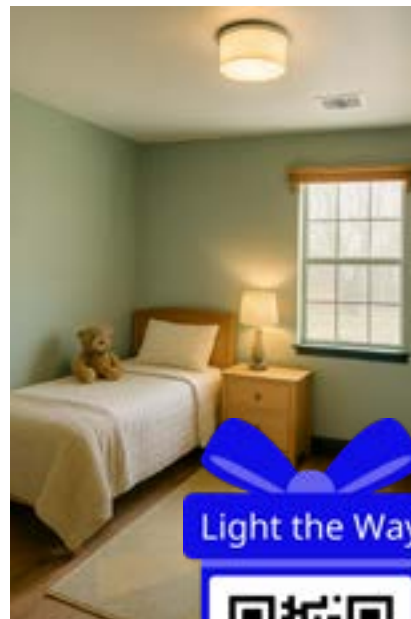
- Furnish homes with warm, child-friendly decor
- Provide trauma-informed bedrooms designed to comfort and calm

Every bed, lamp, and blanket tells a child: "You matter. You are safe. You are loved." Together, we can make their first night at Hope Harbor — and every night after — a step toward wholeness.

As we look toward 2026, we're also preparing for the next step: repurposing a large existing space to create dedicated areas for after-school programs, child-centered activities, training, and family support. This project will require \$50,000 to add partitions and replace 25-year-old carpet, equipping our facilities to best serve foster families for years to come.

When you add both needs together, we are asking for a grand total of \$90,000. God's provision along this transitional journey, however, has been faithful and unmistakable. We are trusting God to provide for our needs so this ministry can continue to provide safe harbor for the vulnerable. Will you be His feet and hands in this endeavor and partner with us to Light the Way? Hebrews 13:16 reminds us that sacrificial giving is pleasing to our God. Would you prayerfully consider helping us finish 2025 well and step boldly into 2026? Together, we're not just building spaces — we're building hope.
